My maternal grandfather [Nicholas]& his brother [John] were born in McHenry County: John E. Murray, Born 1867, Harvard,

Died 1925, Hartford CT & Nicholas C. Murray, Born 7Dec1870, Harvard, Died 7Apr1900, Cranston RI.

They were the sons of Dennis Murray, born in 1843 in County Waterford, Ireland, died 1920 in CT & Elizabeth J. Conner, born in 1844 in County Queen, Ireland, died 1906 in CT.

A letter from Craig Pfannkuche, dated 22 March, 2000, tells me that among the remaining records of St. Patrick's Church shows a "Thomas McGuire baptized on 21 Dec 1867 and the sponsors were named Dennis and Elizabeth Murray."

Dennis Murray & Catherine "Kate" Slevin were witnesses at the baptism of Mary 10 Oct 1867, daughter of Edward Ryan & Ann Slevin.

Dennis Murray & Catherine Slevin were witnesses at the baptism William, born 25Aug 1860, baptised 9 Sept 1860, son of William & Elizabeth McGrain.

Dear Paul,

Glad to hear that you liked the 1905 SF pictures that I forwarded to you, but then I knew you would like them. I have seen lots of '06 photos, but never seen any '05 before.

To answer your questions about our mutual ancestors, I can tell you the

following:

Our mutual grandmother, Nora Gallagher Murray Collins was born in Co. Galway, Ireland, 7 Jan 1871 and died in SF 17 Oct. 1919. The 1880 U.S. Census shows her

and her brother Thomas living in Hartford CT with their uncle Thomas O. Gallagher. The 1893 Hartford CT city directory shows her working at Brown, Thomson & Co. Dry Goods. The Hartford Marriage Records for Hartford 1885-1896, shows her marrying on 28 Jun 1892 Nicholas C. Murray, newspaper reporter (born 7 Dec 1870 in Harvard, IL-died 7 Jun 1900 in the State Workhouse in Cranston RI). The 1900 U.S. Census, which was taken 5 days after his death, shows Nora as a widow with daughters Mary P. (Pauline to us) age 6 & Frances E. age 3. According to Eleanor Roche Mullinger, Nora supported her girls until 1907 by taking in boarders, she and the girls then came west to marry a friend of the family-your grandfather-John W. Collins. He was born in Attleboro MA 7-Oct-1876 & died in SF 6 Mar 1938 (I was 11 when he died, so I remember him well and he was a dear man!) They married on 9 Sept 1907 in SF, but they both were staying with mutual friend George Hogan at 1413 - 9th St. in Alameda. John's occupation was given as silversmith and his parents were Michael Collins & Margaret Lalley, both born in Ireland.

The 1910 U.S. Census shows John and Nora at 2863 - 22nd St. with Mary P. & Frances E. as 15 & 13 + Margaret L. 1 9/12 & John as 5/12. John W.'s occupation is shown as "silversmith polisher in a store". Eleanor M. wrote me that it was Shreve's Jewelers.

On 19 Jan 1913 Margaret died. She was 4 yrs. 6 mos. 13 days old. She died of "tubercular peritonitis" at UCSF, according to her death certificate. EM wrote that "Nora was never the same after that." I can understand why.

The 1920 U,S, Census, since Nora died the year before, shows John W., John J., Claire C. + Pauline & Dick Roche, who married the year before, + Frances E., as a teacher.

Pauline was trying to help out, but after Eleanor was born 28

Apr 1920 it was too much and they moved out. John W. got his sister Teresa to come from MA to keep house for them.

NORA JOSEPHINE GALLAGHER MURRAY COLLINS

Nora Gallagher was born in County Galway, Ireland on Jan. 7, 1871. When she was 4 years old her Mother died. Her brother John (THOMAS?) and sister Clara, who were already in the USA, went from Connecticut to Galway "to rescue her from a wicked stepmother". Clara waited until Nora was raised before entering the convent as Sister Mary Alicantara. Nora attended a Young Ladies Seminary. Have no info on how she met Nicolas Murray, who was born in Harvard, II, 7 Dec. 1870, but is reported to have had relatives in CT. They were married June 28, 1893 at St. Patrick's Church, Hartford CT by Rev. James J. Egan. They visted Cottage City MA on their honeymoon. [24 Mar 1995 letter from Eleanor Mullinger] They had 2 daughters, Mary Pauline, born 30 April1894, died 1954, and Frances, born 9 Oct 1896, died 9 Feb 1966, both at 171 Garden St., Pawtucket, RI Nicolas died of pleuro -pneumonia & exhaustion in a State Workhouse in Cranston, RI, April 7, 1900. He is buried at St. Mary Parish Cemetery, Rt. 12, Lisbon CT 06351

Letter from Eleanor Mullinger dated 27 May 1977, "All I ever heard about Nora's birthplace is that it was Galway-I don't know if it were in the city or surrounding area." "Nora ran a boarding house to support herself and our mothers."

Letter from Eleanor Mullinger 19 April 1989-" know little more than you do. Nora was only 4 years old when her brother John and sister Clara came from Connecticutt to Galway to rescue her from a cruel stepmother. Clara waited until Nora was raised before entering the convent-Sr. Mary Alcantara-I can remember my Mother writing to Sr. M. A. She lived to be very old. Nora attended a Young Ladies Seminary and don't know where she met Nicholas although he did have relatives in CT. He was indeed born in II. Clara McLaughlin said he had a drinking problem."

Undated letter from Eleanor Mullinger-"Nora Gallagher was born in 1870 (I think) one year before Ireland started keeping good records. She came to the States when she was about 4 years old, after her brother John and her sister Clara (much older and already in CT) heard tales of abbuse by a new step mother." "Your memory of John Collins being a doorman at the Palace are correct, his real work was as a silversmith, but duriing the depresson he lost his job at Shreve's and was unemployed for 5 years. He worked in the WPA and whatever he could get until this job as doorman came up and he was glad to get it."

Nora met John W. Collins thru a mutual friend, George Hogan. In 1907 Nora, Pauline and Frances came west to Alameda, where Nora married John. George Hogan was best man. Housing was not available in S.F. due to the Earthquake. He was a silversmith but as a result of the depression, lost his job, worked for WPA and eventually was a doorman at the St. Francis Hotel. They had 2 daughters and a son: Margaret, born 6 July 1908, while they lived at 2868 - 22nd St. [State of CA Certificate of Birth] and died 19 Jan. 1913 in U.C.San Francisco Hospital of tubercular peritonitis and was buried at Holy Cross Cemetery, Colma, [State of CA Certificate], John J., born 6 Nov 1909, died 25 Sept 1982 in Denver CO, buried in Fort Logan Veterans Cemetery and Claire, born 28 Sept1911, died 15 Sept 1992 in San Mateo cremated and ashes sprinkled with Paul E. Judge at Glacier Point, Yosemite. Nora Gallagher Murray Collins died 27 Oct 1919 at Mary's Help Hospital, San Francisco, of Pulminary Embolism and was buried at Holy Cross Cemetery, Colma. They lived at 3524 - 21st St. at the time. John W. Collins died 6 March 1938 in San Francisco in St. Mary's Hospital of a pulmonary embolism and was buried at Holy Cross Cemetery, Colma. They lived at 841 Dolores. [info on Nora's early life is based on a 19 April 1989 letter from Eleanor Roche Mullinger]

Have a nice Easter, I am doing a Brunch for mostly the Stone Family. I also have a friend staying w/me for ten days, so will be busy more so for a while.




Dear Olivia and Hall,

Between 1848 and 1864 all of the land of Ireland was surveyed for the purpose of establishing the level of rates (local tax) to be paid by each landowner or leaseholder. Griffiths Valuation Survey lists each land or householder in the country giving the townland and description of the property (e.g. Land, house and land, or house, out offices/out buildings, and land). It also lists the landlord and the annual valuation. Because of the shortage of other records this is a very important substitute census, although it obviously does not cover all inhabitants of an area. It is particularly important in emigrant family research as it was carried out during a period when much emigration occured, and thus it can form a useful link between the information available about the local origins of an emigrant ancestor and the Irish records. The names occurring in both Griffith's Valuation survey and the Tithe Applotment Survey books have been indexed for each county in the surname index compiled by the National Library of Ireland. Microfilmed copies of the survey are available in several libraries.

Thank you for your call to our centre and our apologies for the delay in getting back to you, as we have been unusually busy these past few months.

Further to your query we have some information which should be of much interest to you. We have a church baptism record for a daughter, Bridget, born to a John & Honor Gallagher (nee Rourke) in 1863. We also have a church baptism record for a daughter, Bridget, born to a Thomas & Clare Gallagher (nee Kelly) in 1828.

We believe that these are possibly the ancestors you referred to in your research application. As you will see from the enclosed map there are few O' Rourke families in Galway, and this is the only Gallagher / Rourke union we can find. In the 1828 baptism record the mother is registered as Clare Kelly, this is possibly the Clorinda Kelly you referred to. We have found no record for a Clorinda in our records, and the name Clare is quite unusual for the time, which leads us to presume a linkage.

The information on the dispersion of family names is taken from the 1855 Griffiths Valuation survey taken in Galway in that year. This was part of a nationwide survey conducted from 1848-64, which details all land and house-holders and a brief description of the holding together with its rateable valuation. Given the dearth of records for the period it serves as a very important and comprehensive body of information.

Copies of the Griffiths Valuation records from the relevant townlands, pertaining to the above families are available, together with a detailed townland map with same areas highlighted.

Names are given alphabetically in each township, surname in capitals, followed by the age category of the oldest person and then the page on the film. Said number is the heavy black number in the upper left or right corner.

A question mark indicated some doubt as to my reading of the name. Dashes indicate letters I could not read though not the total amount of letters. An asterik indicates the oldest person was a woman, and two asteriks indicate a man as the oldest, though a woman's name appears. Other symbols used are explained as they appear.

The body of the census was typed with a Prestige 10 printwheel and the index with a Courier 10. An open format was used for ease in reading since so many of my fellow genealogists are no longer very young and undoubtedly wear glasses.

The user is encouraged to first look for the usual spelling of a name, then consider phonetic spellings. The handwriting of the time was quite ornate so capital letters were often easily confused as: L, S, T; H, K, R.



INTRODUCTION AND EXPLANATION

My personal connection to LaSalle County is found in two time periods: 1851-1855 and 1954 to the present.

In the first, my maternal grandfather, Darwin Hinkley Holcomb, was born 16 May 1852, probably in Earl Township, to Harry and Tryphena (Lawless) Holcomb: their seventh and last child. By 1855 the family was either in the town of Ottawa or already in Delaware County, Iowa. We are not certain of the time of their move.

On page 69 in this publication appears Darwin Hinkley of Adams Township, who was the doctor attendant at the birth.

In the second period, my husband and I moved to the town of Mendota in 1954, and, in 1958 began our family of four. Not being gifted mathematically I have no idea of the odds involved in my returning to the area of my maternal grandfather's birth.

During the summer of 1986 while researching for another family I found there was no listing available, at least locally, of those on the 1855 state census. I arranged to borrow the film from the La-Salle County Historical Society Museum at Utica, Illinois.

Those familiar with census records know that five years before in 1850 the seventh federal census was made, giving, at long last, the names of all in a household, specific age and place of birth. However, in this 1855 census, which was done only in the rural sections, we find only one name, presumably the head of the household, then all ages given in categories with a slash mark. Males appear first, then females.

It was my decision to only give the age of the oldest person in the household who may not have been the person names.

The roll contains Kankakee, Kendall and Knox counties first with LaSalle County finishing the roll. We can feel most fortunate that there was no damage to our part. Kendall is almost totally unreadable.

There are two pages of maps included in this publication. One shows the regular arrangement of the townships in the county. The other shows the order in which they appear on the roll. It is not



Till When I first contacted the MCIGS in the Spring of 1995 seeking information on my maternal grandfather, Nicholas C. Murray, who was born in Harvard, McHenry County, Illinois, December 7, 1870(?) I received a very helpful letter from Corresponding Secretary Tricia Schiedler. She made several suggestions as to avenues I could explore and mentioned in that there was member researching MURRAY.

Because I live within a 1 hour driving distance of the National Archives-Pacific Southwest Region in Laguna Niguel, I was able to view the microfilm of the 1880 Census for McHenry County. In Vol. 36, E.D. 144, Sheet 28, Line 14, I found a family headed by Patrick MURRAY, a 44 year old white male. His wife was 36 year old Anna and the children were Anna (13), John (11), Nicholson (11), Agnes (9), Patrick (8), James (7), Frances (4), Henry (2), Sylvester (1). 





Early Settler Certificate Program

There is an alphabetical list of the names of settlers for whom certificates have been issues. This list includes the year settled in the county, town/township of settlement, and spouse. This list comprises the names of early settlers from approved certificates for March 1985 through March 1999.

You may request a photocopy of the original application by sending \$1.00 per settler and an SASE along with your request to MCIGS at the address above.

The following alphabetical list is arranged with the name of settler, date settled, town/Township; of settlement, and Spouse. If the name is listed more than once it indicates more than one person has received a certificate under that settler's name. Box 184, Crystal Lake, IL 60039-0184. Please include a long SASE with your request. You may also <u>download an</u> application here.

Beginning **January 1st, 2013**, the cost of submitting an Early Settler application will increase as follows: Members will be charged \$10 for the first ancestor, \$7.50 for each additional ancestor. Nonmember fees will be \$15 for the first ancestor, \$10 for each additional ancestor.

It is arranged alphabetically by the name of settler, date settled, town/township, and spouse. Submitted applications for the following early settlers <u>may be ordered</u> from the Society for a fee of \$5.00. 
ELIGIBILITY:

To qualify for an Early Settler Certificate, the applicant must be a direct descendant from an ancestor who settled in McHenry County between 1834 and 1880. Applicant need not be a resident of McHenry County. The cost of a certificate for MCIGS members will be \$10.00 for the first ancestor and \$7.50 for each additional ancestor. Non-members may also apply for a fee of \$15.00 for the first ancestor, and \$10.00 for each additional ancestor. Certificates for ancestors who settled in McHenry County before 1850 will have a gold seal. The ones for 1851-1880 will have an embossed seal.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- (1) When completing the Ancestor Chart, please use the maiden name where applicable. If you are unsure of any dates or information, place a question mark behind the data.
- (2) Documented evidence for each generation must accompany the application, such as: census records; birth, death, marriage records; school or church records; Bible records; military records; obituaries; estate records; newspaper clippings; land records; tombstone inscriptions (give location of cemetery); county histories, etc. DO NOT SEND ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS Please submit PHOTOCOPIES ONLY, as all applications and verifying material will become the property of the McHenry County Illinois Genealogical Society.
- (3) Please submit as much additional information about your ancestor as you wish. You may use the "additional information" section provided on the application or a separate piece of paper.




