

### June Starr


June Louise Starr of Indio, Calif., died Nov. 15, 2003, in Indio. She was 84.

A word about the 14 Vets. Most were able to walk, but nearly all agreed to ride in wheel chairs because of all the walking and touring. I tried to talk with them all, and was overwhelmed by the incredible spirit, humility, and sense of humor they showed. In talking to their sons and daughters and family, I learned that most of them did not talk about the War until recently. I believe that it was such a terrible and frightening memory for them, that suppressing its memory and starting families were top in priority. They are truly the greatest generation.




As a land surveyor and land use permit consultant I worked with the County's property development rules from their inception in the 1970's until my retirement in 2009.

During this period I worked with dozens of property owners in the successful development of their property, while respecting our beautiful environment.

During this period we saw the advent of the Shoreline Master Program, the Comprehensive Plan, the Growth Management Act, and frequent periodic updates of all the attendant rules.

It is with pride that I point to the many projects I worked on as examples which strike a good balance between the owners' wishes and protecting the environment.

We followed the rules, filled out the forms, hired the experts, did the SEPA reviews, presented the information and studies to the County, had the public hearings, and spent the required money for application fees/wetland biologists/civil engineering / surveying /and the fees of other specialists.

We frequently experienced long delays in getting project approvals. The rules we followed were not always simple ones, but we followed them.

It is difficult for me to understand where we screwed up. What are the problems associated with all this work that I and the other professionals, and our clients, have created with this almost 40 years worth of work?

Is the storm water runoff associated with our designs and projects polluting the Sound, or the streams, or the



lakes? Are the storm water runoff treatment and drainage plans we prepared and installed not doing the job?

We followed all the building setback distances, took photos of the screening vegetation, marked trees and brush for Planning Dept. future follow up.

We worked with the architects and builders to comply with the codes, and in general thought we were following a tough set of rules and thereby protecting the environment which is so precious to all of us.

But I guess all this wasn't good enough.

What is the problem? What is being polluted? Are the wetlands studies we did and the resulting buffers we had to install not working? Are all the County wetland maps and project reviews being done not good enough? What is wrong?

You don't have to change all the rules with these onerous new CAO rules.

You do not have a list of Findings which substantiate the changes being proposed. For months the question has been continuously asked -What is the problem? But no answers are forthcoming.

Stand up. Be courageous. You can determine and state a Finding that our existing rules are doing the job. Defend our time tested development rules and regulations. We have protected our environment and there is no proof to the contrary.



## NOTES FROM THE FRONT A FALLEN HERO

Tonight something I will never forget happened. My roommate and I were talking about, I don't know what, but it wasn't important. Then I looked down the street and saw flashing blue lights. I made joke about "Oh look maybe we had indirect fire."

The closer the lights got to us I realized that everyone else that was walking had stopped and was saluting the oncoming traffic. There were no sirens, in fact it seemed like the world stood still. We put up our salute and waited for the three vehicles to pass.

The first and third trucks were just escorting the humvee in the middle. I knew in my heart what I was about to see would stick with me for life.

A silver box laid in the back of the truck and draped over it was the flag of our country. I can't explain what I felt, but I know that many words would never begin to cover it.

I tell you guys this not to worry you, or make you feel sad. I'm telling you this because I would like for you to all say, "Thank you," before you go to sleep tonight. I don't know who the soldier was, but to be honest, it doesn't matter. They were my family. And they gave the ultimate sacrifice for all our freedom. I'm

sure their family is hurting right now, so please pray for them as well. This is the first time I have ever seen this in person and, even though I know it is not realistic to say this, I hope that it is the last.

*Editor's Note: Karen is one of the recipients of our Troops boxes. This is a portion of an email she just sent. It was a reminder to me how separated we are from what our troops are experiencing. The impact of the seriousness of it all is only evident when it strikes close to home as it did for Karen. The sacrifices our troops make on our behalf insulate us so well from the realities of war and we must guard against forgetting about them.*

## REMEMBERING 9-11

Ten years ago on Sept. 11, 2001, four U.S. planes hijacked by terrorists crashed into the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and a field in Pennsylvania killing 3,000 people in less than 2 hours.

Without question, the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, stunned our nation. We Americans acquired a new found sense of our own vulnerability. We were swept away by a surge of patriotism – one that is built on instincts for self-defense, righteousness and the desire to bring to justice those responsible for that heinous attack of 9/11.

It is only appropriate that we honor the memory of those who were martyred 10 years ago, in one of the most heinous attacks in our nation's

history that catapulted our nation into the War on Terror.

Here are a few stories about the bravery of the Americans who thought first of others and their country before themselves.

### OFFICER MOIRA SMITH

Officer Moira Smith was a 13 year veteran of the New York Police Department. She was married to another NYPD officer, Jimmy Smith, and had a two-year-old daughter named Patricia. Officer Smith had shown heroism in the line of duty before, earning the Police Department's Distinguished Duty Medal for her actions dur-

ing the Aug. 27, 1991 subway crash in Union Square in which five were killed and more than 130 hurt. She saved dozens of lives that day, and on September 11, she would selflessly risk her life again to help other victims get out safely.

She was ... oh, God ..." Charles Barbuti, a lieutenant in the 13th Precinct and Smith's friend, paused before continuing. "I would have to describe Moira as active, dedicated, courageous. We had indications that on a number of occasions she had come out of the World Trade Center, carrying people out, then gone back in. She had the

opportunity to leave and she chose not to.”

Smith put her life in danger to rescue people trapped in the World Trade Center, and ultimately, made the ultimate sacrifice that day. She was posthumously awarded the New York City Police Department’s Medal of Honor for her heroism that day. Her remains were recovered in March of 2002, and an East River high-speed ferry was named for her. Of the 23 NYPD officers killed on September 11, she was the only female. She was finally laid to rest on what would have been her 39th birthday.

**TOM BURNETT**

Tom Burnett was the COO and vice president of Thoratec Corporation, a medical devices company. He had a wife, Deena, and three daughters. On September 11, he was on United Airlines Flight 93. After the plane was hijacked, he called his wife and found out about the attacks on the World Trade Center.

Mr. Burnett phoned his wife Deena four times. In the first call he told her about the situation on the plane and asked her to call authorities. The second time he phoned, he told her that he believed their captors were going to fly the plane into the ground. “The next time he called,” Mrs. Burnett said, “I could tell they were formulating a plan.” In the last call, he reportedly said, “I know we’re going to die. There’s three of us who are going to do

something about it.”

Rather than just accept his fate, Burnett decided to act. He, and a small group of other passengers, decided to fight back against the hijackers. While the plan had been to regain control of the plane, they all ultimately perished when the plane crashed in that rural Pennsylvania field. Burnett knew that this was likely to be his fate, and chose to fight back anyway.

While we will never know the exact intended target of Flight 93, it’s generally accepted that the hijackers’ target was either the White House or the US Capitol building. What would have happened if they hadn’t fought the hijackers? What would have happened if they had decided to just accept their fate? If they had gone along with the hijackers, without fighting back? It’s a thought too horrifying to even consider.

It took incredible bravery that day to fight the hijackers, knowing that even if they did, it could cost them their lives.

We owe it to those whose lives were lost that day and to those who showed bravery and compassion in the face of a terrible tragedy to reflect in remembrance.

Let us keep their memory alive - don't just remember the date with your head, but keep the memory of those Americans in your heart. And, when the time comes, please share that story with your children and your grand children so that we never forget.



You might enjoy this from Col D. G. Swinford, USMC, Ret and history buff. You would really have to dig deep to get this kind of ringside seat to history:



1. The first German serviceman killed in WW II was killed by the Japanese (China, 1937), the first American serviceman killed was killed by the Russians (Finland 1940); highest ranking American killed was Lt Gen Lesley McNair, killed by the US Army Air Corps. So much for allies.

2. The youngest US serviceman was 12 year old Calvin Graham, USN. He was wounded and given a Dishonorable Discharge for lying about his age. His benefits were later restored by act of Congress.



3. At the time of Pearl Harbor, the top US Navy command was called CINCUS (pronounced 'sink us'), the shoulder patch of the US Army's 45th Infantry division was the Swastika, and Hitler's private train was named 'Amerika.' All three were soon



changed for PR purposes.

4. More US servicemen died in the Air Corps than the Marine Corps. While completing the required 30 missions, your chance of being killed was 71%.

5. Generally speaking, there was no such thing as an average fighter pilot. You were either an ace or a target. For instance, Japanese Ace Hiroyoshi Nishizawa shot down over 80 planes. He died while a passenger on a cargo plane.
