THE COLE FAMILY
by Robert Barnes

JOHN COLE, the Immigrant, was b. ca. 1669, and d. ----. He m. Joanna, dau. of Dennis and Barbara (----) Garrett. John Cole gave evidence at the trial of Capt. John Oldton, who was accused of murdering Cole's father-in-law, Dennis Garrett.

Cole's age may be established from the fact that in 1707 he gave his age as 38; in 1732 as 63, and in 1734, as 65 (Index to Chancery Depositions, in Md. His Mag. issues of 1928).

In 1706, he had surveyed "Cole's Adventure," which tract had its beginning west of Reisterstown Road, about 1/8 mile above the intersection of Reisterstown Road, and Pinlico Road ~~in~~ Md. His Mag.; Sept., 1921, pp. 218-219).

The date of Cole's death is not known, but his wife is said to have been born in 1675, and d. 1714.

A. ELIZABETH COLE, of John and Johanna, m. John Ensor, age 55 in 1750. John was a son of John and Jane (---) Ensor. The Baltimore County Debt Book of 1750 shows John Ensor the owner of Darby Hall, 300 a.; Daniel's Whimsey, 100 a.; pt Chevy Chase, 200 a.; Manor's Privelege, 80 a.; pt. Mount Pleasant, 75 a.; and Bold Adventure, 80 a. John and Elizabeth (Cole) Ensor had at least one son:

AA. Joseph Ensor, b. 11 April, 1730; m. 7 April, 1757, Mary Bouchelle, and had issue.

B. JOSEPH COLE, of John and Johanna, was b. ----, and d. ca. 1721. *Will*
He m. Susanna ----, who evidently survived him. His will was made 22 Jan., 1720, and filed 13 March, 1721 (Md. Cal. Wills 5:34). In *E* it he names his daughters Sarah and Susanna, to whom he left Daniel's Whimsey; Charles Gorsuch and his wife Sarah Coale; Thomas Coale and his wife Sarah; and the testator's wife Susanna. He left *D* issue, then at least two daughters:

C. JOHN COLE, son of John and Johanna, was b. ----, and d. 1746. He m. Dinah, dau. of Matthew (d. 1705) Hawkins. John's will was made 12 Nov., 1745, and filed 5 Nov., 1746 (Md. Will Book 24:495). *Will?*
To his wife Dinah, he leaves 100 acres "Cole's Chance", to his son Joseph, 200 acres, "Cole's ----?", and he also names sons Charles and Matthew. John and Dinah had issue:

Notes sent by Mrs. Edwards indicate that Abraham Cole was a Revolutionary Pensioner (Application # ~~66666~~ R-2119), that he m. 12 Dec., 1790, one Cecily Gist, and that he was living in Md., in 1845 (?). Mr. K. H. Adams' information is that Abraham Cole's will was made 8 May, 1837, and filed 22 April, 1841 (?).

E. SARAH COLE, of John and Johanna, was b. 1693, and d. 1758. She m. Charles Gorsuch, b. 1686, and d. 1748. According to an article in the Va. Mag. History, (26:330), he was a widower with three children: John (1712/14 - 1796), m. Mary Price; William (1715/18-1797), and Hannah, wife of Thomas Stansbury. However, an article on the Stansbury family in the Md. Historical Magazine says Hannah was a daughter of Charles Gorsuch and Sarah Cole. It is definitely known that Charles and Sarah had issue:

The funeral of William Jefferson Johnston, who died yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock after a lingering illness at his home, "Longview," one mile from Prospect, will take place to-morrow morning from the Brownsboro Baptist church at 10 o'clock. Interment will be in the Brownsboro cemetery.

Mr. Johnston was born in Oldham county, July 12, 1852. At an early age he took up the vocation of a farmer. When the Prospect Bank was organized in 1903 he retired from farming and accepted the presidency. During the summer of 1903, while aiding a neighbor in fighting a fire, he received an injury on his knee from which he never fully recovered. For the past two or three years his health has been rapidly falling and the end was not unexpected.

Besides his wife he is survived by two children, Mrs. E. C. Hoagland and Clay Smith Johnston. The funeral services will be conducted by Dr. Porter, of Lexington, assisted by Dr. Laird, of Springfield. The following will act as active pallbearers: J. W. Mount, L. T. Wilhoite, W. T. English, G. S. Dick, J. M. Letterle and Z. A. Clore.

The honorary pallbearers will be: John C. Pierce, J. T. S. Brown, Jr., L. D. Magruder, B. L. Clore, Robert M. Hawley, H. C. Hudson, R. W. Reynolds and Dr. J. H. Speer.

Octogenarian Dies At LaGrange Hospital

Arthur Johnston, 81 years old, died at three o'clock Wednesday morning at the Mallory-Taylor Memorial Hospital, his being the first death to be recorded in the new institution. Mr. Johnston was brought to the hospital ten days ago after an illness of about a year at his home near Crestwood. His death was caused by a heart affection.

Mr. Johnston is survived by four nieces and five nephews, as follows: Miss Catherine Johnston, Mrs. Leila Hampton, William Hampton, Clay Johnston and E. G. Hampton of Crestwood; Miss Alberta Hampton, Kalamazoo, Mich., Mrs. J. P. Schindler, James Hampton and Mark Hampton of Louisville.

Funeral services were held at 2:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon at the M. A. Stoess & Sons Funeral Home at Crestwood with the Rev. E. J. Dear Wooldridge Descendants:

This morning while I was finishing up typing off some notes on my Wooldridge research, came a letter from Erwin Wooldridge... whose un-used first name I suspect might be Hampton. Am I right?

Now I am glad that I made two carbons and will send the extra carbon to Erwin. Just why I made 2 carbon copies, I did not know at the time, but as so often happens, later we find out. Also you both deserve my apologies for my Hunt and Peck style of typing. This fancy typewriter cannot hide my lack of skill at all. But I do love the typewriter for my handwriting has deteriorated with the passing of years... and you are better off this way, I can assure you. My darling husband (the Wooldridge descendant here at 1950) gave me this typewriter as a thank you gift, a surprise, for our daughter's 30th birthday 9 years ago. He is a very devoted family man.

I have been searching all the various ancestries of all the forebears of our three grandchildren. In almost all lines I have had quite good luck... and like in the Wooldridge line... I have had some very helpful folks to give me information. Only some sort of an idiot would have taken up this job as by the time we get back as far as John Wooldridge who was born Virginia 1794 or so, we have 30 ancestors... with each generation doubling when each ancestor has 2 parents. The only line which I have been unable to get anything definite on is that of Jennie Wooldridge's husband James Turner whom Zella Carman Mitchell has said her mother Molly told her was the town drunk. Certainly he treated Jennie very badly.

On page eight of my notes enclosed with this letter, you will find that my husband is not a son of Zella (who now lives in Honolulu, according to her daughter June Thomas). Elmer is the son of Jennie's daughter Ola Belle Turner and John Wesley Riggle who were married in 1896. They had 3 children: Helen born 1897, Martha (really named Mattie) b. 1901, and Elmer b. 1904. They were divorced in about 1908 and John never remarried. I always felt that he was still in love with Ola Belle (called "Dollie") until his death and secretly inquired about her from me. She was married for 40-plus years to Frank Sprigg Chapman, a member of an old, wealthy and prominent family of Los Angeles for now about 100 years. She told me that Amanda Lynch, Hamp's 2nd wife (and mother of your Bob and our Jennie) was from Virginia but in the 1880 census Amanda says she was born in Tennessee as were her parents also. They probably came out to settle right after the Revolution and her parents were born in the 1790s. So many Virginians did go to Ky. and Tenn. to take up land as a sort of bonus for their war service. Dollie always was sure that Amanda's folks were the Lynches of Lynchburg, Va. It could be but we have no proof as yet.

Thank you both for your help in correcting and adding to my notes. I am so likely to make mistakes. Can you add anything to this?

"Spring Street was so named because it led to a large spring located just across Hogeye Creek on Hampton B. Woodlridge's property. The spring is still there, and in the early days it supplied the village with drinking water which was pumped uphill through pipes with a "Ram" Pressure pump. This pump had to be started by hand, then the water pressure kept it going until it had to be stopped by hand. There was a large watering trough near the spring for livestock. This was a favorite place for the young men to congregate and talk, also, to argue and settle disputes with their fists, rocks, and sometimes knives or guns.

page 25:

"Hamp and Mandy Woodlridge lived on Spring street, across Hogeye Creek. Hamp also had a store over there where he sold hardware, fine harness, and buggies. He also sold whiskey to the Indians, and anyone else who'd buy it. Rumors were that he had a big whiskey still back there in the woods, but I don't know if it was true or not. At that time there was no bridge, but we loved wading across Hogeye Creek to visit Aunt Mandy because we knew she always had cake or cookies to serve company. We were sort of scared of Uncle Hamp, though, for he drank sometimes, too, and we stayed out of his way."

(Complier's note: This was told to Kathryn Clausen by her grandmother in about 1970. The grandmother was a ~~NIECE~~ of Hampton Woodlridge, called Dollie who married a Yates. DHR) Dollie died last year at age 97.)

Because my own maiden name was Hampton and my Hamptons lived in Kentucky in the period 1800-1830 then went on to Illinois, it seemed possible that there was a connection between Hampton Wooldridge and my Hamptons. Buried in Mt. Tabor Church in Oldham County, Kentucky are men named for their mothers' maiden named: Hampton Sparks and Hampton Brown, both of whom had mothers related to my family.

So....I looked through many early Kentucky marriage records to find a Hampton girl who married a Wooldridge boy. Nothing was found. Then I found that in 1830 U.S. Census (H.B. Wooldridge was born 1832) there were Hamptons and Wooldridges living in Hardin and Hopkins Counties. This information is done professionally by computers. When I wrote to the county clerks there for records of a Wooldridge-Hampton marriage before 1832, none was found.

Then when fortune came my way in the form of Kay Clausen of Tulsa, Oklahoma, I found that the father and mother of Hampton B. (for Bourland?) Wooldridge were John Wooldridge and Nancy Bourland. There in my notes taken from a book in the Los Angeles Public Library in June 1972 was a list of Hopkins County Marriages 1807-1869:

It is likely that some of the Wooldridges above were relatives of our Hampton B. Wooldridge. Where the Hampton comes in, it is anybody's guess. It could have been a good friend or the midwife present at the birth, etc.

There was a prominent and prosperous man named Chas. C. Hampton who died Hopkins County 1822. His will names no Wooldridges but does name other familiar names; Enoch, Hunt, etc. who were intermarried with my Hamptons in N.C. However, this Chas. C. is not one of mine as far as I know.

Mrs. Hamners says there were a lot of Bourlands and Hampton and some Wooldridges in early Hopkins County.

Some time after the lodge was formed, a 2-story frame building was built. The upstairs
was used as a meeting place, and the lower room was used as a general store. The lodge
continued to use this building until they purchased the block building constructed by
the late Omer Wooldridge, and used by him for a store building for several years.

It lists John J. Wooldridge as Secretary along with other officers.

The Wooldridges seemed to be connected with the Hebron Cumberland Presbyterian Church in
Maleansboro. It was formed in 1860. Thomas Wooldridge (Brother of Hampton B.?) was an
elder present at the chartering. He was the great grandfather of John J. Wooldridge
who is now (1961? D/R) elder and clerk on the session.

In 1864, the Lick Creek General Baptist Church was organized in Maleansboro. Trustees at
this time were Jones Wheeler and J.B. Wooldridge and H.M. Webb. In 1870, this church met
at Shadelsville Church in White County to join and help form Mt. Olivet Association. In
March 1925 the church and all its records were destroyed. In September 1965, the church
celebrated its 101st anniversary. Lick Creek Church has been in continuous service since
its beginning.

Hello again,

Thanks for your letter and Wooldridge information. Some of it is somewhat confusing, and I've found this in all lineages.

I would say that John Wooldridge came to Hamilton County about 1850, as the patent on the land was dated April 15, 1851. I sent you a copy of that, I believe.

I also have a copy of the land transaction where John and Nancy Wooldridge sold land to John And Sarah Hood. Dated January 31, 1854. Part of this land was given in 1860, and another larger piece in 1866 for the town of Hoodville.

So John must've left there (Hopkins Co., Kentucky) before the 1850 numeration was taken, if he couldn't be found in it.

I think you will have to get more information on Hampton Wooldridge from Benton Co., Arkansas to establish if he was a son, or brother of John. Grandma was pretty sure that Hamp and Sarah Hood were brother and sister.

Anyway in my trips over there I'll keep looking for information on Wooldridge line.

How about this Watergate mess? I don't keep up with all of it, but just snatches. I don't sit and watch it.

Let me hear from you anytime. I am sending copies which were sent for you from Paul Kornmeyer, a genealogist with whom I trade much information about Hamilton Co. He is working on several family lineages of his which are also related to my lineages. I asked him to pass along any Wooldridge information he might find, and bless his heart he did, and will some more I'm sure.

Good luck, and write anytime. I hope to go back to McLeansboro, ILL. this fall before the weather gets cold, but with gasoline rationing, who knows what it will be like. I will probably have to fly to Saint Louis, then take a bus. Pauline has a good car, and lives near the Courthouse where the Hamilton Co., Historical material is stored down in the basement, and it's too hot down there in the summer. They have land, and are trying to get money together to build a suitable museum. Donations are small and building costs keep going up so I guess it will all take time.

Dear Vantha,

During the past months, my genealogy has become dormant, as it often does. While these spells are on, mail which comes gets piled up and remains unanswered. Just this morning, I decided to go over all the letters awaiting attention and there was yours of late April with the Xeroxed pp. from McIntosh. I abjectly apologize for my lack of manners.....
.....I truly do.

So, I went over to the local library and copied the material on Woodbridge family heads in the 1830 census. Along with it to sort of soothe my aching conscience, I am sending some notes I took in the wonderfully rich genealogy rooms in the big downtown Los Angeles Public Library two years ago. At that time I did not know the maiden name of my husband's Hampton Woodbridge's mother. I was searching for a connection between a Hampton bride and a Woodbridge groom. In Hopkins County, Ky., where Hampton Woodbridge's parents were married and lived for a while, there was a very wealthy Hampton (Chas. C.). So maybe they named the baby for him.

In a little cartoon which appears in our evening paper called "Graffiti" it said the other day...."The baby always resembles the wealthiest relative." So maybe that is how Hampton got his name.

We had a wonderful summer. Most of July we went with four other couples from Leisure World to Alaska on the new and very luxurious M/S Royal Viking Star, a Norwegian liner. It is up in the old...and new, too.. gold country. The bar as you probably know refers to a sandbar which made crossing the panning stream easier.

In your letter you also sent to me the name and address of a Bowland searcher who lives but about ten miles from here...a Marian Bonser of Downey, California. Now that my genealogy is awakening again, I shall get in touch with her. Her Bowlands lived in Hopkins County, even. Thank you for all you do for me.

gade, Hood Division, Longstreet's Corps. He was wounded at Malvern by grapeshot, in the week's fighting around Richmond in 1862. He suffered greatly from this wound, but rejoined his comrades in arms as soon as the authorities would permit. Two years later he was wounded again in the fighting on North Anna River in Virginia, and lost a leg as a result of this wound.

Returning to his native home he faced the responsibilities of peaceful pursuits with the same determination and courage that had characterized his career as a soldier. He efficiently served his family and friends and neighbors and his county as Clerk of the Superior and City Courts for twenty years with modesty, honesty, efficiency and self-sacrificing fidelity, until summoned on May 25, 1900, to come up higher and bivouac with the dead "on fame's eternal camping ground." Some 15 years before the summons came, he united with the First Methodist Church of Elberton, and lived a consistent Christian life, and died as he had lived, in the service of Elbert County. The funeral services were conducted at the home by Revs. Sam R. Belk and H. W. Williams, pastors of the First Methodist and First Baptist churches of Elberton, and his body was laid to rest in Elmhurst Cemetery, with such worthy citizens as H. J. Brewer, James McIntosh, P. P. Proffitt, W. D. Tutt, McAlpin Arnold, and Abda Oglesby as active pallbearers.

WOOLRIDGE

William Woolridge, of Elbert County, was the son of John Woolridge of Chesterfield County, Virginia. He is mentioned in his father's will.

John Woolridge took up a land grant in Henrico County, Virginia, in the year 1725. He is the ancestor of the family of Virginia. His brothers were Thomas, Edward and William, who lived in Goochland County, Virginia.

William Woolridge was in Virginia as early as 1622. He served as an officer in several of the Colonial Wars.

The earliest records of the Woolridge family are found in Cheshire, England, where William of that name was living in the reign of Edward the Confessor.

This is an amoral bearing family and the names William, John, Thomas, and Edward have been used by successive generations from the founding to the present date.

William Woolridge, Sr., the father of Gibson Woolridge, came to Surrey County, North Carolina, from Chesterfield County, Virginia, in 1773 as deeds of record in the former county show. He served as a member of the grand jury of Surrey County as shown in Book 1775-1778, Index of Colonial and State Records, Vol. XXX, page 424. William Woolridge was appointed Captain of his district in 1778 and retained this position until his removal to Georgia. This William married Sarah Flournoy, a Huguenot, who came to Virginia in 1700.

Edmund Woolridge, a brother of William, Sr., married Mary Flournoy, also a daughter of Francis.

The children of William Woolridge, Sr., were: Richard, William, Gibson, Thomas, Edward, Sarah, and Martha.

William Woolridge, Sr., was accompanied to Elbert County by his son, Gibson, and a son-in-law by the name of Hudspeth. They arrived in Georgia in the winter of 1783, as deed records in Book C-P 103 in office of Clerk of the Superior Court of Elbert County shows.

Gibson Woolridge served as Justice of the Peace in Surrey County, North Carolina, during 1782 and in the same capacity in Wilkes County, Georgia, in 1786 and 1794. He was a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of Georgia, held in 1798 from Lincoln County.

Gibson Woolridge married in 1775 Lucy Elizabeth Hudspeth, the daughter of Ralph Hudspeth.

The children of Major Gibson Woolridge were:

John Woolridge, Lieutenant-Colonel, Lincoln County, Georgia, Militia, 1797. He was born 1776 and died in Abbeville County, South Carolina, in 1817. He was the father of one son, William, and six daughters.

Thomas Woolridge, born 1778. In 1827 was in Pickens County, Alabama. Died in Texas.

The wife in the above family, Amanda Lynch Wooldridge, was supposedly born in her "ancestral home" in the town "founded by her ancestors" Lynchburg, Virginia. Here tradition seems to be in error, for Amanda herself says she was born in Tennessee as were her parents. We have no names for those parents. Family tradition has it that Amanda was born on 11 February 1837, which would make her age 43 as of a few months before June 1880. b ca 1705 d 1780 Chesyerfield.

had seven sons including:-

John³ Rich³ Thos³ Robt³ Edmund³ Sam (?)³ all mentioned in his will & dau Phoebe, among others - He also mentions five grandchildren Seth⁴ Thos⁴ John⁴ Phoebe W⁴ but does not mention their father, possibly deceased - I think this Thos³, grandson is one of the Thos we find in Buckingham 1790-1815 & likely the father of John⁵ who is your man who also had a dau. Phoebe I have never found the name Phoebe in any other branch of the family except in John²'s descendants - It came from from his firsts wifes family who had a sister Phoebe Branch. Of course this is not proof for your John but it is definitely a lead to me.

Do you know when John Wooldridge of Hamilton County Ill did die - You gave me 1894 maybe you meant 1874 but many of the Wooldridges did live to be about 100 or more - a family trait.

I can place the Thos Wooldridge in Henry Co -right off - he is Rev. Thos³ son of John² - Will 1780 but I cant place the Thomas in Judge Co- in 1830. Do you have the census record on him. If so let me know what you have & do you have a list of all Wooldridges in Ky in 1830, if so it would help me muchly-

I have them in Tenn, Ala., N.C., Miss, Ga. but I hadnt gotten them in Ky & Va- but need them.

Know your husband's heart attack did slow down your ancestor hunting - Age is slowing me down too but I do enjoy it. Hope he is much better now. Glad you have had good luck on your NC Harris line - I have a Harris line in early Chas City Co Va. in the 1600s-

COMES TO CENTENARIAN.

Dr. J. G. Speer, Born Same Day as Abraham Lincoln, Dies in Anderson County.

WAS FRIEND OF EMANCIPATOR.

The Times Special Service. 1909
Lawrenceburg, Ky., May 3.—The body of Dr. J. G. Speer, who died at his home at Alton, this county, late Saturday afternoon after rounding out a century of life, was interred to-day at ~~the~~ **WARRORS CREEK** cemetery, in Oldham county.

The centenarian's end came peacefully in the presence of his immediate family. He had been ill only a few days and death was due to an attack of grippe and pneumonia. He was conscious to the end and in full possession of his mental faculties.

Dr. Speer was a gentleman of the old school and was born in Burke county, North Carolina, February 12, 1809, the same day that Abraham Lincoln first saw the light of day, and when they grew into manhood became inseparable companions. When he was two years of age his father moved to Oldham county, Ky., where he spent his early life and received his education. In 1830, he graduated from the medical department of the old Transylvania University, at Lexington. The following year he moved to Illinois where he began his professional career at Decatur. Dr. Speer was elected probate judge of the county and took a prominent part in the political life of the State.

It was at Decatur that he became intimately associated with Lincoln and they occupied offices in the same building. After office hours they could be seen together every day. While Dr. Speer was an intense Southerner he was a great admirer of "Old Abe" and was always singing his praises. During the latter days of his life when a century of years was hanging heavy upon his head one of his greatest pleasures and comforts was talking over the days when he and Lincoln were chums and speaking in glowing terms of his sterling worth.

Six children survive him, four sons and two daughters: Dr. J. W. Speer, of Alton; Dr. ~~W. C. A.~~ **W. C. A.** Speer and Dr. J. H. Speer, of Oldham county; Marcus Speer, Mrs. Susan Conyers and Mrs. Ann Tanner, of Owensboro.
