

CAMBRIDGE GRAVES

The necessity for making the first complete list of persons buried in the Old Burying Ground, in Cambridge, became apparent when many new graves were discovered in the work of restoration which is now in progress. Miss Elizabeth Farnum of Christ Church, Cambridge, compiled the following list of 822 names, which will be published in installments. Much valuable assistance was given by Mrs. Mary I. deGozzaldi, of Cambridge,

and by Charles C. Pinkney of the Harvard School of Landscape Architecture.

Nearly all the persons recorded have marked graves. In each case the grave numbers correspond with a map revised in June 1934, which was originally made by the city of Cambridge in 1925. Where only one grave number is given, either the headstone or the footstone is missing. When both stones are still standing, if space permits, both numbers are drawn in the grave space on the map. Where it does not, the footstone number is just outside.

The revised blueprint has been placed in the porch of Christ Church, Cambridge, so that those who have ancestors buried there, and all visitors to this historic site, may find the position of each grave.

Labor for the restoration has been given free by the Cambridge E.R.A., but money for materials must be raised by a committee which was formed for this purpose. Contributions are welcome and may be sent to the Old Burying Ground Committee, 1 Garden street, Cambridge. The committee wishes to preserve as nearly as possible the original appearance of this ancient cemetery.
