



## Former university head dies

WOLFVILLE - A former president of Acadia University and one of Canada's most prolific writers, Dr. Watson Kirkconnell, 81, of Wolfville, died Saturday in Eastern Kings Memorial Hospital, Wolfville.

He was educated at Queen's University where he received a Master of Arts degree, honors. in Classics and went on to do graduate studies in economics at Oxford University. 28 477

For 18 years, he taught first English and then Classics. From 1940 to 1948 he was head of the English department at McMaster University and in 1948 was appointed president of Acadia University, a position he held until his retirement in 1964.

Dr. Kirkconnell was the author of 40 books, 130 brochures and joint works and about 600

In 1940 he was invited to Ottawa to help organize the citizenship branch of the department of national war services for the director of public information. He summarized the culture backgrounds of all Canadian groups in a 48-page volume, Canadians All, of which 396,000 copies were distributed to Canadian schools.

In 1942 he became the first and only chairman of the Writers War Committee for Canada. He was one of the organizers and the first chairman of the Humanities Research Council of Canada. He was a charter member of the Canadian Authors' Association, its national secretary from 1925-1929 and served as its national president from 1942-1944.

On his 80th birthday, Acadia University honored the occasion with testimonials at the alumni dinner when Chancellor C. B. Huggins presented him with the first copy of The Undoing of Babel, a volume of essays written in tribute to Dr. Kirkconnell by colleagues. At the same time,
