Dear Mr. Lantz:

I was delighted to receive your letter of August 21st/89 regarding your geneological connection with our family line. It would seem from some information I have that we do have a connecting link. I do not have a complete lineage sheet completed and am still seeking additional information to make the connections. You may be able to help. There is no published manuscript on the Schweinkammers that I know of.

Since you identified the beginning lineage I'll follow with the sketchy information I have and perhaps we can continue to share our findings.

(a) Phillip (Philibus) Schweinkammer, Farmer & Craftsman from Palatinate Germany, aged 24, arrived Halifax N.S. 1752 on the ship "Gale" from Rotterdam. (He was accompanied by Margaret Lantz, daughter of his former employer - Jonathan Lantz - they were married in Lunenburg 1755.

Phillip & Margaret had three children - ① little girl Mary killed on ice in harbor,

your line branched off at Henry.

However, as you can see above, I was blessed with
a real twister - my grandmother Agnes - was a Swinamer
by birth (daughter of James - "Big Jim") prior to her marriage to
Erbin Swinamer

I have not been able as yet to sort out from which of Jacob's children she sprouted. I believe it must have been Johanna as he is the only son of Jacob with a son "Jim". If that is the case it looks as though

Lucile (Lucy) daughter of Henry was a cousin of Jim.

Perhaps geography can play a part in sorting out the lines

my Grandfather Erbin was from Mahone Bay while my Grandmother Agnes was from Vaughans Settlement near Windsor in Hants County. It was from this Vaughans Settlement stock that the Swinners of Hants Co. originated

I probably haven't been of much help but I do find it interesting to dig back into our family past. If you do have any further information I could use, such as dates and particular marriages I would appreciate it. Perhaps we could collaborate on putting a genealogical list together.

Dear Edward Swinhammers,

It sure was a pleasant surprise to receive your answer to my query on our Swinhammers family line. I am sorry for taking so much time in answering your fine letter. We had just left for a Florida visit the last of September and just recently returned, I am having quite a bit of mail to catch up on now.

I had been to the Public Archive of Nova Scotia a few years ago and also get films through an inter-library loan and also rent films at our local Mormon Church library. I have been able to get a lot of names and dates on the various Swinhammers to connect many of them but still have some unknowns. In time I think we can get most if not all of them.

I don't know where to start in going through some sheets that I have enclosed but maybe it is best to start with the earliest. You mentioned that Margaret Penty was "daughters of his former employer - Jonathan Penty." I did not have that information. Is it in a document somewhere? As you, I have the information that

Philip and Margaret (Penty) Sveinhammer had children that were killed on the ice and fell off a wharf and drowned. But I also found a marriage for Maria Magdalena Sveinhammer in 1780, to John Andrews so I have included them both. Maybe there are two separate daughters of Philip. (1, 2)

My next sheets are of John Jacob Sveinhammer. As we know, he was married twice. This is where our ancestors separate, yours being the son John Philip, and mine being John Henry Sveinhammer.

The third generation sheet is of John Philip Sveinhammer / Justina to Hannah Rafure. There is a Rafure genealogy around somewhere but I have never seen it. It is called "450 years of Rafure ..." or something like that.

The fourth generation sheet is of Henry Sveinhammer / Hannah Zwicker. The Zwicker name is certainly common in Nova Scotia. Their son Erbin⁵ is what you gave me as your line so I have included a sheet on his marriage and children as far as I know it.

There is still many, many, unknown statistical information on these sheets as you can see. If you have any more information could you fill them in and return them to me. Do you have any other Sveinhammer lines information? It would be

particularly, interested in any more information on Erben Swinhammers children and grand-children.

It would be good to compile our information together and come up with something more comprehensive for a Swinhammer genealogy. I am sure you must have more "feel" for the Swinhammer lines as you are in a direct line to the ancestry.

I had better close for now and get these long overdue letters to you. Hope to hear from you soon

Dear Mr. Lantz:

Indeed a pleasant surprise to receive your letter of Nov 15 and the accompanying geneology tree sheets. So you folks spend some time in Florida also. We go down each year for three months Jan/Feb/March. We'll be leaving again this year about Jan 3rd and should be back home by the end of the first week in April. We go to St. Petersburg.

You are fortunate that you have access to the Moorman Church Library files. I understand that they are pretty complete.

Regarding Margaret Lentz - daughter of Johnathan Lentz Germany - I read this information from some loose scattered sheets in a drawer on Lunenburg Co N.S. at the Halifax Archives about 4 years ago. These were hand written notes by an Anglican Church Minister, but I don't have his name. He had related the historical background (as I recall) as follows.

Philip Schwemmer having received a "call to arms - conscription" and he did not accept the fact that Citizens should be slaughtering one another because of religious persecution, so he decided to leave. He went to the Lentz home to tell Margaret of his plans.

Upon learning of Philip's plan to leave Germany she decided to go with him. She swore her younger sister to secrecy for time to get away. Margaret & Philip proceeded to Rotterdam and sailed from there on the ship "Isle".

These sheets may now be micro-filmed and on reels at the Lunenburg N.S. genealogy society office. The Secretary - Jim Corrick had told me some three years ago that they were working on getting this done.

With your sheets you have much more information than I had, particularly the Birth/Death/Christening marriage dates and spouses.

I do have ^{some} additional info on the Swinhammer line which you may find interesting: Re Erbin (Agnes) & Edward

✓ Erbin (my grandfather) - Agnes Swinhammer

34FC6/34AXD Agnes - the daughter of James Henry actually lived in Vaughan's Settlement prior to her marriage to Erbin. I believe that her mother Eliza was a Bauchman from the vicinity of Chester but I don't have any clear connection.

On your sheet #34Fc also: note Edward. (son of Henry) Edward (being my great uncle also became my step grandfather. ✓ Yes - Laura May (Baker) Wentzel ✓ was my grandmother (maternal) married 1st to ✓ Artemus Wentzel of Malone Bay. (Laura's father was ✓ George ("Red") Baker of Cross Island.

I am sorry for taking so much time in answering your very nice letter. I got off on researching another branch of my family. Probably about now you are getting ready to get back to New Brunswick. Do you know Mary Morgan Enemo of 98 Hedgewood Dr., Munton? She is a correspondent of mine in the Lanty lines. She also goes to Florida.

Thank you for the additional information on Margaret Penty - daughter of Johnathan Penty and also the information of your line, Erbin Swinehammer, George Lawrence Swinimer, and down to you. Yes, it would be good to complete the information on the other off-spring of Erbins and their children. I don't have too much information but would share what I have with you.

As for the ancestry of Agnes Swinehammer, wife of Erbin Swinehammer (your line), I am enclosing two generations of family sheets showing all the information I have. Of course, you already knew her father was James Henry Swinehammer. He was supposed to have died in 1870. Now comes the mystery! His wife Eliza (Bauchman?) may have married (2) James Fanning (or Tanning). See enclosed sheet. Does this name come up in your researches. I have never come across their marriage in either Lun. or Hants Co. records.

as a Swinehammer (var.). Maybe she used her maiden name when she m. (2). Vaughan Hants Co. is real close to Waterville. Is it possible that Agnes Swinehammer grew up with her step-father, James Fanning (or Tanning). Also, I have not come up yet with a marriage record of James Henry Swinehammes to Eliza. Perhaps looking in a Bachman record will reveal it.

As for John Swinehammer / Mary Catherine Keizer I have not been able to establish her parentage. She is not in the Chester vital records nor in the Mormon Churches I & I for Nova Scotia. There again a Keizer record may reveal her parentage.

That is about all I have for now. Please write and let me know what you feel about the above and also if you need any more information let me know. Hope to hear from you soon.
