Acknowledged in Boston:

Symonds "Did make Delivery by Turff and Twig."

William Symonds 2, Samuel 1, was born in England. He has the title of Gentleman, Jan. 4, 1655, under which date he conveys a lot of land to William Story, carpenter.

He and Elisabeth his wife, Nov. 19, 1656, convey to Jno: Woodam a house and about an acre of land in the street called Brook street.

June 29, 1657, hs styles himself of Preston, alias Wells, gentleman, when he sells to Thomas Wells of Ipswich, a farm of 200 acres, and other lands.

He was admitted freeman in 1670, and was the Representative of Wells in 1676. He had the rights of Commonage, 1678. He died May 22, 1679.

He married Mary, daughter of Jonathan Wade, Esq., and had:

Susanna, born Jan 3, 1668, m. Jos. Jacob Dec. 18, 1690 Dorothy, b. Oct. 4, 1670, m Cyprian Whipple Dec. 19, 1695 Mary, b. Jan. 6, 1673, m. Joseph Whipple, Dec. 10, 1697 Elizabeth, born July 20, 1678

The two last were minors in 1694, and under the guardianship of their uncle, Col. Thomas Wade.

There was an agreement entered into by the heirs of Mr. Symonds (1) for the division of the Argilla farm, dated April 10, 1694. They divided it into two equal parts, one of which was assigned to the children of William 2: Susanna. Dorothy, Mary, Elizabeth. The other half to:—John and Ruth Emerson of Gloucester; Thomas and Priscilla Baker of Topsfield; Daniel Eppes of Salem, Symonds Eppes of Ipswich, sons of Daniel and Elisabeth Eppes both deceased.

MARK SYMONDS. Took the freeman's oath at Boston, May 2, 1638; was commoner of Ipswich, 1641.

He died April 28, 1659, aged 75 years. At the time of his decease he possessed a house and twelve acres of land lying in ye common fields on ye north side ye river, and a planting lot at Reedy Marsh. Inventory, dated May 16, 1659, £257, 6, 9.

Joanna Symonds, died April 29, 1666. Her will was dated April 6, proved May 9. She left two daughters:

John Symonds made a will August 16, 1671. Wife Elisabeth. Their children:

His property, consisting of house, orchard, land, was valued at £230, 14. Personal £100. He is styled John Symonds carpenter.

William Symonds, [also spelled Simmons,] was an inhabitant in 1635.

December 28, 1647. William Symonds, laborer, sells to Simon Bradstreet a planting lot containing seven acres, being on the hill in Ipswich, on the north side of the river. He lived at the upper end of High street, near the Burying Ground, and was for many years herdsman of the town. Several contracts made with him as herdsman are

The names Symonds, Symons, Simmons, Symmes and Sims are of English origin. Several of these names were in Ipswich, Mass. in the early days of the Mass. Bay Colony, including Samuel Symonds, who became Deputy Governor.

XI-1170 MARK SYMONDS, born about 1584 in England was a planter in Ipswich in 1634. He was made a freeman 2 May 1638 and died 28 April 1659. His wife died 29 April 1660. Mark Symonds was constable in 1639 and held other town offices He was a paternal ancestor of Johnny Appleseed (John Chapman), his daughter Mary having married Edward C. Chapman, third great grandfather of John Chapman. An item of interest is that Johnny Appleseed's maternal line began with William Simonds of Woburn whose son James, married Susanna Blodgett (daughter of Samuel). Thus both of these are ancestral lines of the author.

Marke Symonds appeared first in Ipswich about the year 1634, he was freeman the 2 May 1638, and Commoner of the town in 1641.

Robert Andrews, George Giddings, Mark Symonds and Thomas Treadwell are chosen surveyors for this year.

(Essex Ct. Files) Court Held at Salem 2 Feb. 1641. Mark Symonds on the Jury. He was also on the Jury of Trials 4 Nov. 1645, and the 30 Mar. 1647.

Marke Symonds was appointed admr. of the Estate of George Abott, late of Rowley in 1647.

Marke Symonds was on the Grand Jury the 24 Sept. 1650.

His house and twelve acres of land lay on ye common fields on ye north side ye river, and a planting lot at Reedy Marsh.

(Ipswich Deed II:10) Thomas Harrison of the parish of Dunstans in the east, in London & Dorithy my wife have with one assent ... constituted ... our very loving bretheren Samuel Symonds and William Symonds of Ipswich ... in the parts beyond the seas ... our true & lawful ... attorneys joyntly ... sixteenth day of February Anno Dom 1653.

(Ipswich Deed IV: 340) . . . Marke Symonds of Ipswich . . . for . . . fifty pounds . . . Have Granted . . . unto John Pickard of Rowley . . . his peell of ground . . . lyeing on the North Syd of the North River . . . at the end of his farme formarly sold to John Crose containing seaven acres . . . with about halfe an acre bought

of Robert Lord . . . having the land of Twyford West toward the Southwest . . . 16 of September 1658 . . . Rec. June 9, 1680.

(Essex: File No. 27116) The last will & testam<sup>t</sup> of Marke Symons . . . I doe appoynt my beloved wieffe Johannah Symons to be sole executrix . . . I bequethe to my Daughter Susannah Ayres a fether bed & boulster w<sup>ch</sup> was her mothers wth y<sup>c</sup> worst rugg. I bequeathe to Abigaill Pierce a fether bed . . . I bequeathe to John Warner junior one ewe lamb . . . after ye decease of my said wieffe my estate to be equally devided amongst our three daughters & y<sup>c</sup> children of my daughter Mary Chapman deceased . . . Also I apoynt my lo<sup>g</sup> bretheren Moses Pengrie & Edward Browne to be overseers of this my last will & testament. Dated 25 (2) 1659. Signed in ye prsence of George Smith, Aaron Pengry. Proved in Court held at Ipswich 28 Aprill 1659.

Inventory taken 16 May 1659 by Robert Lord and Robert Day. Mentions "his dwelling house & barne with the ground about it. 18 acres of Land, 2 acres of meddow at Mr wintrips farme & 1 acre of salt marsh."

Amount of estate £257.6.9.
