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## FIRST GENERATION

1. **JOHANN FRIEDRICH<sup>1</sup> HEISON/HEYSON** was born about December 1708 or January 1709 at Wenings, Grafschaft Isenberg-Birsteinichen [Germany] and died at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 11 June 1792 (Dutch Reformed Church, Lunenburg, parish records, hereafter D.R.L.). Johann Friedrich Heison married at Hering, District of Ushberg, Kingdom of the Palatinate [Germany] 17 February 1733 **ANNA CATHERINE JUNCKERIN**, daughter of Caspar Junckers, who was probably born at Hering, District of Ushberg, Kingdom of the Palatinate and died at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia before 1782.

Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison was the son of Johannes Heison who was from Wenings, Isenberg-Birsteinichen. The parish records of the Evangelische Pfarramt Hering [the Lutheran parish office at Hering] state that Johannes Heison was a 'Tuchmacher' [cloth-maker] and was a 'Bürger' [citizen] of of Wenings. Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison, who resided at Hering, is listed in the parish records as a 'Strumpweber' [stocking weaver]. The origins of Caspar Junckers are unknown according to the death records of the Parish of Hering, but it is known from those records that he was attached to the garrison at the fortress of Ditzberg as a 'Büchsenmeister oder Geschützmeister' ['Constabler' or musketeer/ artilleryman]. He died at Hering 16 November 1731, age 52 years.

Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison, his wife and four of his seven children left Hering in 1751 and came to Halifax, Nova Scotia as part of the British sponsored programme to settle the province with Protestants. They came across the Atlantic on the ship Murdoch. On the passenger list of the Murdoch, he is listed as a farmer from the Palatinate. The Murdoch fell down the Rhine from Rotterdam, the Netherlands, the point of embarkation, to Hellevoetluis on 22 June 1751 {New Style, N.S.}, left Hellevoetluis on 25 June 1751 {N.S.}, arrived at Halifax, Nova Scotia in September 1751. It appears that the passengers disembarked at Halifax on 19/30 September 1751 {Old Style, O.S./N.S.} (Bell, Winthrop. The 'Foreign Protestants' and the Settlement of Nova Scotia, p. 199, hereafter Bell, 'Foreign Protestants'). Like the majority of the foreign Protestant settlers, Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison was indebted to the Crown for his passage to Nova Scotia. His debt was for three freights, two adults and two children [not including infants which were free], at fl. 212.12.8 plus a cash loan of fl. 12.0.0. (Bell's Register, P.A.N.S., MG 1, vol. 109-111, hereafter Bell's Register). One freight was fl. 75.12.0 or £6.17.6 at the contemporary rate of exchange (Bell, 'Foreign Protestants,' p. 261.). The passengers from the Murdoch were settled at the blockhouse on the Halifax isthmus where they were employed building a stockade across the isthmus to pay their debt. They remained at isthmus until they were removed to Lunenburg, Nova Scotia in the spring of 1753 (Bell, 'Foreign Protestants,' p. 356). Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison appears on list of residents of Halifax in July 1752. He is listed as labourer at the blockhouse and the isthmus. The Heison family consisted of two males above age 16, one female above age 16, and two females under age 16. He and the family appear on victualling list N<sup>o</sup> 4 for

August to October 1752 as Frederick,<sup>1</sup> Anna Catherina 1<sup>st</sup>, John Philip,<sup>2</sup> Anna Catherina 2<sup>nd</sup>, and Anna Elizabeth Heison. Frederick,<sup>1</sup> Anna Catherina and John Philip<sup>2</sup> Heison appear on the Compassionate Victualling List of February to April 1753. The list included provisions for the children although they were not listed (Bell's Register).

The Heysons were among the settlers who were sent out from Halifax to found the township of Lunenburg in June 1753. Frederick<sup>1</sup> Heison appears on the Return of Arms of Lunenburg in December 1753. He is listed as residing in Strasburger's Division which were the blocks between Prince and Hopson Streets. In the July 1754 return of divisions, he is listed as residing at Strasburger's Division, lot C-11 (Bell's Register). Lot C-11 was on Cumberland Street and was 40 feet wide along the street and 60 feet in depth (Bell, 'Foreign Protestants,' p. 431). Presumably Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison received a garden lot when they were given to the settlers in August or September 1753; however, there is no mention of it in the existing records. The garden lots were located just east of the town lots and east common.

Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heyson received his first 30 acre lot in the land lottery of 1753-54. His 30 acre lot was located at Mahone Bay range C, lot 10. The Heison family was among the first settlers of Mahone Bay. Livestock was distributed to the settlers in the fall of 1754. Fried<sup>ch</sup> Heison was paired with Conrad Knöchell [Knickel] and received 1 cow and 1 sheep. In June 1755 Friedrich,<sup>1</sup> Anna Catherina, John Philip,<sup>2</sup> Anna Feronica, and Anna Elizabeth Heison appear on the victualling list, numbers 535-39. Fred<sup>k</sup>,<sup>1</sup> Cath<sup>a</sup>, Feronica, Phillip,<sup>2</sup> and Eliz<sup>a</sup> Heyson appear on the victualling list for February to May 1756, numbers 592-96. Friedrich Heison participated in the cattle expedition to Grand Pré. Frederick,<sup>1</sup> Catherina, Feronica and Philip<sup>2</sup> Heison appear on the victualling list for January to May 1757 (Bell's Register). The Heysons remained the victualling list for an extended period of time because of Indian harassment during the Seven Years War prevented them and other settlers from farming their 30 acre lots. After 1757 the Heysons and other settlers were able to return to their lands because the Indian harassment ceased.

The registry of 30 acre lots in 1760 shows that Fred<sup>k</sup> <sup>1</sup> Hyson owned a lot at Mahone Bay, C-10. In 1763 several tracts of 300 acre lots were surveyed and distributed by lottery. Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison participated in the second land lottery on 7 November 1763. He received a 300 acre lot in the Third Division, lot G-2. The settlers did not have 'de jure' ownership of their land until the township grant was finally given on 30 June 1784. The township grant confirmed the ownership of the land that was given through the various lotteries. Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison does not appear on the township grant.

Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heison appears on the 1767 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, p. 5). The household consisted of two people: 1 man and 1 woman. He owned 1 Ox/Bull, 1 Cow, 1 Young Neat Cattle and 1 Swine. His farm produced 10 bushels of rye, 1 bushel of Pease, 10 bushels of barley and 5 bushels of oats.


Two property deeds exist for two fifteen acre lots at Mahone Bay Letter C, no. 10. They are as follows:

- I. Friedrich Heison to William Corkum 1766

Lunenburg, Nova Scotia ss

Know all Men by these presents that I Friedrich Heison of Lunenburg in the County of Lunenburg in the Province of Nova Scotia Farmer for and in Consideration of the Sum of Five Pounds Current Mony of the Province aforesaid to me in hand paid by Willhelm Corkum of the Town County and Province aforesaid Farmer the Receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge, Have Given Granted, Bargained, Alienated, Sold and by these presents doth Grant, bargain and sell unto the said Willhelm Corkum his Heirs and Assigns for Ever One half Lott of Land Known and recorded by Letter C number Ten containing Fifteen Acres more or less ajoined at No. nine situated and lying in Mahone Bay with all the Houses, Improvements, Woods, Commons, Waters, Benefits, and Advantages whatsoever on the premisses mentioned belonging or any ways appertaining to them. To Have and to Hold the said Lott of Land Houses and Improvements and all and singular the said premisses above mentioned and every part and parcels thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Willhelm Corkum his Heirs and Assigns to the only proper use and Behoof of the said Willhelm Corkum his heirs and Assigns for Ever; And I the said Friedrich Heison for myself and my Heirs the said Lott of Land and premisses, and every part thereof against me and My Heirs and against all and every other person and persons whatsoever to the to the said Willhelm Corkum his Heirs and Assigns shall and will warrant and for Ever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty Seventh Day of October, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand, Sevenhundred and Sixty Six and in the Sixth Year of His Majestys Reign.

To Have and to Hold the said Demised Half Thirty Acre Lott or Fifteen Acres of Land unto him the said Philip Heyson, his Heirs and Assigns for Ever, And I the said Friedrich Heyson for myself my Heirs Executors and Administrators Do hereby Covenant Promise and agree that I and they shall and will for Ever Warrant Maintain and Defend the Clear and undoubted Title of the Demised Half 30. Acre Lot or Fifteen Acres of Land and appurtenances as before described unto him the said Philip Heyson his Heirs and Assigns against myself my Heirs Executors and Administrators and all Person or Persons Claiming or pretending to Claim any Right Title Interest or demand on or to thesame free and Clear of Dower or former or futur Deeds or any other Incumberances whatsoever.

The following document is the will of Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup> Heyson (Public Archives of Nova Scotia: Lunenburg Will Books, Vol. 1, pp. 114-116):

In the Name of God, Amen.

I Frederich Heison Senior of the Township and County of Lunenburg in the Province of Nova Scotia, Yeoman, being in perfect Health and understanding, praised be God Do make this my Last Will and Testament, as followeth. [Imprimis] I give and bequeath to my Son in Law Henry Koch the Sum of Fifty Five pounds Current Money of this Province and One Cow. I give also unto my Son in Law Henry Koch His Heirs and assigns forever, The One

half of my Three Hundred Acre Lott situate in the Third Division Letter G, Number Two, in the Township of Lunenburg aforesaid.

Item I give to my Grandson Frederick Heison His Heirs and Assigns forever, the other half of my Three Hundred Acre Lott. And unto my son Philip Heison I give the Rest and Residue of my Goods and Chattels after payment of my Lega[-ies] and funeral expenses as He Has by Deed of gift from me, my half thirty Acre Farm Lott of Land in Mahone Bay. And do Constitute my Son in Law Henrich Koch Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto Sett my Hand and seal this Eleventh Day of April in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Sevenhundred and Eighty Nine.

- i. **ANNA MARIA CATHERINE**,<sup>2</sup> b. at Hering, Ushberg, Palatinate 1 March 1735 (Hering, parish records, hereafter Hering); d. probably at Centre, N.S.; m. at Halifax, N.S. 1 December 1752 (Bell's Register) **JOHANN ADAM LINCK/LING**, b. at Hesse about 1732.

Johann Adam Linck was a mason by trade. He came to Halifax in 1752 on the Sally. According to the return of divisions of Lunenburg in July 1754, he resided at Rudolf's Division, lot F-6. The return of the division stated that he had a house and garden. He was also listed as a soldier. In 1760 he received a 30 acre lot at Centre, lot A-7 (Bell's Register).

Children, surname **LINCK**: 1. Johann Philip, at Lunenburg, N.S.

2. ii. **JOHANN PHILIP**, b. at Hering, Ushberg, Palatinate 20 October 1737 (Hering).
- iii. **JOHANN?**, b. at Hering, Ushberg, Palatinate 21 July 1740 (Hering). The Hering parish records state that he was adopted; however, the minister was not sure because the old script German was difficult for him to read. It appears that he remained in Germany.
- iv. **ELIZABETH VERONICA (EUPHRONIA)**, b. at Hering, Ushberg, Palatinate 29 July 1743 (Hering); d. probably at South Range B, Lunenburg, N.S.; m. at Lunenburg, N.S. 2 January 1759 (St. John's Anglican, Lunenburg, parish records, hereafter S.J.A.L.) **HEINRICH KOCH**, son of Anton and Gertrude (Hulbusch) Koch, b. at Weldenbach, H6chstenbach, Grafschaft Sayn 1734, d. probably at South Range B, Lunenburg, N.S. 1813.

According to the Return of Town Lots in 1760, Heinrich Koch owned lots B-12, 13 and 14 and G-11, 12, 13 and 14 in Moreau's Division. In 1760 the registry of 30 acre lots shows that he owned lot lots of land at South B-15 and 19. In the 300 acre land lottery of 7 November 1763, he received lot E-6 in the First Division (Bell's Register).

- v. **ANNA ELIZABETH**, b. at Hering, Ushberg, Palatinate 21 June 1746 (Hering); d. probably at Mahone Bay, N.S.; m. as his second wife at Lunenburg, N.S. 25 November 1766 (S.J.A.L.) **WILHELM (WILLIAM) CORKUM**, b. at Westhofen, Palatinate about 1716, d. at probably at Mahone Bay, N.S. 10 April 1783.

William Corkum was a farmer from the Palatinate who came to Nova Scotia in 1752 on the Pearl. According to the Return of Arms of December 1753, he owned lot F-7 with a house in Zouberbuhler's Division. In the livestock distribution of 1754, he was paired with Wilhelm and Johann

Müller and received 6 sheep, 1 sow and 1 goat. In 1756 he participated in the livestock expedition to Minas Basin, and in 1758 served as a private in the Indian patrol. The registry of town lots in 1760 states that he owned lot F-7 in Zouberbuhler's Division, and the registry of 30 acre lots states that he owned South E-1. On 3 October he drew lot E-3 First Division in the 300 acre land lottery.

## SECOND GENERATION

2. **JOHANN PHILIP<sup>2</sup> HEYSON** (Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup>) was born at Hering, District of Ushberg, Kingdom of the Palatinate 20 October 1737 (Hering) and died at either Oakland or Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 1 January 1813 (D.R.L.). He married at Lunenburg, Nova Scotia 6 March 1759 (S.J.A.L.) **MARIA MAGDALENA ZWICKER**, daughter of Peter and Maria Magdalena Zwicker, who was born at Zeiskam, Kingdom of the Palatinate about 4 June 1740 and died at either Oakland or Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 26 March 1828 [age 88 years, 9 months, 22 days] (D.R.L.).

Johann Philip<sup>2</sup> Heyson came to Nova Scotia on the Murdoch in 1751 with his parents. His wife Maria Magdalena Zwicker came to Nova Scotia on the Gale in 1752 with her parents. Philip<sup>2</sup> Heyson independently appears in the records beginning in 1760 with the registry of 30 acre lots. He appears with Peter Zwicker [jr.]; they are listed as each owning a 30 acre lot between the land of Benj<sup>n</sup> Green and that of Henry Becker who owned Oakland Nos 12 and 13 which were the last two lots in the first Oakland range. On 3 December 1764 Philip<sup>2</sup> Heyson participated in the third 300 acre land lottery and received a lot at Fourth Division, F-5 (Bell's Register). His land holdings were scattered throughout the villages of Mahone Bay, Clearland, Oakland and Indian Point. The Lunenburg township grant of 30 June 1784 confirmed his ownership to 675 acres (DesBrisay, Mather Byles. History of the County of Lunenburg, p. 71, hereafter DesBrisay).

Philip<sup>2</sup> Heyson appeared in the 1770 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, p. 5). His household consisted of six people: 1 man, 1 woman, 3 boys and 1 girl. He owned 2 Oxen/Bulls, 2 Cows, 2 Young Neat Cattle and 2 Swine. His farm produced 10 bushels of rye, 4 bushels of Pease, 12 bushels of barley and 4 bushels of oats.


1. Nova Scotia ss.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting; Know Ye I Lord William Campbell Captain General and Governor in Chief in and Over His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia or Acadie and its dependencies Vice Admiral of the same Et<sup>ca</sup> Et<sup>ca</sup> Et<sup>ca</sup>. By Virtue of the Power and Authority to me given by His Present Majesty King George the Third under the Great Seal of Great Britain, have given, granted and confirmed, and by these presents, by and with the Advice and consent of his His Majesty's Council for said Province, give grant and confirm unto Philip Heyson his Heirs and Assigns, a Tract of Land situate lying and being in the Township of Lunenburg in the Province aforesaid, beginning at the Mouth of a small River that empties out of a Marsh at the Western part of Land granted to the late Benjamin Green Esqr, in the said Township of Lunenburg, thence to run Southerly and then Westerly round a Point by the several Courses of the Sea Shore at the High Water-Mark, One hundred and Forty Eight Rods, thence to run North seven degrees East, Two hundred and twenty five Rods, or untill it comes in a line

with the Head of the first Range or Division Oak-land-Lotts, thence to run South Sixty Seven degrees East Twenty five Rods, on Oak-land Commons, thence to begin at the first mentioned bound and run North Seventy five degrees West, fifty Rods on the aforesaid Green's Land, thence to run North One Hundred and Sixty Eight Rods, or untill it meets the end of the third Course expressed in this Tract containing on the whole by Estimation Sixty Acres more or less according to the plan annexed, Allowance being made, for all such Roads as may hereafter be judged Necessary to pass through the same, with all and all manner of Mines unopened excepting Mines of Gold and Silver, Lead, Copper, and Coals. To Have and to Hold the said Granted Premises with all privileges, profits and Commodities and Appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said Philip Heyson his Heirs and Assigns for ever. Yielding and paying by the said Grantee his Heirs and Assigns, which by the acceptation hereof he binds and obliges himself his Heirs Executors and Assigns to pay His Majesty King George the third his Heirs and Successors or to any person Lawfully Authorized to receive the same for His Majesty's use a per Yearly Quit Rent of One farthing per Acre for every Acre so granted, the first payment of the Quit Rent to arise from and After the expiration of two Years from the date hereof and so to continue payable Yearly thereafter forever, on default thereof this Grant shall be Null and Void. And Provided also that this Grant shall have been Registered at the Register's Office and a Doquet thereof entered at the Auditors Office within Six Months from the date thereof, otherwise this Grant shall become Null and Void. 


In the Name of God Amen, I Philip Hison of Mahone Bay in the County of Lunenburg and province of Nova Scotia Farmer, considering the uncertainty of human life and although I am at present infirm yet being of sound and perfect mind and memory, I think it my duty to regulate my affairs in this life, so that those who may come after me may have as little trouble as possible respecting thesame and do therefore make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and form following, First I direct that my body may be decently buried in such way as my Executors herein after named shall think fit, and my Executors do pay all my Just debts, and as to my worldly Sustenance of Kind or Nature soever both Real and personal Estate of every Kind, I give devise and bequeath thesame and every part thereof, in the following manner, I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Magdalena Hison during her natural life the house in which she now live together with all my household furniture and everything appertaining thereto, Also the annual interest of five hundred pounds which Sum it is my will that my Executors hereafter Named shall hold in Trust for the purpose aforesaid, and after the death of my said wife do dispose of thesame as hereafter directed; And unto my Son Jacob Hison the house and land on which he now lives together with the house devised to my said wife after her death, also four Thirty acre Lots situate in Clear Land Number fourteen & fifteen & thirteen & fourteen he paying unto the Two children children of his late Brother John the Sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds which is to be equally divided between them when they shall attain the Age of Eighteen years, which said land and everything thereunto belonging in case my said Son Jacob shall die without any Male issue then it is my will that the Two Eldest sons of each of his Brothers (William and Henry) shall become the heirs to said Estate and that the heirs Male of their bodies do respectively inherit the same, and unto my Sons William Hison and Henry Hison Two thirty acre Lots situate in Mahone Bay number Ten and N<sup>o</sup> Twelve and half a Thirty acre Lot back of

Number Nine they paying into the hands of my said Executors the Sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds, & also unto my said Son William a Three hundred acre Lot Number five Letter F fourth division Martin's River, and one Thirty acre Lot Number Eleven in Clear Land & unto my said Son Henry Two Thirty acre Lots in Clear land. This Day the Last Will of Jacob Heyson was moved in [---] form of Law on the Oath of John Kniese & John Zwicker two of the Subscribing witnesses, the [Exce] & Probate was Granted to Mary Gertraut his widow in the said will she being sworn faithfull to Execute the Trust... [The remainder was not transcribed]

The following is a paraphrased translation [by Christa Mølting] of the above will of Jacob Hyson:

In the Name of God, Amen.

I Jacob Heyson in the Township of Lunenburg, Province of Nova Scotia, proprietor, have as a good Christian consideration to write my last Will. I am of complete sound of mind (Bless the Lord to Eternity). I experience a weakness of my body and my thoughts are going in the direction that I will give my soul into the Hands of Almighty God and that my body be returned to the earth, in a Christian-like manner, from which it came. Because of the above feelings I am writing my last will and testament. First I bequeath by the authority which is mine to my honoured wife Maria Gertraut Heyson three pieces of land (called the Mühl Grand) the House, Barn, Stables and all things and property which I received from my Father Philip Heyson. This is my wish and last will that my wife receive the above after my death, except if she decides to get married again. Second, I leave to my wife all my moveable and personal property in the house, barn, stables, etc. after my death. In case she gets married again then all my property, except what is legally hers, goes to my brother Heinrich [Henry] and his children. Third, it is my will and desire that Ketty Heyson who I adopted receive everything I leave to my wife after her death. But she has to promise that she obeys and is not disloyal to my wife. Also promise not to take anything that is not legally hers except if my wife gives it to her. But if Ketty Heyson dies before my wife, I wish that Betsey her oldest sister inherit after my wife's death. In case my wife does not grant the inheritance to Betsey, then I wish Betsey's brothers and sisters should receive it. Fourth, it is also my last wish to leave to Johan Michael Berghaus Twenty-five Pounds local currency after my wife's death. He will only receive the above amount if he obeyed and was loyal to my wife. Finally I order and wish that my best friend John Heckman and my wife are the executors of my last wishes. All previous will are recalled and invalid and I Jacob Heyson, herewith state and certify my last will with my Hand and Seal at Lunenburg on the first of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred thirteen.

From the will it appears that Jacob and Maria Gertraut adopted a girl named Ketty. It does not state the relationship between the Heysons and Ketty's siblings. It may be implied that they siblings were not adopted by the Heysons. The will does not state the relationship of Johan Michael Berghaus to the Heysons or to Ketty, Betsey and the other unnamed siblings.

The Receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge Have given, Granted, bargained, Sold made over and Confirmed, And by theses presents do give, Grant bargain Sell make Over and Confirm unto the said my son Henry Heyson his Heirs and Assigns, The following pieces parcels and Tracts of Land Yiz: a certain Thirty Acre Lot of Land Known by being Lot number Ten also the One half of Lot Number Nine joining to the above said Number Ten, in letter B: Mahone Bay, Item one other Tract of Land situate and laying between the Mahone Bay Lots letter B: and the back of the North West Range lots butted and bounded as follows---beginning at a Stake and stones near a Road at the back of N<sup>o</sup> Eight thence Westerly by Lands belonging to Eisenhauer, untill it comes to lot number Ten, back of the North west range lots thence Southerly on N<sup>o</sup> ten, untill it comes to the Corner of Land belonging to Hubly thence on Hublys Land Easterly untill if comes to the Road above mentioned then on said Road Northerly to bounds first named at the stake and Stones containing Twenty Acres, together with the first mentioned pieces Containing Sixty five Acres of Land be the same more or less Situated in the Township of Lunenburg aforesaid with all the building and Improvements thereon and all Rights privileges Advantages Tree woods water water Courses Ways Commons pasture and all other Appurtenances [and Members thereunto] belonging or reputed to belong thereto.

Henry appears in the 1861 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, polling place #3, Mahone Bay, abstract 8). The household consisted of six people: 1 married male age 50-60; 1 married female age 50-60; 1 married male age 20-30; 1 married female age 20-30; 1 single female age 20-30; and 1 single male age 10-15. The census shows that one female over 15 could neither read nor write and that 1 male could not write. Henry owned 15 acres of Cultivated Intervale valued at NS\$240 and 7 acres of Cultivated Upland valued at NS\$56. He also owned 4 Neat Cows, 3 Milch Cows, 9 sheep and 1 pig. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 9 tons of hay in 1860, 50 bushels of barley, 50 bushels of potatoes, 8 bushels of turnips, 30 bushels of other roots, 20 bushels of apples and 60 lbs of butter.

Henry and Mary appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-

H1, p. 12, #10 [house 31, family 38]). They are listed with Mary's family. He was a farmer. Henry is listed as Presbyterian while Mary was listed as Baptist. In terms of property Henry owned 52 acres of which 15 were improved and 37 in pasture. Additionally he owned half an house, half of a barn, 1 waggon, 1 boat, 1 plough, 1 Milch Cow, 8 sheep, and 2 swine. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 37 bushels of barley, 35 bushels of potatoes from half an acre, 12 bushels of turnips, 35 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets), 4 tons of hay from 8 acres, half a bushel of flax seed, 10 lbs of flax/hemp, 25 bushels of apples, six bushels of pears/plums, 60 lbs of butter, 14 lbs of wool, 40 yards of cloth and 40 yards of linen. Additionally 2 sheep and 1 swine were sold for slaughter.

They appear in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C2, p. 51 [house 226, family 258]). They are again listed with Mary's family. He was Presbyterian and she was Baptist.

He is listed as Presbyterian, while she is listed as Anglican. He owned 105 acres of which 32 were improved, 15 in pasture and one in orchards. Additionally he he owned 1 house, 1 barn, 2 carriages/sleighs, 2 waggons/sleds, 1 plough, 1 horse, 1 colt/fillie, 2 Milch Cows, 5 other horned cattle, and 2 swine. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 26 bushels of barley, 11 bushels of of oats, 2 bushels of peas, 1 bushel of beans, 50 bushels of potatoes, 3 bushels of turnips, 10 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets), 10 bushels of carrots, 10 tons of hay from 10 acres, 18 lbs of flax, 30 bushels of apples, 2 cords of Tan bark, 50 spruce logs, 120 lbs of butter, and 8 lbs of wool in 1870. Seven sheep and 1 swine were sold for slaughter.

Anne appeared in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C2, p. 46 [house 208, family 240]). She is listed as a widow and an Anglican. A Sophia Hyson also lived there; she may be the Sophia who appears as Sophia Robar in the 1871 census. In 1881 she is age 52 while in 1871 she is age 40. Also a Sarah (age 28) and a James (age 40) Hyson resided with Anne. James was a farmer and they were both Presbyterian. [They do not appear to fit into the Heyson/Hyson family.] They had a servant, Rachel Bishop (age 18).

Caspar appears in the 1861 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, polling #3, Mahone Bay, abstract 8). The household consisted of 3 people: 1 married male age 40-50; 1 married female age 40-50; and 1 single female age 5-10. The census states that there were two females over age 15 who could not write. [It appears that there was one child, but the age is unclear. Having been married in 1848, the age of 5-10 years seems more appropriate for their possible child.] He owned 6 acres of Cultivate Intervale valued at NS\$300 and 9 acres of Cultivated Upland valued at NS\$12. He also owned 2 Neat Cows, 1 Milch Cow, 6 sheep and 1 pig. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 4 tons of hay, 30 bushels of barley, 4 bushels of oats, 30 bushels of potatoes, 5 bushels of turnips, 6 bushels of other roots, 8 bushels of apples, 55 yards of cloth, and 50 lbs of butter.

Caspar and Delilah appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-H1, p. 14, #8 [house 37, family 48]). He was a farmer. They were both listed as Presbyterian. Caspar owned 22.5 acres of which 15 were improved and 7 in pasture. Additionally he owned 2 waggons, 1 boat, 2 ploughs, 2 Working Oxen, 2 Milch Cows, 1 other horned cattle, 4 sheep and 1 swine. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 10 bushels of barley, 8 bushels of oats, 5 bushels of turnips, 5 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets), 5 tons of hay from 5 acres, 8 bushels of apples, 120 lbs of butter, 9 lbs of wool, and 10 yards of cloth in 1870. Three sheep were sold for slaughter.

They appear as Gaspar and Delilah in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C2, p. 55 [house 244, family 277]). They were listed as Presbyterian and he was a farmer. Two other people lived with them: William Mader, age 15, and Sophia Yarling, a widow age 65. [See note below.]

[A Sophia Hyson married at Lunenburg, N.S. 14 May 1842 (D.R.L.) Benjamin Yarling who died between the 1871 and 1881 censuses. In 1871 they lived with Caspar and Delilah Heyson. It is possible that Sophia is Caspar's sister Elizabeth Sophia.]

He married **ELIZABETH BURGOGNE**, daughter of John David and Anna Barbara (Klettenburg) Burgogne, who was born at Oakland, Nova Scotia 1786 and died probably at Clearland Nova Scotia. She married second John Philip Ernst, son of George Frederick and Anna Elizabeth<sup>3</sup> (Heyson) Ernst.

Johannes was confirmed as a member of the Dutch Reformed Church in 1794. He was a farmer. Johannes had a tendency to womanize as demonstrated in the following passage taken from papers of a Judge Fetch dated 1 February 1809 (Kroll, Robert. Intimate Fragments: An Irreverent Chronicle of Early Halifax. Halifax, N.S.: Nimbus Publishing Ltd., 1987.):

It has never occurred to me that the value of a pregnant woman, whether a wife, daughter, or hired-girl, is inversely proportionate to her swollen belly. I have George Zwicker, a German farmer from Lunenburg, to thank for this insight. He had charged John Kyson [sic] with feloniously ravishing and having carnal knowledge of his daughter Mary. At yesterday's trial, Zwicker argued only for compensation for such losses as he incurred while his daughter was pregnant.

Zwicker was most friendly and agreeable in Court and went so far as to oppose hanging the accused so long as he paid the damages. Zwicker did not consider Kyson's [sic] assault and rape on his daughter a criminal offence; rather a tort requiring a hearing before a court of General Sessions. He did not use these terms but his argument suggested as much. He quoted chapter and verse: "If a man find a damsel that is a virgin, which is not betrothed, and lay hold of her, and lie with her, and they be found; then the man that lay with her shall give unto the damsel's father fifty shekels of silver."

Zwicker worked out this biblical payment to three guineas six shillings based on his daughter's diminishing ability to perform the services required of her on the farm. So much for virtue and virginity. George Zwicker, with the assistance of Hebraic teaching, has turned genteel and chivalrous behaviour topsy-turvy by developing a labour theory of female value. I fear that such thinking will one day gain general acceptance among both men and women. When that day dawns, feminine grace, beauty, charm, and demeanor will be lost forever.

Trusting in your care and fidelity I do by virtue of these presents constitute and appoint you guardian of the Said minor charging you well and faithfully to perform that office and trust unto the said minor in and by all things according to the law and to enter upon and take possession of all her Said Real and personal estate in the County of Lunenburg aforesaid or elsewhere whereunto the Said minor may have any right or title and to manage and dispose to the best advantage of the same until the Said minor attains the age of twenty one years and render just account thereof to the Court of Probate when thereto required and to the said minor on her attaining the age of twenty one years, and to pay and deliver what and so much of said estate as shall be found remaining upon account of the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of Probate for the time being unto the Said minor, upon her attaining the age of twenty one years aforesaid or otherwise as the Said Judge by his Decree or Sentence shall limit and appoint. Benjamin and Elizabeth appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-H1, p. 65, #17 [house 211, family 249]). The census states that they were Presbyterian and that they could not write, although they could read. He was a farmer. He owned 150 acres of land of which 120 were improved with 117 of that in pasture. Additionally he owned half an house, 1 shop, 1 barn, 3 waggon/sleds. 1 plough, 2 Work Oxen, 3 Milch Cows, 3 other horned cattle, 9 sheep and 2 swine. In terms of agri- and arboricultural production, the farm produced 35 bushels of barley, 7 bushels of oats, 120 bushels of potatoes from 1 acre, 20 bushels of turnip, 40 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets), 10 tons of hay from 6 acres, 25 lbs of flax/hemp, half a bushel of pears/plums, 180 lbs of butter, 25 lbs of wool, 20 yards of cloth, 18 pine logs and 1000 staves. Two cattle, 3 sheep and 2 swine were sold for slaughter.

In the Name of God Amen I Benjamin Hyson of Indian Point in the Township and County of Lunenburg farmer being through the goodness of Almighty God of sound mind and memory but being aware of the uncertainty of human life do make publish and declare this last will and testament that is to say I recommend my soul to God who gave it and I desire that my body may be decently buried in Christian like manner, with respect to worldly estate, I give bequeath and dispose of it in the following manner after all my just and lawful debts are paid and discharged.

First. I give and bequeath to my daughter Annie Hyson all my personal estate for her use. I give and bequeath to my son William Hyson the Northwest part of my lot of land No. five lying at Martin's River containing Thirty acres more or less and the use of a road on my southern part for him and his heirs on the said lot No. five, I give and bequeath to my son William Hyson and my four daughters and my two grand[daughters], namely William my son, Annie Hyson, Catherine Hyson the wife of Edmund Hiltz. Sarah Hyson the wife of David Heisler and Eliza Hyson the wife of James Zwicker and my two Grand daughters, Mary and Victoria Hyson the [two to] have one share between the two.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my son William Hyson as the executor of this last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of January in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety five A.D. 1895.

William and Elizabeth appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-H1, p. 69, #19 [house 197, family 235]). They were Anglican and literate. William was a labourer. It is not recorded if they owned land, but they occupied 1 acre. [It may be assumed that they owned 60 acres at Hyson's Pt., Oakland where the family resided until the 1950's.] In terms of property it is recorded that he owned 1 Milch Cow and 5 sheep. He married at Mahone Bay, N.S. 15 November 1864 (N.S. YR's) **MARY ANN MADER**, who was born at Mader's Cove or Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia about 1843 and died there 1932.

Alfred and Mary appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-H1, p. 8, # 1 [house 22, family 25]). They were Methodists. He was a seaman.

They appear in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C2, p. 67 [house 293, family 233]). They were Methodists. He was listed as a fisherman.

They appear in the 1891 federal census (Lunenburg 38-B3, p. 59, #22 [family 307]). They were Methodists. Alfred is listed as a fisherman. The family was literate except the youngest who was not yet of school age.

Alfred appears in the 1902 McAlpine's Directory and was listed as a fisherman residing at Mader's Cove. Alfred and Mary appear in the Portland [ME] Directory for the years 1921-22. They resided with their son [Alfred] Wesley at 85 Union St, South Portland, Maine. Alfred again appears in the Portland Directory for the year 1925 when he resided with his daughter Grace at 175 High St., Portland, Maine.

The following documents established the legal guardianship of Alfred when his father died in 1855 (P.A.N.S.:Lunenburg Will Books, vol. 4):

Know All Men by these presents that I Alfred Hyson of Oakland in the County of Lunenburg (Son of Frederick Hyson late of the same place farmer deceased) being a minor upward of fourteen years of age and entitled to certain Real and personal estate in right of my said father Frederick Hyson deceased Have elected and chosen and by these presents do elect and choose William Turner of Oakland aforesaid School master to be guardian of my person and estate untill I shall attain the age of twenty one years. And I do hereby promise to be ruled and governed by the said William Turner in all things [treating] my welfare and do authorise my said guardian to enter upon and take possession of all my estate Real and personal in the County of Lunenburg aforesaid or elsewhere whereunto I may have any right and title and to manage and dispose of the same in the best advantage of me the said minor untill I attain the age of Twenty One years as aforesaid giving and granting unto the said Guardian full power in the premises aforesaid and whatsoever he shall do or cause to be done in the said premises by virtue hereof I do hereby promise to ratify and confirm In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty ninth day of December in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven.

16. **JOHN FREDERICK<sup>5</sup> HEYSON/HYSON** (John,<sup>4</sup> John William Gorkum,<sup>3</sup> Johann Philip,<sup>2</sup> Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup>) was born at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 16 January 1832 (D.R.L.), was baptized at Lunenburg, Nova Scotia 17 February 1832 (D.R.L.) and died at either Ingramsport or Head of St. Margaret's Bay, Nova Scotia before 1909. He married first at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 7 October 1854 (S.J.A.M.) **ELIZA LANGILLE**, daughter of Charles Langille, who was probably born at Blockhouse, Nova Scotia and died of typhoid at Halifax, Nova Scotia 23 September 1869 (N.S. YR's). He married second at Halifax, Nova Scotia 30 June 1877 (N.S. YR's) **NANCY PHILIPS**, daughter of John and Susannah Philips, who was probably born at or near Head of St. Margaret's Bay, Nova Scotia about 1843. Nancy married second as his second wife at [place not stated], Halifax County, Nova Scotia 29 April 1909 (N.S. YR's) Joseph C. Smith of Tantallon, Nova Scotia.

John appears in the 1861 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, polling place #3, Mahone Bay, abstract 1). The household consisted of 6 people: 1 married male age 20-30; 1 married female age 20-30; 1 male age 5-10; 1 male age 3-4; 1 male age 2-3; and 1 female under 1 year. The census stated that 1 female over age 15 could not write. The farm produced 7 bushels of potatoes in 1860.

John, but not Eliza, is listed in the 1871 federal census (Halifax 196-Q, p. 28, #11 [house 80, family 92]). He is listed as Anglican, literate and a ship carpenter. Additionally he is listed as not married [which may indicate that Eliza died prior to the 1871 census]. The family resided on 5 acres of land of which 3 acres were improved, but the census data are unclear about the ownership. He owned 1 barn, 1 reaper/mower [crossed out on the census form], 1 Milch Cow, and 1 swine. In terms of agri- and arboricultural production, the farm produced -- bushels of wheat from  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre, 8 bushels of wheat, 100 bushels of wheat from  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an acre, 6 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets),  $5\frac{1}{2}$  tons of hay from 2 acres, 100 lbs of butter, and 10 cords of firewood in 1870. One swine was sold for slaughter. Living with the Hyson family was Nancy and Susannah Philips, ages 29 and 69 respectively, both of which were illiterate.

John and Nancy appear in the 1881 federal census (Halifax 32-J2, p. 7, #18 [house 27, family 29]). John is listed as a boat builder. The family appears on the census as Anglican.

He appears in the 1866/67 Nova Scotia Directory and is listed as a farmer at Mahone Bay. The Nova Scotia vital records at the time of his second marriage, which was Baptist, list him as a mechanic residing at St. Margaret's Bay.

17. **AARON<sup>5</sup> HEYSON/HYSON** (John,<sup>4</sup> John William Gorkum,<sup>3</sup> Johann Philip,<sup>2</sup> Johann Friedrich<sup>1</sup>) was born at either Mahone Bay or Oakland, Nova Scotia 5 November 1835 (D.R.L.) and was baptized at Lunenburg, Nova Scotia 8 December 1835 (D.R.L.). He married **SARAH EISENHAUER**, daughter of ----- and Christianna Eisenhauer, who was born about 1835-37 and died probably at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 4 November 1873. He married second as her second husband at Mahone Bay, N.S. 2 January 1875 (N.S. YR's) **CASSANDRA GERTRUDE HIRTLE**, daughter of Daniel and Eliza Hirtle, who was born about 1840.

Aaron appears in the 1861 Nova Scotia census (Lunenburg, polling place #3, Mahone Bay, abstract 9). The household consisted of 4 people: 1 widowed female age 50-60; 1 married male age 20-30; 1 married female age 20-30; and 1 female age 1-2. One female over age 15 could neither read nor write. The census does not state if Aaron owned any land. However, he owned 1 pig. In terms of agricultural production, the farm produced 11 bushels of barley, 6 bushels of potatoes, 10 bushels of turnips, and 5 bushels of other roots.

Aaron and Sarah appear in the 1871 federal census (Lunenburg 195-H1, p. 56, #20 [house 182, family 218.]). Aaron was Presbyterian and a Sea Captain. Sarah and the children were Lutheran. They were all literate, whereas Sarah's mother Christiana Eisenhauer, who lived with them and was Lutheran, was illiterate. Aaron owned 1/2 an acre of land of which an eighth was in gardens or orchards. Additionally he owned an house, one-third of a Sailing Vessel (15 tons or 21 shares), and 2 swine. He employed 4 people on the boat. In 1870 his involvement in the fishery produced 200 quintals of cod and 25 barrels of mackerel. In terms of agricultural production, the small plot produced 20 bushels of barley and 20 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets) in 1870.

Aaron and Cassandra appear in the 1891 federal census (Lunenburg 38-B1, p. 24, #11 [family 131]). He is listed as Presbyterian and a fisherman. Cassandra and the children were Lutheran. The family were all literate.

The Nova Scotia vital records state that Aaron and Cassandra were married Presbyterian and that they resided in Mahone Bay, N.S. Aaron appears in the 1902 McAlpine's Directory and is listed as a master mariner residing at Mahone Bay.

They appear in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C2, p. 23 [house 101, family 117]). They were Presbyterian. Benjamin was a sea captain. Isaac Veinot, age 67, resided with them. [It is possible that he is Lavinia's father if she were married previously.]

Benjamin and Lavinia appear in the 1891 federal census (Lunenburg 38-B3, p. 21, #24 [family 109]). They were Presbyterian. He was a sea captain.

Benjamin and Elisheba married Presbyterian. She was residing at Mader's Cove, N.S. at the time of their marriage. The marriage record states that he was a master mariner.

Benjamin appears in the 1902 McAlpine's Directory and is listed as a master mariner residing at Mahone Bay, N.S.

He married first **CAROLINE ELIZABETH ERNST** who was born at Clearland, Nova Scotia about 1838. He married second as her second husband at Mahone Bay, Nova Scotia 21 April 1891 (N.S. In terms of agricultural production, the lot produced 30 bushels of barley, 100 bushels of potatoes from 1 acre, 15 bushels of turnips, 30 bushels of Mangelwurtz (beets), 20 lbs of flax/hemp, 20 lbs of butter, 18 lbs of wool, 15 yards of cloth and 20 yards of linen. Four sheep and 1 swine were sold for slaughter.

They appear in the 1881 federal census (Lunenburg 11-C1, p. 26, #21 [house 103, family 131]). They were Presbyterian. He was listed as a fisherman.

William and Eliza were married Presbyterian. The marriage record states that he was a farmer. William and Arabella were also married Presbyterian.

He appears in the 1866/67 Nova Scotia Directory and is listed as a farmer residing at Indian Point. In the 1902 McAlpine's Directory, he is listed as a cooper residing at Indian Point.
