Genealogical and Memorial History of N. J., by F. B. Lee beginning at pg. 1635, Vol. 4, gives a complete record of the Van Couwenhoven (Conover) family.
 Dominicus and 3 of his sons served in the Revolution—John, William and Levi—the published birth date of Dominicus is usually given as 1730, which is some years too late—was more likely, 1720. Will names 5 sons--no daughters.

Proof: The Immigrant, WOLFERT GERRETSE VAN COUWENHOVEN, came to N. J. 1630. Was an Original landed proprietor, having purchased his land from the Indians, in Flatbush and Flatlands, 6-16-1637. Was Overseer of Farms for Patroon Van Rensselaer: freeholder in Midwout 1637-41: commr. from the colony to Holland, 1653; schepen of New Amsterdam, 1654; great burgher, 1657; d. 1661.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's (Col. Joab Houghton) place of residence during the Revolution was Hopewell New Jersey

My ancestor, Col. Joab Houghton, assisted in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution as follows:

Colonel Joab Houghton is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence while acting in the capacity of Captain Lt. Colonel, being commissioned a Captain in the first Regiment, Hunterdon Co. New Jersey Militia, Captain, Col Phillips Johnstons Battalion, Brigadier Gen. Nathaniel Heard's Brigade New Jersey State Troops, July 1776, where he served for five months. He was attached to Major General Nathaniel Green's division in the Continental Army. He was at the Battle of Long Island, New York, Aug. 27, 1776 and White Plains, New York, Oct. 28, 1776. He was commissioned Colonel, First Regiment, Hunterdon County, New Jersey Militia March 15, 1777; Lieutenant Colonel in Col. John Taylor's Regiment, New Jersey State Troops, during the Revolutionary war. It was under his supervision that the first company for the war was made up, after service at the old Hopewell Baptist Church when news of the Battle of Lexington reached them. He was with Washington's army at Long Island, across the short hills of New Jersey and the Delaware.
