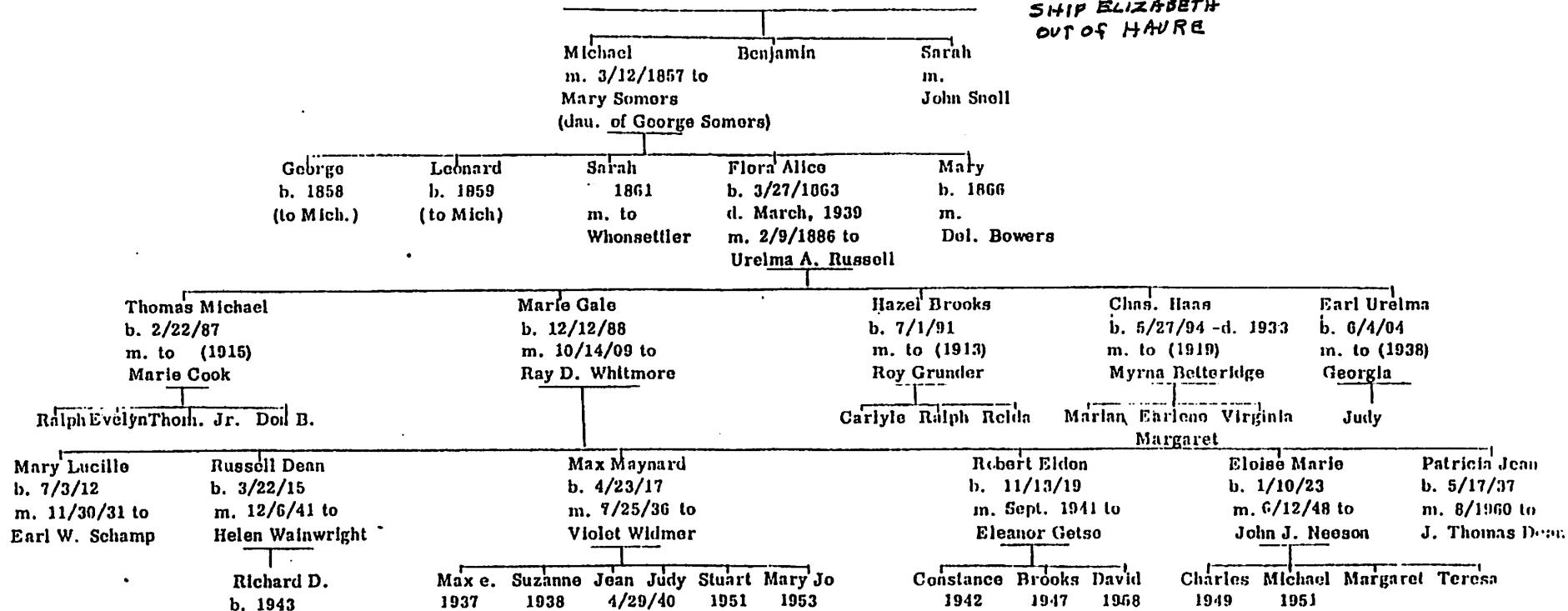

CARROLLTON MAN RETURNS AFTER TRIP TO HOMELAND

Martin Haas of Carrollton returned Monday after seven months spent with friends and relatives at Sultz-sous-Forets, Alsace, France. Both he and his wife are natives of Alsace, but she did not accompany him on his trip. Mr. Haas was born in 1861, nine years before the Franco-Prussian war in which Germany seized Alsace-Lorraine; and came to America in 1883. He has been a resident of Carroll-co for seven years and of Carrollton for two years. This was his third trip abroad.

Mr. Haas' home town is three miles from the Maignot line and the Rhine river, and war talk, he says, was an important topic of conversation. Everyone is afraid of war, but neither the French nor the Germans want war. Most of the younger people in that section are strongly in favor of French rule, but many of the older generation, who were under the kaiser's government until 1918, prefer Germany because of better markets. Imports from France's African colonies can be sold cheaper than Alsatian products, and this works undue hardships, Mr. Haas said.

Mr. Haas feels that if war is to come in Europe in the near future it will start in September, for at that time German harvests will be in and the food supply will be the most plentiful. Hitler, he thinks, will shortly be forced to fight or to see his country ruined, for the chief industry is in manufacturing munitions, and this produces no income. If war does come, many of the families of northern France are prepared to move to other parts of the country, but the older people, with no place to go, say they will stay where they are. During the last war, many such families lived the entire four years in cellars and ruined houses in the midst of the front lines.

It wouldn't have been so bad but they took advantage of the fact that for some time Mr. Shumaker has been laid up and unable to work on account of a broken leg. This "mob" went unannounced and when Mr. Shumaker looked out of the window he counted 30 men in his corn field and the way they were cutting his corn up was something fierce. He managed to get to the field and it was then that he discovered some of his neighbors and Brother Moose who had come to give him a hand in his corn-cutting. It took that "mob" just two hours and twenty minutes to cut his sixteen acres, and we can say right here that if the Journal scribe had been there it would only have taken twenty minutes to do the job. OBITUARY

Jacob Haas.

Jacob Haas was born in Stein-seltz, Alsace, France, March 10, 1842. Baptized in infancy, confirmed at the age of 14 and re-baptized into the reformed church.

He was united in marriage to Miss Magdalena Biegler Feb. 8, 1870. To this happy union two sons were born.

He came to America with his family in the spring of 1892 and settled on a farm in Canaan township, Wayne county, Ohio, where he lived until 1912 when he moved to Creston.

Being a devout worshiper of Jehovah, he not only sought a home but a church in the country of his adoption and since there was no Reformed Church, he, with his family, united with the Presbyterian church of Canaan.

He was a faithful, loving, devoted husband and father. Despite his suffering, he found comfort and joy in caring for and watching the development of his grandson, who has made his home with them since the time he was but a few weeks old, being deprived of maternal care through the death of his mother.

He departed this life Oct. 2, 1919. Left to mourn their loss his faithful wife, two sons, Jacob at Akron, and Martin, who lives on the old home place west of Creston; one brother, Martin, who still lives in Alsace, France; two grandsons, Carl Martin and John Jacob Haas, and a large circle of friends.

Had he been permitted to live until Feb. 8, 1920, he and his wife would have celebrated their golden wedding.

TWO ARE VICTIMS OF PTOMAIN POISONING

Mother and Daughter Die After Eating Canned Spinach.

Mrs. Michael Haas, 92, and her daughter, Mrs. Reuben J. Whonsetler, 60, died at their home at Canaan Center, Friday, both victims of ptomaine poisoning.

Mr. Whonsetler and a daughter, Mary, do not care for spinach and did not eat any of it, thereby escaping the horrible fate of the other members of the family.

On Tuesday the two women had eaten a part of the contents of the can of spinach and it apparently caused no ill effects. The balance of the contents had been placed in a dish and on Wednesday this was eaten. Thursday morning they were both ill and as they grew steadily worse during the day, Dr. Bell of Creston, and Dr. Whitaker of Lodi, were called and discovered the cause of their illness and gave what medical aid was possible. However, by this time, both were beyond human assistance. Mrs. Haas, because of her advanced years, succumbed first and passed away early Friday morning, while Mrs. Whonsetler lingered until about three o'clock in the afternoon.

The entire community was surprised and shocked to learn of the double tragedy. Mrs. Haas had been a lifelong resident of the community. Her physical condition had been good and her mental fac-

ulties had been clear. Her husband died two years ago and since that time she had made her home with her daughter. She is survived by three children, Mrs. U. A. Russell of Wooster, Geo. Haas of Michigan, and Mrs. D. E. Bowers of Creston.

The services for Mrs. Whonsetler were held from the same church at two o'clock Monday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Drumm of Madisonburg. Burial was made in the Canaan cemetery.

Mr. Whonsettler is a son in law and with his wife, occupies the old farm belonging to Mr. Haas, and where the Haas family lived until 1890. It was therefore considered to be the right place to celebrate the Golden wedding anniversary.

Michael Haas is a son of Belthasar Haas and wife, who were born in Alsace, Germany, and emigrated to the United States in 1835, settling in Canaan township on the same farm now owned by Michael, and where the celebration was held. His father was a wagon maker and farmer.

Michael was born in Sabach, Germany, December 16, 1831, and came with his parents to America when four years old and grew up on the farm. He went to school in the Munhollen school house, near his father's home. He bought 81 acres of land of his father's farm and afterwards pur-

chased 41 acres, the farm now being 122 acres and belonging to the Haas family since 1836.

He was married March 12, 1857, to Miss Mary Sommers, daughter of George Sommers and wife, of Canaan township. The wedding ceremony was performed by Rev. David Kammerer, of Wooster at the home of the bride's parents. The bridesmaid was Mrs. John Kenney and the groomman Jonas Sommers. The bride had attended school at Golden Corners.

The newly married couple began house keeping at the old Haas home. To this union five children were born two sons and three daughters, namely:

George Washington, married to Miss Julia Whonsettler, daughter of Samuel Whonsettler, who now reside in Coopersville, Michigan. Her parents are dead.

Leonard, married to Miss Alice Dague, daughter of George Dague and wife. Leonard died a few years ago, and the widow resides in Coopersville, Michigan.

Sarah A., married to R. J. Whonsettler. They reside on the old Haas homestead.

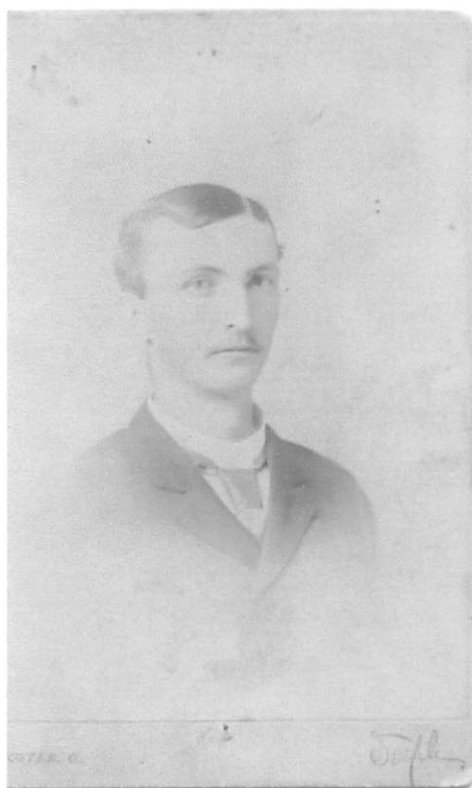
