

Rogers, Virgil Madison. "Family History, Rogers - McCrary-Lantham, with Allies and Descendant Families." Strasburg, VA: Shenandoah Pub. House Inc., 1975.

Good narrative genealogy of three South Carolina Piedmont section families. The immigrant Rogers ancestor was Robert T. Rogers, who was born in Northern Ireland 23 Dec 1743 and arrived 26 Charleston, SC by ship on 4 Nov 1773. There is no apparent connection between any of the families and New York or New England. There is a discussion of the origins of the family names in chapter II. Copied title, etc., pp. 9-38.

Reprint of several installments of this genealogy that appeared in the "Indiana Magazine of History" in 1949. Some pages are apparently missing at the beginning of the first installment. The remaining pages are of no value. Copied cover.

Rogers, Ellen Stanley. "Dr. John Rogers, 1794-1872." 1966.

Good biography of John Rogers, who was born in Ireland in 1794 and came to Baltimore by 1800. He lived in Baltimore, Georgetown, NC, and TN. No connection to NY Rogerses. Copied cover, etc.

Williams, I. Newbon. "The Rogers-Harbor Family; a Search for Ancestors." Bradley Beach, NJ: Clarence W. Smith Press, 1946. 128 pp. (Corrections and Addenda in envelope pasted inside book cover.)

Some what negligible efforts to "prove" that William Rogers, who settled in Long Island, N.Y., was a son of Thomas Rogers of the "Mayflower." The evidence was rejected by the Society of Mayflower Descendants. Further research resulted in the "Corrections and Addenda," which establishes William as a descendant of John Rogers the Harbor. Williams also erroneously claims descent of Thomas Rogers from John the Harbor. Copied title, Corrections & Addendum.

Porter, Cyrus Kinn. "Porter Family Record. A Few Twigs from a Branch of the Porter Family."

Traces Robert Porter of Farmington, CT line. Settled here in 1640, died 1689. Date and place of birth unknown.

No 2 very complete genealogy. Members covered live in CT & NY, mostly Oneida Co. (Cicero, etc.).

Includes letter from author claiming to correct earlier errors in establishing some of his line to the John of Windsor line.

Lesterbee, Ethel Brigham. "The Ancestors and Descendants of Luke Rogers and Sarah Wright Brown." Boston: privately printed, 1907.

Covers Luke Rogers family, which lived in Stow, Litchfield, Concord, & Boston, MA during period when looking for Verdy. Covers only 2 Rogers ancestors: Abraham Foster (1764-1834), John (m 1762, d. c. 1796)
No connection.

Rogers, James Swift. "James Rogers of New London, CT and His Descendants." Boston: by compiler, 1902

Covers the "religous" James Rogers line from the Puritans, including the Rogers reed. (No prob. connection to Verdy.) There were also in New London descendants of other Rogers lines: Thomas Rogers of the Mayflower, John Rogers of Dedham 1623, and Adam Rogers (stake), son of Adam, who married a white woman.

Lines of John of Marshfield, William of South Hampton, & James of Newport stay short of a known immigrant ancestor.

This line looked like a very likely candidate because of the prevalence of Tracy and Samuel in the family naming pattern. However, no connection can be found between this line and Washington Co., NY. Washington Co. adjoins VT, and there is a possibility that the Rogers line came from VT. (Eliza Rogers' cousin)

Most of this family seem to be wealthy, prosperous, influential business men, merchants, ship's captains, iron founders, etc. Very many in line deeply involved in religion, Rogerian, Seventh Day Baptists, Congregationalists; and a few Quakers, Methodists, and Moravians.

Traces line of Arthur Warren, who was in Weymouth, MA before 1638. No parents or English origin known. Family formed in Townsend, MA.

Arthur² m. Abigail, daughter of John Rogers of Duxbury, MA

A prominent family with many important business men, but no connection to James Warren of Ohio. No James in book

beyond 1666.

Fair genealogy - more narrative than formal. Immigrant ancestor is John Warren (1620/1 - ~1702), immigrated (prisoner) 1651. Not all descendants of James covered, but almost all male lines covered far enough that there is little likelihood that we are missed.

Huntington, Rev. Charles White. Warren-Claire Genealogy. Cambridge: John Wilson & Son, 1894.

Wierd "mathematical" approach to genealogy. Research about John Warren (1767-1828) of Grafton, MA and his wife Lois Lyon. No apparent connection to us.
