Good narrative genealogy of three South Carolina Piedmont section families. The immigrant Rogers ancestor was Robert T. Rogers, who was born in Northern Ireland 23 Dec 1743 and arrived at Charleston, SC by ship on 4 Nov 1773. There is no apparent connection between any of the families and New York or New England. There is a discussion of the origins of the family names in chapter III. Copied title, etc., pp. 9-27.

Good biography of John Rogers, who was born in Ireland in 1794 and came to Baltimore by 1800. He lived in Baltimore, Georgetown, NC, and TN. No connection to NY Rogeses. Copied cover, etc.

Somewhat legalistic effort to "prove" that William Rogers, who settled in Long Island, N.Y., was a son of Thomas Rogers of the "Hay Plow". The evidence was rejected by the Society of Hay Plow Descendants.

Further research resulted in the "Connections and Addenda," which established William as a descendant of John Rogers the Haymaker. Williams also erroneously claims descent of Thomas Rogers from John the Haymaker.

Traces Robert Porter of Farmington, CT line, settled there
in 1640, died 1689. Date and place of birth unknown.

Not a very complete genealogy. Members carried listed in
CT & NY, mostly Onandaga Co. (Cicero, etc.).

Includes letter from author claiming to correct earlier errors
in 266 attributing some of his line to the John of Windsor line.

No connections.

Rogers, James Swift. "James Rogers of New London, CT
and His Descendants." Boston: By compiler, 1902

Covers the "religious" James Rogers line from the martyr,
including the Rogerose sect. (No proved connection to martyr.)
There were also in New London descendants of other
Rogers lines: Thomas Rogers of the stayflourer, John Rogers
of Dedham, Eng., and Adam Rogers (store), son of Adam, who
married a white woman.

Lines of John of Marshfield, William of Southbury, &
James of Newport stay short of a known immigrant ancestor.

This line looked like a very likely candidate because of the
presence of James and Samuel in the family naming patterns.
However, no connection can be found between this line and
Washington Co., NY. Washington Co. adjoins VT, and there is
a possibility that the Rogers line came from VT. (Eliza Rogers' census)

Most of this family seem to be wealthy, prosperous, influential
businessmen, merchants, ship's captains, manual laborers, etc. Very
many in line deeply involved in religion, Rogerose, Seventh Day
Baptists, Congregationalists; and a few Quakers, Methodists, and Moravians.

A prominent family with many important business men, but no connection to James Warren of Ohio. No James in book

Fair genealogy - more narrative than formal. Immigrant ancestor is James Warren (1625/6 - ~1702), immigrated (prisoner) 1651. Not all descendants of James covered, but almost all male lines covered for enough that there is little likelihood that we are related.

Huntington, Rev. Charles White. Warren - Craike Genealogy. Cambridge: John Wilson & Son, 1894.

Wier's "mathematical" approach to genealogy. Reaches about John Warren (1767-1828) of Grafton, MA and his wife Lois Lyon. No apparent connection to us.
