I received your note, and was sorry to learn that your father had died, but glad to know that you had in opportunity to spend Christmas with some of your family. You mentioned a postcard from Pauline Fuller of New Mexico. I don't know the name, but in one of her letters, Cousin Laura Puller Marner mentioned that several of Melson's children "west West and raised their families there, so I didn't know them"---so, Pauline might be a daughter of one of them.

I wrote to Dr. Gerald Fuller and he send me the names of the descendants of Tuward Fuller, the Mayflower passenger, from whom we are descended, according to Dr. Gerald Fuller. I added that information to what I had from other sources, and have made a copy, which I enclose, of all the information I have so far. He (and two other people to whom I write and have never met) told me of a book written in 4 volumes which proves our ancestry, and told me the Detroit Public library probably has a copy. I am leaving tomorrow for a two week visit with my brother Bob who lives in Florida, and when I come back I'm planning to go to Detroit one day, and see if they do have the book. If so, I'll copy any information that rel tes to our branch of the Fullers (if there really is some) and I'll send you a copy of whatever I find. In the meantime, would you have time to copy whatever you have, and send it to me—perhaps we can get some more pieces of the muzzle together.

The Michigan State Library has two books which I found fascinating reading, although I didn't get much information out of them. gathered there last Sunday evening, the occasion being the memorial services of the late Homer Covey, who gave his life for his country in the late Spanish-Amer-

ican war.

The City Band and the Pingree Guards met at the headquarters of the Guards and attended the services in a body. Directly in front of the pulpit the drum of the dead hero was beautifully arranged.

Homer B. Covey was born July 7th, 1881, one and one half miles west of this fourteen during tbe first His beme years of his life was upon the farm, where he was born, with the exception of two year during which his parents resided in this city. His school life, however, has

year during which his parents resided in this city. His school life, however, has been almost entirely connected with the public schools of Eaton Rapids, only one year having been passed the district school. During this period he spent much of his time at the home of his grandparents, thus taking advantage of the school privileges here afforded.

In the spring of 1694, while yet under thirteen years of age, he accompanied his father to the weekly prayer-meeting, where, under the influence of that sacred hour, he openly confessed the Lord Jasus Christ as his Saviour. He was baptized by C. B Lester, then paster of the Baptist church, in the following June. Unassuming and modest, he won and maintained the love and respect of teachers, schoolmates and all who knew him. A casual meeting was sufficient to convince one that he was truly a gentlemen.

He was a member of the Eaton Rapids City band, and the Pingree Guards, the members of which mourn his loss.

When the call of the President came for volunteers he responded, leaving school about the middle of April and taking his departure from home May 14, for Camp Eaton, Island Lake, where he enlisted as drummer boy, in Co. on the Olivette when he was taken off by malarial dysentery August 19th and buried beneath the wayes of the old WAR lantic. and

The universal comment of old and young, near and remote, dearest friend and casual acquaintence is, that Homer was a good boy. In one of his recent letters to his mother he said: "You need not worry about my forming had habits, or being led astray by had company. It was never so easy for me to be so good as it is here, if this is a rough life." He will be missed in school, in the band, among the Guards, on the street, and most of all in the home, but we may think of him as having exchanged the tent of the army camp for the celestial palace.

The following letter from Homer's Captain was received a few days since, and is published to show the esteem in which the boy was held by his comrades at the front.

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Camp Wikerr, Montaur Pr., Aug. 25, '96.

Mas. Covey, Eston Rapids Mich.

Dear Madam:

I am sorry I have on this occasion to relate to you the sad news of the reported death of your son, Homer. The news was imparted to me by the pross through the columns of the N. Y. Sun. It is not official, but I fear true. When last I saw him he was at the hospital at Santiago, down with Typhoid Pever, and was taken from there to Hospital Ship Olivette on Aug. 15th, which arrived here on Sunday, Aug. 21st. I have not learned what disposition was made of the body, but I am inclined to think he was buried at sea.

Well, my dear Mrs. Covey, you have my heartfelt sympathy in this hour of your sad bereavement; but we must all remember it is the will of our Almighty Creator, who has taken him home and remember this dear boy of yours has gone to his father in Heaven. I feel deeply your loss as well my loss, for I had learned to love him for his manny, true, faith ful, patriotic spirit and his ever willing attention to duty as a soldier, as he was good, kind, and true, and ever ready to help his comrades feel very deeply the loss of one so dearly loved by all and all join in extending to you their heartfelt sympathies.
