

An interesting bit of legal evidence as to who was who in the very early days of the lown of Blehland, was disclosed in a certified list of the electors of the township in November, 1807, which S. C. ex-hibited. Said list of names was compiled for the purpose of determining the electors for the senatorial election of that year. In said time electors possessing senatorial franchise had to be worth \$500. However, an assemblyman could be be elected by voters possessing not less than \$100. Quite a few are listed in the column of those renting tenements of at least forty shillings, about \$8. Presumably said gentry voted at the town meetings. so popular in those days, though we cannot say definitely. Among the more munificent of the citizenryfreeholds of \$500-we find the following names: Joseph Chase, Jonathan Roads, Timothy Kellogg, Samuel Vorce, Joseph Spaid, Pliny Jones, Israel Jones, Wm. Examination of such lists, however, is always a magnet to some people, and so we pass it on for these who enjoy delving into the past. One's ancestor may have been a resident of the county in 1807, or even before, and the name not appear on the list, for said grentlemen, understand, must be of the more affuent class, else they did not vote.
