JENNINGS: The Surname

In becoming the surname "Jennings," the name of John underwent a progression of changes. The first appearance of the name in England took on the forms Jehan and Johan. English dialects soon shortened these to Jen, Jan or Jon. The "s" was added at times to distinguish one person from another. The several diminutive suffixes popular with the English at this time were "kin," "in," and "ing." It did not take long for the name Jen to become Jennings. Early tax records of England give evidence of early forms of this name: John Janygn, 1327; Thomas Jenyn, 1428; Ralph Jenyngs, 1545. There was Lord Mayor Jennings of London, 1508; Sarah Jennings, born ca. 1600, Duchess of Marlboro and ancestor of Sir Winston Churchill; Peter Jenings, born 1631, England, member of the House of Burgess in Virginia; Hon. Edmund Jennings, born 1659 England, died 1727 in Virginia and buried in Williamsburg. By the time the first census was taken in America many families had settled here. The 1790 Federal census show there were two hundred seventy-four heads of households with the name Jennings and having an average of 5.5 size family. It also lists the following spellings found of the surname Jennings: Gennings, Gennins, Ginning, Ginnings, Ginnins, Jenings, Jennens, Jenning, Jennins, Jinings, Jining, Jinnings, Jinnins.

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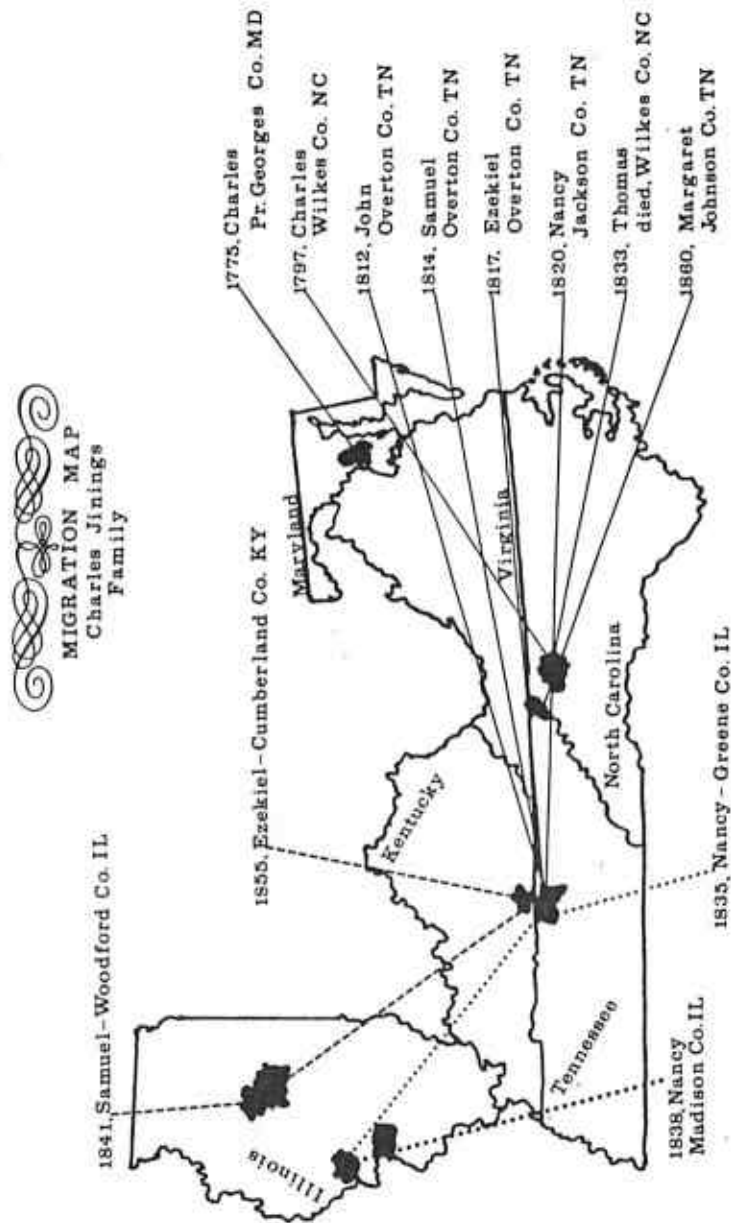

remarkable uniformity for a period of several centuries. The first historical account shows them to have settled in Yorkshire. Their character indicates that they were of the Saxon race, and settled prior to the Norman Conquest. It is a family of peace and plenty, with no ambition for glory of civil or other kind of wars. They were industrious and thriving agriculturalists and manufacturers. While some families sought power and wealth as powerful warriors, and became the nobility of England, the Jennings were satisfied with dignity and nobility that attains to the loyal, God fearing; were religious but not fanatic, honest and upright from principle.

There were no English Titles in this family, but there were instances of female marriages into nobility.

This work by Wells, Vol. III, leads us through prominent members of the family in England from 1600 to 1875, and in America, it covers the family in Connecticut from 1645 to 1880. Most of the report is of a genealogical nature but is interspersed with comment that the family was one of considerable prominence. (Notes by this compiler indicate that another volume covers the family in New Jersey, but he has been unable to locate it). The name has been found throughout English histories.

The Name and Family of Jennings

The surname of Jennings is said to have been derived from the Celtic name MacEonin, mac meaning "son" and Eonin meaning "young Owner John". The name is found in ancient British and early American records in the various spellings of Jennens, Jennins, Jenness, Jenniss, Jenning, Jennyns, Jenning, Jenynges and Jennings, of which the last is the form most generally used in America today.

The family of Jennings, which is of ancient Welsh origin, was seated at an early date in Carnarvonshire, Wales. It later spread to Ireland and to the Counties of Bedford, Chester, Shrops, Devon, York, Middlesex, Bucks, Warwick, Somerset, Surrey, Stafford, Hants, London and Suffolk. It appears that the family were, for the most part, of the landed gentry and yeomanry of Great Britain.

One Jennings of the Yorkshire branch of the family was Lord Mayor of London in 1508, but the records of his descendants have not been found.

Of the Warwickshire branch, one John Jennens or Jennins was succeeded in the year 1575 by his eldest son William, who had issue by his wife, Joan Elliott, of nine children. Their son John married twice and had, among

ly because the size of the family would seem to require it, but so because Mr. Prichard was a man of substantial means. A man's status in the community was certainly reflected in the type of house which he provided for his family. The original purchase agreement read "for yourself and son" and would suggest that possibly a large lot was shared by William and his eldest son John, who was probably married as of this time.

William was prominent in the affairs of Quaboag from the beginning. He is found as one of the original proprietors in 1665; one of the Prudential Committee of Quaboag in May of 1667; a signatory of the unsuccessful petition to the General Court October, 1670; and as one of the petitioners for incorporation Brookfield in 1673. (Samuel also signed the latter petition, but strangely, the names of his two older brothers John and William, do not appear amongst the petitioners. No explanation can be given of this unless it could be that they had both removed from Quaboag, as of that date.)

In addition, William Prichard was concerned in the active management of the affairs of the Plantation. In 1673 and 1674, he served as constable (9), a position of considerable respectability. On March 30, 1675, he was appointed Clerk of Writs by the Hampshire County court (10) and in 1675, he was a selectman of Brookfield (11).

His military status was that of Second Sergeant in the local detachment, under command of First Sergeant John Ayres. It was this capacity that he was to go to his death at the ambush on August 2, 1675.

Some insight into the other activities of Mr. Prichard during residence at Quaboag can be gained by studying his accounts with John Pynchon. The major commercial enterprise in any community of that period was always the grist mill. Things were not different at Quaboag, and when John Pynchon decided to build a mill for the convenience of the planters, and for his profit, he listed the services of the men of the Plantation. William Prichard was instrumental in building the mill house and in other aspects of this project, since he was paid over 11 pounds for his interest by Mr. Pynchon (12). Also, in the agreement between John Pynchon and miller John Ayres in November, 1672, there appears a clause specifying "Goodman Prichard having

liberty to grind his own corn only" (13). This was an exclusive privilege granted to no other planter at Quaboag and was probably allowed him because he had served as the first miller in Mr. Pynchon's mill shortly after it was constructed.

Apparently William Prichard did some hunting and trapping in addition to his mill interests, husbandry, and civic activities. On several occasions he and his sons are credited with the killing of wolves and for selling of beaver skins.

That Mr. Prichard was a respected member of the community and enjoyed the confidence of his fellow inhabitants is attested to by the fact that he was chosen to represent them in court in the controversy between Mr. John Younglove and the inhabitants in June of 1672 (14). On March 30, 1675, he again appeared in the County court, but this time was a witness to the "reviling speeches" against Samuel Kent by Thomas Wilson (15). In his official capacity of selectman of Brookfield, he appeared before Magistrate Pynchon on June 18, 1675 to answer to the charges that he had unlawfully ordered the Constable to distrein some pewter dishes of John Ayres, in an action of Replevy (16). There was no conclusive settlement of this case.

Of the vital records of the Prichards during their stay at Quaboag, we have the following. On September 19, 1672, Mary Prichard was married to Judah Trumble by Magistrate Pynchon (17). On August 2, 1675, William Sr. was killed at the ambush in New Braintree. Samuel died soon after, during the siege, when the Indians captured him outside of the fortified house, decapitated him and mounted his head on a pole.

The loss of her husband and son must have dealt a disastrous blow to widow Prichard. After the relief of the siege, the Prichards removed to Suffield where some of them were to become prominent inhabitants. The household now consisted of Mary, age 23 wife of Judah Trumble; unmarried daughters, Esther 21, Elizabeth 19 and Sarah 13; and son Joseph, age 17.

On March 26, 1676, the inventory of the estate of William Prichard (erroneously called John) was presented to the court, but "the widow not appearing in court, it is left till some other convenient time to be settled according to law" (18). About one year later, on March 6, 1676-7, John Prichard signed an agreement with John Pynchon for the settlement of his father's account (19).

er to 1696, a portion of the Prichard estate at Brookfield was to Hezekiah Dickenson of Hatley, who sold in 1693 to **Benjamin** of Hatfield, the home lot and 55 acres, the future of Jennings Tavern. In 1690, John of Topsfield and Joseph mesbury, sold the remaining portion of the estate of William and Samuel to their brother William Jr. of Suffield. And so the story of the Prichards of Brookfield until the second ment when Joseph acquired a grant in 1718. Details of the r are found below in the biography of Joseph.

The last named John (the Third) and Martha had 12 children: Paul, baptized June, 1729; Sarah baptized July 19, 1730; David, baptized, August 29, 1731; Martha baptized April 29, 1733; Han- nah baptized May 18, 1735; Patience, baptized April 30, 1738; John baptized May 29, 1744; Lydia (twin) baptized December 7, 1746; Priscilla (twin) baptized December 7, 1746; Mary baptized October 16, 1748; Huldah, baptized October 28, 1750; and Eunice, baptized June 7, 1752 (27).

Paul, above mentioned, the eldest son of John the Third and Martha, had for a wife Hannah, who bore him eight children, all born at Boxford; Amos, born August 25, 1752; Jeremiah, born September 24, 1754; Perley, born June 11, 1757; William, born September 19, 1759; Sarah, born April 17, 1762; Hannah, born March 8, 1764; John, born March 25, 1766; and Benjamin baptized October 1, 1769 (28).

David, above, married Dorothy Averell at Topsfield on Novem- ber 8, 1752. He "died in Ye war-1756." She died January 30, 1822 age 89. Their children were Dorothy who was baptized November 25, 1753 and died November 13, 1756; and Eli baptized Decem- ber 7, 1755 and died January 11, 1756 (29).

2. *William Jr.* was the second son of William Sr. and was born at Ipswich about 1648. He came to Brookfield with his father in 1665 and may have removed to Suffield prior to 1673, the date of the Petition for the Incorporation of Brookfield. Like his brother John, his name does not appear on that document.

We find him definitely at Suffield on March 6, 1677-8 when he purchased a lot from John Pynchon. The actual purchase could have been made sometime prior to this. On November 10, 1679, William Jr. was paid for mill work at Suffield by John Pynchon (30). In 1679, the committee for Suffield granted him 50 acres on Feather Street and on December 25, 1685, an additional 4 acres of swamp land adjoining his lot (31).

William Jr. married Elizabeth Allen of Suffield on November 14, 1683. She died January 16, 1684 and he married secondly,
