

Light and Colors.

It is now the general conclusion of scientists that light is simply the result of vibrations, or waves, which occur in a hypothetical substance known ns the ether, a substance supposed to permente all space and all objects and to be coextensive with the universe. According to this theory, when the ether is caused to vibrate at a certain rate it gives rise to the sensation of light in proportion to the rate of vibration, or, in other words, the waveare produced, red having the longest wave length and violet the shortest ware length of any of the colors-that is, there are more waves or vibrations in a given time in the case of violet than in the case of red light.
