

PREFACE

To the Descendants of Eleazer Richardson:

In presenting this brief memorial of Eleazer Richardson to his descendants I am fully aware of its imperfections.

It is believed to be nearly, if not quite, accurate as far as it goes; but there may be omissions of some facts that are unknown to the writer. It has been my aim to gather and crystallize into printed form the fast perishing fragments of our family history that they may be "preserved unto us and to our children."

To those who have kindly assisted me in my researches, I wish to express my sincere thanks and appreciation.

Many have contributed their mite, but I wish especially to mention my esteemed aunt. Mrs. Bedee (Richardson) Broughton, who assisted by her daughter, Mrs. Eva (Broughton) Potter, both of Oswego, N. Y., have brought from memory's storehouse, and placed at my' disposal, some genealogical matter concerning the generations of Eleazer and his son Azel which otherwise would have been difficult to obtain. To Dr. Joel H. Greene, of Dubuque, Iowa, I am deeply indebted for much interesting information. Thanks are also due to Rosell L. Andrew Crocker, first child of Azel W. and Martha Slocum) Richardson, was born November 3, 1820, at Cornwall, Vt. In early manhood he accompanied a band of Mormons traveling as far west as Cleveland, Ohio. There he left his traveling companions, and engaged in rading with the settlers along the Cuyahoga River by coading a boat with provisions and calling at different corts. He accumulated the sum of thirteen hundred collars in gold, and formed a partnership with two other men, (one a Mr. Johnson). In the summer of 1851, he died of cholera, aged thirty-one years. One of his partners lied at the same time. He never married.

Amarilla Zoviah, second child of Azel W. and Martha (Slocum) Richardson was born June 11, 1822, at Cornwall, Vt. At the age of eighteen she was baptized and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church at Orwell, N. Y., and later transferred membership to the Methodist Episcopal Church, Sandy Creek, N. Y. On April 22, 1849, she was married by the Rev. Joshua Freeman to Francis Whitmore Baker, son of William and Harmony (Newton) Baker, of Richland, N. Y. She was a tailoress by trade. She died at Lacona, N. Y., March 22, 1900, aged 78 years. Her husband, Francis W. Baker, was born at Vernon, Hartford County, Conn., August 23, 1824, and settled with his parents at Richland, N. Y., in 1844. Francis W. and Amarilla (Richardson) Baker resided at Richland, N. Y., until 1867, when they removed

to Lacona, N. Y. In June, 1861, he enlisted as a private in the 24th Regiment, N. Y. Vols. Co. G, under Capt. William Ferguson; and served in the army of the Potomac under McClellan. He was honorably discharged July, 1863, having served two years. He died at Lacona, N. Y., May 15, 1903, aged seventy-eight years and nine months.

Francis W. and Amarilla (Richardson) Baker had

Y., and was a tailoress by trade. She was married at Pulaski, N. Y., February 22, 1849, by the Rev. Thomas Salmon, pastor of the First Congregational Church, of Richland, N. Y., to John Lucas Nichols; she died in Sandy Creek, N. Y., April 4, 1884. John Lucas Nichols, son of Thomas B. and Susanna (Lucas) Nicholas, was born at Sandy Creek, N. Y., July 21, 1818, and died at the same place May 16, 1896. He enlisted July 31, 1862, in Co. E, N. Y. Vols., 147th Infantry, and was honorably discharged March 26, 1863, on surgeon's certificate of disability.

24, 1828. He married January 29, 1852, at Sandy Creek, N. Y., Isabel, daughter of James and Mary (Smith) Rogers of that town. They resided successively in Richland, Sandy Creek and Camden, N. Y., for the first few years after their marriage, finally returning to Richland about 1863-4, where they resided the remainder of their lives. He was employed for many years by the Rome, Watertown & Ogdensburg Railroad Company, but later, engaged in farming, and continued in that occupation until his death. He died in Richland, N. Y., January 4, 1894. His wife, Isabel, died at the same place, August 18, 1904, and both are buried there.

Musgrave, an Episcopal rector of New York City, to Darius Clark, son of Urial and Oril (Barber) Broughton of Hamden, Delaware County, N. Y., where he was born August 12, 1830. He went to Orwell, N. Y., in 1848. They resided at Richlaud, N. Y., until 1872, when they removed to Oswego, N. Y., with their family, where she still resides. On March 10, 1912, she and her husband celebrated their sixtieth wedding anniversary at the home of their daughter, Mrs. Eva R. Potter. She was baptized and united with Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church, Oswego, N. Y., October 29, 1882. She is a member of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society. While her husband was in the Civil War, she really endured the hardships of a good soldier, caring

for her family and farm. She excelled in needlework. On August 29, 1862, he enlisted in Co. C, 147th Regiment, N. Y. Vols., and was honorably discharged at Army Hospital, Philadelphia, Pa., January 3, 1865. He died February 4, 1913, at the home of his daughter, Eva R. Potter, in Oswego, N. Y., and was buried in Evergreen Cemetery, Orwell, N. Y.

Darius C. and Bedee O. (Richardson) Broughton had five children:

Eleazer Gilbert, sixth child of Azel W. and Martha (Slocum) Richardson, graduated from Mexico Academy, Mexico, N. Y., and taught school at Pineville, (Salmon River, P. O.) Oswego County, N. Y. He went to North Carolina, and had taught there five years when the Civil War began. He was then impressed into the Confederate service. At the bombardment of Elizabeth City he escaped. An old negro piloted him to the outskirts of the city. He went alone to the wharf and, on the way, rebel pickets passed him; but he threw himself close to a fence, and they passed without observing him. He stole a boat which was anchored at the wharf and rowed out to Burnside's fleet, and finally reached New York. He wrote his father who at that time lived in Castile, N. Y., and money was sent him for his journey home. Soon after returning North, he married a southern girl who was living in Castile; afterward, being in poor health, he entered Lafayette. Ind., Water Cure and subsequently became a member

Descent of Raymond J. Porter from SAMUEL ROGERS, JR. Soldier in the American Revolution.

Samuel Rogers, Sr. was born 20 Jan 1718/9, place unknown at this time. He married Captivity Peters 22 Jun 1742 in Sturbridge, Worcester, Massachusetts. She was born 22 Jan 1722, place also unknown at this time. I don't know if her real name was Captivity, or if that was a nickname. I've never seen any other name in the records for her. Samuel, Sr. died 28 May 1805 at the age of 86, and Captivity died 16 May 1810 at the age of 88, both in Washington County, New York.

The birth dates and death dates are from the first of two Rogers family Bibles that were extracted by the Oneida, New York Chapter of the NSDAR and were published in their Volume XXXIII "Bible, Church, and Court House Records, 1795-1925." It appears on GS Film 1435718, Item 3. Copies of prints from the film are enclosed. The marriage date and place are from *Vital Records of Sturbridge, Massachusetts to the Year 1850*, published by the New England Historic Genealogical Society in 1906. Copies of the relevant pages for this event and others to be mentioned are also enclosed. The place of death is from census and land records.

The birth of Samuel Rogers, Jr. is not recorded in the town records, but is calculated to be in Jan 1754 from the death date and age at death in the family Bible. His marriage to Rachel Hibbard, daughter of Jonathan Hibbard and Experience Warfield, of Dudley, Worcester, Massachusetts on 6 Feb 1775 in Dudley is recorded in the town records of both towns. It is not clear whether the date is the marriage date or the date intentions were filed. Rachel was born 8 Aug 1751 in Dudley. Her birth is recorded in the town records.

The military service of Samuel Rogers, Jr. in the American Revolution is recorded in Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War, A Compilation from the Archives, Prepared and Published by the Secretary of the Commonwealth (1896). The record shows that he was drafted to serve a term of nine months from the time of his arrival in Fishkill, that he was mustered 15 May 1778 in Colonel Holman's Regiment of the Continental Army from Sturbridge, and that he arrived in Fishkill 7 Jun 1778. He is described as being 24 years old, of fair complexion, and 5 ft. 11 in. tall. The age given agrees with the date of birth (Jan 1754) calculated above.

There are several other entries in the book for Samuel Rogers, but all but one of them can be eliminated for one reason or another. The one exception is the entry at the bottom of page 520 for Samuel Rogers in Colonel Holman's Regiment; enlisted 10 Dec 1776; discharged 28 Dec 1776; service 22 days, at Providence, Rhode Island, including three days (52 miles) travel home.

Two facts strongly suggest that this entry is also for a Samuel Rogers of Sturbridge: Colonel Holman's Regiment was from Sturbridge, and the distance from Providence to Sturbridge is exactly 52 miles by the most direct route in my Road Atlas. The question is, which Samuel Rogers? Both men were of age to serve; Samuel was 57 in 1776, and Samuel, Jr. was 22. The fact that Samuel, Jr. almost invariably appears in the records as "Jr." until after his father died might suggest that this service was for Samuel, Sr., but I can't be sure.

The births of two of Samuel, Jr.'s children are recorded in the Sturbridge town records. Edverdum was born 25 Oct 1775, and Alfred was born 6 May 1778. These dates agree with the family Bible except for the transposed year for Alfred, which is questioned in the extract of the Bible. Three other children; Samuel III, Roxanna, and Rufus; are not recorded in the Sturbridge records. This is the only place where I have found Edverdum's real name. In all other records he is known as "Verdy," or some spelling variant of that name.

Both Samuel and Samuel, Jr. migrated from Sturbridge to the Town of Columbia, Washington County, New York some time before 1800, perhaps in concert with other (related?) families. On 21 Feb 1800, Samuel Rogers (Jr.) and his wife, Rachel, recorded a mortgage from one Thomas Empee in that town. [Bowman, Fred Q. Landholders of Northeastern New York, 1739-1832. Baltimore: GPC, 1983] Both families appear in the 1800 Federal Census in the Town of Cambridge. Samuel and Captivity are living alone; Samuel, Jr. and Rachel are living with their three sons and one daughter. (Rufus died young.)

Verdy Rogers married 3 Jan 1805 Phebe Baker, daughter of Thomas Baker and Mary Carswell of Salem, Washington County, New York. Phebe was born 2 Nov 1778, probably in Colrain, Hampshire County (now Franklin County), Massachusetts. I have been unable to locate any record of their marriage, or of the births of Phebe or of any of their children, except in the family Bibles previously referenced.

James Rogers was born 16 Sep 1805 in Washington County, New York. In the 1810 census, Samuel Rogers, Sr. had died (28 May 1805), and Samuel, Jr. was living near his sons Verdy and Samuel in the Town of Hebron. I don't know if the change in location was the result of resettlement or just the redrawing of town lines, which was very common at that time.

In 1816, the Rogers and Baker families migrated to Richland, Oneida County (now Sandy Creek, Oswego County), New York, probably together and with others. They settled near each other, and on 23 July 1817 Thomas and Mary Baker, Verdy and Phebe Rogers, Nathaniel Baker, Sally Baker, and Polly Baker, along with Allen McLean and George Harding were founding members of the First Congregational Church of Sandy Creek [History of Oswego County, New York. Philadelphia: 1877, p. 380].

James Rogers married 4 Jan 1827 Mary Smith, probably the daughter of Levi Smith of Lorraine, Jefferson County, New York. There is no record of this marriage, nor the births of any of their children except in the family Bibles.

Eliza Rogers, daughter of James and Mary Rogers, was born 20 Feb 1828 in Sandy Creek. She married, date unknown, Van Rensselaer Porter in Sandy Creek. There is no record of this marriage. This region was a wilderness being tamed at the time, and no vital records were kept.

James died intestate 14 Feb 1848, at the age of 42, so there is no will or census record to identify his children. However, his widow lived until 16 Apr 1893, and appears in all of the censuses with her children and, occasionally, grandchildren. Her death notice, funeral notice, and obituary appeared in the Sandy Creek News for 20 April 1893. Her obituary (copy attached) states that she was born in 1808 in Vermont, that she moved with her parents to Lorraine at the age of six, and that she married James Rogers at the age of 18. It further states that her children were Mrs. Eliza Porter, deceased, Mrs. Isabel Richardson, and LeRoy Rogers. All of these facts agree with those in the family Bible records.

Further evidence is provided that Eliza Rogers is the daughter of James Rogers and the granddaughter of Verdy Rogers by the probate records of Verdy Rogers (copies attached), who died 2 Apr 1849. In them Van Rensselaer Porter and his wife Eliza are identified as heirs of Verdy Rogers, and Eliza is identified as the daughter of his son, James, deceased.

My descent from Van Rensselaer Porter and Eliza Rogers is detailed and documented in my original application for membership in the NSSAR, which has been accepted. My National number is 118472.

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EXCERPTS FROM SANDY CREEK, NY NEWSPAPERS

These newspaper excerpts were taken from from microfilms in the Annie Porter Ainsworth Memorial Library between 26 Sep and 3 Oct 1989, with the assistance of Margaret Kastler, Librarian and Marie Parsons, Town Historian. Lacking a microfilm printer, they were read into a tape recorder and transcribed, resulting in unavoidable differences from the original punctuation and paragraphing. All are from the Sandy Creek News, now defunct.

The files are on forty reels of microfilm and extend from 1862 to 1864 for the Sandy Creek Times and from 1871 to Mar 4, 1985 for the Sandy Creek News. Many issues are missing in the early years, and no record was found of several events that were sought. There were many more references to the Porter and allied families in these files, but time did not permit extracting them all. The files were scanned issue-by-issue until the end of 1895, when time became short. After that, the files were searched for records of events with known dates only. No doubt, there are many more interesting records remaining to be extracted.

(This printout contains only those extracts pertaining to the death of Mary Smith Rogers.)

Mrs. Mary Rogers died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Heman [sic] Richardson in Richland, New York April 16, 1893, aged 85 years. The funeral was held in the M.E. Churah at Richland Tuesday afternoon, Rev. Mr. Hancock officiating.

Mrs. Rogers was born in Vermont in 1808. At the age of six, she with her parents, moved to Lorraine, New York. At the age of eighteen, she was married to James Rogers and went to housekeeping in Sandy Creek, where she lived until eight years ago, when she went to Richland to live with her daughter. Three children were born to them, Mrs. Eliza Porter, deceased, Mrs. Isabel Richardson, and Leroy Rogers. She was left a widow some thirty years ago.

She has been a member of the Congregational Church in Sandy Creek ever since it was organized, and she was a good Christian woman, respected and loved by her friends and neighbors. For years she has been an invalid and a great, though patient, sufferer. During the past winter, she has been uncommonly well for her until about a week ago, when she had an attack of pleurisy. Her grandson, Doctor Richardson succeeded in quelling that and then erysipelas set in. Doctor Box was called, but could not save her, and on Sunday morning she ceased to breathe. Interrment at Sandy Creek beside her husband.

Dear Mr. Porter,

I just read your query in the Feb.-Mar. issue of Nexus about John Rogers. I can't answer your question but perhaps you could answer mine. I have a Jonathan Foskett born in Charlestown, Mass. 12 Nov 1703. He died in Sturbridge, Mass. 1 Nov 1764. He married in Medford, Mass. Hannah Crouch on 9 June 1724. They lived in Grafton awhile and then in Sturbridge. They had these children: Jonathan b. 10 Aug 1724; Nathan b. 9 Apr. 1733; d. 31 June 1753; Mary b. 17 Feb 1735/6; d. 16 June 1744 and Caleb b. 18 June 1739;d. 18 June 1739. Jonathan left a will and he names wife Hannah, son Jonathan, grandsons Joshua and Daniel, under 21; granddaus Esther and Elizabeth Foskett; wife's son Samuel Rogers; my wife's grandsons Caleb and Moses Rogers. Do you have anything like this in your Rogers family? His widow Hannah was probably the Widow Fosket who d. Stafford, Ct. 30 Apr 1782 age 83 years.

Thank you for your reply to my query. I don't quite know what to make of your information. It appears that there could be a connection to my Rogers line, but I'm not sure.

I will enclose a copy of my (not quite up to date) FGS for Samuel Rogers, Sr. He married 22 Jun 1742, at Sturbridge, Captivity Peters, daughter of Henry and Captivity (Jennings) Bartlett Peters. Captivity Jennings was born in Canada 14 Mar 1678 while in captivity. The famous story of the capture of the captives and their subsequent ransom by Benjamin Waite and Stephen Jennings is told and retold in all of the histories of the western Massachusetts towns of the era. The fact that she married Henry Peters after her first husband, Abijah Bartlett, was killed by Indians is not in the histories, but I have ample evidence to document it.

I have no vital records of a daughter named Captivity born to Henry and Captivity, but she is named in deeds from her mother and her marriage to Samuel Rogers is recorded in the Rogers family bible. This Samuel Rogers (he had a son Samuel also) is the "dead end" of my Rogers line and is the one who I was trying to get information on in my query.

On 11 May 1757, the family of Samuel and Captivity Rogers of Charlton were warned out of Brookfield. Named among their children were Caleb and Moses. Four of the children named in the warning, including Caleb and Moses, have not been found in any of the vital records of the area. The Rogers Bible names only son Samuel and his descendants, so is of no help.

Since Captivity Rogers survived until 1810, Caleb and Moses could not have been from a second wife of Samuel, but they could have been from a first wife, and Captivity would then be Samuel's second wife.

Your extract of the will of Jonathan Foskett mentions his wife's son, Samuel Rogers. I construe this to mean that his wife married [-----] Rogers before she married Foskett and they had a son, Samuel Rogers before [------] Rogers died; and that Jonathan then married Hannah (Crouch) Rogers 9 Jun 1724. Presumably Samuel and [------] Rogers had sons Caleb and Moses Rogers before the date of Jonathan's will. That date was not in your letter, but had to be before 1 Nov 1764.

My Samuel Rogers, Sr. was born 20 Jan 1718/9; place unknown. He was born about five years before the Foskett-Crouch marriage, which makes it possible that he was the son of [-----] and Hannah Rogers and that Hannah married Foskett after Rogers died. You didn't give me any dates to test this hypothesis against.

While writing this, I looked through my file of Worcester Co. deeds and found a deed from Samuel Rogers (Jr. or Sr.?) to Jonathan Foskett, Jr. for land formerly belonging to Jonathan Foskett, Sr., which land had been sold at vendue to Samuel Rogers. While this does not establish a clear connection between the Rogers and Foskett families, it does add a circumstantial link to the above hypothesis.

I have no birthdates for four of the children in the warning: Mary, Lucy, Caleb, and Moses, and they are not mentioned as children of Samuel and Captivity in the Rogers Bible. They all could be children of a first wife. The girls, if Hannah's grandchildren, may have died or been married

and so were not included in Jonathan's will. However, Samuel Rogers was only about twenty-three when he married Captivity, so it is unlikely that he could have had more than two children by a supposed first wife.

I think that we definitely have something here worth exploring. I am leaving tomorrow for a research trip in the East and will work further on this when I am in the Sturbridge area. This may be the breakthrough I've been looking for years in the Rogers line (or it may be just a "flash in the pan"). It looks like we might be half-cousins of some degree.

I'm enclosing copies of my Rogers FGS, the warning, and the Rogers-Foskett deed. If you have any more detail on what you sent me, I would appreciate receiving it so I don't have to do it over. Don't delay writing because I'm on a trip; my mail will be forwarded to me. My replies may be delayed by circumstances, but I will eventually reply.
