SMITH(2) TRUMBULL, son of JAMES and MALINDA COVEN TRUMBULL, married HARRIETT TUCKER, and settled on a farm in New Centerville, N.Y. He enlisted Srpt. 26, 1861, as a private in Capt. Wilber F. Raymond's Co. B. 7th Regiment of N.Y. Cavalry, from which he was discharged Mar. 31, 1862. He re-enlisted Dec. 30, 1863 in Capt. Burch's Co. g, 24th N.Y. Cavalry. Capt. Burgh was an uncle by marriage of ISRAEL E. BALDWIN, who would later marry SMITH'S daughter ALICE. Both SMITH and Capt. Burch were killed at the siege of Petersburg, Virginia. On June 26, 1864, SMITH was wounded in the left elbow. Infection set in, and on June 28, his arm was amoutated just below the elbow. On July 14, he wrote to his wife that he was feeling well and the wound was healing. On M July 17, the hospital at Alexandria, Va. sent her a letter to come in all possible haste if she wished to see her husband alive. She left for Alexandria the morning of the 20th, but she was too late; he died at 6:13 P.M., on the 19th of M July. He was buried before she arrived in Alexandria. His grave is number 2426 in the Federal Cemetery in Alexandria.

ALICE CLEORA TRUMBULL see following saction

Elinor Malinda Trumbull, named for her two grandmothers, was born June 1, 1851. When her father enlisted in the army, she went to live with her maternal grandparents, JOSEPH and ELINOR STUYVESANT TUCKER, in Sandy Creek. When she was ten years old, she was stricken with rheumatic fever, which at that time was called inflammatory rheumatism. It left her with an affliction of the heart from which she never recovered, and she died Dec. 24, 1867, at the age of sixteen.

Cora Tryphena Trumbull was born Aug. 19, 1853. After her father's death in 1864, she lived for a time with the Campbells, relatives by marriage of the Trumbulls. In 1867 she went to Wisconsin, to live with her aunt, Ann Trumbull Ingersoll. In 1895, she married James Hedding. There were no children. She died in 1942.

Elmer Eugene Trumbull was born in New Centerville, N.Y. In 1877, when he was 21 years old, he went West and took up a claim near Millard, Barton County, Kansas. He died of typhoid fever Oct. 19, 1880.

Cora Trumbull Baldwin

ALICE, daughter of SMITH and HARRIETT TUCKER TRUMBULL, was born in New Centerville, N.Y. In 1861, when her father enlisted in the Army, she went to live with her Uncle Edmund and Aunt Mary Tucker Felch on a farm near North Bay, on Oneida Lake. She lived there until the death of her sister, Elinor Malinda Trumbull, on Dec. 24, 1867. She then lived with her maternal grandparents, JOSEPH and ELINOR STUYVESANT TUCKER, who were in poor health. Her diaries were written in 1867 and 1868. ALICE went to school while in Sandy Creek; her teacher was a man named Blanchard. ALICE married ISRAEL BALDWIN Apr. 23, 1877. He worked as a carpenter in Sandy Creek. Their first child was six weeks old when they moved to Jamesville, N.Y., where he obtained employment in the construction of the Cortwright Hotel. They lived in Jamesville the rest of their lives, except for a few years when ISRAEL worked as a foreman in the I. A. Weston bicycle factory in Syracuse. When gy the bicycle factory went out of business, they moved back to Jamesville. In 1913, ISRAEL built a camp on Seeber Shore, Sandy Pond. From then until about 1922, ALICE spent all summer every year at the camp with one or more of her grandchildren. She died April 5, 1925.
