CALPHORNA W. AMES & LUCETIA HEDGER, WITNESSES

State of New York County of Oswego On this
27th day of June AD eighteen hundred and Seventy three
personally appeared before me N. J. Shelley a Justice
of the peace in and for said County and State above
Elizabeth Covey a resident of Sandy Creek Oswego
County New York who being duly sworn according to
law, declares that she is aged 85 years, that she
is very infirm and unable to travel at all, that
she lives 21 miles from the office of any Judge or
clerk of a court of Record and is totally unable to
go to any such office and is pecuniarily unable
to hire any such Judge or clerk to visit her for
the purpose of making this declaration and therefore
she makes this her declaration before the above named
Justice of the peace, pursuant to "Section 21 of the Act
to revise Consolidate & amend the laws relating to pensions
passed Approved March 3rd 1873. She further declares that she
is the widow of Benjamin Covey who served the full
period of Sixty days and more in the military service
of the United States in the war of 1812-14 and who
was the identical Benjamin Covey who was drafted
as a private in Captain John Dunning's Company in
the Regiment Commanded by Lt Col M Smith of
New York Militia at Staten Island New York on or
about the 7th day of Sept 1814 and was honorably
discharged from said Service at Staten Island New York
on or about the 16th day of December A.D 1814. that he
Served in defense of said Staten Island New York

that she was married under the name of Elizabeth
Hedger to said Benjamin Corey on the 19th day of October
A.D. 1806 by Daniel S. Gowler at Tonawanda Co. New York
there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that her
said husband died at Sandy Creek on the 15th day of
February A.D. 1865, and that she has not remarried
since his death; that at no time during the late rebellion
against the authority of the United States did she or her
said husband adhere to the cause of the enemies of the
Government, giving them aid or comfort or exercise the
functions of any office whatever ~~under any~~ authority
or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States;
that she will support the Constitution of the United States;
that she is not in receipt of a pension under any
previous act; that she makes this declaration for the
purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the
United States, under the provisions of the Act approved
February 14 1871 and hereby constitutes and appoints
with full power of substitution and revocation James

Shelly a Justice of the Peace in and for said County personally appeared Calvin Parish a resident of Orwell Oswego County New York a person whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit and being by me duly sworn says that he is 72 years of age, that he has been well acquainted with Benjamin Coey and his wife Elizabeth for the last 66 years past that his first acquaintance with them was at Boston Corners Berkshire County Massachusetts which place has been since incorporated in County of Columbia New York. That deponent has distinct recollection of going to school to Elizabeth Coey in the year AD 1807 deponent was then 6 or 7 years of age and Mrs Coey had been married to her husband Benjamin at that time about a year. That deponent distinctly remembers that said Benjamin and Elizabeth Coey then in the year 1807 lived together as man and wife and were so reputed by every one. deponent remembers nothing of their marriage but was not present. deponent and said Benjamin and Elizabeth lived near each other from the last above date (1807) until as far as deponent remembers about the year AD 1820 when Benjamin & his wife Elizabeth removed to Oswego County New York. and during all that time deponent knows that Benjamin and wife



Elizabeth lived and cohabitated together as man and wife, that in the year AD 1834 deponent himself removed to Sandy Creek Oswego County New York, and soon after that time within a few months he visited said Benjamin and his wife Elizabeth at their house and found them living as man and wife and in same year AD 1834 he deponent settled in same town with the Covays and have so resided in same neighborhood ever since deponent has had continuous acquaintance and intercourse with said Benjamin and Elizabeth since the year AD 1834 up to the death of said Benjamin which occurred about the year 1865 as near as deponent now recollects and deponent is positive that they lived together as man and wife during that whole period, and further that since said Benjamins death he has had the continuous acquaintance as a near neighbor with Elizabeth Covay and that she is now the widow of said Benjamin and has not again married since his death, that had she married deponent would certainly know it, that she has been nearly blind for a number of years and is quite infirm and crippled and has been so for last 10 or 12 years, further that deponent has distinct and perfect knowledge of the facts above stated, further that he has no interest either direct or indirect in the prosecution of the


