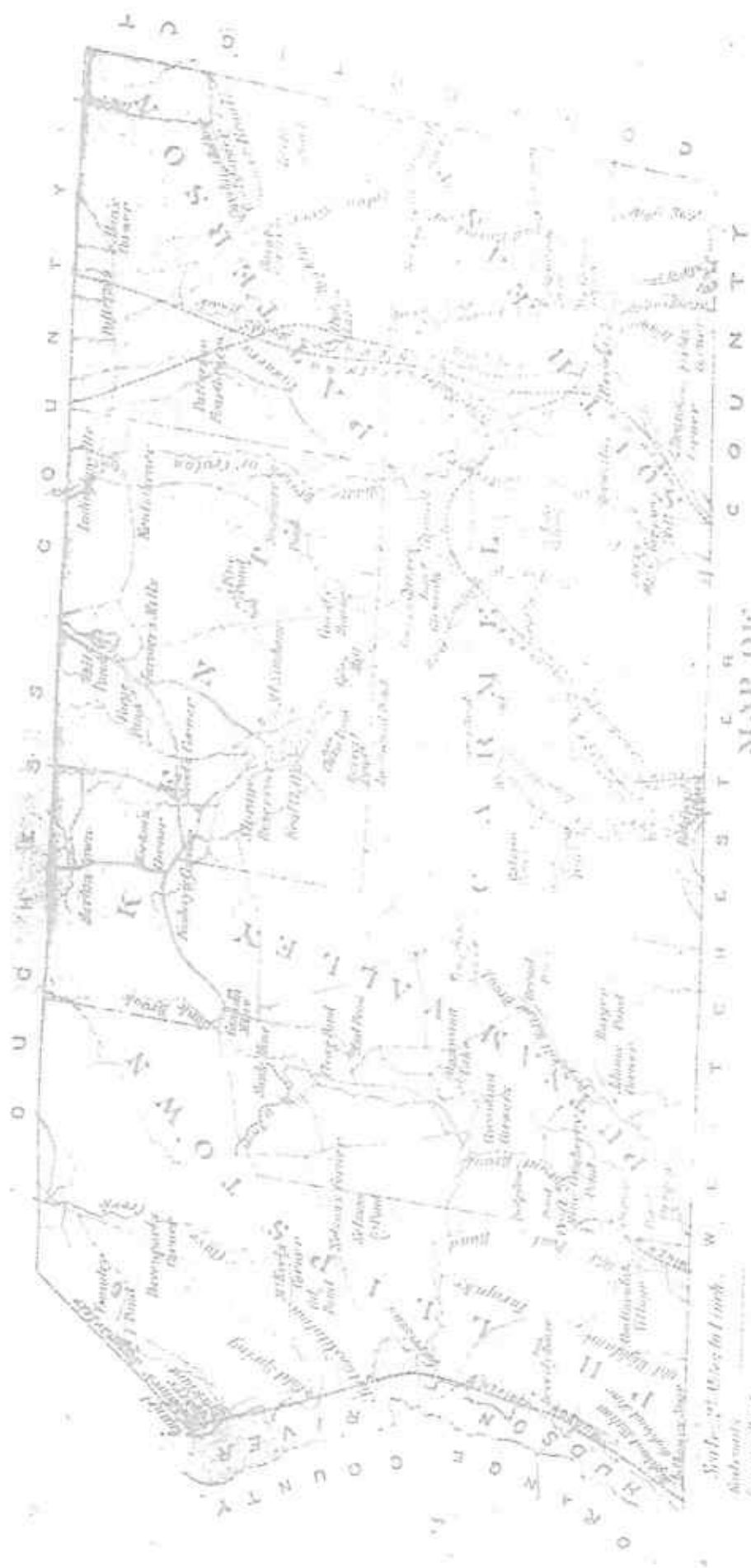

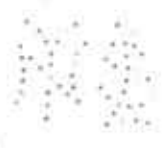
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MAP OF PUTNAM COUNTY

PUTNAM COUNTY

Putnam County was formed from Dutchess County, June 12, 1812. It lies upon the Hudson River, between Dutchess and Westchester Counties, and extends east to the Connecticut boundary line. It was named from Major General Israel Putnam, who was stationed in the County a part of the time during the Revolutionary War.

In the Act of December 16, 1777, passed by the Colonial Assembly, the county was styled South Precinct; on March 24, 1778, it was subdivided into Southeast, Fredericksburgh, and Philips Precincts. The first of these precincts included the present towns of Southeast and Patterson, the second Carlisle and Kent, and the third Putnam Valley and Philipstown.

Putnam County contains 254 square miles. A strip of land, 580 rods wide along the east border of the county constituted a part of the "Oblong" Tract, patented by Thomas Hawley and his associates, June 8, 1751. The remaining part of the county, and a small part of Dutchess County, were included in the great Highland Patent of Adolph Philipse.

The Philipse Patent was granted June 17, 1697, to Adolph Philipse, a merchant of New York, who died, in 1749, without issue, leaving his estate to his nephew, Frederick Philipse. The latter had five children, - Frederick, Philip, Susannah, Mary, and Margaret. By his will, dated June 6, 1751, Frederick was disinherited, and Margaret dying young, the property was equally divided among the remaining three. Philip left a widow, who married one Ogilvie; Susannah married Beverly Robinson; and Mary married Colonel Roger Morris.

On the 7th of February 1754, the patent was divided into nine lots; three, each four miles square, bordering upon the Hudson and denominated "water lots"; three, each four miles wide by twelve miles long, extending north and south across the patent, and denominated "long lots"; and three, each four miles square, upon the east border, denominated "back lots". Philip, Susannah, and Mary Philipse each owned one of each kind of lots.

At the time of the Revolution this patent was owned by Philip Philipse, and Mary and Susannah, wives of Colonel Roger Morris and Beverly Robinson, of the British army. Morris and Robinson, together with their wives, were attainted, and their property was confiscated and sold by the Commissioners of Forfeiture. When Morris and Robinson and their wives were attainted, their property was sold, chiefly to former tenants.

The State Legislature, on October 22, 1779, passed "An Act for the Forfeiture and Sale of the Estates of Persons who adhered to the Enemies of this State, etc." On March 10, 1780, a law was passed directing the Commissioners of Forfeitures to sell property attainted at auction. It seems that formal deeds were given to the various purchasers, many of which have been put on record in the offices of the Clerks of both Putnam and Dutchess Counties, and Abstracts were entered in Liber 8 of Deeds.

Lot No. 1: There were in 1777, 17 tenants who rented 5250 acres of land for which they paid \$ 135:15:0 Currency Rent. Besides which he had a farm of 1500 acres in his own hands, making together 4750 acres. The remaining 5254 acres were untenanted. Every Man had his Farm House and many of them orchards. He believes that two thirds of the tenanted lands were under cultivation. The unsettled land on Lot No.1 was not all in one body but intermixed with the settled land. Part of it was rocky and unfit for settlement, and parts were very good. Land valued (settled) average \$ 3 per acre and unsettled 15/ per acre, but Lot No.1 was not so valuable in proportion as Lot No.7, but more valuable in proportion than Lot No.4. He thought the 17 farms were very much underlet. Thought the farms would have paid 3 times the Rent they did and the tenants got good savings off the farms. Tenants on Lot No.1 who had no leases were restricted from cutting any timber except for the use of their own farms. Continental Village was on Lot No.1. Of the 17 tenants none had leases.

Lot No. 4: On this Lot there were 75 tenants, although the Rent Roll mentions only 74, of these 52 farms were under Survey. The Rents were \$291:15:0 per annum. The remaining 23 farms rented for \$62 per annum. The farms were most, if not all under Lease, some for wheat or corn rents, and some for rents in money. Of the 75 tenants most of them under short leases; in general very good farms; great part of them lying in Peaks Kill Hollow and from 4 to 12 miles from Peaks Kill Landing on Hudson's River to which there is good roads. On Lot #4 there were 20 tenants over and above those he mentions, but have not been granted regular leases or entered in his Rent Book. He did not think it right to include them in his list of Tenants.

Lot No. 7: On this lot there were 54 Tenants who rented 9321 acres. 399 acres further were wood lots and on that account, he considered them as being more valuable than if settled. 494 acres which had been let to Alex^r Grant. He gave Grant £ 1000 to buy out his lease and was offered £ 100 per annum for this land, but he declined it, intending it as a settlement for his Son. This Lot separately considered is the most valuable of all. Valued separately it should not have been less than £ 6 or £ 7 per acre.

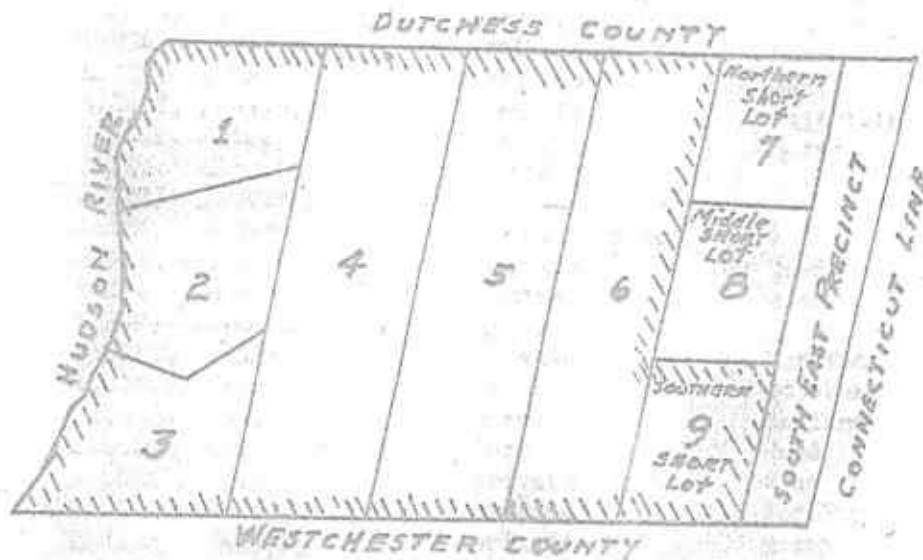

Colonel Ludington and his Regiment were called to the defence of the Hudson at Fishkill, in June 1779, on the alarm caused by the British seizure of Verplanck's Point, and a few days later returned to the vicinity of Crom Pond, to resume the local police work which formed so large a part of their duties. There, before day light of June 24th they were surprised by an attack of about 200 British Cavalry which had made a dash all the way up from New York. Nearly 30 of the Militia were killed and wounded in the sharp skirmish which ensued.

PENSION RECORDS

CAPTAIN GEORGE LANE, died February 16, 1806, at Philipstown, Dutchess County. Abby Hadden, widow of George Lane applied for a pension as a resident of Yorktown, Westchester County, on November 11, 1836, aged 89 years. Captain George Lane commanded a Company of Dutchess County Militia under Colonel Ludington, and resided in Philipstown during the War. Job Austin and Amos Odell made affidavits to Captain Lane's service.

NATHAN LANE, Jr. son of Nathan Lane, Sr., was born October 2, 1749. He married Martha Mills, Martha applied for a pension June 12, 1839. Amos Odell of Putnam County, aged 83 years, on December 26, 1838 swore that he knew Nathan Lane as an Ensign and Lieutenant of the Line under Captain George Lane in 1778.

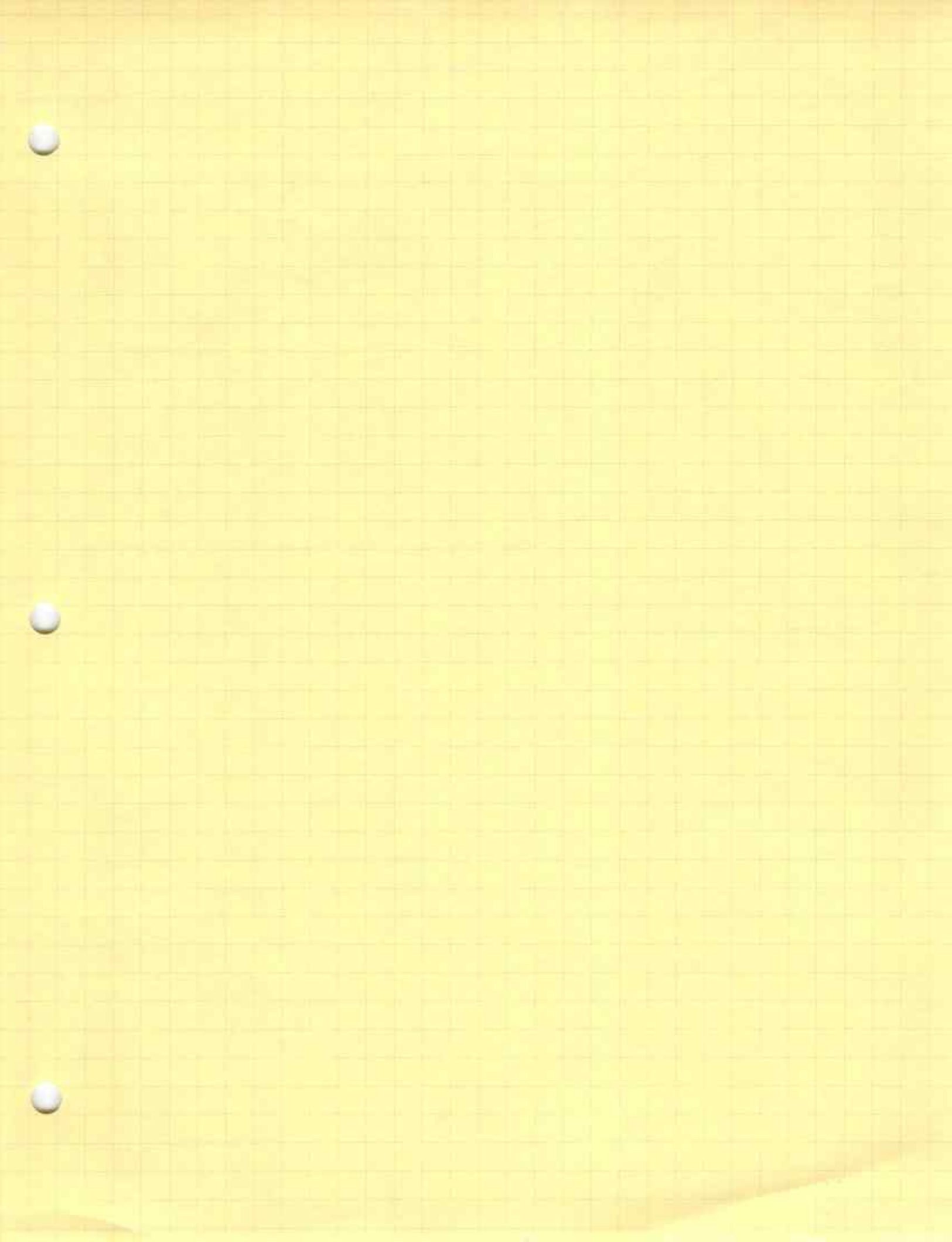
ISAAC POST of Philipstown, born in 1761, at Yorktown, moved to Philipstown, in 1765. On November 17, 1837, Amos Odell of Putnam County, age 82 years, certified that he served with Isaac Post in September 1778, in Captain George Lane's Company, of Colonel Henry Ludington's Regiment.

AMOS ODELL, born in February 1735, in Cortlandt Manor, was placed on the Pension Roll, December 21, 1833, at age of 78 years. He declared in his pension application that he belonged to the "Beat" of Captain George Lane's Company. He was drafted from his beat and served three months in Captain Elijah Townsend's Company, and under Lieutenant Nathaniel Jagger, in Colonel Ludington's Dutchess County Militia. He served at Red Mills, now Mahopae Falls, Putnam County, guarding public stores and prisoners, in spring of 1776. Later in 1776 he went as a substitute for Henry Garman, serving three months in Westchester County under Captain Ephraim Lockwood, and Lieutenant Sackett, in Colonel John Hyatt's Regiment, near White Plains. In Spring of 1777 he served in the Company of Captain Obadiah Bridge and Lieutenant Robert Connelly. He declared that in January 1777, the "Whole county was alarmed, and all the militia was ordered out". He served in Captain Moses Dusenbery's Company, and under Ensign John Dusenbery, a brother of the Captain.

ISAAC ODELL, of Philipstown, born August 15, 1758, served in Captain George Lane's "beat". In 1833, he declared in connection with his brother Amos's application for a pension that he served with his brother in 1776 and 1777.

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FOREWORD

The accompanying records of Philipse Patent (now part of Putnam County), supplement the records compiled by the writer in his "EARLY SETTLERS OF PUTNAM COUNTY, NEW YORK", and released in 1946.

On February 7, 1754, the Philipse Patent was divided into nine lots; three, each four miles square, bordering upon the Hudson River, and called the "water lots"; three, each four miles wide by twelve miles long, extending north and south across the patent and called the "long lots"; and three, each four miles square upon the east border, called the "back lots".

By the Will of Frederick Philipse, dated June 6, 1751, the Patent was divided equally among three heirs, Philip Philipse, who left a widow, that married Rev. John Ogilvie; Susannah Philipse, who married Beverly Robinson; and Mary Philipse, who married Colonel Roger Morris.

Philip, Susannah, and Mary Philipse, each owned one of each kind of the lots mentioned above. Beverly Robinson and wife Susannah owned lots #1, #4, & #7; Roger Morris and wife Mary owned lots #3, #5, & #9; and Philip Philipse and his widow Mary Ogilvie, owned lots #2, #6, & #8.

The earlier compilation of Records appearing in "Early Settlers of Putnam County, New York", relate principally to settlers on the lands of Beverly Robinson and Roger Morris; whereas, the present compilation relate principally to settlers on the lands of Philip Philipse and his widow Mrs. Mary Ogilvie.

The accompanying Philipse Patent records were copied from manuscript material, in the Library of Columbia University, and are known as the Philipse-Couverneur Family Papers.

MINERAL AND MINING RIGHTS OF PHILIPSE MANOR.

"On page 186 of Edward H. Hall's Philipse Manor Hall book(*), in treating of the dissolution of the Manor and the persistence of old manorial rights and customs, he refers to the legal difficulty of eradicating the rights of the Philipse family in real estate acquired over two centuries ago, and to the obstacles which ancient mineral rights presented to the giving of clear titles to real estate within the bounds of certain portions of the old Manor. While the existence of these mineral and mining rights have not affected the title of the State to the Manor Hall property or the relations of Society(†) thereto, it seems appropriate to mention, with a view to completing the history of this phase of the subject, that the Legislature of 1912 passed a law to extinguish the mineral rights of the Philipse heirs in the counties of Putnam and Dutchess. A similar bill was passed by the Legislature of 1911 but was vetoed by Governor Dix. The bill which was enacted in 1912 and received Governor Dix's signature forms chapter 509 of the Laws of 1912 and reads as follows:

An Act to Provide for the Acquisition of the Mineral and Mining Rights of the Heirs of Philip Philipse, in the counties of Putnam and Dutchess, and making an Appropriation therefor.

Became a Law April 18, 1912, with the approval of the Governor.

Passed, three-fifths being present.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY,
DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The commissioners of the land office may, by agreement with the owners, upon such price and terms as they may deem just, not exceeding the sum of two hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000), hereinafter appropriated, acquire title on behalf and in the name of the people of the state, to an outstanding undivided one-third interest of the heirs of Philip Philipse in the mines and minerals in one hundred thousand acres, more or less, of certain lands in the counties of Putnam and Dutchess heretofore sold by the people of this state as forfeited by the attainder of Roger Morris, and Mary, his wife, and Beverly Robinson, and Suzannah his wife, and which lands are included in lands known as lots number one, three, four, five, seven and nine of the division of the Philipse patent, and as described in the partition deeds made February seventh, seventeen hundred and fifty-four, between Philip Philipse and Beverly Robinson, and Suzannah, his wife, of the first part, and Mary Philipse of the second part, to lots numbered three, five and nine, and deed of Philip Philipse and Mary Philipse of the first part (and Beverly Robinson, and Suzannah, his wife, of the second part, to lots numbered one, four and seven, said deeds being recorded in the office of the secretary of this state.

§ 2. Upon the requisition of said commissioners of the land office, and upon a voucher or vouchers, certified by said commissioners or by such officer or officers thereof as they may designate for that purpose, in form to be approved by the comptroller, the comptroller shall pay to the owners the sum or sums that may be necessary to pay for the mining and mineral rights authorized to be acquired by this Act.

§ 3. The sum of two hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, payable by the treasurer out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, is hereby appropriated, subject to the audit of the comptroller, to carry out the provisions of this act, and the same shall be payable by the comptroller on the requisition of said commissioners of the land office.

§ 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
