An interesting bit of legal evidence as to who was who in the very early days of the town of Richland, was disclosed in a certified list of the electors of the township in November, 1807, which S. C. exhibited. Said list of names was compiled for the purpose of determining the electors for the senatorial election of that year. In said time electors possessing senatorial franchise had to be worth \$500. However, an assemblyman could be elected by voters possessing not less than \$100. Quite a few are listed in the column of those renting tenements of at least forty shillings, about \$8. Presumably said gentry voted at the town meetings, so popular in those days, though we cannot say definitely. Among the more munificent of the citizenry—freeholds of \$500—we find the following names: Joseph Chase, Jonathan Roads, Timothy Kellogg, Samnel Vorce, Joseph Spaid, Pliny Jones, Israel Jones, Wm. Smith, Smith Dunlap, John Thorton, Rubin Bennett, Jutica St. John, John Holmes, Robt. Gillespie, Peleg Brown, Dan Eames, Wm. Wales, Jonathan Calkins, Alexander Stinson, John Ingerson, Isaac Lehigh, Benj. Bull, Johnson Bull, Stephen Taylor, John C. Pride, Jeremiah Chaplin, Peter Whiteside.
