D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me, a Justice of Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Mary Porter aged 61 years, a resident of Orwell in said County, in the State of New-York, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Ashtel Porter deceased, who was a teamster in the company commanded by Captain Sumner of the U. States in the year 1813 Regiment of ... commanded by ... in the war with Great Britain, declared June 1812, that he was hired to take a Wagon load of clothing for the Army from Utica to Sackett Harbor by an officer & did take & deliver no return & transport & deliver to ... a load as directed, & that he also took a load of tar, pitch, & small staves from Utica in both ways, & transported to ... that her said husband the Mary year ... at said port for U.S. on or about the ... day of ... A. D. 1813 ... 10 to 12 days each for the term of 20 or 24 days ... and continued in actual service in said war for the term of the same and was honorably discharged at Sackett Harbor, & paid as on the ... day of ... by Pay master A. D. Smith, ... (but he not sure) She further states that she was married to the said Ashtel Porter in Orwell on the 10th day of May A. D. 1842 by one Eldon Cannon a minister and that her name before her said marriage was Mary Strong that her said husband died at Sandy Creek on the 15th day of June A. D. 1854 and that she is now a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which she may be entitled under the "act approved March 3d, 1855." She has no record evidence of said marriage.



further says he knew the said Abbel to be engaged in
the transportation of clothing hats &c for the army in
the year 1813 that the said Abbel took said loading
with his team from Utica Oneida County and brought
it as far as Richland Oneida County (then Oneida County)
at which time and place the said Abbel was taken sick
and was unable to proceed further with said loading
and he said Abbel employed this deponent to take his
said Abbels team and proceed on to Sackets Harbor with
the loading and he said deponent did take said Abbel
team and took the said loading on to Sackets harbor
and delivered the same at the Landing Stone at Sackets
Harbor said loading consisted of clothing and hats for
the army: that the distance said loading was transported
was about 90 miles being from Utica to Sackets Harbor
and deponent further says that he received pay for
the transportation of said loading and gave his receipt
for the same either in his (deponents) name or that of
the said Abbel and as deponent believes from recollection
that the business was transacted with Samuel Brown

(Brother of General Jacob Brown) but as to that deponant
is unable at this time to state positive And deponant
further says that he was knowing to the said wheel
being engage in teaming with his team in the transporta-
tion of Soldiers and baggage belonging to the Company command
by Lieutenant Smith Dunlap, from Richland to a place
called Scotch Settlement near Sachete Harbor in the
County of Jefferson a distance of about 30 miles and deponant
says he was with the said wheel and belonged to the
said Company of the said Smith Dunlap that they
were two days and a half on the road. And deponant
further says from information and belief that that the
said wheel done other teaming for the army of the
United State during the said war at different times
and places than aforesaid: that the said wheel being
at that time the owner of a good team: and teams
being at that time rather scarce the said wheel was
frequently called into service of the United States as
teamster in transporting goods provisions &c for the
said army and further this deponant saith nat;

being duly sworn according to Law. deposes and says that he was personally well acquainted with Ashbel Porter in his life time that he was so acquainted with him said Porter even since the year 1811 up to the time of his (said Porter's decease) that he was well knowing to him said Porter being engaged as teamster with his team in the transportation of military stores, Munitions of War and Clothing for the army of the United State in the war with Great Britain declared on the 18th day of June 1813; that he was knowing to him said Porter transporting a load of Cannon Balls and Cast Iron Balast for the use of said Army from Tabungh Oneida County to Sackets Harbor in the County of Jefferson a distance of fifty Miles that the time occupied in such transportation was 4 or 5 days; that this was done in the Spring of 1813 that he was also well knowing to said Ashbel Porter transporting a quantity of Clothing Blankets &c for the said Army from Utica Oneida County to Sackets Harbor a distance of ninety miles making in all the distant travel of said Clothing 180 miles that the distant travel in transporting said Balls & Balast was one hundred miles; that the time of transportation in conveying said Clothing was six days that from information and belief he said Dependant says that the said Porter was engaged in other terms at different times during the said war and different occasions than those aforesaid mentioned that he said Dependant was engaged in the same services in such transportation during said war and that he frequently saw said Porter engaged as aforesaid other than the times particularly specified as aforesaid.




