Dear Mrs. Plummer:

Your recent letter addressed to the Adams County Court House was passed along to me for reply.

If Brice Virgin was born 1812 in ADAMS COUNTY, OHIO no doubt any possible record would have burned in 1910 when a fire at the Court House destroyed many of the Probate Records. It is doubtful that birth records were even kept that early--mostly individuals kept such records in their Bibles. The only births and deaths that were saved from the fire cover the period of 1888-1893. Only three marriage books were saved which cover the period 1803-1833; and a few which were listed when Adams County was part of the Northwest Territory and kept all records in Deed Book 1,2,3. In these books I found these marriages which may be of interest to you: (these can be certified)

SUTTON, John and Deborah Worstell on 23 Apr. 1805
VANCE, David and Nancy Massie on 18 April 1822
VANCE, David C. and Tilda Stephenson on 1 June 1828
VANCE, Elias Nelson and Saraham Kincaid on 2 Feb. 1832
VANCE, James and Asenith Kincais on 1 July 1830
VANCE, Moses and Nancy Philips on 4 Apr. 1833
VANCE, Nancy and William Mannon on 31 Dec. 1829
VANCE, Polly and Edward Stone on 27 May 1830.
VIRGEN, George and Heziah Taylor on 13 Nov. 1828
* VIRGIN, Brice and Hannah SMITH on 16 Apr. 1829

*This may be one of the marriages you referred to in your letter. If you wish copies, please address letter to PROBATE DEPUTY CLERK. Of course any records after 1910 would be available. Only one Will Book for the period 1849-1860 was saved from the fire; and a few other miscellaneous books such as estate inventories, guardian bonds, etc.

Since you probably are interested in genealogical research, you may wish to join our Society. I am enclosing an application for your consideration. Perhaps some one who reads our Newsletters has more information on the family, and can assist you. Many of our members have gained more information by placing a query in our Newsletters. We exchange with several other genealogical societies also. I notice the name of BRYCE VIRGIN as a Sergeant on Captain Michael Cresap, Sr. Roll of Virginia Military men (1774) taken from page 1242, Virginia Soldiers of 1776---This was commonly called "Cresap's Rifles"--perhaps this Bryce Virgin is an ancestor. There are several members working at present on the VANCE surname; but our records do not show a common connection to VIRGIN. I can give you their names and addresses, if you wish.

Tracing down information about people from whom you descended can be both interesting and rewarding. Your genealogy can reveal fascinating facts about your ancestors, where they came from and lived, their occupations, and their children. It's also a good idea to contact older members of your family to gather data. Each person you talk to should be able to contribute information on some portion of your ancestry. Combining their facts could result in a fairly complete picture of your family tree for three or four generations.

Check the records

If you plan to chart your family tree back more than four generations, it will probably be necessary to check the records.

Wills, adoption records, name changes.

GOVERNMENTAL

Social Security, military, census, passports, tax rolls, voter registration, immigration and naturalization, homestead, pension applications, divorce, foreclosures.

LAND

Mortgages, leases, deeds, maps and plats.

BANK, SAVINGS AND LOAN, CREDITORS

Savings and checking accounts, loans, mortgages, charge accounts.

CHURCH AND SCHOOL

Transcripts, rosters, rolls, membership lists, baptisms, marriages, funerals.

Thank you for writing. When I checked the family file (Virgin) I find that our member Mrs. Wilma Brumley had already written to you 1981. She explained that our records (most of them) were burned in the 1910 fire. She had sent to you what records (marriages, etc)

I didn't notice that she had sent any census information. Since your Brice was born in 1812 he would be shown in the 1850 census however married. Do you find him where? I found in the 1850 census of Tiffin Twp. a Brice age 16 b. Oh household #1471 with a family of James Ellison. A Joseph Virgin age 9 b. Oh. living with a family #389, Robert Ellison. So it seems the Ellison family plays a part in the family. This was in Monroe Twp.

In the 1870 census it shows a Hannah E. Virgin age 34 b. Oh with children Andrew J. age 25, William H.H. age 22; Greenberry age 19; Jonathan age 17; Eveline age 16 (the ages of these children would make Hannah too young for mother it would seem. She was living with Kizziah Copas age 57. Keziah's first husband was George Virgin of Jefferson Twp.

I am enclosing the 1820, 1830, & 1840 census index which should show the names that would fit Brice's parents. Did he die in Adams Co.?

Sorry we can't give any further information. The land records could tell more. Our member that wrote to you previously, Mrs. Wilma Brumley, 2506 Bethany Ridge Rd. West Union, OH 45693 will do this for her expense of copying and postage and any donation to Society. Also, enclosing our brochure that you might want to join our Society and use the newsletter queries.

3. ___ could not be located after a search of standard references.

4. ___ may be available, but would require extensive research which, unfortunately, we are unable to do because of limited staff time. Please see paragraph three of Resources for information regarding private researchers.

5. ___ is available here at the library but cannot be supplied by mail. All newspapers, periodicals, and most genealogical materials are reference and do not circulate.

6. our staff does not provide copies of the U.S. Census. We will copy census index data. Send SASE to the Hamilton County Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 15851, Cincinnati, OH 45215 for a list of local researchers who will do census work for a fee.

7. ___ because of limited staff time, we cannot respond to over two letters per month from a single patron, and not more than two names or two questions per letter.

8. IN REPLY OR IN MAKING PAYMENT PLEASE REFER TO 07BPER2690. Using this will expedite your answer.

9. Remarks: We checked a variety of sources, and we are enclosing some information we feel may be valuable in your search. First you will find copies of references to the elder Brice Virgin, who was a prominent military officer in the Cincinnati area around 1792. The second source we checked was the Cincinnati city directories, for the years 1819, 1825, 1829, and 1831, but we found no listing for either Brice or Thomas Virgin.

From there we moved to census indexes, checking for the states of Ohio and Kentucky from 1820 through 1860. We found no listings in either state for Thomas Virgin. However, we were able to find two listings for Brice Virgin, one in Kentucky and one in Ohio:
1830 OHIO CENSUS INDEX: VIRGIN, BRICE--ADAMS CO.--MONROE TOWNSHIP--PAGE 018
1840 KENTUCKY CENSUS INDEX: VIRGIN, BRICE--LEWIS CO.--NO TWNP. LISTED--PAGE 060

We suggest locating these references in the appropriate census years in order to find more information. We cannot do census research, but we have provided an address where you can locate a private researcher to do so (see #6 above). Finally, we have enclosed the 1880 Soundex listing for Brice Virgin, the last census year before his death. This not only provides a citation for census research, but also lists his wife and children in Lewis Co. at the time.

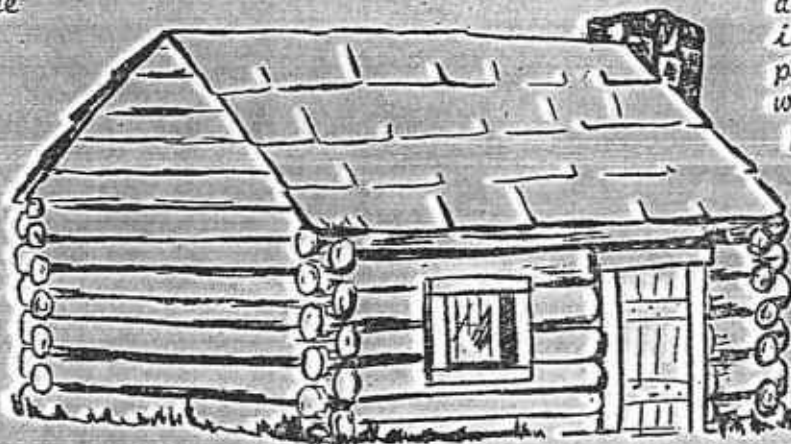
