Thomas M. Walsh, 84, part owner of the old M. Walsh & Sons stone company, 622 W. Olive, Bloomington, died at 5:45 a. m., Sunday, March 9, 1975, at St. Joseph's Hospital where he had been a patient three days.

Mr. Walsh, who resided at 601 N. Lee, with four brothers operated the firm founded by their father in 1900. The company moved to West Olive in 1908. Mr. Walsh retired in 1958.

Much of the cut stone used in construction in the Bloomington-Normal area through the 1960's came from the Walsh firm. Bloomington buildings with Walsh-cut stone include the old Bloomington High School, now the junior high, built in 1914, and Trinity Lutheran Church.

The pillars that stood on the Main Street side of Mennonite Hospital until the new addition replaced them in 1968 were shaped at the Walsh company.

The firm's work place on West Olive, once a landmark, burned twice in the early 1970's, the second time just before it was to be demolished.
