CHARLES BUCK

Charles Buck entered the service in Aug or Sep 1777 under Capt. Andrew Hamilton, Lt. Wm. Rennick, Maj. George Poag, and Col. George Skilleron. He volunteered at the Little Levels of Greenbrier in Botetourt County, Virginia. He marched to Point Pleasant at the mouth of the Kanawha and back to Botetourt County. Charles Buck applied for a pension 10 July 1834 in Gallia County, Ohio. His pension was refused as he served only four months.

Charles was born in Frederick County, Virginia 3 Feb 1758. He lived in Botetourt County, Virginia after his discharge until Oct 1802 when he moved to Gallia County, Ohio. He was a Gallia County commissioner in 1804. In 1812 the first election in Springfield Township was held in his home. The 1840 census places him, age 80-90, in Jackson County, Ohio. There is no will or estate for him in Gallia or Jackson Counties.

No proof has been established but it is believed that he may have had sons Thomas and Charles. Thomas born 1789 was the son of Charles and Sarah Buck who married in 1784 according to the Thomas Buck family Bible. Thomas lived in Gallia County. Living next door to Charles in Milton Township, Jackson County in 1840 was a younger Charles, possibly a son.

WILLIAM BUTLER

William was a private in the Revolution. He was pensioned 5 Sep 1795 and is found on the pensioner's roll in 1835.

William owned land in Gallia County, Ohio by 1817. His will names a wife Tasy. William and Tassy Butler are listed as early members of the Free-Will Baptist Church which was organized in 1805 in Cheshire Township. He died in 1830, probably in Huntington Township, Gallia County and left a "soldier's rite of land" to some of his children.

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to Charles Buck, a soldier of the War of the Revolution.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, R. 1392, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Charles Buck. This is the record of the only Charles Buck, that is found on file in the Revolutionary War records of this office.

Charles Buck was born February 3, 1758 in Frederick County, Virginia, the name of his parents not given.

He volunteered at Little Levels, Botetourt County, Virginia, in August or September, 1777 and served in Captain Andrew Hamilton's company, Colonel Skillion's regiment, with the Virginia troops; they marched to Point Pleasant at the mouth of the Big Kanawha, and returned home, having been out four months.

After the Revolution he lived on the Little Flats of Greenbrier in Botetourt County, Virginia until about the last of October, 1803, when he moved to Gallia County, Ohio. 1802

Charles Buck applied for pension July 10, 1834, then a resident of Gallia County, Ohio. His claim was

not allowed, as the length of his service was only four months. The pension law under which he applied provided for those soldiers only who had rendered at least six months' service.

There are no data in this claim relative to the family of Charles Buck.
