Collins descendants to gather for reunion

Descendants of the late W.D. and Myrtle (Wolf) Collins will gather Sunday, June 11 for their 2nd biannual reunion. Grand-daughter Rita (Collins) Havenar and her husband, George, 323 S. Foreman, will again host the event.

The 1998 reunion was attended by 83 family members from Arkansas, Arizona, California, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Tennessee, Texas and Wyoming as well as a number of Oklahoma communities.

W.D. and Myrtle Collins moved from Jerioc Springs, MO, to Pawnee County, OK, in 1933 with their seven children: Glenn, Chester, Mabel, Carl, Lloyd, Ray and Frances. Ten years later they, their unmarried children, and their married sons and their families moved to the Bunker Hill Community west of Vinita.

W.D., Glenn, Chester and Ray, who were ordained Baptist ministers pastoring churches in a number of area communities, including Bunker Hill. They, along with Carl, were also ranchers and did custom haying, doing business for many years as "W.D. Collins & Sons."

After serving in World War II, Lloyd moved his family to Cleveland, daughters Mabel and Frances lived with their families in Reedley, CA, and Ketchum, respectively. In the late '40's, Carl and his family relocated in Phoeniz, AZ.

W.D. and Myrtle have been followed in death by Glenn and grandson, Mitchell "Mitch" Collins; Chester, wife Ruby (Cliffman), and daughter-in-law, Shirley (Abbott); Mabel's husband, Herbert Lee; Ray and daughter, Saundra Polson; and Frances' husband, Glenn "John" Minson. The 121 living family members live in over 14 states and the U.K.

A good turnout is expected for this year's gathering. The family hopes many friends from the area will drop by to visit throughout the day, and a cordial invitation to do so is extended by the hosts.

PACIFIC AND SOUTHWEST ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

RESOLUTION RELATING TO RENTAL/HOUSING ALLOWANCES FOR RETIRED OR DISABLED MINISTERS OF THIS CONFERENCE

WHEREAS, the religious denomination known as The United Methodist Church has and functions through Ministers of the Gospel who are duly ordained or licensed; and

WHEREAS, the practice of The United Methodist Church is to provide a parsonage or a rental allowance as part of the gross compensation for each of its active ordained or licensed ministers; and

WHEREAS, pensions paid to retired ordained or licensed ministers of The United Methodist Church are considered as deferred compensation and are paid to said retired ordained or licensed ministers in consideration of previous, active service, and disability benefits are considered payments in lieu of compensation for active service; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized that the PACIFIC AND SOUTHWEST Annual Conference is the appropriate organization to designate a housing/rental allowance for retired ordained or licensed ministers who are members of this Conference; and

WHEREAS, the disabled minister has the same legal relationship to an Annual Conference as does the retired minister and, thus, this Annual Conference is also the appropriate organization to designate a housing/rental allowance for a disabled ordained or licensed minister who is a member of this Conference;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. An amount equal to 100% of the pension payments received by a retired minister, or 100% of the disability benefit payments received by a disabled minister, during the year of 1984 be and is hereby designated as a rental/housing allowance respectively for each retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister of The United Methodist Church who is or was a member of the $\frac{P}{AND} = \frac{NND}{SW}$ Annual Conference at the time of his or her retirement or disability:
- 2. The pension or disability payment to which this rental/housing allowance applies shall be the pension or disability payment resulting from all service of such retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister from all employment by any local church, Annual Conference, General Agency, or institution of The United Methodist Church or of any former denomination that is now a part of The United Methodist Church, or from any other employer who employed the minister to perform services related to the ministry and who elected to make contributions to the pension or benefit funds of The United Methodist Church for such retired minister's pension or disabled minister's benefits.

NOTE:

The rental/nousing allowance which may be excluded from a minister's gross income is limited to the lesser of (1) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the minister's employer or other appropriate body, (2) the amount actually expended by the minister to provide his or her housing, or (3) the legally-determined fair rental value of the parsonage or other housing provided. As specified in Rev. Rul. 71-280, 1971 C.B. 92, "the only amount that will qualify for exclusion under section 107(2) of the Code as a 'rental allowance' is an amount equal to the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances such as a garage, plus the cost of utilities." Beginning in 1984, there is no longer a sick pay or disability income exclusion available with respect to disability benefit payments. Therefore, the full amount of disability benefit payments will be taxable income to the recipient beginning in 1984.
