Field acreages shown will be considered correct for current year unless the field boundary differs from the boundary lines shown.

KEEP THIS RECORD for use in planting and identifying areas. Later, we will ask you (if you participate in either Wheat or Feed Grain Program) to bring it to the county office to report and certify to crop and diverted acreage on your farm. Additional detailed information with respect to reporting acreages will be furnished at a later date. However, we want to call your attention to the following items now:

- 1. A reporter WILL NOT visit your farm to measure acreages as in the past. (You will report the acreages instead.)
- 2. However, after acreage reports are obtained, acreages will be measured on about 25% of farms, selected on a random basis.
- 3. If the measured crop acreage exceeds the applicable permitted acreage, or if the diverted acreage is less than the intended diverted acreage, no payment can be made and there will be no further opportunity to adjust acreages.

We will give you all the help we possibly can in making sure that your acreages are correct. We will measure any acreages you are not sure about, either before or after planting, upon your request and payment of the cost. We will also assist you in the county office in determining crop acreages.

If you have any further questions on this matter, we will be glad to discuss them with you the next time you are in our office.






