SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES, HARVY SCOTT, RIN 1153

1. TIMELINE -- HARVY SCOTT AND KISSIAH (CLARK) SCOTT:

- About 1790 Kissiah (Kiszia) Clark born to Goshen Clark and Sallie (Pritchard) Scott, probably in Pasquotank Co., NC. Birth date derived from tombstone data (d: 9 Aug. 1847, age 57 Yrs) per refs. 1 and 2. Parents per Davis, (ref. 2) and Munhall (ref. 3), his FGS # 60. Birth place not verified but most sources seem to indicate the Clarks, as well as the Scotts, were living in Pasquotank Co., NC, at this time. Davis, in write-up about Harvey (sic) and Kisiah (sic) (Clark) Scott, says "It is possible that the Goshon Clark family and the Marmaduke Scott family lived as neighbors in old Pasquotank during the exiting (sic) days of the ratification of the Constitution of the United States."
- About 1791 Harvy Scott born to Marmaduke Scott and Mary (Jackson) Clark, in Pasquotank Co., NC. Birth date derived from tombstone data (d: 26 March 1845, age 54 Yrs) per references 1 and 2. Parents per Davis (ref. 2) and Munhall (ref. 3). Birth place per Davis (ref. 2) and Munhall, (ref. 3).
- 1809/1812 Harvy Scott and Kissiah Clark married in Pasquotank, Co., NC. Date estimated -based on assumption that Harvy was at least 18 when married and the birth date of their first child -- either Amelia or Lilly.
- 1810/1815 Daughter Amelia Scott born in Pasquotank Co., NC. See note 6 below for discussion of children and how estimated birth date for Amelia was derived..
- 13 July 1813 Daughter Lilly Scott born in Pasquotank Co., NC. Date per McQuerry Family Bible record (ref. 4); Place based on residence of Harvy and Kissiah at time.
- 23 Jan. 1818 Son Marmaduke Scott born in Pasquotank Co., NC. Date per tombstone data in Mercer Co., MO, Cemetery Book (ref. 5, page 216) {d: 12 May 1895, age: 77 yr, 3 mo, 19 da}. See note 6 for additional discussion. Place based on residence of Harvy and Kissiah at this time.
- 1819/1820 Examination of census data and school records suggest that Harvy and Kissiah had an unidentified (by name) female child during this time period that grew to adulthood or that they raised an "outsider" from infancy to adulthood. See Note 6 below.
- 1820 Harvey (sic) Scott listed as head of a household on 1820 U.S. Census for Pasquotank Co., NC. (Reference 6) Household consisted of one male under 10, one male 26-44, three females under 10 and one female 16-25. {Age bracket for adult male agrees with tombstone data for Harvy Scott (b: 1791) but age bracket for adult female does not agree with tombstone data for Kissiah Clark (b: 1790).} See Note 6 below.
- 1821/1825 Examination of census data and school records suggest that Harvy and Kissiah had an unidentified (by name) male child during this time period that grew to adulthood or that they raised an "outsider' from a young age to adulthood. See Note 6 below.
- About 1822 Harvy Scott family moved to Wayne Co., IN. See next entry -- purchase of land.

- 10 Sept. 1822 Harvy (sic) bought 80 acres of land in Wayne Co., IN from a Solomon Carter and wife. Sale recorded in Wayne Co., IN, Deed Book D, page 105. Description: N 1/2 of SE 1/4 of Sect. 20, Twp 15, Range 1 West. Price: \$250.00. (Ref. 3)
- 27 Nov. 1825 Son Haywood Scott born in Wayne Co., IN. Date per Munhall (ref. 3) and it is compatible with school records (ref. 7) and Census data. Place based on residence of Harvy and Kissiah at the time.
- About 1828 Son Ellsberry Scott born in Wayne Co., IN. Date per School records and Census data. See Note 6 below. Place based on residence of Harvy and Kissiah at the time.
- 24 March 1830 Daughter Nancy Ann born. Date per Munhall, (ref. 3) which is consistent with school records (ref. 7) and census data. Place is probably Wayne Co., IN, but have not confirmed when family moved to Madison County.
- 1831/1832 Harvy Scott Family probably moved from Wayne Co., IN, to Madison Co., IN.
- 22 Sept. 1831 Harvey (sic) Scott sold land in Pasquotank Co., NC, "by agent", to an Abner Williams. (Reference 10) COMMENT: This may not be "our Harvy Scott" but could be since transaction was handled by an agent.
- 28 Sept. 1831 Hervey (sic) Scott filed for 84 acres of Government land in Hancock Co., IN. (Ref. 8) This tract is one mile east of the 40 acres John McQuerry Jr. lived on when he died and which James McQuerry eventually bought.
- 16 Jan. 1832 Harvy Scott and wife Kezia (sic) sold the 80 acres he bought in Wayne Co., IN, in Sept. 1822 to a Robert Fellow. Price: \$455.00. Transaction recorded in Wayne Co., IN, Deed Book N, page 412. Harvy signed document; Kezia signed with "her mark". (Reference 3)
- 15 Feb. 1832 Harvy Scott was one of 19 residents of Fall Creek Twp, Madison Co., IN who signed a petition for a school in the township. (Ref. 7) Signature quite legible except for a smudge that appears to be due a break/deterioration of the original. Surname appears to be spelled with one "t" but smudge/break/deterioration could obscure a second "t".
- 7 June 1832 Harvey (sic) bought 40 acres of land in Fall Creek Twp, Madison Co., Indiana, from a David Fisher. Price: \$200. Description: W 1/2 of W1/2 of NW 1/4 of Section 36, Twp 18 N, Range 7 E. (Ref. 9) This property apparently was Harvy Scott's home, or a part of a farm that was his home, for the rest of his life. He bequeathed this 40 plus an adjoining 80 acres, which he described as "the land on which I now live", to "my dear wife, Kisiah (sic) Scott" for the rest of her life. (Ref. 14) This land was some 3 1/2 miles north of the 40 acres John McQuerry Jf. lived on when he died.
- 10 Nov. 1834 School record (ref. 7) shows Harvy Scott had one child under 5, four children over 5 and under 14, and one child over 14 and under 21. See Note 6 below.

SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES, HARVY SCOTT, RIN 1153

- 7 July 1836 Harvy/Harvey Scott filed for three tracts of Government land in Hancock Co., IN. (Ref. 8) One tract, 40 acres, located about 1 1/4 miles northwest of the 40 acres John JP lived on when he died. The other two, both about 80 acres, located 3 to 4 miles south southeast of the John Jr. 40. Lilly (Scott) McQuerry inherited the south half of these two tracts later. (Ref. 13)
- 13 Nov. 1836 School record (ref. 7, shows Harvy Scott had one child under 5, four children over 5 and under 14, and two children over 14 and under 21.

Harvey (sic) Scott listed on the 1840 U.S. Census for Fall Creek Twp. Madison Co.,
IN. (Ref. 11) Household consisted of two males 10-15, one male 15-20, one male 50-60, one female 5-10, one female 20-30 and one female 40-50. COMMENT: Age bracket for oldest male is not consistent with tombstone data for Harvy's age.

- 1842 Hancock Co., IN, Tax List for 1842 shows a Harvy Scott paid taxes on 3 tracts of land in Hancock Co., IN, (those Harvy/Harvey Scott filed for on 7 July 1836 per pages 44 and 65 of Tract Book as shown in ref. 8) and a Harvey Scott paid taxes on 2 tracts, one being the tract Harvey Scott filed for on 28 Sept. 1831 per page 63 of the Tract Book (ref. 8) and the other being 28 acres in the NE 1/4 of Sect. 13, Twp 17 N, Range 7 E. No poll tax or personal property tax was assessed and no value listed for improvements on these 5 entries -- tax payer did not live on these tracts.
- 1845 School records (ref. 7) shows Harvy Scott had 3 children under 21 -- Haywood, 19, Ellsberry, 17 and Nancy, 15.
- 1846

5 School records (ref. 7) shows "Widow" Scott had 3 children under 21 -- Haywood, 19, Ellsberry, 17 and Nancy, 15.

- 26 March 1845 Harvy Scott Died per tombstone data (ref. 1) and Deeds of conveyance per references 13 and 14.
- 9 Aug. 1847 Kisiah Scott died per tombstone data (ref. 1).
- 2. OCCUPATION: Harvy Scott was a farmer.

3. CHURCH AFFILIATION and ACTIVITIES: No information found to date.

4. <u>POLITICAL AFFILIATION and CIVIC SERVICES/ACTIVITIES</u>: Only record of such activities found to date is the record is that Harvy Scott was one of 19 Fall Creek Township residents who signed a petition for a local school in 1832.

5. <u>MILITARY SERVICE</u>: No indication found to date that Harvy Scott served in the military forces.

6. CHILDREN OF HARVY SCOTT and KISSIAH CLARK.

Six children of Harvy and Kissiah (Clark) Scott have been identified by name through various sources. Review of U.S. Census data and School Records of Fall Creek Township, Madison County, Indiana, indicates they may have had at least eight children who reached adulthood and, possibly, one that died in infancy. This note summarizes a) information, including sources, identifying the six named children and b) data indicative of three unidentified children.

SIX IDENTIFIED CHILDREN OF HARVY AND KISSIAH (CLARK) SCOTT

Amelia: Dorothy Powers Elliott (ref. 15) identified first wife of Benjamin Gray as Amelia Scott, sister of Lillian Scott, 2nd wife of James McQuerry. Helen Gray Collings (ref. 16) identified one of her ancestors as Amelia Scott, daughter of Harvy and Kissiah (Clark) Scott and first wife of Benjamin Gray. This relationship is shown in the pedigree chart compiled by Mrs. Collings. Etta O. Cross, (ref. 20) notes that Benjamin Gray's first wife was a Scott, a sister of Marmaduke, Ellsberry and Nancy, but does not state her given name. The 1820 U.S. Census (ref. 6) shows three females under 10 in the household of Harvey (sic) Scott. One of these is believed to be Amelia. This person's birth year would be 1810 to 1820. The oldest child listed in the Benjamin Gray household in 1850 (ref. 17) is Marshall A. Gray, age 18, indicating he was born 1831-1832. If Marshall was Amelia's first child and if she was 17 or older when her first child was born, Amelia was born no later than 1815. This, plus the census data, indicates Amelia was born 1810-1815. Helen Gray Collings (ref. 16) shows her ancestor George Gray, son of Benjamin and Amelia (Scott) Gray, was born in 1829. This birth date is consistent with tombstone data for a G. W. Gray buried in Hamilton Cemetery, Mercer Co., MO (ref. 5, page 124) and with an 1810-1815 birth date for Amelia. However, the 1850 Census shows a George W. Gray, age 15, in the Benjamin Gray household. If this George Gray was Amelia's first child she could have been born later than 1815.

<u>Lilly (or Lillian)</u>: The reference 13 Deed of Conveyance, referencing a will by Harvy Scott dated Feb. 14, 1845, identifies Lilly as the daughter of Harvy Scott. The Family Bible record (ref. 4) shows that Lilly was born 18 July 1813; tombstone data (reference 5, page 127) indicates 19 July 1813.

<u>Marmaduke:</u> Winfield Scott (ref. 18) and Mrs. Lloyd Scott (ref. 19) identify Marmaduke (as well as Haywood, Ellsbury and Nancy) as siblings of Lilly (Scott) McQuerry and hence a son of Harvy Scott. Furthermore, Marmaduke Scott and James McQuary were named executors of Harvy Scott's estate in the will identified in Deeds of Conveyance to Lilly McQuary, (ref. 13) and to Ellsberry Scott (ref. 14). Tombstone data (ref. 5, page 216; death date: 12 May 1895; age: 77 yr, 3 mo, 19 da) translate to a birth date of 23 Jan 1818. This date is compatible with age shown in the various records summarized in table at the end of these notes and with 1870 and 1880 census data for Mercer County, MO, (Madison and Sommerset Twps., respectively), but is not compatible with the 1850 census data for Madison County, Indiana.

<u>Haywood:</u> Mrs. Lloyd Scott (ref. 19) identifies Haywood (as well as Marmaduke and Ellsberry) as siblings of Lilly (Scott) McQuerry and hence a son of Harvy. Birth date (27 Nov. 1825) and death

date (29 Sept. 1884) are per Burton D. Munhall (ref. 3). Birth date is compatible with census data and school records as shown in the table at the end of these notes.

<u>Ellsberry:</u> The reference (14) Deed of Conveyance identifies Ellsberry as the son of Harvy Scott. Birth year is based on age listed in 1845 and 1846 school records (ref. 7). Death date is per Burton D. Munhall (ref. 3).

Nancy: Etta Cross (ref. 20) identifies Nancy as a sister of Marmaduke, Elsbury (sic) and Benjamin Gray's first wife. She also notes that Nancy married a Smith Davis. Winfield Scott (ref. 18) noted that "Uncle Duke Scott...died the 12th of May last" and then wrote "That leaves only Aunt Nancy of our blood uncles and aunts"...."Uncle Smith is alive and well..." Mr. Munhall (ref. 3) shows a Nancy Ann Scott who married John Smith Davis. The write-up about the Elisha and Johnson Davis families (ref. 2) includes 1850 Census data for the family headed by Elisha Davis, wife Miriam, which shows a John Smith Davis, age 24, son, a Nancy Davis, age 20, wife of son, and a Harvey Davis, age 8 mo, son of John, in the Elisha Davis household. The section on Harvy Scott and Kissiah (Clark) Scott and their children includes reference to the Elisha Davis household in the 1850 U.S. Census and notes that in this household "we find John Smisson (sic) Davis and wife Nancy Ann. Munhall (ref. 3) lists Nancy Ann's birth date as 24 March 1830. That birth date is consistent with dates derived from the 1840 U.S. Census (ref. 11) and School Records (ref. 7), as shown in table at end of these notes. Munhall also shows that Miriam Davis (wife of Elisha Davis) was a sister of Harvy Scott in his FGS for Marmaduke Scott and Mary Jackson. Thus Nancy Ann married her first cousin.

THREE UNIDENTIFIED CHILDREN IN HOUSEHOLD OF HARVY AND KISSIAH SCOTT

Three unidentified children show up in the Harvy Scott household on certain census and/or school records. School records show 6 children in the Harvy Scott household in 1834 and 7 in 1836. Amelia was married by 1834 and Lilly was married either late in 1834 or early 1835 so it appears Harvy and Kissiah (Clark) Scott may have had eight or nine children. Census records could include visitors in the household. It seems unlikely school records would reflect short time visitors; school tax assessments apparently were based, in part, on this head count. School records could (probably do) include grandchildren, nieces/nephews, etc., residing in the household.

For purposes of this note, these are called "Unidentified female child", "Unidentified male child" and "Unidentified child". A table at the end of these notes (following the list of references) lists these three unidentified children, along with the six identified children, in order of birth as presently known and shows which records these unidentified children appear in the Harvy Scott household -- i.e. 1820 and 1840 U.S. Census records and school records dated 1834, 1836 and 1846.

<u>Unidentified female child</u>: An unidentified female shows up in the 1820 and 1840 U.S. Census records; an unidentified child is listed in School Records dated 1834 and 1836. Analysis of these data (see table at the end of these notes) indicate this person was born 1819/1820. It appears this person was either a child of Harvy and Kissiah Scott or a child of someone else they raised from infancy.

<u>Unidentified male child</u>: An unidentified child shows up on the 1834 and 1836 School Record (ref. 7) and an unidentified male is listed on the 1840 US Census (ref. 11). If this is the same person for all records his birth year would be 1822/1825. This range would preclude him from being on the School Record for 1846 even if he were in the household since he would be 21 or over. This person could be a child of Harvy and Kissiah (Clark) Scott.

SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES, HARVY SCOTT, RIN 1153

<u>Unidentified child:</u> This person shows up on only one of the records reviewed -- namely the school record for 1836 so the sex of this child is unknown. Between 1834 and 1836 the number of children listed on the school records for the Harvy Scott household increased by one -- from 6 to 7. This could be a child of Harvy and Kissiah born between 1834 and 1836 and died before 1840 or it could be a child born 1831 to 1836 they took in for a short time. Kissiah would have been about 45 years old so it is somewhat unlikely she would have a child. Another possibility is that Nancy was listed in the "under 5" category on the 1836 school record -- unlikely since she would have been 6 years old in 1836. This unidentified child is not included in the family of Harvy and Kissiah (Clark) Scott. He, or she, could be an "outsider"-- possibly a grand child.

Birth places for children are based on where the family was believed to be living at the time and on census data. Census data shows various places for Lilly -- North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and Kentucky. However, most census data, including later years where children identified where their parents were born, show North Carolina. Munhall shows Marmaduke was born in Indiana but census data shows North Carolina. Birth place for the "Unknown male child" is omitted because his birth date range spans the time period Harvy Scott moved from Pasquotank Co., NC, to Wayne Co., IN.

7. SCOTT IMMIGRANT ANCESTOR -- FOLK TALE OR LEGEND?

Winfield Scott wrote (ref. 18) that the Scotts and Clarks came from Scotland and that they were sailors before becoming colonists in the new world. He noted he had been in "Carolina last fall looking for relatives". (That would be the fall of 1894.) The Scotts and Clarks he talked to knew there were Scotts and Clarks "scattered all over the country" and believed that many, if not most, were kinfolk but they "had no idea notidea of their relation" to these widely scattered Scotts and Clarks. An 80-year old gentleman, whose surname was Scott, told him that "all the Scotts originated from one man who settled there in a very early day". This Scottish seafarer-turned-colonist, named Scott, picked a woman from Denmark for his helpmate when the colony proprietor brought over some European women to be wives of the settlers. The Danish woman proved prolific; she made many Scott babies who grew up and made many, many more Scott babies.

ADDITIONAL RESEARCH:

o Try to locate, get copy of, Harvy Scott's will and/or deeds of conveyance to determine who Harvy Scott's heirs were, what they received and where they were living at that time. Apparently all deeds of conveyance were from John H. Cook, Commissioner.

o Try to locate Harvy Scott household on 1830 Census. Wayne Co., IN? Madison Co., IN?

o Check Census records for children, 1850 to 1880 and 1900. Where living, where they say they were born, where they say their parents were born and names of their children.

o Cemetery records -- children. Have burial places only for Lilly and Marmaduke. Do not have burial place for Duke's wife, Suzanna McAllister and could not locate it in Lynn, (ref. 5)

o Check land records for listing of residence of buyer/seller.
