#### HISTORY OF THE M.M. McQUERRY FAMILY

M. M. McQuerry was one of the substantial citizens of Bethany. He was born in Indiana the Son of Calley & Pricilla (Mingle) McQuerry.

Calley was born in Indiana in 1834. In 1865 he with his wife and family came to Missouri to settle in Mercer County, where he was a highly respected farmer and stockman. He died at the home place in 1898 and was buried in the Hamilton Cemetery. His wife now 84 years of age still lives on the farm, which she and her husband settled on when they came to Mo.

M.M. (Marion Madison) McQuerry got his education at public school and in 1888 he began farming near Mt Moriah, Mo. He remained on the same farm 12 years. Then he moved to Bethany Township where he in 1900 bought 159 Acres. He kept this farm until 1918, when he sold out and moved to Bethany. For two years he dealt in the Real Estate business, since that time he conducted a Taxi business in which he was very successful. He owns an acre of ground which he uses for pasture, also four lots on Oakland and Alden Sts. His residence burned recently.

Mr. McQuerry was married in the fall of 1886 to Martha Jane Miller who was reared in Mercer County. To M.M. McQuerry and Martha Jane (Miller)
McQuerry the following children were born: Nettie living at home, Genevave, now living in Hutchinson, Kansas. James Madison of St. Joseph, Mo. Charley living at home. Harlie who lives in Cypress Township. Lois living at home and Cally deceased.

Mrs. McQuerry and her son, Calley a child of four were killed in a Railroad accident near Ridgeway in 1912.

Harlie married Ruth Anterback, who was born and reared in Cypress

Township. They have one son, George Pershing McQuerry now two years old.

James and Charlie were in the Service (World War I) James was sent over seas, Charlie was in Camp Funston for several months.

Mr. M.M. McQuerry was a member of the Independant Order of Odd Fellows. He is a Reliable man who merits the esteem in which he was held by the Community.

#### APPALLING AND DISTRESSING RAILWAY ACCIDENT FRIDAY

Two Members of McQuerry Family Killed at Crossing South of Ridgeway

Boy Aged Four Completely Decapitated—Mother of Boy So Badly Injured
she Died Two Hours Later

One of the most appalling and ghastly accidents ever recorded in this county occurred one and one-half miles south of Ridgeway last Friday afternoon. Mr. and Mrs. M. M. McQuerry, and two children Cally, a bright little boy of four, and Lois, a girl of seven who had been visiting relatives and friends in the vicinity of Mt. Moriah and Modena, were returning to their home about six miles southwest of Bethany, having come through Ridgeway. It was between one and two o'clock in the afternoon, Friday, August 15th, and Mr. McQuerry was driving a team of mules to a spring wagon, and as he approached the railroad crossing about a mile and a half south of Ridgeway, a very dangerous crossing on account of the orchard and hedge between the public road and the railroad, the south-bound passenger train thundered along at a rate of thirty-five miles an hour, and just as the team had cleared the track, the powerful engine crashed into the spring wagon.

The mother and two little ones must have been sitting in the rear seat, as they were either ground beneath the ponderous wheels of the swiftly moving train, or hurled into the air like egg shells. Little Cally, the baby boy, aged four years, suffered a complete decapitation, the head being cut off as smooth as if it had been done with an ax. Besides the head being cut off, the right arm was severed at the shoulder and also cut in twain at the elbow, and the right leg below the knee was ground into a pulp. The little skull was crushed, but the features were not in the least mangled, there being only a slight bruise noticeable on the right temple.

Mrs. McQuerry was not killed outright, but died an hour or so after reaching Bethany. Her injuries were internal, besides both limbs being cut off from which the loss of blood was perhaps sufficient to cause death alone. The little girl Lois, excaped with a badly broken limb, and some minor bruises and is getting along as well as could be expected. It seems that Mr. McQuerry was just past the death line when the locomotive struck them, and he was thrown out of harms way, receiving only some slight bruises, besides being severly jarred and for the time being stunned.

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After the horrible accident, the train stopped and the passengers assisted in putting the dead and wounded in the baggage car and they were brought to Bethany, where medical attendance which had been telephoned for and was waiting at the depot to do everything possible for the wounded, but in spite of their skill, Mrs. McQuerry soon passed into the great beyond, to again hold her baby boy in her loving mother arms.

We will not attempt to describe the sight, as we viewed mother and little son in the Prentiss undertaking rooms, both cold in death and only a few hours before so full of life and vigor, but we will say, we sincerely hope it will never again be our lot in life to look upon a scene like that was. But after an all nights labor the undertaker and wife, prepared the bodies for public view in accordance with the wishes of the sorrowing husband and father and by six o'clock the next morning the transformation was truly wonderful. The little baby boy lay as if asleep, attired in a pretty black velvet burial suit, the little body resting under a beautiful canopy of spotless white lace, while the \_\_\_\_\_ mother was resting near as if to watch her darling boy.

Sunday morning the funeral cortege slowly wended it's way to the eastward and during the early afternoon the mortal remains of mother and son were tenderly laid to rest in Hamilton cemtery, in Mercer county, the childhood home of both, Mr. and Mrs. McQuerry. The sad occasion was witnessed by one of the largest funeral gatherings ever held in this part of the state. In death, as in life, Mother and baby boy sleep together, both being buried in one grave.

The mother who was so suddenly removed from the family circle was 44 years of age, Three or four other children, mostly grown, and the desolate and bewildered companion and father have the most profound and sincere sympathy of all the people of this entire community, in this the hour of their terrible sorrow.

The crossing where the terrible and shocking accident happened is a very dangerous place, several other accidents having taken place there in the past. It is the same crossing where Mr. and Mrs. Hallock, were so badly injured a year or two ago, while crossing in an auto. For the sake of human life, the obstruction to vision along the railroad at that point should be immediately removed.

#### LITTLE CALLY

Cally, youngest child of M.M. and Martha Jane McQuerry was born near Bethany, Mo., July 24, 1907, and died Friday, August 25, 1911, at the age of four years, 1 month and 1 day.

For four bright summy years had Cally not only been the joy and comfort of the home, but his sweet childish presence brought a wealth of sumshine and happiness into the lives of the entire neighborhood. The baby in the home, in a family of several children, he was petted and loved, the pride of each one. He was the constant companion of Lois, the older sister, who as yet has not been informed that both her Mama and baby brother have gone from her forever.

The untimely death of one so young is indeed sad, but above it comes the comforting thought that the gentle child did not realize the pain, that he is now spared earth's cares and sorrows and his memory will form another cord to draw his loved ones to the brighter home beyond.

#### THE FUNERAL

The funeral party left Bethany Sunday morning for the Hamilton Church in Mercer county. It was in this neighborhood near the church that both Mr. and Mrs. McQuerry were reared; and there, as in their Harrison county home, their friends are legion.

The funeral sermon was preached Sunday afternoon by Rev. Harper, assisted by Rev. Dodson. At least one thousand people were present; a sympathetic congregation, who by tears and every act in their power tried to lighten the sorrow of the afflicted family.

The grave had been lined in white, festooned with black and white draperies, and in the one grave were buried the bodies of mother and child; two lives so suddenly snatched from loved ones and who only a few hours before were in the bloom of health, with the promise of long life and happiness.

#### DEATH CAME UNHERALDED

Cally McQuerry Killed by Train His Mother Dies From Injuries

We have this week to chronicle the saddest accident that has happened in this county since the Clipper started, nearly six years ago; an accident that has brought great sorrow to one family, depriving them of wife and mother and the baby of the home.

M.M. McQuerry, who lives about three miles southwest of Bethany with his wife, daughter Lois, seven years old, and little son Cally, four years old, were returning from a visit with the Wm. Goodwin family near Mt. Moriah. They were driving a mule team, hitched to a spring wagon. Mr. McQuerry and Lois were seated in the front, and Mrs. McQuerry and the baby boy in the back seat. When passing the Harding crossing near the Neff farm, lamiles southwest of Ridgeway, the wagon was struck by the engine of the southbound passenger train. Mr. McQuerry and Lois escaped death by being thrown from the wagon, but Mrs. McQuerry and the little boy were hit by the engine and their bodies carried several feet on the pilot. The little boy was instantly killed; his arm was cut off and his head severed from the body, and he was terribly mangled. Mrs. McQuerry's body was also terribly bruised and mangled, and one limb was cut off. Little Lois suffered a broken limb, and she was badly bruised. Mr. McQuerry was unconscious for several minutes but suffered no broken bones.

The engineer applied the emergency brake and reversed the engine, made the stop in six car lengths. Friends assisted the trainmen in caring for the dead body of the child. Mrs. McQuerry was placed on a cot, and with her husband and the injured child, were brought to Bethany, where doctors were summoned and every attention given the suffering ones, but Mrs. McQuerry lived only about two hours: her death occurred at the Rudy hotel, north of the depot.

The two bodies were taken to Prentiss undertaking parlors, where they were prepared for burial, and were kept there until the funeral party, with the two hearses, started on the sad journey Sunday morning.

The little girl is being cared for by friends at the Rudy hotel, but on account of her nervous condition, the doctors have not yet allowed her to be informed of the death of her mother and brother. She seems to be doing nicely, and hopes are entertained of her recovery.

We often read of such accidents; glance over the head-lines and

think no more about them. But when they come so near home, and our friends are victims, how much harder it seems. Only those who witnessed the accident can know of the feelings of that husband and father; in the presence of death, his wife dying and with the injured child. Not many could have been so brave as was he, though crushed with grief, and suffering from nervous shock from which he will probably never recover. Seeing the bodies carried from the train as tenderly as could be under the circumstances by the trainmen is a scene we can never forget.

Coroner A. C. Bonser held an inquest Monday afternoon, in regard to the death of Cally McQuerry. J. C. Henry, of Blythedale; Olin W. Hughes, the engineer on the train the day of the accident, also J. F. Hickman of Ridgeway, were examined, and the verdict of the jury was that the boy came to his death by being run over by a train.

#### M.M'QUERRY SUICIDES

Takes Life by Hanging as Family Attends Church

Despondency Over Stroke Suffered Six Weeks Before Believed to Have Been Cause.

M.M. McQuerry, 63 years old, retired farmer and for several years, a driver of a service car here, committed suicide by hanging late Sunday forenoon at his home at the corner of Oakland avenue and North Twenty-fifth street. Despondency over the condition of his health is believed to have been the cause. He left no note that has been found.

Mr. McQuerry lived with his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Norton, in a fine residence that he built only a few years ago. He was a widower, his wife having lost her life 15 years ago whan a vehicle in which the family were riding was struck by a passenger train at a crossing south of Ridgeway.

About six weeks ago he suffered a slight stroke of paralysis and was slow in making a recovery. His right side was affected. Remaining close at home since that time, he had spent much of his leisure hours across the street east, at a filling station operated by Warren Bolar. During the three or four days next preceding his death it had been noticed he seemed morose, and while he would talk if spoken to. he spent long periods of time in silent thought.

Sunday forenoon, Mr. and Mrs. Norton left the McQuerry home to attend Sunday school and preaching services at the Methodist church. Some time after 10:00 O'clock, Warren Bolar saw him going from his house to the barn, a short distance north of the residence. At the same time, James Thomas drove by from the north and called a greeting to McQuerry just as he was entering the barn, receiving a response. Thomas said this was at 10:30 o'clock. This was when he last was seen alive.

Services at the Methodist church were late in closing Sunday, and Mr. and Mrs. Norton did not reach home until about 12:20 o'clock. Failing to see her father about the house, and knowing his late habit of spending much of his time at the filling station, she called Bolar to know whether he had been there. When she found he had not, she became alarmed, and Norton and Bolar commenced a search of the premises.

At that time the fear was that Mr. McQuerry had had a second

stroke, although Mrs. Norton said that she, also, had norticed her father had been acting queerly for several days.

Norton and Bolar entered the barn and had looked about the ground floor, when Norton climbed part way up a ladder leading to the loft and saw the body of his father-in-law hanging from a rope that was suspended from a rafter at the west end of the building. It was at once apparent he was dead, and Dr. E. F. Harding, coroner, was notified.

Circumstances showed that Mr. McQuerry had entered the loft of the barn and had climbed to the top of a row of stacked bales of straw, carrying with him a strong rope that had been used to tether a cow. A ladder had been set up against the bales, which were four or five deep. Although somewhat enfeebled from the effects of the recent stroke, he had been able to drag one bale up to place it on top of the others, so that he would stand higher. The rope had first been fastened to a rafter in a corner of the barn, then passed by another rafter before being tied with a double hitch to a third, in front of the straw bales. Witha noose made in the end of the rope, and it slipped about his neck. Mr. McQuerry had stepped from his position into space. Death, it was said by physicians who examined the body, had come through strangulation. The body was out about two feet from the sides of the straw bales from which he had stepped to his death.

Bolar said he had not even considered the possibility that Mr. McQuerry could climb the ladder into the loft, in his then physical condition.

His pockets did not contain any notes to members of the family, and a search made of his room did not reveal that any had been left there.

Short funeral services were held here from the home at 10:00 o'clock this forenoon. This afternoon the body will be taken to the Hamilton church, east of Mt. Moriah, where services will be conducted by the Rev. W. O. Dotson. Burial will be at the Hamilton cemetery.

The latter was not able to be at the funeral.

Mr. McQuerry came to Mercer county, Mo., with his parents when about two years of age and moved to Harrison county about thirty-eight years ago. He lived on a farm until about fourteen years ago, when he came to Bethany and engaged in the business of taxi driver.

He was at one time a member of the I. O. O. F. and had his church membership at the Hamilton church near Mt. Moriah, joining the Baptist church there about twenty-five years

Mr. McQuerry was married in April, 1885, to Martha Jane Miller, who was killed in a railroad accident in August, 1911. Since that time he had lived with and had been cared for by his daughter Nettie.

The children of his marriage are Mrs. Ed Norton, Bethany; Mrs. V. A. Cabrall, Los Alamontis, Cal.; James M., Blythedale, Mo.; Charles, Omaha, Neb.; Harley, Bethany, and Mrs. Lois Neely, Chicago, Ill. Callie Wayne, the baby of the family, was killed with his mother at the age of four years.

The funeral was conducted at the home by Rev. W. O. Dotson. Interment was at the Hamilton cemetery.

## M.M. McQuerry, 63, Is Dead, a Suicide

Body of Taxi Driver Found Hanging in Barn About Noon Sunday

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While his daughter and her husband were attending Mother's day services at the Methodist Episcopal church, M. M. McQuerry, 63 years old, a Bethany taxi driver, took his own life Sunday morning. His body was found shortly after 12 o'clock hanging by a rope in the upper part of a barn at the rear of his Oakland avenue home.

Mrs. Nettie Norton, the daughter, and her husband, Ed Norton, who make their home with Mr. McQuerry, started to Sunday school about 10 o'clock. They left him sitting in living from of the home, reading a newspaper.

On their return from church about noon, they failed to find him in the house, and supposed he was at the Sinclair filling station across the street, operated by Warren Bolar, Mr. Bolar, however, said he had not been there, but remembered seeing Mr. Mc-Querry about the barn.

Because Mr. McQuerry had been ill with paralysis for several weeks, they were alarmed at his disappearance, thinking he might have suffered another stroke. Mr. Bolar accompanied Mr. and Mrs. Norton to the barn. Not finding him in the lower part, Mr. Bolar climbed a ladder and found the body. The rope had been tied to ratters above and Mr. McQuerry had jumped from a stack of baled straw at the side of the loft, the body swinging clear of the stack.

He had been dead about an hour when found. Dr. F. H. Broyles, who lives next door, came and helped cut the body down. Dr. E. F. Harding, coroner, was called and made a brief investigation. No note was found. Dr. Harding sald Mr. McQuerry's neck was not broken, death being caused by strangulation.

Ill health is thought to have prompted the suicide. Some weeks ago he suffered a light stroke of paralysis and had been confined to his home most of the time since, although he was recovering. Having lived an active life, it is believed by some that his sudden illness and confinement caused him to brood over his condition. Worry over financial matters also may have played a part, as he was caught in one of the bank failures. His mind had not seemed to be affected by the paralytic stroke.

After the body was found, it was removed to the S. M. Haas undertaking parlors to be prepared for burial. Later it was taken to the home.



#### **Spence**

(DD-512: dp. 2,050; l. 376'6"; b. 39'4"; dr. 13'5"; s. 35.5 k.; cpl. 273, a. 5 5", 4 40mm., 6 20mm., 6 dcp., 2 dct. (hh.), 10 21" tt.; cl. Fletcher)

Spence (DD-512) was laid down on 18 May 1942 by the Bath Iron Works, Bath, Maine; launched on 27 October 1942; sponsored by Mrs. Eben Learned; and commissioned on 8 January 1943, Lt. Comdr. H. J. Armstrong in command.

Spence conducted her shakedown cruise out of Guantanamo Bay from 8 to 28 February. She then served as an escort in the Atlantic and Caribbean and had convoy duty in the Casablanca area in April. She was routed to the west coast and, on 25 July, got underway from San Francisco for Pearl Harbor.

Spence sortied with TG 58.4, the fast carriers, on 6 June, to attack the Mariana Islands. As aircraft struck the islands, the destroyer moved in and bombarded enemy positions on Guam and Saipan. The planes attacked Iwo Jima on the 16th and then returned to pound the Marianas. Spence participated in the "Marianas Turkey Shoot" during the Battle of the Philippine Sea on 19 and 20 June. On 23 and 24 June, aircraft bombed targets on Guam, Saipan, and Tinian. The destroyer conducted shore bombardment against Rota, Saipan, and Guam from 26 June through the end of the month setting fuel tanks afire and sinking two sampans on the 27th.

Spence replenished at Eniwetok in July and, on 4 August, sailed for the California coast via Pearl Harbor and arrived at San Francisco on 18 August. She was drydocked all of September and, on 5 October, sailed for Pearl Harbor and the Marshalls. She arrived at Eniwetok on 31 October and was ordered to Ulithi in early November where she was assigned to TG 38.1, the Support Unit for the fast carriers of TF 38. She screened the carriers in Philippine waters as they launched attacks against Luzon during November and the first part of December.

On 17 December, Spence prepared to refuel and pumped out all of the salt water ballast from her tanks; but rough seas caused the fueling operation to be canceled. The next day, the weather worsened and the storm turned into a major typhoon. As the ships wallowed in canyon-like troughs of brine, Spence's electrical equipment got wet from great quantities of sea water taken on board. After a 72 degree roll to port, all of the lights went out and the pumps stopped. The rudder jammed; and, after a deep roll to port about 1100, Spence capsized and sank. Only 24 of her complement survived. Hull (DD-350) and Monaghan (DD-354) were also sunk in the typhoon. Spence was struck from the Navy list on 19 January 1945. Spence received eight battle stars for World War II service.
