INTRODUCTION

I was introduced to the McQuerry/Moore family early in life. They were friends of my Melton and Bushong grandparents from Mercer County, Missouri. I always felt like they were my family too. Willie and Nellie Bushong Melton and Cally Winfield and Ocie Gail Denison McQuerry were friends all their lives. Willie and Nellie lived near Princeton in Mercer County and Winfield and Gail lived in Spickard in Grundy County.

Nellie Bushong Melton's sister Maud Bushong married John Little from Spickard and the three couples visited every week. Winfield and Gail McQuerry had two daughters. Cecile Blanche married Alfred Alvin Hickman. Winnie Hazel married Thomas H. Moore. This joined the McQuerry and Moore families in Spickard. Willie & Nellie Melton's oldest daughters continued the friendship to the next generation. Ruth and Buelah Melton were friends with Hazel. Hazel's daughter Thora grew up with Willie and Nellie's son, William B. 'Junior' Melton. Bill Melton is my father.

Tom Moore went to California in early 1938 to seek work during the depression. He was successful and wanted his family to join him. Bill Melton graduated from Princeton High School in 1938 and was on his way to Pasadena, California to attend college and live with his sisters, Ruth and Buelah. Hazel Moore wanted to join Tom in Los Angeles so Bill offered to drive her and her youngest daughter Nelda. They all reunited in the Los Angeles area. Later that year daughter Thora Moore joined the family.

Thora Moore met and married Cecil Lee and Bill Melton went back to Missouri to marry his high school sweetheart Helen Richardson. The two couples became friends and lived within two blocks of each other in Highland Park, not far from Pasadena. They both had their first son's two weeks apart, Darell Lee and Robert Melton. The two boys lived nearby until they were two years old. It was then 1944 and Bill joined the US Navy and took his wife and son back to Gallatin, Missouri to live with Helen's parents. Their daughter Patricia Melton was born. Six months later, Helen brought Bobby and Patty by train to Los Angeles to see Bill before he shipped out to the Pacific. They stayed with their good friends, Thora and Cecil Lee. Yes, that is when Darell Lee and Patty Melton met. Twenty years later they would again meet and marry. This united the McQuerry, Moore and Melton families. So it was a natural progression to write about this family history 44 years later.

Darell and Pat Lee visited the families in Mercer and Grundy Counties in 1971 and after retirement really reunited with the Hickman family in Spickard. It became a yearly adventure, researching the libraries, interviewing family and of course the many hours taking pictures of those historical cemeteries. Wynn and Alice Hickman, Bessie Hickman and Ardis Simpson shared lots of history and pictures. Gordon Denison, Terri Hill and Carma Burton were introduced as cousins. Terri and Carma are cousins of Darell through the Denison family and with Pat through the Melton, Hamilton families. We also met with Max and Maradyn Oyler in Trenton and they provided the early Moore history from Pocahontas County, West Virginia.

Darell and Pat Lee met with Wayne and Ruth McQuerry in Orange, California around 1998. Hazel Moore knew that a cousin Wayne was interested in the family history. Wayne generously shared his fabulous years of research with us and we were able to fill in some history for him. Wayne and Ruth traveled to North Carolina and Indiana to do a complete search of the libraries and courthouses. They are credited with most of the McQuerry research in this book.

Darell and Pat also traveled to Indiana to research the McQuerry and Denison families in the Hancock County area.

To add more to this story and interesting event occurred when Darell Lee and their pastor Robert Snyder were talking and found that Robert's dad, Joe Snyder and Pat's dad, Bill Melton both graduated from Princeton High School in Missouri. Research found that Robert's family had cousins in the Hickman family. The Snyder family had relatives in the Spickard area as well as Princeton. In 2002, Bob Snyder meet Darell and Pat Lee in Spickard, staying with Ardis Simpson and meeting the families and touring the old home places. Lea Boyd was then 93 and it was a privilege to meet with her. She was a cousin of Bob's from the Boyd family. Maggie Boyd Snyder was Bob's grandmother. Lea of course also knew the Melton families. The Snyder family is included in this work. Bob's sister Marilyn Snyder also was working on family history and contributed to this history. The Girdners, Boyds and Wrights are part of this family.

Another friend from our church added that his family had been in Missouri. When Pat was at the Mercer County Library, she found the family book for Thomas Joshua Hendrickson, which she recognized as the family of this friend Tom Hendrickson. Thomas Joshua had married Jane Owens, daughter of John Andrew Jackson Owens that lived near Topsy. Their daughter Bernice had married King Evan Girdner from Bob Snyder's Girdner line. So from a little church near Los Angeles, California 5 people have family lines in Mercer and Grundy County.

Thus this book is finally complete.

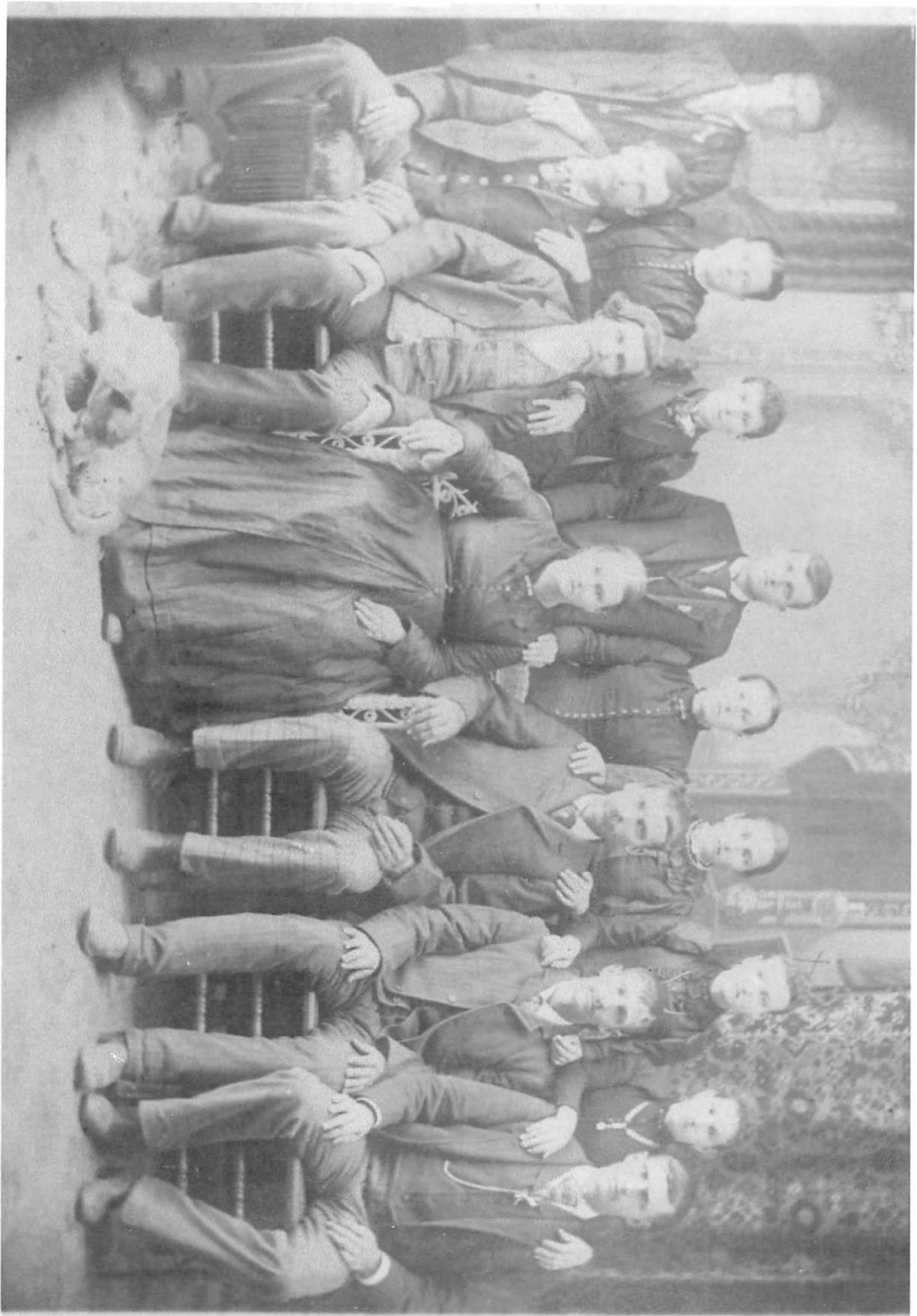

Descendants of John McQuerry

Generation No. 1

1. JOHN¹ MCQUERRY was born Abt. 1733 in Scotland, possibly Iona Island, and died Bet. 1797 - 1800 in Probably Wilkes Co, North Carolina. He married KITTY.

Notes for JOHN MCQUERRY:

John is said to be from Scotland. Page 104 of EARLY SETTLERS OF REDDIES RIVER N.C. By Paul Gregory, tells about John Sr.

"Clearance McQueary, a descendant through William, was the official historian for the McQueary clan when I interviewed him in 1965. His records say that John McQueary Sr. was born in Scotland, possibly Iona Island. He came to America and made his home in or near Lynchburg, Virginia. While I have not verified this, I have no reason to think that it is untrue. According to family tradition, the McQueary families in America descend from the Macquaire Clan of Southwest Scotland, near the Ayr River.

None of the children of John McQueary have been definitely identified, except William. Since John recorded his name as Sr. in the 1790 census, one must conclude that there was a Jr. in the house. Therefore, I am assuming that John McQueary who married Nancy Shepherd in Wilkes Co, about 1792 was that Jr. No other McQueary families lived in Wilkes County during this period of time.

Several additional tax lists of Wilkes county have been found. These records for the years of 1787, 1788, 1792, 1793, 1794, 1795 clearly indicate that there were two John McQueary's living on Reddies River. Both were taxable through the years of 1793, at which time John Sr. discontinued paying poll tax. This would suggest that he had reached his 60th birthday and was therefore exempt from paying poll taxed by virtue of his age. These tax records clearly listed both John's, one as Junior and one as Senior both living on Reddies River. Therefore, there seems little doubt that the above two John's were father and son; and that John McQueary Sr. died sometime between 1797 and 1800."

EARLY SETTLERS OF REDDIES RIVER-early 1700-1976 by Wilkes Co. NC Genealogical Society was located by Pat Lee at the Allan Co. Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1998. Page 103 tells of John McQueary Sr. (this family follows the John Shepherd Sr. family)
"JOHN MCQUEARY SR. - Another family who came to Reddies River in Wilkes County during the Revolutionary War was that of John McQueary Sr. The exact date of his arrival is not known. However, we know that he was here in 1779 as this is the date he entered his land (100 acres), which was located on Mill Creek, a tributary of Reddies River, just below Thomas Owen's Spring. (entry 1104 Wilkes Co.)

Apparently this claim was not approved as no grant or deed has been recorded in Wilkes county in his name. The 1784, 1785, 1786 list of taxables for Wilkes County confirm that John was Poll taxable, but that he owned no land. It is a fact that sometimes men transferred their entry claim before the grant was ever made.

John Sr. does not show up on federal census for Wilkes County until 1790, and lists John Sr. and shows again that he was living on Reddies River. His family showed 1 male child under 16, 5 females. His son John Jr. was not listed in this census but his son, William was. This is

the last record we have for John Sr. Either he died or left the county prior to the 1800 census.

William went to Kentucky.

Generation No. 2

2. JOHN JR.² MCQUERRY (*JOHN*¹) was born August 05, 1765 in Pittsylvania Co, Virginia, and died October 1846 in Brown Twp, Hancock, Indiana. He married NANCY SHEPHERD March 03, 1790 in Wilkes Co, North Carolina, daughter of JOHN SHEPHERD and SARAH MUSICNOW. She was born November 17, 1765 in Spotsylvania Co, Virginia, and died 1842 in Probably Hancock Co, Indiana.

Notes for JOHN JR. MCQUERRY:

HISTORY OF HANCOCK CO. INDIANA by George Richman 1916, found by Pat Lee at Hancock Co. Library, page 526 "Brown Township: The first land entry in the township was made by Pryor Brown, in 1830 entered the township 17 range 8. He was followed by a number of families whose names are still familiar in the county. Among them are.....John McQuery."

The old McQuerry Bible was last seen in the hands of Thelma McQuerry Meinecke and viewed by La Mar McQuerry. A copy was given to Wayne McQuerry in the 1980's. Pat Lee received a copy in 2002. This copy was made by La Mar McQuerry in July 1983. Evidently this was originally viewed and copied by Louise Taraba. She supplied the Bible information to Wilkes County Genealogy Society.

"JAMES MCQUERRY FAMILY RECORDS, In January 1972, I was most pleased to locate the old McQuerry Family Bible in the care of Thelma McQuerry Meinecke. Some dates and names could not be read even with a magnifying glass. All family data was written in the old pen. With careful study, I believe this reading is as exact as possible. Copied census records help verify this information as does a sheet of paper found in grandfather's belongings. Data from these sources follow in the Bible records.

My connection to this family is through my father, Samuel Ellis McQuerry, who was the son of Marmaduke McQuerry, the grandson of James McQuerry, the great grandson of John and Nancy McQuerry both born in the year of 1765. The Bible was printed in New York by E. and J. White, for the American Bible Society. It is a stereotype edition and was stereotyped in 1818. Five pages between the Old and New Testaments contain data.

Inside the front cover of the Bible is the name John Judd. (Just who this person was and the connection to the McQuerry family is not known at this time. Perhaps Judd was the middle name for John McQuerry.) Have since learned John Judd was census taker. He was also married to Rhoda Shepherd cousin to Nancy Shepherd who married John McQuerry."

The following is copied from a paper found in Marmaduke McQuerry's belongings after he died.

"James McQuerry son of John and Nancy McQuerry was married to Rachel Jennens and their offspring were:

1. Polly who married Bill Caldwell,
2. Perry who married Charlotte Reeves,
3. Sally who married Mart Bussel
4. Betsy who married Quincy Samples who died, she then married John Powers.

Then Rachel died, he (James) then married Lilly Scott and their offspring were:

1. Cally, who married Pricilla Mingle,
2. Kiziear, who married Joh Dawson, 2nd Breedon.
3. Lurancy, who married Philip Prichard
4. Nancy Jane, who married Mich Collier, in state of Indiana, lived there her life time.
5. John Harvey who married Rachel Gibson
6. William Alsbury, who married Sallie Little
7. Phoebe, who married Robert Southers, who died and she married Isaac Weber
8. Haywood Martin, who married Cely Mallet
9. George Washington, aged 9 years was kicked and killed by a horse.
10. Marma Duke, who married Eva Miller, who died and he married Rhoda Gibson

Marma Duke McQuerry was born June 3, 1858. Eva, his wife, was born Nov. 13, 1869.

Their offspring were:

1. Ida May McQuerry born Jan. 24, 1889, married Clyde keuhn
2. Samuel Ellis McQuerry was born Nov. 2, 1890, married Carrie Ellsworth.
3. Ina Asberine McQuerry was born Aug. 10, 1892 who married Ward Hamilton.

Eva died July 13, 1895. Marma Duke then married Roda Gibson, then Elza Oars McQuerry was born 1899 and died Jan. 17, 1901

(all census data was sent by Mrs. Lewis Johnson, wife of a distant cousin.)"

From Wayne McQuerry Sept. 2002, "We do not know who has the McQuerry Bible now. We tried to locate it. Thelma McQuerry Meinecke had given it to someone in Oregon. Don't remember the name...believe she was a descendant of Marmaduke."

EARLY SETTLERS OF REDDIES RIVER-early 1700-1976 by Wilkes Co. NC Genealogical Society was located by Pat Lee at the Allan Co. Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1998. page 105, "John McQueary Jr. of Reddies River, married about 1792 Nancy Shepherd, daughter of John and Sarah Shepherd. No record of this marriage has been found. We know that the marriage took place as the will of John Shepherd included John and Nancy Shepherd McQueary as legatees. The 1800 census reveals that John and Nancy had five children by this date--two boys and three girls. By 1810, two more boys had been born.

Recently, the old McQueary family Bible has been located and the information in it was furnished to me by Mrs. Louise Taraba, a descendant who lives in Kansas City. This Bible record verifies the census data and birth dates. John was born in 1765 and Nancy was born November 17, 1765.

John McQueary made his home on Reddies River, near Deep Ford Hill. In 1798 he purchased 150 acres from his father in law, John Shepherd Sr, and this property was located just below Lewis Shepherd's land near Deep Ford Hill.

John was active in the work of Reddies River Church. The exact date he joined this church is not clear. However, we know from the church minutes that he was a member as early as January 1, 1803 when 'John McQueary, John and Robert Judd were to cite Larking Pumphry to come to the next meeting to answer the charges that had been brought against him'. On other occasions, John represented the church at various associational meetings. His status as a member was enhanced in 1808, when John and several other members donated one dollar each to the church to take care of some building needs. One dollar in those days was substantial donation.

John continued to serve the church faithfully. In July 1829, John was elevated to the position of deacon in Reddies River Church. He did not get to serve in this capacity very long as the church records say that John McQueary and his daughter, Sally Baldwin, along with Nancy Baldwin, requested letters of dismissal in September 1830, apparently in preparation for their leaving the county.

In 1831, John McQueary and his sons, John and James moved to Hancock County, Indiana. They settled in Brown Township while Andrew, who probably left earlier, settled in Greene Township, and Morgan, who had earlier gone to Indiana, settled in James Township.

The 1840 census of Hancock County, Indiana recorded the following McQueary men:

John McQueary Sr. 70-80 years, wife same, no children

John McQueary Jr. 30-40, wife same, 7 children

James McQueary 30-40, wife same, 7 children

Andrew McQueary 40-50, wife same, 9 children

Morgan McQueary 40-50, wife same, five daughters.

One Morgan McQueary was in Randolph County, Indiana in 1820. It is assumed that he left Wilkes County shortly after he married Polly Case in 1816."

Notes for NANCY SHEPHERD:

Nancy's father is John Shepherd Sr. His wife is listed as Sarah Musicnow in the records of Wayne McQuerry. Wayne gives Sarah's birth as May 25, 1735 and died after 1810. Wayne also gives John Shepherd Sr.'s father as George Shepherd Sr. died 1751 in Spotsylvania, Va, with wife of George being, Elizabeth Mary Angelick Day.

EARLY SETTLERS OF REDDIES RIVER has an article on page 82;

"THE JOHN SHEPHERD FAMILY- John Shepherd Sr., son of George Shepherd, Sr. of Spotsylvania County, Virginia, apparently came to Reddies River in the late fall or early spring

of 1776. John sold his land in Spotsylvania County in November 1775- property that he purchased about twelve years earlier. The date that he came to Wilkes County, N.C. is confirmed by John's daughter, Delphia, who stated in the 1850 census of Dallas County, Missouri, that she was born in Wilkes County in 1776.

When John and his wife, Sarah, arrived on Reddies River, only a few scattered families were living there. They settled near Deep Ford Hill. The waters of Reddies River were clear, clean, swift and cold. This is the place that John sank his roots never to move again.

On April 24, 1778, John entered his land that he had lived on and improved, following the Confiscation Act, claiming 405 acres, beginning at the bend in the river near Deep Ford and extending northward to the forks of the river, including property on both sides of the river. He later bought additional acres of land.

John Shepherd Sr, was born in Spotsylvania County, Virginia on August 10, 1734 and died on Reddies River in Wilkes County, N.C. June 11, 1810, being 75 yrs, 10 months and 1 day old, according to the Thornton Shepherd Bible record.....

No doubt John was a man not only with considerable substance but also with recognized integrity. A close reading of his will indicates that John provided his children with considerable financial assistance and had enough left at his death to provide each one with a considerable additional amount. John's will is reproduced below:

'In the name of God, Amen. I John Shepherd, Sr. being in perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, have made and ordained to be made this my last will and testament in the manner informed following to wit: I leave my soul to Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned; and as to all my worldly goods it hath pleased God to bless me with, I leave in the manner following: My will is that all my just debts to be paid and satisfied, then I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Sarah, to have full and free possession of all that I possess during her life or continuance at the place where I now live, and if she chooses to move from here to take Grace and her bed and chest during her life; and to Anne Viars, or her three daughters, I leave \$90 to be divided between them; to Susanna Vannoy I leave \$160 to make her equal with the rest; and to James I leave \$10 to make him equal with the rest; and to Lucy Pumphrey I leave \$70 to make her equal with the rest; and to John Shepherd Jr., I leave \$130 to make him equal with the rest; to NANCY MCQUERRY I leave \$90 to make her equal with the rest; to Steven Shepherd I leave \$80 to make him equal to the rest; and to Lewis I leave \$50 to make him equal to the rest and to Sally Jennings I leave \$127.50...., and to Delpha Judd I leave \$135....; and to Andrew Shepherd I have given \$250' and when all this is settled, if anything remains I leave it to be equally divided agreeable to the will amongst all that is mentioned in the afore will. I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son, John Shepherd and Nathaniel Judd Jr. executors of this my last will and testamentthis 21st day, A.D., 1810. Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of us: Lewis Shepherd and NANCY MCQUERRY.

Signed: John Sheppard.' This will was proven in July Session of County, 1810, by the oath of Lewis Sheppard."

McQuerry and Veda Hamilton; "JAMES McQUERRY FAMILY, James McQuerry, progenitor of many Mercer County, Missouri, residents and descendants of former residents, was born and reared in Wilkes County, North Carolina. He was the youngest of seven children born to John Jr. and Nancy (Shepherd) McQuerry. His six brothers and sisters, all born near Wilkesborough, North Carolina were Sarah, Lucy, Morgan, Betsy, Andrew, John Jr. (information on them listed under John Jr. McQuerry).

James' grandparents were John Sr. and Kitty McQuerry and George Sr. and Elizabeth Mary (Angelick) Day Shepherd. Family Bible records show James' birth date as December 22, 1807; other data, including his tombstone inscription, indicates the birth year was 1806.

James was married first on March 14, 1826, in Wilkes County to Rachel Jennings (April 18, 1808), probably, Wilkes Co., NC- October 29, 1834. James, Rachel and James' parents (about 65 years old) withdrew in September 1830 from the Reddies River Church and headed for Hancock County, Indiana. When it was catalogued in 1980, Rachel's grave was the earliest identifiable one in the Hays Cemetery, Hancock County, Indiana (originally known as the McQuerry Cemetery.)

James married second Lillian 'Lilly' Scott about 1835 in Indiana. Lilly was born July 18, 1813, Pasquotank County, North Carolina, the daughter of Harvey and Kissiah (Clark) Scott. Harvey Scott was born 1791 in Pasquotank Co., NC; married Kissiah Clark in 1809. Harvey died March 26, 1845 in Madison Co., IN. Kissiah was born in 1790 in Pasquotank Co. NC and died August 9, 1847 in Fall Creek Twp. Harvey's father was Marmaduke Scott who died in 1813. Harvey's mother was Mary Jackson.

James, Lilly and their younger children came in the summer or early fall of 1860 to Mercer County, Missouri, and homesteaded on a farm in southwest Madison Township, south of where the Hamilton Church is now. He later bought 160 acres of land which joined his on the east. He sold this farm to his son Cally when Cally came to Mercer County.

James and Rachel had a least four children: (Children listed here appear in list of children provided by Wayne H. McQuerry)

Family records show James and Lilly had ten children, all born in Hancock County, Indiana. (Children listed here appear in list of children provided by Wayne H. McQuerry.

In 1841 James and Lilly donated land (now part of the Hays Cemetery) for a 'meeting house and public burial ground.' James was administrator of the estates of his father and father in law. He cared for his brother James III for five years prior to John's death. James was the guardian of Betsy's children after her death, and he and Lilly reared these children.

James McQuerry died on December 14, 1876. Lilly died on January 14, 1888. Both are buried in the Hamilton Cemetery, Madison Township, Mercer Co., Missouri."

They came in a covered wagon to Mercer County, Missouri, 3 miles west of Modena from Terre Haute, Ind. in 1862. Uncles (I think) John Harvey & Marma Duke (Dukey) McQuerry had come earlier to the location west of Modena. My grandparents lived first in a little log cabin before they came or after they arrived but I feel like it was before. My memory of it was in the orchard and the apples I liked most were a wonderful sweet apple I haven't seen in years and a Snow apple bright red and snow white flesh.

Grand Mothers Maiden name was Kessler (from Germany) but her talk was Pennsylvania Dutch. Always she would say you now and fetch me...' I was of a mind it would be the death of her.

She made lots of cottage cheeze whitch she called 'Schmiercasse' (the boys often got wind of it and they called it 'dog-face' but they had to eat it just the same! Their denim blouses or jackets were always 'Tannys or tanney coats.' Grandma Mc told me when they were leaving Indiana, 'grandpap Mc put 2 silver \$ in my hand and told me to buy candy along the way for the children.' They got along very well without and I bought a 'piggy gilt' after we got settled and then when each of the children married I gave them a piggy-gilt. Grandmother Mc (her children called her 'Manny') made the children, especially the boys help her pick geese until all the children had big nice feather-beds when they started house keeping. My dad hated geese and swore he would never have a one and didn't. Grandpa Mc said each son should stay and help him until he was 21 yr and he would deed him 40a. of land. With the boys help they kept on adding more land as they could purchase it. One 40a. was straight west of the Groff Cemetery, he said that would be a good 'wean-er farm' but Uncle Jake and Aunt Lura moved there but they wouldn't stay there long anyway. They landed back west of Modena.

Grandma often told me that she begged grandpa Mc to turn around and go back to Indiana when they got to the foot of the Patterson hill (Averil lives at the top of Patterson hill) and when they got up it they were almost there. The cabin they went to was right east of the Hamilton church on the South side of the roads.

John W. Denison and Sarah Johnson (Note: Cecile Hickmans other grandparents, parents of Gail Denison McQuerry) came from Pendleton, Indiana in a covered wagon in 1863 to Hancock County, Iowa. They crossed the Mississippi River on the ice. Grandma Denison told me the wind was blowing so cold and she was so scared. She walked and carried my Uncle Roe (Monroe) under her shawls, grandpa drove the horses and walked holding the lines to one side so if the wagon broke thru the ice he could save the horses. Edna tell me that grandpa worked on the ?dam to get money to get them a home and grubstake until they could raise a crop. They lived in Iowa until 1878 when my mother was 3 yrs old and settled west of Goshen in Mercer County, Mo. Aunt Tina, Alley Albert (Edna of Cally (Emmets father) Blanch (Sylvia) John Thomas, Glen & Gail born in Ia. Grandma said she was left an orphan at the age of 13 yr & a dear old Quaker Lady took her in if I every heard what happened to her parents I

don't remember. Grandpa Denison loved to hunt & fish and like the timber. Had a big apple orchard and raised lots of vegetables which he buried in holes in the orchards. I can remember going with him and Emmet to open an apple hole in the winter. Grandpa took a wooden candy bucket and heaped it full to take in to Grandma & Ma & the apples were so crisp and cold and good. And my Mother of course was given plenty to take home with her. The vegetable hold yield turnips, cabbage, potatoes etc. I never heard about his schooling but was told he was a brilliant debater in their Literary Debates so popular at that time.

Edna & others have told me that Grandpa D. was awful stingy he never seemed so to me but they say Ma was his pet and Emmet he adored-bought him the little suit and boots had his picture taken. The only picture in the family.

I asked my mother if they had relatives in Iowa. She said she didn't know but grandma once mention to me a Hugh- I don't know if Denison or Johnson. Ma said she remembered a man would ride in and grandpa would take care of his horse and they would eat supper and talk all night (it seemed to her) about old neighbors or relatives in Iowa and next morning early grandpa and him would go fishing or hunting squirrel but he would be gone before night.

There was always plenty of pop-corn which Emmet popped in a long handled popper in the fireplace. My dad helped cut and bring in the night-log and we kids bring in the sticks and chips need to kindle a good fire in the winter."

McQuerry and Veda Hamilton, "CALLY AND PRISCILLA JANE (MINGLE) McQUERRY FAMILY: Cally McQuerry, a Mercer County, Missouri, farmer/stockman for some 33 years, was born on October 5, 1831, in Brown Township, Hancock County, Indiana. Family records show he was the son of James and Lilly (Scott) McQuerry. Other records, including tombstone death date for Rachel, first wife of James, indicate Cally may have been the issue of Rachel. Cally was married January 25, 1855, in Hancock County to Priscilla Jane Mingle (November 23, 1836, Hancock County), the daughter of Jacob and Susan (Snyder) Mingle. Cally and Priscilla began farming and soon started their family in Hancock County. Later, they moved a short distance to Madison County, Indiana.

Cally, identified as a resident of Madison County, Indiana, in April 1864, bought 160 acres of land in Mercer County from his father. James had purchased this farm less than two months earlier. Cally, with his family and others, moved to Mercer County ca late 1864/1865 and eventually settled on the farm west of Modena which his grandchildren called 'the old home place.' This farm is now owned by Dick and Charlotte Antle.

Twelve children were born to Cally and Priscilla, the first five in Hancock County, Indiana. (Children are listed in the article but omitted here.)

Cally and Priscilla were family centered. Most of their children and grandchildren remained in 'visiting distance' for many years. Some of Cally's grandchildren remembered him as a 'very good fiddler.'" Some also recalled that, in his later years, his constant companion was a large dog named 'old Yeller."

Cally died on May 26, 1898. Priscilla died on March 13, 1923. Both are buried in the Hamilton Cemetery. They spent their lives on the same farm which they purchased when they came to Mercer County."

Kessler? from Germany, spoke Pennsylvania Dutch. Cecil Hickman gives her name as Pricilla Jane Kessler Mingle. The parents of Priscilla have not been proven. L. Taraba gives her mother as Susan Snyder and father's last name Mingle. A Jacob Mingle with wife Susannah appears in court records in Hancock Co., IN according to Wayne H. McQuerry. A Jacob Mingle with wife Susanah are buried in Mendon Cemetery.

Pat and Darell Lee went to Hancock Co., IN in 1999 to research the McQuerry family and found that the Mingle family was also in Hancock Co. We can not be sure if we have the correct family but from the following sources it appears that our Jacob Mingle could be from this prominent family. A Jacob Mingle is mentioned as the brother to George Mingle. George Mingle is said to be the son or grandson of John Mingle, Revolutionary Soldier. By placing this information here it does not prove that our Jacob is the Jacob mentioned in these articles. The family is buried in Mendon Cemetery and lists Jacob and Susanah along with George and John Mingle.

1895, copied by Heritage Books 1990, page 373, "THE MINGLE FAMILY- The Mingle family since 1840 have been one of the prominent ones in both Hancock and Madison counties. George Mingle settled on the line dividing the counties in 1840, but in Hancock County. He was born in Pennsylvania at the close of the last century, or about the year 1795. His wife Christena Loy, was born in Ohio. They resided on the old farm until 1868, when Mr. M. died. She died in 1872; both buried at the Mingle cemetery. Mr. and Mrs. Mingle were strong, vigorous pioneers, just in their prime when they came to this country.

Pat Lee found a manuscript at the Indianapolis, Indiana State Library concerning the Mingle family.

It is a DAR speech that was presented by Nellie Gray Hallowell date showing is 12-13-41. "Paper read at the dedication of a monument erected to the memory of JOHN MINGLE, a Revolutionary soldier, by the Kik-tha-we-nund Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

The Mingle family is one of the pioneer families of this section of the country. They lived a simple, quiet life. Tradition tells us that the family was German, ordinarily spoken of as 'Dutch', migrating to Pennsylvania. They first bore the name as Mungel. As years passed, the name became Mangel. At the time when we are most interested, JOHN MINGLE, my great-great grandfather was born, February 2, 1758 in Bedford County, Pennsylvania. He enlisted in the state militia, fighting for the colonies in their struggle for freedom from their mother country, for which he received government pay.

Following the war he married in 1787 and moved to Montgomery Co., Ohio. Later he came to Indiana where he resided for some time with his sons, David and George. These are the only two we know about from the large family. John died August 18, 1842 at the home of his son David in Madison Co., Indiana.

George Jr. Mingle became a member of the Madison County Lodge F. and A.M. in 1855. WE ALSO FIND JACOB MINGLE WAS THE FIRST PIONEER TO OPEN HIS HOME AS A TAVERN TO ACCOMMODATE THE TRAVELER. LITTLE IS RECORDED ABOUT THIS AS JACOB LIVED BUT A SHORT TIME. (note: the Jacob in Mendon Cemetery died at age 47) (article goes on to name descendants)

The pioneer family of George Mingle lived on the Madison-Hancock County line on what is known as the Shull farm in the neighborhood of the town of Menden, three and one half miles south of Pendleton.

In the cemetery sleep many pioneers of days long passed. It is here we meet today to recall the memory of a man of other days and to mark a spot that future citizens may know that he lived to aid our liberty."

"MARION MADISON AND MARTHA JANE (MILLER) McQUERRY FAMILY- Marion Madison 'Maddy' McQuerry, (December 2, 1863, Hancock County, Indiana), son of Cally and Priscilla Jane Mingle McQuerry, came to Mercer County, Missouri, when he was about one year old. He married Martha Jane Miller, daughter of Abraham and Deborah Maxwell Miller. Abraham and Deborah, both born in Ohio, were married in Allen County, Ohio. About 1855 they came to Harrison County, Missouri, and a few years later moved to Mercer County. They had three daughters and five sons. Abraham was a Civil War veteran.

Marion Madison and Martha Jane were married on November 22, 1885, in Mercer County. Their first home as the 'weaning house' on Cally McQuerry's farm where their first two children were born. Cally McQuery was born in Indiana in 1834. In 1865 he with his wife and family came to Missouri and settled in Mercer County where he became a highly respected farmer and stockman. He died at the home place in 1898 and is buried in Hamilton Cemetery. His wife, now eighty-four years of age, still lives on the farm upon which she and her husband settled when they came to Missouri.

M. M. McQuery received his education in the public schools and, in 1888, he began farming near Mount Moriah, Harrison County. He remained on the same farm for twelve years, when he moved to Bethan Township where, in 1900, he bought 159 acres of land. He kept this farm until 1918 when he sold it and moved to Bethany. For the next two years he engaged in the real estate business; since that time he has conducted a taxi business in which he has been very successful. Mr. McQuery was married in the fall of 1886 to Martha Jane Miller, who was born and reared in Mercer County, Missouri. To M.M. McQuery and Martha Jane McQuery the following children were born; Nettie, living at home; Genevive, now Mrs. Garten, living in Hutchinson, Kansas; James Madison, living in St. Joseph, Mo; Charley, living at home; Harley, who lives in Cypress Township; Lois, living at home; and Cally deceased. Mrs. McQuery and her son, Cally, a child of four, were killed in an accident at a railroad crossing close to Ridgeway, Missouri, in 1912. They are buried in Hamilton Cemetery.

Harley McQuery married Ruth Utgerback who was born and reared in Cypress Township. They have one son, George Pershing, now two years old.

James and Charles McQuery both served in the World War. James was sent overseas with the Engineering Corps and made an excellent record. Wynn's maternal grandparents, Cally Winfield and Ocie Gail Denison McQuerry, purchased a feed mill in 1917 which operated until the late 30's. It was located south of the river bridge. The Hickmans had three daughters, Glenda, Peggy and Marsha."
