John and second wife, Wilmoth (Seamore) Collins migrated southwest from Halifax County, Virginia to Rockingham County, North Carolina circa 1819. The exact location is unknown but land deeds indicate they were in the southwest part of the county along the Dan River (ref. 47, 48). Rockingham County lies in the northern Piedmont Plateau adjacent to the state of Virginia. The 210 mile long Dan River bisects the county meandering from southwest to northeast through rolling hills typical of the Piedmont. The forests were of mixed hardwood and old-pines that sheltered a variety of birds and small wild animals. Many varieties of ferns and wild flowers grew in abundance. The woods, fields and roadsides were splashes of color with several species of orchid, azalea, laurel and rhododendron.

John was a farmer. The fields were small patches of land composed of sandy and clay loam that varies in color from red to yellow to gray. Most of the fields were located along the river banks where the soil is extremely fertile. The major crops grown were tobacco, cotton, flax, wheat and corn.

The Collins dwelling was probably a one room log cabin with mere openings for windows, guarded with wooden shutters. The fireplace at one end of the room was probably built of sticks, moss and clay. It was used for cooking as well as warmth. The furniture was home-made using an ax, adz and auger-- the table constructed of a rough hewn slab with legs driven into auger holes, a few rude stools, beds made by laying wooden slabs across poles supported on forked posts and an cradle made of a hollow trough made from a small log for the ever present baby. Their food consisted largely of fish and game supplemented with cornbread and hominy. The clothing was deerskin leggings, hunting shirt, augmented with cloth spun and woven using flax and cotton (ref. 47).

John and Wilmoth's family increased in North Carolina. Their first son, George Washington Collins, was born in 1821, an unnamed child, then Simon Peter Collins, the subject of this writing, was born 22 June 1828 (ref. 3). Simon Peter is my paternal great grandfather. The family continued living in Rockingham County for a few more years. Simon was about four years old when the family moved and settled in Hart County, Kentucky. The family may have gone to be with Wilmoth's mother, Dicia Seamore. Dicia first appears on the tax records in 1831.(ref. 49) The tax record for 1833 shows John had one horse, mare or mule valued at \$30.00 but did not seem to possess any property. The 1835 tax records show that John had purchased 119 acres and owned two horses. The next few years John purchased more land on Green River.

Simon grew from a small child to adulthood in Hart County. He was taught the rudiments of farming and farm life by his father. The 1850 Census of the United States, Hart County, Kentucky lists him as a student, but doesn't designate what he was studying at 21 years of age. He was living in his mother's household (ref. 34). John, his father died in 1843 (ref. 33). S.P. Collins first appears on the tax records in Hart County, the year of 1852, also in 1854, 1855, 1856, with no land.

Simon Peter Collins and Elizabeth Washington Boston married in Hart County 23 November 1854 (ref. 2). Elizabeth's parents, James and Bidy (Slinker) Boston were opposed to this marriage so Simon and Elizabeth made plans to elope one night. Simon was putting a ladder up to Elizabeth's upstairs window so she could join him but, in doing so, made a noise that brought an enraged Mr. Boston out of the house, shotgun in hand. Simon, undaunted by loud words and the threatening shotgun, proceeded with his plan. Faced with such determination, Mr. Boston relented and accepted that a marriage was going to take place, but said they must "do it right!" They married in the Boston home.

Their first child was a boy, named Youel J. born 8 April 1856 in Hart County. Shortly after he arrived, they joined the James and Bidy Boston family on a trek westward looking for a new place to settle where plentiful arable land was available with a suitable climate. The Boston's settled in Greene County, Missouri near a hamlet named Bois D'Arc (Bowdark) northwest of Springfield. Simon Peter and Elizabeth decided to make their home in Cedar County about thirty-five miles northwest. (ref. 35). Their first land purchase was made 1 August 1857 from Samuel S. Brown containing seventy-nine acres, located about two miles east of the hamlet, Jerico Springs. The cost of this farm was \$99.62 or \$1.26 per acre.

Another son was added to the family, George Dixon Collins arrived in March 1858. The family lead a busy farm life--growing crops to feed to the livestock and the surplus to sell, raising livestock for their own use as well as to sell for part of their income. The Collins families were stockraisers, including cattle, horses, hogs, turkeys, geese, and chickens. Elizabeth had many tasks in addition to tending the children, gardens, perhaps spinning and weaving, cooking, making clothing and linens. She didn't have any of the conveniences that we have today such as a washing machine, vacuum cleaner, electrical appliances, running water in the house, and an inside bathroom. The farmer tilled the soil with draft animals and crude implements. The hay was often cut with a scythe and stacked using pitchforks. The grain threshed by beating the cut stalks with a stick.

David L. Collins arrived 10 May 1859. This tiny baby was not destined to enliven the family but for a very short time. He passed away four days later and was laid to rest in the Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County, a

few miles south of their home. Another son, arrived on 20 February, 1860. He didn't live long enough for them to choose a proper and fitting name for this little bundle of joy. He died 5 March 1860. He was laid to rest beside his brother in the Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County.

Simon and Elizabeth were quite ill that summer with the "chills." Biddy Boston, Elizabeth's mother, spent some time with them using her talents in caring for the sick. Travel and letters between the two families were infrequent. Sometimes it would be six months between communication.

Simon visited the Boston's sometime in late November or December 1860 and declared that he is now a preacher. He did not have an assigned church or congregation but was an itinerant pastor traveling to wherever necessary to spread the gospel. He was a member of the Missionary Baptist Church and preached in many places around the countryside, sometimes being away from home several days at a time. Simon quite often rode his favorite saddle horse on his rounds, but in the case of inclement weather he would ride in a buggy so he would have a little shelter from the wind and rain. While he was away preaching, Elizabeth took on the extra tasks of everyday duties on the farm; in fact she seemed to prefer the outdoor life to housework.

Another little son joined the family on 11 February 1861. He was named James E. Collins. The family was sorrowed again when their youngest baby boy died on 1 April 1862. He too was laid to rest in the Cedarville Cemetery beside his brothers. The family grieved over the death of three of their tiny babies.

There was a lot of unrest in the United States over the slavery issue. The Southern States desired to retain their way of life, many plantations owning slaves to work in the fields and mansions. Just eleven days after the death of baby James, the Confederate Army opened fire on Fort Sumter on 12 April 1861. The war was really a struggle between two different ways of life. The South had developed into an agricultural entity while the North developed into a manufacturing industry. Missouri was a border state. Late in 1862 the Confederate Army was recruiting vigorously in Southwest Missouri and Northwest Arkansas. The Confederates thought that if they could win Missouri to join the Confederates, they would win the war. Many men volunteered in either the Union Army or the Confederate States Army. Being reared a southerner, but not owning slaves, Simon, at age 34, journeyed to Red River, Arkansas to volunteer for the 10th Missouri Cavalry on 1 January 1863 for a period of three years (16).

Simon was away when their next child was born. My grandfather, Simon Peter Jr., was born on 18 April 1863. The skirmishes that the 10 Missouri Cavalry seemed to be involved in were mostly in Northern Arkansas but at times they were blockading along the Mississippi River. The Cavalrymen furnished their own horses and firearms, were paid \$12.00 a month. They furnished their own uniforms with probably no two soldiers dressed alike. Often as not the color was butternut brown causing the enemy to call the Confederates butternuts. The Confederate soldiers were brave, patriotic, resourceful with boundless confidence in themselves. They were an undisciplined army; each unit did what they thought best, sometimes without knowing the overall plans or what other units were doing. (ref. 53,54,55).

Actual fighting seemed to take up a small amount of time for the soldiers; they found various activities to relieve the boredom of camp life. Most of the men were homesick and would much rather be at home with their families. They had to do something to occupy a lot of the time while in camp between skirmishes. They played early versions of baseball, football, and quoits. More importantly they had footraces, cockfighting, gambling with cards and dice, singing and reading (53). A story told by my Uncle Bill Collins illustrates Simon Peter's physical prowess and his determination to act in accordance with his beliefs. Simon was noted for his ability to run--to win footraces. One day when there was no particular activity going on, Simon's brother-in-law, Tom Boston, decided to get some foot races going. He got some men to participate in the races and many more to bet on the outcome. Tom, of course bet on Simon Peter. After getting the event set up, Tom went to Simon and asked him to participate. Simon was busy "pegging" his boots-wooden pegs were used instead of nails to hold the soles and uppers together—but he finally gave in and agreed to race. However he soon found out that the soldiers were betting on the outcome and refused to race. He considered gambling to be sinful. (ref. 11)

The bushwhackers in Missouri were numerous and bold. They stole what they wanted then burned the buildings leaving nothing for the residents. Simon's wife, Elizabeth, had a visit from the Kansas bushwhackers probably in the summer or fall of 1863. They told her to take her little family and whatever else she wanted from the house and leave. After she left they took red hot coals from the fireplace and strung them throughout the house and burned it to the ground. She took her little family of three small boys traveling by team of horses and wagon to live with her parents in Greene County, about thirty-five miles away. She made many trips back to see about the family farm until the end of the war (5, 55).

General Lee surrendered his army at the Appomattox Court House in Virginia, seventy-five miles west of Richmond on April 9, 1865. Six weeks and five days later Company C, 10 Regiment Missouri Cayalry, Confederate States Army, commanded by Col. Wm. T. Barry surrendered at New Orleans, LA, May 26, 1865, and paroled at Shreveport, LA, 7 June 1865 (16,56). At last, Simon could return to Missouri and his beloved family. At last he could return to the more tranquil life of farming and itinerant preacher in the area surrounding his home.

Simon and Elizabeth bought and sold several parcels of land in Cedar County. Apparently this was for investment purposes. Some fifty land transactions by them are listed in the Cedar County, MO, Deed Books. (ref. 26) Some of these records document mortgages and/or pay-off of mortgages so, in their later years, they may have been "bankers" for some family members and neighbors.

Simon Peter Collins, Sr. was a Democrat according to family history (11).

Simon was a Master Mason (A.F. & A.M. or Ancient Free and Accepted Masons) and was active in Masonry. He was an officer of the Garrett Lodge, White Hare, Cedar County, Missouri when it formed in March, 1870. Sometime later Simon and Elizabeth signed a Deed of Trust securing a promissory note by the Lodge with a mortgage on their property. This note was paid off by the Lodge and Simon and Elizabeth received a Release/Ouit Claim Deed from Garrett Lodge in March, 1892. S. P. Collins was listed as a charter member of the Jerico Lodge, Jerico Springs, MO when it was formed in May 1884. (ref. 29)

Simon and Elizabeth were parents of seven more sons and two daughters. They were greatly saddened to lose both daughters and two of the sons; four more times with heavy hearts they must bury their tiny babies. What a grief stricken time for the entire family. (ref. 14,19,20,21,23) Eight sons lived to their majority: however the eldest, Youel, was kicked by a horse and died from those injuries at age 23 years. Four of the sons, George Dixon, Simon Peter Jr., Haden Hope and John Spurgeon became farmers and lived in Cedar County. Isaac Sidwell became a Medical Doctor, Russell Franklin and Benoni Lee both became teachers, then later went into mining in Idaho, and Spokane, Washington areas.

After Simon Sr. had become an older person and not too involved with farming he frequently rode his horse 2-3 miles to Jerico Springs to get the mail. On his way he stopped at his son Simon's home to visit and for the noon meal. Grandmother's father, George H. Sears, made his home with them after he became a widower. Grandfather Sears had served in the Union Army as an artificer from the state of Indiana. One

day they seemed to have quite a heated argument about the Civil War. Simon Sr. got miffed and wouldn't stop by for his noon meal for several days!

An uncle of mine described his grandfather as a "big, rough built man, very stout, fists like a ham of meat, feet like a hearth rock, ears like a saddle blanket...biggest ears I ever saw!" The photograph of him in his later years (probably about 1905) shows Simon was a sizable person and somewhat portly at that time. He had a full head of white hair, a huge white beard that covered his ears. The size of his boots indicates he was endowed with a very "good understanding." It has been reported that he weighed about 285 pounds in later years (11).

Simon Peter Collins died on 25 December 1906 at the age of seventy-eight years, six months and three days. He was laid to rest in the Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County, Missouri near his deceased children. The inscription on his tombstone reads:

ALL IS WELL.

Albemarle County, Virginia, was the ancestral home of Elizabeth Washington Boston, my great grandmother. This county lies in the highlands east of the Blue Ridge Mountains, about mid-way between the north and south borders of Virginia. The highlands rise sharply from the western Piedmont. Rivers tumbling out of the heavily wooded Blue Ridge Mountains carved deep ravines as they rushed through the highlands. Nuts, berries and game were plentiful. Elizabeth's grandfather, James Boston Sr., born in 1775, the year the Revolutionary War began, was probably born in this county. At age 24, he married Nancy Hill on 25 August 1799 in Albemarle County. Their first four children, including Elizabeth's father, James Boston Jr., born 17 May 1807, were born there. James Sr. served as a soldier from Albemarle County during the War of 1812.

Soon after the War of 1812 ended, circa 1815-16, James Sr., Nancy, and sons, Reuben, Abner, James Jr. and William, joined other hardy pioneer families in migrating westward. They settled in Green County, Kentucky. James Sr. and Nancy produced three more sons, John, Richard, and Benjamin, in this primitive land of opportunity explored and opened to settlement by Daniel Boone.

Green County is one of several counties in the center of the state lying south of Green River. This area is referred to as "the garden of Kentucky." The red clay and limestone soil is rich and productive. The growing season is long with ample sunshine and plentiful rain. Green County is generally rolling, or hilly, with flat land interspersed along rivers and creeks. At the time the Boston family moved there, large, original-growth trees covered much of the land. Abundant wild game inhabited the area.

The Boston's were farmers and for the most part, self-sufficient. Tobacco was the chief cash crop. They raised horses, mules, cattle, and hogs for home use, as well as for sale or trading. Crops were corn, hay, and small grain to feed livestock. They hunted wild game such as deer (venison), turkeys, rabbits, and squirrels. Fish were abundant in rivers and creeks. Cows provided milk, cream, and butter. Other food included wild berries, fruit, nuts, and vegetables such as cabbage, potatoes, and turnips. Numerous gurgling springs supplied adequate fresh water.

Timber was readily available to make log cabins, furniture, and household items, such as wooden trenchers (platters) and bowls. Churns, piggins (a small wooden pail with one stave extended above the rim for a handle), pails, and washtubs were also made from local timber. Tinkers traveled the countryside peddling household items: pewter basins, bowls, dishes, plates, spoons, cups, pitchers, and mugs. Pioneers obtained tinware that included basins and cups from a tinsmith. Spoons made of wood, iron or pewter were often found in

the pioneer's kitchen. Tables made of wood boards resting on crossed wooden legs served them well. Wooden stools and benches preceded home-made chairs.

Standard equipment in the home included cards for carding wool and cotton, wheels for spinning thread, and looms for weaving cloth. Dress was plain and serviceable. Men's summer clothing consisted of flax, tow linen, or striped cotton breeches, coat, and waistcoat. For winter they exchanged cotton for woolen jeans or linsey-woolsey also made in the home. Some wore buckskin hunting shirts. The pioneer made shoes for the family. First he tanned the leather, then cut, fashioned and sewed it into shoes. Most men wore fur hats or caps in winter. Straw ones were common in summer. Women and girls wore homespun cotton of various colors, striped or checked. Underwear, was usually made of linen thread spun, woven, and sewn at home. Sunbonnets were a standard part of the female wardrobe for summer wear.

Farming was "labor intensive" mostly hand work in those days. First came clearing the land of trees and brush using crude tools and brute strength. Farmers used horses, mules or oxen to help extract stumps. A yoke of oxen, or a team of horses or mules pulled crude plows. The farmer walked behind guiding the plow, to till the soil prior to planting crops. These plows probably were made of cast iron with wooden handles. Cast iron plows, patented in 1797, slowly replaced metal sheathed wooden plows, despite fears of some that iron would poison the soil. They probably planted corn by digging a small hole in the ground with a sharpened stick, drop the grains in the hole, kick some dirt in, and then step on it to firm the soil. This was known as "holing" corn.

James Jr. grew to adulthood in Green County. He learned the art of farming from his father. James and Bidy (sic) Slinker, daughter of Christopher and Pheba Slinker, married 29 December 1826 in Green County, Kentucky. The 1833 tax records listed them living in Hart county. The following year, on 26 March 1834, my great grandmother, Elizabeth Washington Boston, was born. She joined two older brothers, Reuben and William, and older sister Mary Jane. Elizabeth's six younger siblings were: brothers Thomas, James Franklin, and George, sisters Martha, Emily, and Sarah.

Elizabeth grew to womanhood in the family home. She learned the duties and pleasures of being a mother and homemaker from her mother. By age twenty, Elizabeth was ready to marry, and start a family with a young man from a nearby farm, Simon Peter Collins. For unknown reasons, Elizabeth's parents didn't approve of the marriage. So, Elizabeth and Simon planned to elope. On the planned night of elopement, Simon came with a tall ladder for Elizabeth to quietly slip down from her bedroom. Simon stumbled in the darkness while putting the ladder up to the window. Mr. Boston came charging out of the house, shotgun in hand, to see what the ruckus was about. Undaunted by the gun, and colorful language of his intended father-in-law, Simon proceeded to help Elizabeth down the ladder. After realizing that he faced a very determined young man and a

stubborn daughter, Mr. Boston grudgingly relented. He told the love-struck couple that if there was to be a wedding, it had to be "done right." The young couple married in the bride's parents home on 23 November 1854.

The newly weds set up housekeeping on a nearby farm. Elizabeth and Simon's first child, a son, was born 8 April 1865 and named Youel.

A month or so later the family, along with Elizabeth's parents and siblings, began a long treck to southwest Missouri. They endured many hardships in their travels to new, unfamiliar land. Trails were treacherous with infrequent bridges over streams of water. Ferries carried them across larger rivers including the mighty Mississippi near St. Louis, Missouri. Once in Missouri, traveling in wagons, they followed the Missouri River west to Boonville, then southwest across country. They forded small streams and rivers, dodged trees, shrubs, and boulders.

The Boston's settled first in Greene County, near the hamlet of Bois D'Arc (pronounced Bowdark), a few miles northwest of Springfield. Wheat, oats, corn, molasses cane, and cotton flourished in the moderately flinty red limestone clay. They also grew watermelon and "mushmelons" (sic). Garden vegetables raised included cabbage, potatoes and, "beens" (sic).

Simon and Elizabeth settled in Cedar County, near the village of Jerico Springs, some thirty five miles northwest of Bois D'Arc. Cedar County, like Green County, lay in the "Springfield Plain" area, one of the low plateaus of the northwest Ozarks. The terrain is hilly, with some flat areas suitable for crops. The soil is similar to that in Greene County, but slightly different. It is reddish in color, sandy, and in some areas, quite rocky. Spring fed streams lace the land.

Timber was abundant when Simon and Elizabeth settled in Cedar County. Forests of oak, hickory, pine, maple, black walnut, poplar, cedar, elm, sycamore, and cottonwood were alive with white tailed deer, birds, and wildflowers. River birches and beech trees grew in the cool valleys. Fruit trees included apple, peach, wild persimmon, paw-paw (Missouri banana) and wild plum. An abundant supply of wild blackberries grew in the pastures; gooseberries grew along creek banks. The Collins' raised corn, wheat, and hay. Most homes were log cabins built using native trees.

The early settlers obtained much of their food, and some skins for clothing or sale, from the land. Most of the larger streams contained fish. Wild animals included deer, rabbit, fox, opossum, squirrel, muskrat, civet cats, skunks, otters, and mink. Wild fowl included turkey and quail. Natural springs provided plentiful water for human use as well as for domestic animals such as hogs, cattle, horses, chickens, and geese.

The following year, on 1 August 1857, Simon and Elizabeth purchased land from Samuel Brown near their first place of residence. George Dixon, their second son, arrived in March 1858. Elizabeth busied herself caring for her family and doing other tasks demanded of a pioneer farm wife.

Personal letters written to relatives in Kentucky tell of hard times plaguing the families during the late 1850s. Part of these difficulties were undoubtedly due to the depression that gripped the entire country. In addition, the letters tell how drought took its toll.

Other letters frequently listed prices of various items and indicated the writer considered these prices costly. For example, a letter dated 10 August 1857 shows that corn and wheat sold for \$1.00 per bushel and that "baken" (sic) was 15 cents per pound. Two years later, another letter states that corn and wheat were 75 cents per bushel, horse's \$75.00 to \$150.00 per head, ox's \$40.00 to \$75.00 per yoke, and cow's \$15.00 to \$20.00 per head. A letter dated 30 May 1859 states that corn was from \$1.00 to \$1.25 per bushel and flour \$4.00 per hundred pounds. Most of the letters noted the writer(s) had plenty to eat and a little to sell. They indicated that other family members in the area had ample food. None of the letters noted that any of the family lost their farms due to foreclosure.

Personal tragedies compounded the woes of Simon and Elizabeth during the late 1850s and early 1860s. Elizabeth was pregnant or recovering from child birth much of the time during the years 1857 through 1861. Unfortunately three of the four children born during this time period died shortly after birth. These three children, their birth and death dates were:

David L. Collins, born 10 May 1859, died 14 May 1859.
unnamed son, born 20 February 1860, died 5 March 1860.

James E. Collins, born 11 February 1861, died 1 April 1862.

Sadness weighed heavily on the family each time they made the trip to the Cedarville Cemetery in Dade County, Missouri to bury their three infants side by side. Dade County is adjacent to Cedar County on the south. Cedarville Cemetery, located near the northern boundary of Dade County, was only a few miles from Simon and Elizabeth's farmhouse.

In a letter dated 30 May 1859 the writer(s) wrote the following observation concerning the latest women's fashion:

The ladies are hooped from the ancle (sic) to the waist and (on) some windy days from waist to over the top of their head.

Abraham Lincoln became President of the United States in 1860. That same year Simon became an itinerant pastor of the Missionary Baptist Church. Elizabeth united with another Baptist church. Later she

changed membership to the Primitive Baptist Church. Elizabeth attended to many of the farm duties while Simon was away preaching.

The slavery issue reached the boiling point following Lincoln's election. Several states seceded from the Union in 1860 and early 1861. The Confederate States of America, a new Southern Union, formed in Montgomery, Alabama, in February, 1861. They elected Jefferson Davis President of the Confederacy; Alexander Stephens, Vice President. Just a couple of months later, on 12 April 1861, Confederates fired on Fort Sumter, South Carolina, marking the beginning of the Civil War. These actions must have been of great concern to Elizabeth and all the Collins and Boston families who were southern sympathizers.

Elizabeth's husband, Simon, volunteered in the 10th Missouri Cavalry, Confederate States Army at Red River, Arkansas, on 1 January 1863. He left Elizabeth at home, pregnant, and with two small boys to care for. She managed the farm in Simon's absence. On 18 April 1863, she gave birth to my grandfather, Simon Peter Collins, Jr.

During the fall of 1863, pro-union groups known as Kansas Jayhawkers (Bushwhackers) were active in eastern Kansas and western Missouri. They destroyed everything in sight where people favored the Confederacy. Bushwhackers came to the Collins home and told Elizabeth to take her little family and anything else she wanted and leave. She loaded her three small sons and some possessions into a wagon hitched to a team of horses. She then drove about 35 miles southeast to her parents home near Willard, Missouri, in Greene County. (Willard is a few miles northeast of Bois D'Arc.) After the "bushwhackers" looted the home, they took live coals from the fireplace, scattered them throughout the house, and burned it to the ground. Elizabeth made several trips to see about the family farm during Simon's absence.

General Lee surrendered his Army at the Appomattox Courthouse in Virginia, seventy-five miles west of Richmond, on 9 April 1865. Six weeks and five days later, on 26 May 1865, the unit Simon served with surrendered in New Orleans. The entire unit was paroled at Shreveport, Louisiana on 7 June 1865. Soon afterward the soldiers, including Simon, started the long trip home to their families.

Elizabeth may have enjoyed the respite from being pregnant and giving birth to babies. That didn't last long after Simon returned home. Their next child born 13 May 1866, sex unknown to us and not named, died 5 June 1866. Again the family made the treck to bury one of their babies in the Cedarville Cemetery.

Simon and Elizabeth were parents of six more sons and two daughters. They lost both daughters and one son. Eight sons lived to their majority. Youel, the eldest, kicked by a horse died from those injuries at age

23 years. Four sons, George Dixon, Simon Peter Jr., Haden Hope, and John Spurgeon, became farmers and lived locally. Isaac Sidwell became a medical doctor. Russell Franklin and Benoni Lee became teachers. Later Isaac, Russell, and Benoni went into mining in Idaho and in the vicinity of Spokane, Washington.

Elizabeth and Simon bought and sold several parcels of land in Cedar County. Apparently this was for investment purposes. Cedar County, Missouri, Deed Books show some fifty land transactions by them. Some of these records document mortgages and/or pay-off of mortgages. They may have been "bankers" for some family members and neighbors in their later years. Several transactions were in Elizabeth's name only. Not many women in those days were land owners unless she inherited it from her father or deceased spouse.

Real Estate records show Elizabeth possessed practical business knowledge. She seemed to know how to manage money as well as invest in farm acreage. Great-grandmother preferred outdoor life and was good with cattle. She frequently rode her horse over the farm checking on the animals. Apparently she was a very poor housekeeper and didn't rank very high in the culinary department. She would much rather be in the field helping with the farming. After driving the horses in at noon, she threw the reins to each side, told the boys to take care of the horses, and then "stirred-up" something to eat. Reports are that Simon managed to be away from home as much as possible at meal time. Parishioners provided munificent tables for the preacher!

Another of her talents was knowing how to care for the sick. Her obituary states: "Aunt Betty was known for her ability and kindness in waiting on the sick and anyone in trouble." Neighbors frequently summoned her to help in illness. She usually mounted her favorite horse, a blue roan pacer, and rode sidesaddle to the destination, regardless of whether it was during the day or the dead of night. Family legend has it that Elizabeth trained in midwifery before leaving Kentucky. She served as a midwife and delivered dozens of babies throughout Cedar County. She had copious experience of her own birthing fifteen children.

Elizabeth had considerable knowledge of herbs, roots, leaves, and plants, according to family recollections and verbal accounts. One of her granddaughters, Clara (Collins) Foster, reported that Elizabeth rode her horse for miles to find a certain root or herb she needed for a particular ailment. Some of her descendants attribute this knowledge of herbs and herbal medicine to her alleged Indian heritage. {NOTE: It has not been proven Elizabeth had any Indian heritage. One of her sons claimed to be 1/16 Indian. All attempts to prove or disprove this hypothesis have been unfruitful.}

For reasons unknown to me, Elizabeth educated only three of her younger children. As mentioned above, Isaac became a medical doctor. He graduated from Marion-Sims College of Medicine at St. Louis, Missouri, and began practice at rural Wagoner, Missouri. Russell and Benoni attended the Normal School at Warrensburg, Missouri, became teachers and taught in local schools. They were well respected within their

communities. She referred to these younger sons as "hers" and the older sons as "Simon's." Why? The mystery still remains.

Elizabeth was not supportive of Simon's ministry according to stories handed down through the family. One grandson stated that she "fought him all the way" and never attended any of the services to hear him preach. Did she have different theological beliefs? Did she resent him spending so much time away from home and the family?

Around the turn of the century, Elizabeth and Simon had separate, full length portraits taken of themselves. She would NOT have her picture taken "with that old man!" Elizabeth appeared to be of medium height and slender. She has a sober, determined expression but definitely not a dour look.

Simon passed away Christmas Day, 1906. He was buried beside his children in the Cedarville Cemetery. After Elizabeth became a widow, she sold 160 acres of land to Walter Higgins. She still owned considerable property.

Elizabeth made a holographic will on 22 March 1909. Sons George D. and Simon Jr. were, in effect, disinherited; they were willed \$5.00 each. She bequeathed the remainder of her estate to her other five living sons. A. W. Porter (son-in-law of brother James F. Boston), was appointed executor. Probate records show that Elizabeth recanted this will the day before her death. She wanted all her children to share and share alike. The court later upheld her death bed wish.

Illness and old age caught up with Elizabeth. She could no longer care for herself. Son Haden moved her from the farm to his home in Jerico Springs so he and his wife could care for her. She succumbed quietly early on the morning of 24 April 1909, at age seventy-eight years, one month, two days. They selected the larger Methodist church in Jerico Springs for the funeral service. This church could better accommodate the large number of family and friends who wished to celebrate her life. Burial was at Cedarville Cemetery beside her late husband. The epitaph on the gravestone reads:



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

10th Cavalry Regiment was organized in December, 1863, using M.L. Young's 11th Missouri Cavalry Battalion as its nucleus. It contained 559 officers and men. The unit served in C. Greene's and J.B. Clarke's Brigade, Trans-Mississippi Department, and skirmished in Arkansas and saw action in Price's Missouri Expedition. During this operation it reported 16 killed, 56 wounded, and 73 missing. The regiment was included in the surrender in June, 1865. Its commanders were Colonel Robert R. Lawther, Lieutenant Colonel Merritt L. Young, and Major George W.C. Bennett.

## HISTORY OF GARRETT LODGE NO. 359, A. F. & A. M., AT ARCOLA, MISSOURI.

by Dr. R. M. Crutcher.

Master Masons in the vicinity of White Hare, Cedar County, Mo., met at the masonic hall in White Hare, March 22, A. D. 1870, A. L. 5870, to organize a Masonic lodge under dispensation. Brother H. J. Church, D. D. G. M. was present and called the brethern to order and opened a lodge of Master Masons and called the appointed officers to their stations, viz:

W. C. Montgomery, W. M.

C. G. Snyder, S. W. S. P. Collins, J. W.

The following brothers were present—J. B. Sellars, W. N. Sellars, James J. Frisbie, Jesse Harris, P. R. Dix and William T. Shaw. Visiting brothers present:

The lodge next elected J. B. Sellars, treasurer and P. R. Dix, secretary. The worshipful master then appointed W. N. Sellars, S. D., J. J. Frisbie, J. D., D. W. Roberts, S. S., Jesse Harris, J. S., Charles Corprell, Tyler and the following committee on finance: J. J. Frisbie, R. C. Ball and Morris W. Mitchell.

The following petitions were received for initiation: B. F. Handley, J. L. Thurman, A. M. Morrison, after which the members of Garrett Lodge, U. D., met in special committee for the purpose of organizing under a charter

The charter granted by the Grand Lodge of Missouri was read and the lodge proceeded to the elect the following officers: W. C. Montgomery, W. M., C. G. Snyder, S. W., S. P. Collins, J. W., J. B. Sellars, Treasurer; J. L. Thurman, secretary and the following officers were appointed:

P. R. Dix, S. D.; J. J. Frisbie, J. D.; W. N. Sellars, Tyler; and the following finance committee: James J. Frisbie, Morris W. Mitchell and John Dale. John C. Harris, chaplain.

Garrett Lodge, No. 359 continued at White Hare, Cedar County and was very prosperous both fraternally and financially, having money loaned out, until Jerico Springs decided to organize a lodge of Masons, when a number of brethern demitted from it to help organize at Jerico about April 10th, 1884, when Washington Lodge, No. 87 at Greenfield and Melville Lodge, No. 458 at Dadeville, were asked for a waiver of jurisdiction that Garrett Lodge might be removed from White Hare, Cedar County, to Arcola, Dade County, a distance of five miles. The waiver was granted and the Grand Lodge permitted the removal.

On the 24th day of July, 1884, a Special Grand Lodge of Missouri met at Arcola, Missouri, to dedicate the new hall of Garrett Lodge. D. D. G. M. Seymour Hoyt opened the Grand Lodge with the following officers present:

Van Osdell and J. M. Travis. This part of the program was followed by a splendid dinner for everyone present.

Early and Present Merchants.—The first general store here was opened by James A. Cogle, who was succeeded by James A. Cogle & Co., and that firm, in turn, by James A. Cogle & Sons. Another early store was opened by Hood Shumate; still others by James Rogers & Co., Legg & Heiter and Clayton & Co. Stratton & Lakey early opened a drug store. The following-named merchants were doing business in Jerico Springs in the early part of 1889: Robert Cooper, J. R. Duncan, Pickett & Herman, J. H. Shumate & Co., Stratton & Lakey, R. H. Swaim & Co., Shumate & Patterson, Wimer Bros. & Co., J. B. Carrico, J. H. Clayton, J. A. Cogle & Sons, Peer & Brown.

Items of History .- The name Jerico is the result of a combination of the name of ancient Jericho with the name of Joseph B. Carrico, a former owner of the tract of land on which the town is built. In the beginning, to induce settlement here, Mr. Stratton donated many lots to persons who would build on them. The first building on the site of the new town was the R. B. Clark residence, which was moved from its former location on the farm of C. E. Whitsitt, west of the town. The second was the Jerico House, since converted into the A. Starkey residence. These two buildings served as hotels until others were erected. Mr. Peer put up the United States Hotel in 1882. The Neumann House was built in 1883. The first bath buildings were constructed in 1883, by D. G. Stratton and M. J. Straight. The flouring mill of Hartsock & Son was built in 1882. It has since passed to other owners. Williams & Legg established a fruit evaporator in 1886.

"The Fountain of Youth" is the name given to the springs

at Jerico by Mr. Stratton.

The Hartley Banking Company was organized by J. E. Hartley in March, 1884. It has a paid-up capital of \$11,000 its first officers were: A. M. Pyle, president; J. P. Brasher, vice president; John D. Porter, cashier; and the directors, A. M. Pyle, M. B. Loy, J. P. Brasher, J. F. Baston, James Potter,

#### 3. CHURCH AFFILIATION:

Simon Peter Collins Sr. and Elizabeth Washington (Boston) Collins were Baptists according to family history (Ref. 1). Willie D. Collins (Ref. 11) referred to his grandfather as a Missionary Baptist preacher. Willie D. also noted that "(Elizabeth) would have nothing to do with Simon Peter's religion ... fought him all the way". Apparently she was dissatisfied because he (Simon) was gone so much when he was preaching. Elizabeth's obituary (Ref. 5) says "She united with the Baptist Church in 1860, (later) joined the Primitive Baptist Church and held fast to the faith throughout her long life."

#### 4. POLITICAL AFFILIATION and CIVIC SERVICES:

Simon Peter Collins Sr. was a Democrat according to family history (Ref. 1). As far as can be determined his father and most, if not all, of his sons were Democrats. {Simon and Elizabeth lived before women were granted the right to vote.}

Simon Peter was a Master Mason (A.F. & A.M or Ancient Free and Accepted Masons) and was active in Masonry. (Ref. 29, pages 181, 182 and 415) He was an officer of the Garrett Lodge, White Hare, Cedar County, Missouri, when it was formed in March, 1870. Sometime later Simon and Elizabeth signed a Deed of Trust securing a promissory note by the Lodge with a mortgage on some of their property. This promissory note was paid off by the Lodge and Simon and Elizabeth received a Release/Quit Claim Deed from Garriott Lodge in March, 1892. S. P. Collins was listed as a charter member of the Jerico Lodge, Jerico Springs, Missouri, when it was formed in May 1884.

#### 5. MILITARY SERVICE:

Simon Peter Collins Sr. served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War or War Between the States. (Ref. 16) He enlisted in Red River, Arkansas, on 1 Jan. 1863 for a period of 3 years. He was assigned to Company C, 10th Regiment, Missouri Cavalry, Confederate States Army. Sparse records found to date do not show where he served or what, if any, campaigns/battles he participated in. His unit surrendered to Union Forces at New Orleans, Louisiana, on 26 May 1865 — 6 weeks, 5 days after General Lee surrendered at Appomattox Court House. Simon Peter was released, or paroled, at Shreveport, Louisiana, 12 days after his unit surrendered and taken prisoners.

#### 6. SOME CHARACTERISTICS OF SIMON PETER COLLINS Sr. -- PHYSICAL AND OTHER:

Willie D. Collins (Ref. 11) described his grandfather as a "big, rough built, man...very stout...fist like a ham of meat, feet like a hearth rock, ears like a saddle blanket... biggest ears I ever saw"! A photograph made during his later years (probably about 1905) shows Simon was a big person and somewhat portly at that time. He had a full beard — white — which covered his ears; the size of his boots indicates he was endowed with very "good understanding". Lucy (Collins) Bridgewater said Simon weighed about 285 lb. in later years.

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### SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES, SIMON PETER COLLINS Sr., RIN 19

Willie D. Collins recalled a story he had heard (possibly from his grandfather) that illustrates Simon Peter's physical prowess and his determination act in accordance with his beliefs. This event occurred while Simon was in the army. Simon was noted for his ability to run -- to win foot races. One day when there was no particular activity going on, Simon's brother-in-law, Tom Boston, decided to get some foot races going. He got some men to participate in the races and many more to bet on the outcome. Tom, of course bet on Simon Peter. After getting the event set up, Tom went to Simon and asked him to participate. Simon was busy "pegging" his boots -- wooden pegs were used instead of nails to hold the soles and uppers together -- but he finally gave in and agreed to race. However, he soon found out that the soldiers were betting on the outcome and refused to race any more. He considered gambling to be bad, immoral.

#### 7. SOME CHARACTERISTICS OF ELIZABETH (BOSTON) COLLINS;

Elizabeth Washington (Boston) Collins was described by Willie D. Collins (Ref. 11) as "a little woman". A photograph of her taken during her latter years (probably about 1905) shows she was somewhat thin and rather short. She stood erect -- no "dowager's hump".

Family legends (Ref. 1 and 11) say that Elizabeth was a midwife for many of the babies born in Cedar County. She would ride a horse many miles, at night when necessary, to get to a woman about to gibe birth. Her obituary (Ref. 5) states that "In her younger years (she) was known far and near for her ability and kindness in waiting on the sick and any one in trouble." Elizabeth was quite interested in medicine, herbs and plants in general according to family recollections.

Family legend says that Elizabeth was part Indian -- Slinker line. Simon Peter Jr. is reported to have claimed he was 1/16 Indian. Willie D. Collins said "Grandmother Collins (was part Indian) from a way back -- Tukaho (or Tuckahoe) Tribe". {Note: Tuckahoe is defined in dictionaries as roots and tubers eaten by some eastern and northern American Indians.}

#### 8. SLAVES:

The Collins owned slaves while in Virginia and North Carolina but either set them free or sold them relatively early. The 1840 U.S. Census of Hart County, Kentucky, shows John Collins Jr., father of Simon Peter Sr., owned no slaves. An 1843 Hart County, Kentucky, Tax Record shows that the estate of John Collins Jr. owned no slaves. James Boston, father of Elizabeth, owned one female slave in 1840 per the Hart County, KY, Census but that is the last record found showing the Bostons owned slaves.

Family legend says that Simon Peter Sr. found one of his sons playing with a black boy when he returned from Civil War service and gave him a whipping for such fraternization. Willie D. Collins said the son was Simon Peter Jr.; Lucy (Collins) Bridgewater said it was George Dixon who got the whipping. Since Simon P. Jr. would have been only 2 years old when his father returned from the War, it was probably George, or possibly Youel, who got the whipping for playing with the black boy.

#### SIMON PETER (Sr.) AND ELIZABETH (BOSTON) COLLINS

Simon Peter, born 22 June 1828, Rockingham County, North Carolina, son of John and Wilmuth (Seamore) Collins married Elizabeth Washington Boston 23 November 1854, Hart County, Kentucky. Elizabeth, born 26 March 1834, Hart County, was daughter of James and Biddy (Slinker) Boston. Simon, Elizabeth, and one year old son, Youell, came to Lynn Township, Cedar County, Missouri, in 1857. They moved to Box Township before 1870 and later to South Benton Township where they died.

Eight of fifteen children born to Simon and Elizabeth lived to maturity:

Youell: born 8 April 1856; never married; died 25 March 1879; buried Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County, Missouri.

George Dixon: born March 1858; married Mallie Locke (widow) 22 June 1912; no issue; died 1936, buried, Cedarville Cemetery.

Simon Peter Jr.: See story elsewhere.

Haden Hope: born 14 October 1869; married Emily Arnold December 1898, Cedar County; issue; Buler, Emory and Edith. Haden died 30 January 1953; buried beside wife in Brasher Cemetery, Cedar County.

Isaac Sidwell: born September 1872; married, first, Lucy J. Birge, 1895; issue: Amelia and Leota. Lucy died 8 May 1905. Isaac married, second, Frances M. Currin, 1907, Burke, Idaho; issue: Sidwell Currin. Dr. Collins served as a physician during W.W.I. He practiced medicine in Spokane, Washington and was County Coroner. Entire family interred in Greenwood Memorial Terrace Cemetery, Spokane.

John Spurgeon: born June 1874; never married; died, 1931; buried in Brasher Cemetery. John farmed in Cedar County.

Russell Franklin: born August 1875; married Susie B. Marshall; issue: Cecil.

Russell received a teaching certificate from Warrensburg, Missouri, Normal School. Later he went into mining. Russell died, 1942, Leevining, California; buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery, Glendale, California.

Benona Lee (Ben): born July 1877; married Debra C. Ballenger 10 December 1902. Issue: Reba and Velma, born in Missouri and Benjamin, born in Spokane. Benona was a teacher. Later he went into mining. He died 23 August 1935, Whitman County, Washington. Family interred in Greenwood Memorial Terrace, Spokane.

Simon enlisted in the Confederate Army on 1 January 1863 in Arkansas. He was a fast runner but refused to participate in races after learning his comrades-in-arms were wagering on these races. Following cession of hostilities, Simon's unit surrendered at New Orleans. Simon was paroled at Shreveport, Louisiana, 7 June 1865. Simon, often called "Uncle Peter", was tall and heavy set. A farmer and Missionary Baptist preacher, Simon rode his saddle horse to various places to preach the gospel. He was a Master Mason -- member of White Hare, later Jerico, Lodges.

"Aunt Betty" was a determined, self reliant, independent woman with empathy for family and neighbors. She was responsible for Isaac, Russell and Benona going to college. She served many families with tenderness and kindness during times of need -- illness, death or childbirth. She was mid-wife for many babies born in the community.

Simon Peter died 25 December 1906; Elizabeth died 24 April, 1909. Both buried in Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County, Missouri.

# ELIZIBETH W. COLLINS

Elizabeth W. Boston, was born James and Biddie. Boston in Wart county Kentucky, March, 27, 1831, and was married to Simon Pr Collins Nov. 230 1854 - To this unloc, were born Afteen children, eight of whom with the father hove preceded and Betty to the better land. The remaining sons are H. L., R. 10:, and Der I. by Collins, of Spokane Was and J. S., IL. H., S. P. and G. D. Collins of Cedar county, Mo. Aunt Betty as she is familiarly known all over Cedar county moved to Missonri in the year 1857. She suffered many hardships and pri vations during the civil war, her husband deing absent in the army. her house was burned finally, by the Kansas militia and she was left to the mercy of the element with her imall clutarete. The remainder of the war she fived in Green county, Mo. often making teigs back with one small son to look after her things. Though Aunt Betty suffer d inany hardships, she endured them with fortitude and she had minisual business ability. Her character-was above repronct and her reputation for truth and integrity were far above the attack of cammny.

In her younger days aunt Betty was known far and near for her ability and kindliess in waiting on the sick and atty one in trouble. Now that she is with us no more may her children and all who knew her emulate her sterling qualities. She at last is at rest. Aunt Betty died strong in the Christian falth tull of hope, sure of victory raver death and the grave. She quited with the Baptist church in 1860, afterward joining herself to the Primitive Baptist and held fast to the faith throughout her long life. Aunt Berty Suffered much pain during her last sickness at themome.of Haden Collina where he and moved her so as to be-better able to wait on ner. But at the last hour April 24th 1909 at 7 p vlock at m. hunt Betty passed across to the other side like a little child going to sheep "Except ye become as little children" "For of such is the kingdom of Heaven."

Funeral services were held in Jerico prings, at the Methodist church, which was filled to overflowing by her friends desiring to pay this last tribute of respect. Bro. M. A. Wolf preached the funeral sermon and all that was mortal of Elizabeth W. Collins was laid to rest in the Cedarville cemetery by the side of her late husband S. P. Collins.

Lillie, born 8 May 1864, Monroe County, Indiana, daughter of George Hostetter and Nancy Miriam (Alexander) Sears, came to Cedar County at age twelve. Ten of thirteen children born to Simon and Lillie (all in Cedar County) lived to maturity:

George Washington: born 7 September 1885; married Bessie Slough 28 February 1909, Westboro, Missouri; son, Harry. Married, second, Grayce Slough, Bessie's half-sister, 1928, College Springs, Iowa; son, Donald. George ranched near Thermopolis, Wyoming, where he died in July, 1959. Burial: Monument Hill Cemetery, Thermopolis.

Mary Lillie Myrtle: born 6 June 1887; married A. J. Sherron June 1904, Cedar County; one son. Married, second, David Fife; daughter, Emily. Myrtle died 5 March 1922. Burial: Cedarville Cemetery, Dade County, Missouri.

Elizabeth Miriam: born 28 May 1889; married Lawrence Thronburg 5 June 1912, Cedar County; issue: Ona, Mildred, Evelyn, Irene and Leona. Married, second, John Allen, Wyoming; son, John E. Married, third, Wilfred Short, Wyoming; no issue. Miriam died 16 September 1996 in Basin, Wyoming. Burial: Monument Hill Cemetery, Thermopolis.

Roy Everett: born 1 August 1902; married Olevia Thronburg, 20 November 1927, Thermopolis; issue: Russell, Leland, Keith, Reba, Lillie and Polly. They lived/ranched near Thermopolis.

Clara Jeanette: born 30 March 1907; married Lawrence Foster 11 August 1923, Cedar County; issue: Harold and Virginia. They lived in Cedar and Vernon Counties.

Twins Euel Lee and Eunice Lena and an unnamed son died in infancy. Burial: Anna Edna Cemetery, Cedar County.

Simon was a farmer/stockman, Percheron horse breeder and livestock trader. Neighbors envied his watermelon patch. He bought mule colts, broke them to work when about two years old, then sold them. For several years he purchased the turkey crop of surrounding farmers (one to two thousand according to his children), dressed them and sold the dressed fowl in Nevada. Turkey butchering was something of a social event. Neighbors came to help -- mainly to pluck feathers at five cents for each turkey plucked. Mr. Collins was a member of Woodmen of the World and I.O.O.F. Lodges.

Lillie was jovial and friendly; visitors were always welcome and she insisted they stay and share a home cooked dinner. She quilted and crocheted. She raised geese for feathers to make feather beds for her family. She plucked the geese herself -- children were too rough on the geese! Lillie was an avid reader -- her Bible, magazines and books.

Simon and Lillie spent their entire married life in Cedar County -- most of it on a farm east of Jerico Springs. Both were members of the Jerico Missionary Baptist Church. They retired to Jerico Springs where they died. Simon died 3 November 1946. Lillie died 29 December 1950. Both interred in Anna Edna Cemetery, Cedar County.

# **EDD AND GLACIE COLLINS**

Edwin (Edd) Miller Collins, son of Simon and Lillie Collins, was born 28 July 1900 on the family farm east of Jerico Springs, Missouri. He attended Cedar Hall Country School through eighth grade, then farmed with his father for several years.

Glacie Merle Cox, daughter of James and Margaret (Agee) Cox was born 2 December 1902, near Montevallo, Vernon County. She received her education in Cedar County at Pleasant View (Hard Scrabble) School and Jerico Springs High School, where she graduated in 1919.

Edd and Glacie met at a Box Supper at Pleasant View School. Edd was smitten by 16 year old Glacie's blond hair and blue eyes. Courting followed. A shiny black buggy drawn by a lively team of sorrel Arabian "ponies" carried them to church activities, movies, and "just ridin' around". They married 21 November 1920 in Jerico Springs at the Methodist parsonage. Edd continued farming with his father; Glacie continued teaching at Mitchel Grove.

The "call of the west" soon became overpowering. Glacie resigned from her teaching position (sister Wilma Cox completed the term) and, on 1 April 1921, Edd and Glacie boarded a train for Thermopolis, Wyoming, to join several of Edd's siblings. Their first child, Everett Wayne, was born 16 November 1921 on a ranch near Garland, Wyoming. After losing their entire 1922 hay crop to an unscrupulous buyer, the family returned to Missouri early in 1923.

Edd soon found work on a farm near Westboro, Missouri. Daughter Ruth Verle joined the family 25 November 1923. The family worked on various farms in the vicinity

of Westboro until the "call of the west" again prevailed in the spring of 1927. Edd, Glacie and children, along with Glacie's sister and husband, Minnie and Lester Neal, headed west in their Chevrolet touring cars. Destination: Lodi, California, home of Edd's sister, Dora, and family. The journey took 22 days. They camped along the roadside at night. Neither Lester nor Edd found suitable work so they returned to Missouri that fall.

Glacie and Edd lived on various farms in northwest Missouri and southwest Iowa before settling in Atchison County, Missouri, in March, 1932, during the height of the depression. They rented until 1942 when they purchased a farm east of Westboro. In 1969 they retired from farming and moved to Westboro. Edd had emphysema.

Edd and Glacie were Democrats; both served many years on Atchison County Election Boards. Edd served as County Road Commissioner for several years.

Edd was a fun loving man. He liked to joke, tease and play cards. He was a "water witch"; he located many good water wells in the local area. Following retirement, he pursued his life long fascination with rocks -- cutting, polishing and mounting semiprecious gemstones to make beautiful jewelry for family and friends.

Edd died of lymphoma on 8 June 1978. Interment in Cedar Grove Cemetery, Westboro.

Glacie was an excellent cook and seamstress. Hobbies included oil painting, leather tooling, crocheting, knitting and needlepoint. She raised huge vegetable and flower gardens. She liked to play cards, entertain and go places.

Mrs. Collins was a faithful member of the Westboro Methodist Church for 55 years. She taught Sunday School 35 years. She was a delegate to Annual Conference many years. Glacie was a member of the Women's Society of Christian Service, later United Methodist Women, and served as president for eight years

Glacie resided in Gardenview Care Center, Shenandoah, Iowa, following surgery on both hips and open heart surgery. She succumbed there on 25 April 1996 at age 93. Burial in Center Grove Cemetery, Westboro, Missouri.

## DR. I. S. COLLINS TAKEN BY DEATH

Former Coroner Was Candidate in Coming Election

Dr. I. S. Collins, 78, Democratic candidate for Spokane county coroner, died yesterday at the Edgecliff sanitarium. He had been in the sanitarium since he collapsed in his downtown office October 22.

Dr. Collins previously had served as coroner and deputy coroner. He served eight years as coroner. Since 1943, when he left the county office, he had maintained a private medical practice. He was instrumental in the organization of the state coroners' association in 1937.

Dr. Collins was born in Cedar county, Mo. He graduated from Marion-Sims college of medicine at St. Louis, Mo. He came to Spokane in 1910 and had resided here since then.

He was a member of Spokane lodge 34, Free and Accepted Masons, receiving his 50-year membership award last spring. He also was a member of the American Legion, the Scottish rite and El Katif shrine. He was responsible for the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity library at Washington State college. He donated the library of more than 5000 books as a memorial to his son, Sidwell C. Collins, a WSC student who was killed in an auto accident in 1932.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p. m. tomorrow from the Smith chapel. Burial will be at Greenwood cemetery.

# TOO MUCH SPEED TAKES LAD'S LIFE

Too much speed caused a fatal automobile accident last night on the Inland Empire, highway a mile and a half south of the Mullan bridge, according to deputy sheriffs.

Sidwell C. Collins, 21, son of Deputy Coroner and Mrs. I. S. Collins, W2203 Sharp, was instantly killed, and three of his young men companions were slightly injured when the Ford coupe in which they were traveling swerved from the road and overturned.

The four were returning from Pullman where they had been to arrange for working their way through college during the coming year. Young Collins was a graduate of North Central in 1930 and had finished one year at Washington State. The other three, Albert Wood, W2302 Sharp; Milton R. Wyatt, W2219 Boone, and Robert A. Whitman, S1012 Napa, were friends and schoolmates.

Wood was driving the car, with Collins and another youth in the seat with him and the fourth boy in the luggage compartment behind.

The accident happened when the machine came to the end of the concrete pavement and struck rougher asphalt. Wood explained that he was going not more than 40 miles per hour, but that the car refused to steer and flopped over without warning.

Deputy Sheriffs Slegmund and Miles and Prosecutor C. W. Green ough investigated last night, but none of the youths was held. A further investigation is to be made today.

The body of the dead boy was sent to the Smith funeral home.




