
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- 1811 Nelson Harrison born to William and Mary (Fawcett) Harrison in Rockingham County, VA.
- 20 Mar 1812 Margaret Buck born to Thomas and Susannah (Cherrington) Buck in Gallia County, Ohio.
  - 8 Jun 1813 Naomi McNeal (McNeil? McNeel?) born in Ohio. Naomi was the daughter of a pioneer physician. [Handwritten notes by Emma (Harrison) Link found in Link Family Bible, typed by Virginia (Link) Milano]
    - 1825 Nelson Harrison came to Gallia County, Ohio, from Rockingham County, Virginia, with his parents and siblings except for his oldest sister who was married and remained in Rockingham County.
- 19 Aug 1829 Nelson Harrison married Margaret Buck, daughter of Thomas and Susannah (Cherington) Buck in Gallia County, Ohio
  - 1832 Tax records for Jackson County, Ohio, showed Nelson Harrison had 1 horse, \$40; 2 cattle, \$16; no "pleasure carriages" or money at interest. Total value: \$56.00. Total tax due: 64.4 cents.
  - 1833 Tax records for Jackson County, Ohio, showed Nelson Harrison had 2 horses, \$80; 5 cattle, \$40; no "pleasure carriages" or money at interest. Total value: \$120.00. Total tax due: \$1.32.
  - 1834 Tax records for Jackson County, Ohio, showed Nelson Harrison had 2 horses, \$80; 3 cattle, \$24; no "pleasure carriages" or money at interest. Total value: \$104.00.

Listed on the same sheet, and immediately below Nelson, is a William Harrison. William had 4 horses, \$160; 4 cattle, \$32; no "pleasure carriages" or money at interest. Total value: \$192.00. {This William Harrison is *probably* the father of Nelson. It is the last record of a William Harrison we have that could be, most probably is, the father of Nelson. Nelson's father would have been about 60 or 61 years old in 1834.}

- 1840 Nelson Harrison listed as head of household on 1840 US Census, Jackson County, Ohio. Household included a male and female in the 30-40 age bracket (Nelson and Margaret), one male under 5, one male 5-10, 1 female under 5, and one female 5-10.
- 9 Jan 1846 Thomas Jay Harrison born to Nelson and Margaret (Buck) Harrison near Oak Hill, Jackson County, Ohio.
- 27 July 1846 Margaret (Buck) Harrison died in Jackson County, Ohio.
- 9 Nov 1847 Nelson Harrison married Naomi McNeil in Jackson County, Ohio.
  - 1850 Nelson Harrison listed as head of household on 1850 US Census, Liberty Township, Jackson County, Ohio. Household consisted of Nelson (39), Naomi (38), Jacob B. (20), Phebe A. (17), Isaac (15), Susan (12), Delamere (10), Maria (8) and Thomas (5). Nelson's occupation listed as "farming"; value of real estate listed as \$3,000.

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- 1857 Nelson Harrison died in Gallia County, Ohio, leaving 11 year old Thomas Jay an orphan to be reared by stepmother Naomi (McNeal) Harrison.
- 1860 Naomi Harrison listed as head of household on 1860 US Census, Jefferson Township, Jackson County, Ohio. Household consisted of Naomi (47), Phebe A. (27), Susan (22), Mary A. (19), Mina (17), and Thomas (16). Naomi's occupation was "farming"; her real estate was valued at \$3,000 and personal property at \$200.
- abt 1862 Thomas Jay Harrison joined other teenagers and old men shoring up Union forces for about a week when a Confederate Army commanded by General James Longstreet threatened to ford the Ohio River near Gallopolis, Ohio. (The threat never materialized.)
  - 1865 Thomas Jay Harrison enrolled at Ohio University, Athens, Ohio.
  - 1870 Thomas Jay Harrison graduated from Ohio University, Athens, Ohio.
  - 1870 Naomi Harrison listed as head of household on 1870 US Census, Jefferson Township, Jackson County, Ohio. Household consisted of Naomi (57), Susan (29), and Thomas J. (24). Occupation of Naomi listed as "keeping house:" her real estate was valued at \$2,400; personal property valued at \$450. Thomas listed as "farmer" and eligible to vote.
- 31 Aug 1870 Letter to "Trudy" Williams; salutation: "Dear Friend"; Complementary close: "Truly"; Signature: T. J. H. This 3-page letter primarily consists of criticism (*constructive*) of Trudy's last letter and congratulating her on her efforts/work with her "Sabbath School class" along with numerous "dos and don'ts" for her guidance! It says nothing about what he is doing!
  - (2nd paragraph) Will you allow me to criticise some things I saw in these lines from you. Trudy, if I do so mered or your advantage? I will preface my criticism with the remark that I greatly admire your clear, straight-forward, uninvolved way of expressing your thoughts. I admire, too, the good hand you hold in penmanship. I think you have made great improvement since last I saw your writing. But to the criticisms should consider each point as entirely possible...; but I want you to excel. Won't you? Custom requires that the order in opening the letter should be name of office, county, state, date. Thus: Clay, Ohio, August 25, 1870. You placed the date first. I could omit the letters after date; as 25 instead of 25th. It is not customary among some of the best writers. In this expression, "I thought A little bit of news" etc. The A is wrong, you know. (See primer on capital letters.) "Grandma is a visiting" sounds somewhat antiquated. Leave out the "a" and the sentence has a better jingle. Your author in grammar would condemn the expression "you had better believe"; but is now often used... I advise you now, for your own improvement, to rewrite everything coming from your pen. Every great historian has risen to eminence by care. McCauley rewrote nearly all his sentences. Gibbon rewrote the first chapter of his Roman history three times... Avoid scratching out a word; just draw your pen rapidly through it once, or take a sharp knife and scratch it off and begin further on for the next word. In this way you present a clean, unblotted, page pleasant to behold and one commences to read without prejudice.
  - o (3rd paragraph) I am very glad you take hold of your Sabbath School class with <u>pride</u>. I sincerely hope that you may so conduct yourself in your duties toward it that it's members

may have reason to be proud of their teacher. It is a rare field for usefulness and selfimprovement. If you study your lessons out carefully and thoroughly and give your class thorough instruction on the doctrines, history, geography and chronology of every lesson, you will have a chance for mental culture beyond what the same application would furnish at any literary institution. Don't be absent a day unless you are too sick to get there.

- (4th paragraph) You say that you and Susan are going to hear the music. Could you not 0 help make the music? I wish you would both go if a school is started; only don't let the boys come home with you or the evil may efface the good! ...
- (Comment) The letter was written at St. Paul, Indiana. It would be interesting to know 0 what T. J was doing there. St. Paul is on Interstate 74 and more than half way from Cincinnati to Indianapolis. Following his discussion of the music program Trudy and Susan were going to hear, T. J. notes There is a fine singer trying to make up a school in this place, and if he succeeds and I remain here, I think I shall attend.
- 20 July 1871 Thomas Jay Harrison and Gertrude Leslie Williams married in Jackson County, Ohio. Gertrude, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Harger) Williams was born in Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, on 27 August 1853.
  - 6 Oct 1872 Grace Harrison, first child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Jefferson Township, Jackson County, Ohio.
- 31 July 1873 Naomi Harrison sold the remainder of the "home place," about 60 acres, to her stepson, Thomas Jay Harrison, for "certain guarantees ... and five dollars."
  - 1873 Thomas Jay Harrison nominated by acclamation by the Republican Convention to be Jackson County's representative in the Ohio State Legislature.
  - 4 Feb 1875 Cora Lee Harrison, second child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Jefferson township, Jackson County, Ohio.
- 11 Feb 1877 John Scott Harrison, third child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Jefferson township, Jackson County, Ohio.
- Dec 1877 T. J. Harrison, a school teacher at Oak Hill School, was locked out of the school house by his students when he returned from his usual noon walk. Instead of capitulating to the rowdy students, and giving them treats to unlock the door as was the custom at that time, he 2440,810 quickly showed the culprits who was boss. To the consternation of the students, he picked up a fence rail that normally served as a "base" in the game of "blackman," hoisted it onto his shoulder, made a run to the door with the fence rail serving as a battering ram to break down the school house door. This was the last known time a teacher was locked out of the Oak Hill school. T. J. completed the school year at Oak Hill and then resigned. 1100+1879

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T. J. and wife, Gertrude, sold their farm in Jackson County, Ohio, to James K. Henson in 25 Mar 1880 preparation for the move to Missouri.

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- 25 Mar 1880 T. J. wrote letter to "Dear Brother" -- Isaac Harrison who was already in Missouri.
  - "Yours of March 18 was received vesterday." (Fast mail service!) 0
  - Content of letter clearly indicates Isaac had found a farm, or farms, that should be to T. J.'s 0 liking and had asked how much he (T. J.) would give for a Quit Claim deed.
  - T. J. wrote that he had "sold in a hurry to meet this case" for \$2,400 -- \$2,000 cash and 0 \$400 to be paid in November -- and that it would take \$200 for the move. He stated he did not "want much debt if it can be avoided."
  - T. J. essentially left it up to brother Isaac, "with Clint's advice," to work out the best deal he 0 could subject to money available and his desires as noted above.
  - T. J. wrote "I am ready to come as soon as safe to do so -- must light out by the 15th of 0 April."
- Spring, 1880 Thomas Jay Harrison bought 156 acres of land near what soon thereafter became Gardner Station in Harrison County, Missouri, for \$10 per acre. This was some 6 miles northeast of Bethany, Missouri.
  - 1880 Thomas J. Harrison listed as head of household on US Census of Grant Township, Harrison County, Missouri. The household consisted of Thomas J. (34), farmer; Gertrude (27), housekeeper; Grace (7); Cora (5); John S. (3); Nelson B. (8/12); and Naomi (67). Thomas J was born in Ohio, his father born in Virginia and mother born in Ohio. Gertrude and both of her parents were born in Pennsylvania. The children were all born in Ohio. Naomi, listed as "mother", no occupation, was born in Ohio and both parents were born in Virginia.
  - Fall, 1881 Thomas Jay Harrison sold his farm near Gardner Station and bought 120 acres four miles south of Bethany, Missouri. There were no improvements on the new farm except fences and only 35 acres was broken land.
- 14 Jan 1882 Isaac Fletcher Harrison, fifth child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri.
  - 1884 Thomas Jay Harrison completed a 2-story, 6-room house, with basement, that was to be his home for the rest of his life.
- Halun Calig Mary Fach Fach Fach Sourg1891 Northule 19 Oct 1884 Cary Williams Harrison, sixth child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri,
  - 1886 Sparse records (that have survived) of the Mitchelville Church show that Thomas J. Harrison was Sunday School superintendent. These records show Hiram McNamee (brother-in-law of T. J.) was assistant superintendent, Isaac Harrison (brother of T. J.) was treasurer, and C. D. Evans (brother-in-law of T. J.) was one of the Sunday School teachers. Family verbal history says T. J. was Sunday School Superintendent at Mitchelville for many years. [Noted also in obit.]
  - 5 Sept 1887 Gertrude Emma Harrison, seventh child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri.
    - 1890 Thomas Jay Harrison began dairying.

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2 May 1890	May Harrison, eighth child of T. J. and Gertrude, born, and died, in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri. Buried in Burris Cemetery
5 Aug 1891	Naomi (McNeal) Harrison died in Harrison County, Missouri. Buried in Burris Cemetery. Tombstone shows "McNeel."
15 Sept 1891	Anna Lois Harrison, ninth child of T. J. and Gertrude, born in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri.
18 June 1899	Grace Harrison, first child of T. J. and Gertrude, died. Buried in Burris Cemetery.
1900	Thomas J. Harrison listed as head of household on US Census of Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri. The household consisted of Thomas J., Coray (sic), John S.,
5 1910	Nelson B., Isaac F., Cary W., Gertrude, and Annie L. T. J. owned farm free of mortgage.
10 Sep 1920	Cora Harrison, second child of T. J. and Gertrude, died in Bethany Township, Harrison County, Missouri. Buried in Burris Cemetery.

- abt 1920 T. J. Harrison wrote long article, as a letter to the Editor, which was published in a Bethany newspaper. Complaining about wasted resources building a road. Lots of philosophy.
- 3 Dec 1931 Letter to "Dear Emma & family" signed "T J H"
  - Your contribution came just after eleven and it is 1-15 now. I am prompt because I think I already owed you two or more letters. Many thanks. It is very nice to have so much good grub to help us get through need.
  - o I got a funny letter from Jane Garner -- you know Ma's cousin. She was born the next year after your Ma and has done house work for others since she was 15. She said she had been to Cal. four times, to Alaska once, to the Grand Canyon twice and to Europe this year and if I read it right, she said this last cost \$1,400! But just listen -- She said she has \$15,000 in bank and stocks and bonds bringing \$600 per year. The irony of it!
- May 1937 Write-up in Ohio University Alumni Association newsletter identified Thomas Jay Harrison, a retired farmer living near Bethany, Missouri, as one of two "Oldest Living Alumnus." Both members of class of 1870. In age, Mr. Harrison was more than six years older than his former class mate. Among various items pointed out about T. J. Harrison was that "From 1870 to 1880 he studied law -- enough 'to keep out of trouble' -- but he never applied for admission to the Bar."
- Oct 1938 A Clarence Henson wrote a letter, dated 11 Oct. 1938, to Thomas Jay Harrison requesting information -- specifically whether he (T. J.) was the person who sold a farm to Henson's father, J. K. Henson. At the bottom of the letter, and continued on the back, were several notes believed to have been written by T. J. Harrison's daughter, Emma (Harrison) Link in preparation for a response to Henson's letter. {T. J. was infirm, nearly blind by 1938 but his mind was still sharp.} These notes obviously reflect words spoken by T. J. and are summarized below:
  - o Many things to tell him if it were possible.
  - o Very glad came to Missouri -- that you enjoyed a fair share of prosperity.

- o Bought farm 30 mi from r. r. Very lucky -- R. R. located with depot 1 1/2 miles from new farm. (Within a short time) sold it for 50% advance -- another stroke of good luck.
- o Bought farm four mis. w. of Bethany -- another piece of good luck. Federal Highway 69 located right past the door -- another piece of good luck.
- o In 1890 he started dairying -- another stroke of good luck. Part of the time 200 to 300 a month for years.
- *o* Except what I gave my children {Thought/words obviously not complete but Aunt Emma undoubtedly knew the message he wanted to covey.}
- o Now in bed sick. blind & don't know what next. Good luck to you. -- Yours Truly
- 10 Sep 1943 Thomas Jay Harrison died at the Wood Hospital, Bethany, Harrison County, Missouri. He had been in the hospital for 780 days prior to death. In this case, the Wood Hospital served the equivalent of today's Nursing Homes. He was blind, deaf, and bedfast throughout this time but his mind remained alert, sharp.

# NOTES, EXCEPTS FROM LETTERS WRITTEN BY T. J. TO HIS WIFE WHILE HE WAS ATTENDING STATE LEGISLATURE SESSIONS:

(Salutation, complementary close & signature shown on first line of each synopsis. Direct quotes italicized)

- 26 Jan 1874 Dear Little Wife; Yours; Thomas J. Harrison
  - o Disappointed that he (T J) had not received a letter from her. Disappointment ...all the more poignant because we have today agreed in our <u>patriotism</u> to abjure our love for wife and children and home, and remain without adjournment until we are through. Our wives will no doubt rejoice to know that their <u>dictators</u> are not likely to put in an unpleasant appearance. It is singular that men can be so foolish and weak in principles as to fear to vote for a sufficiency of time to visit home! ... because their constituents would be displeased if they were to go home even for a day.
  - o Notes that a fellow legislature, a Dr. Munson, said he was completely disgusted with activities going on and would not return again even though they gave them four times as much money for their service. T J adds *I think him about right*.
  - o Notes he greatly appreciated the two letters (from Gertrude) he had just received. He then adds Don't allow Grace's want of "tittle" to prevent your writing again soon.
  - Notes that Right across a little open space from my room is a family of man, wife and 3 little ones -- after my own heart. They have a small organ and the wife, though a plain farmer's girl like you, plays well and sings finely. I can hardly resist the temptation to go and help her. Sunday evening she played an hour or two and I could but feel like grumbling that you and I could not thus together seek enjoyment.
  - o The letter ends with Please allow me to say in your ear that, though I like your letters so very much, I would much rather have the substitute you propose to give. Don't forget that you have my whole love and that I want nothing less from my little wife.

This clour may contain a verse in the particle voice,

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20 Feb 1874 Dear Little Trudy; Yours only; T. J. Harrison (Letter transcribed almost in it's entirety) o (opening paragraph) It gave me no great pleasure to read parts of your last letter. I don't think you were hardly fair in some of your criticisms. I felt miserable when I wrote you those short letters and lack of love and good wishes did not cause their brevity. The fact that I did not express my love as freely as usual arose from the fear that the old folks read with small sympathy. Love, pure and disinterested, is a noble attribute of humanity, yet its avowal is often productive of sarcastic smiles from any other than the subject and object of it — the giver and receiver. If you were here, a warm kiss and caress should soon convince you that my love is not <u>materially</u> lessened to say the least. ... It seems to me you write impatiently. Do you feel so?

> I think, Trudy, I can give up going to theaters or any place else where simple pleasure is the object, if my wife desires it. I would not like her to go against <u>my</u> will. I will therefore pledge you herein that I will not attend said resorts of pleasure unless some noted lecturer, whom I wish to hear, constitutes the attraction. Brazen faces, bare legs and bare a\_s shall not control my attendance. Nor shall music, either, if you will wield your power at home. I have so far gone simply out of curiosity -- a desire to see what was done at these places. I have seen the inside of each and am now satisfied.

- o How do you spell that which you wished me to dissolve in my mouth? Be careful of that little word to, too, two. You may interchange them. You say "I received" etc.
- o My throat is now well, thanks to Providence, and my body is, I think, sound as usual; but my brain gets very tired of these business proceedings, if <u>proceedings</u> is the proper term when so little is done. We are doing much better, however, as we get better broken into the harness. It is impossible to say when adjournment will come. I think the flowers will bloom and fields look green ere we cast the last long lingering look at our adopted winter's home. ... A great many unimportant bills are introduced and many such pass the House, but they are mostly squelched in the Senate. That body is so contemptibly mean that it will pass nothing in which none of it's members have a personal interest. Their advantage therefore is not superior wisdom but transcendent meanness.
- o I will send you a little money today as I have drawn only one week's wages since I was at home the first time and am about out. I shall draw next week, though, and I shall then supply your needs. Write and tell me how much to send.
- o Accept the assurance of my sincere love for both my little dears, and write soon....

13 Mar 1874 My Dear Little Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison

- o Chit chat -- how he misses her. Does she need money? Can send it if she doesn't' ask for too much. Notes that I sent for the Star for you according to your request. I hope you will receive (notice how this word is spelled) it soon and be well pleased with it. What did you mean in your last in regard to Mr. Williams's Keeping grocery? You and the children both allude to it in a way that leaves me in doubt whether you are in fun or earnest. Please explain.
- o What are you women doing toward suppressing the whisky trade in your community? There is nothing of importance enough to talk of except the "Whisky War" here. ... Last night Gough lectured on temperance at the open house which was filled to overflowing. It

was a masterly effort ... Perhaps when you come up next winter you will have the chance to hear the Lion roar.

- o I want you to tell me, Trudy, what to bring home to the children. I can't make a satisfactory choice either in kind or quality Y need hardly tell you that.
- o I am glad to hear of your success in the new music book. I hope you will continue to give attention to music...
- 9 Apr 1874 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison. {Letter started on Thurs.; finished Friday}
   o Discusses, comments on, uncertainty about when legislature will finish their business.
  - Notes that the election has strengthened the Democrats and that one had stated he was
     *… in favor of reorganizing the remaining benevolent institutions before we leave if it takes
     all summer.*
  - Bad weather -- snowing, ground covered with several inches of snow and snow still falling.
     I fear you will have a very disagreeable work to do in your feeding (my feeding, I should say)
  - o Says he plans to come home Saturday (11 April) ... to be with my <u>Darling</u> ... Will She greet my coming with a holy kiss?
  - o Notes that he was disappointed he did not receive a letter (from Trudy) yesterday
- 3 Dec 1874 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison
  - Chit chat. Legislature to adjourn for holidays. Boarding house where he stays charges full fare for absences of one week or less and half-fare for absences over a week. Legislator received no pay during recess. T. J. had a roommate -- representative from Clinton County. "Nice" room, on third floor. Rent/fare: either \$5.50 or \$0.50 per week -- document faded.
  - I went to church last night to while away the time and I was surprised to find one of the goodest old fashioned prayer meeting I have lately gone to -- good singing and hearty praying.
  - Recently attended an organ recital at First Congregational Church. Sent Trudy a copy of the "programmie".
- 3 Mar 1874 Dear Trude; Yours; T. J. Harrison
   o Chit Chat. T. J. had bad headache for several days. Went for a long walk, as recommended by "Dr. Ray." Only made headache worse!
  - o Ended with Now good bye and be a good girl; Kiss Grace for me and receive mine.
- 3 Jan 1875 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison {Beginning of T J's 2nd year as legislator}
  - o We made a call Friday on the governor. Cake and wine loaded down a side table and few of the members had the grit to say "no" when the latter was offered them. To relieve your apprehensions at this juncture I will just say that I was not tempted above what I bore.

- o We heard a lecture at the Penitentiary by Furguson, the Chaplain, on "Mordicai the Jew." There was some fun but little sense -- I'll say wisdom -- for it was the most sensual sermon I ever heard. It was full of obscenity and was very ill adapted to the place.
- o (This afternoon) we called on Mrs. John G. Deshler who set a rich table for perhaps two or three hundred -- at least as many as called. This was the silliest affair I have ever been a partner to. I suppose it was all in strict etiquette but a trained parrot might have entertained company with as much good taste and politeness as did this volary of, and acknowledged leader in, fashion.
- o I propose to start my juvenile bill forward and I hope it will be dealt with gently.
- o One year ago was my first Sunday in Columbus, and what great changes my experience has wrought in that time! Instead of the sober, earnest men I expected to see in the halls of legislation, I find few but political tricksters regarding naught but their own interests. But I have no time to pursue the thought as I would...
- (End of letter) I must commend you for your penmanship for you are rapidly improving.
   ...Good bye and may this be the happiest and most useful year of the feast when you make the review a year hence.

#### SOME MISCELLANEOUS NOTES NOT READILY TIME IDENTIFIED;

- o Pioneered in growing alfalfa in Harrison Co. [Newspaper article after death]
- o Made one of the first road drags-used locally [Obit]

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- Interested in, worked for new/improved roads. Instrumental in getting a shorter road from his home to Bethany that later became a part of US 69. [Obit]
- o Thomas Jay Harrison revered education. He appreciated classical literature and classical music. He was the only known member of the family to go to college/university. He was proud of that fact and accomplishment. All his children, except one, that lived to adulthood attended college or university; 3 sons and 2 daughters graduated from the Univ. of Missouri. His tombstone inscription includes "OHIO U 1870". Tombstone inscriptions for his daughters who died young, Grace and Cora, include "M.S.U. 1896" and M.S.U. "1898" respectively.

What prompted this respect for education and love of classical literature and music? Could it be his stepmother, Naomi McNeel?? She, daughter of a physician, raised him. T. J. was six months old when his mother died and 11 years old when his father died. Records indicate, and family verbal history confirms, there was much love and respect between Thomas Jay and Naomi. Among other things, she took care of him when he was a baby, young child and young adult. He took care of her in her later years.

# THOMAS JAY HARRISON, FARMER, SCHOLAR, TEACHER, LEGISLATOR, FARMER 1846-1943

BOOM! CRASH! The sound of a wood door breaking, splintering. Startled students inside the Oak Hill, Ohio, Country School, on this Indian Summer day shortly before Christmas, 1877, just stared at the broken, splintered, door with a fence rail poking through. Then a hand came through the hole, unlocked and opened the door. Their teacher, Thomas Jay Harrison, stood in the doorway, with that fence rail, he used as a battering ram to thwart the students devious plan, still on his shoulder. He glared first at one small cluster of students and then another. Older boys, both those responsible for locking Mr. Harrison out when he went for his usual noon time walk and those who knew they would be suspected of the deed, became apprehensive. The one-room school had but one door and Teacher was blocking that exit. Escaping through a window was not an option; the boys knew, from experience, Teacher could move as fast as they could, if not faster, -- and he still had that fence rail on his shoulder. Deafening silence enveloped the school room, broken only by an occasional bird call from surrounding trees or a squirrel chattering as it scrounged for nuts to hide away for winter food. Not long before, these silent students had been chattering like magpies about what kind of treat Teacher might offer to induce them to unlock the door.

It was a custom during that period of time, in southern Ohio at least, for students to lock their teacher out of the school house sometime during the week or two preceding Christmas. They would let him/her in only after collecting a ransom, or treat, they deemed appropriate. According to a history of Jackson County, Ohio, the 1877 lock-out of T. J. Harrison was the last known such incident at Oak Hill School.

Thomas Jay Harrison, my maternal grandfather, was born 9 January 1846 near Oak Hill, Jackson County, Ohio. He was the youngest of seven children born to Nelson and Margaret (Buck) Harrison. Nelson, born in Rockingham County, Virginia, in 1811, came to Gallia County, Ohio, in 1825 with his parents William and Mary (Fawcett) Harrison. His siblings, except his oldest sister who was married and remained in Rockingham County, came to Gallia County at the same time. Margaret, born 20 March 1812 in Gallia County, Ohio, was the first child of Thomas and Susannah (Cherrington) Buck.

Nelson Harrison and Margaret Buck married in Gallia County, Ohio, on 19 August 1829. Nelson began farming for himself shortly after marriage. Tax records show Nelson was in Jackson County in 1832. He was assessed for one horse, valued at \$40.00, and two cattle valued at \$16.00. He had no "pleasure carriages" or money at interest. His total tax bill was 64.4 cents. Jackson County Tax Records show Nelson had two horses and five cattle in 1833. Total value of this personal property was \$120.00. In 1834 Nelson still had two horses but only three cattle. The 1840 US Census of Jackson County shows Nelson and Margaret had four children, a boy and a girl under five and a boy and girl between five and ten. Their fifth child was born later in 1840.

Margaret (Buck) Harrison died on 27 July 1846 -- six months, 18 days after the birth of Thomas Jay. Nelson married Naomi McNeal on 9 November 1847. Naomi, born 8 June 1813 in Ohio, was the daughter of a pioneer Ohio physician. Nelson and Naomi had no issue.

The 1850 US Census of Liberty Township, Jackson County, Ohio, shows Naomi and all seven of Nelson's children in his household. Nelson's occupation was "farmer" with real estate valued at \$3,000.

Sometime in the 1830s or 1840s, Nelson became involved in iron ore mining and smelting. Nelson's grandfather, Benjamin Fawcett, was heavily involved iron ore mining and smelting in Rockingham and, later, Bath, Counties, Virginia. Nelson's venture proved unsuccessful. When he died, in 1857, he was heavily in debt. He, or his estate, lost some, if not all, of his farm land holdings. Court records indicate the 60 acres that became the "home place" for Naomi and Thomas Jay may have been Naomi's inheritance.

Naomi was the only mother Thomas Jay ever knew. Thomas Jay became known as "T. J." and, in later life, as "Uncle Tommy." After Nelson died, when T. J. was only eleven, Naomi became his only parent. A deep bond, a deep admiration and mutual respect, developed between this stepmother-stepson and lasted throughout both their lives. She cared for and nurtured him through his young, formative, years; he looked after and took care of her during her old age.

Early in his life, T. J. developed a life-long love for learning, education, and an appreciation of music -- as a participant, not just a listener/spectator. In this respect, he was somewhat unique among his siblings and, as far as is known, his cousins. Was stepmother Naomi the prime motivator in developing these interests?

Sometime between 1850 and 1860 the family moved from Liberty Township to Jefferson township. The 1860 US Census of Jefferson Township, Jackson County, Ohio, shows Naomi as head of household and a farmer. Real estate was valued at \$3,000 (same as 1850); personal property was valued \$200. The household included five of her stepchildren -- Phoebe A., Susan, Mary, Maria and Thomas.

A Confederate Army, commanded by General James Longstreet, threatened to invade Ohio by fording the Ohio River near Gallopolis, Ohio, during the early part of the Civil War. T. J. joined other teenagers and old men shoring up Union forces in that area. The threat never materialized. T. J. and the others returned after "soldiering" for a week or so -- to the great relief of old timers anxious to get back to their farms and stores but to the dismay of teenagers basking in a new role as heroes and freedom from close parental supervision! Some youngsters relished "time on the town" where saloon keepers winked and interpreted dirt and grime on their smooth faces as beard stubble and dance hall girls flashed a wee bit more of their feminine charms than usual just to see the startled look on their cherubic faces as they flitted on to more affluent patrons.

Thomas Jay Harrison enrolled in the University of Ohio, Athens, Ohio, in the fall of 1865. Listed below are some of the classes he took and grades received:

T. J. graduated from Ohio University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Arts and Sciences in the spring of 1868. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1870 after taking some more courses in Greek. University records indicate he did not attend some school terms during the 1865-70 period and was, perhaps, a part time student during some other terms. He farmed his stepmother's land during that time period, and afterwards, and he may have taught school prior to graduation from the University.

The 1870 US Census of Jefferson Township, Jackson County, shows Naomi Harrison the head of a household that included, besides herself, Susan and Thomas J. Harrison. Naomi's occupation was listed as "keeping house." She had real estate valued at \$2,400 and \$450 worth of personal property. Thomas J.'s occupation was "farmer;" he had no real or personal property and was the only member of the household eligible to vote. The decline in value of real estate (from \$3,000 in 1860 to \$2,400 in 1870) was probably due to land lost, or sold, because of Nelson's debts when he died. Nelson's estate was not settled until 1862. The increase in value of personal property (\$450 in 1870 vs. \$200 in 1860) probably reflects additional livestock and, maybe, farm implements, accumulated by Naomi -- most probably with help from T. J. This is somewhat amazing; T. J. was just a "teener" during the early part of this decade and was attending the University during the last half of the time period.

A 3-page letter written 31 August 1870 by T. J. to his then fiancée, Gertrude "Trudy" Williams, is somewhat amazing, and amusing, when read with today's sense of propriety. It does, however, say much about T. J.'s dedication to excellence, his priorities, et cetera.

T. J., in St. Paul, Indiana, had just received a letter from Trudy. The salutation, "Dear Friend," the complementary close, "Truly," and the signature, "T. J. H.," although a bit formal for a betrothed couple, seem "normal" enough. But, after a few lines of chit chat and thanking her for her letter, the remainder of letter is devoted to criticism (*constructive*) of Gertrude's grammar and writing and congratulating on her efforts/work for her "Sabbath School class" along with numerous "dos and don'ts" for her guidance. The letter tells nothing about his (T. J.s) activities. {Comment: To this day, we do not know when he went to St. Paul, when he returned, or why he went there.} Most of the letter is printed below:

"Will you allow me to criticise some things I saw in these lines from you, Trudy, if I do so merely for your advantage? I will preface my criticism with the remark that I greatly admire your clear, straight-

forward, uninvolved way of expressing your thoughts. I admire, too, the good hand you hold in penmanship. I think you have made great improvements since last I saw your writing. But to the criticisms. I should consider each point as entirely possible ...; but I want you to excel. Won't you? Custom requires that the order in opening the letter be name of office, county, state, date. Thus Clay, Ohio, August 25, 1870. You placed the date first. I omit the letters after date: as 25 instead of 25th. It is not customary among some of the best writers. In this expression "I thought A little bit of news," etc. The A is wrong, you know. (See Primer on capital letters.) "Grandma is a visiting" sounds somewhat antiquated. Leave out the "a" and the sentence has a better jingle. Your author in grammar would condemn the expression "you had better believe;" but is often used ... I advise you now, for your own improvement, to rewrite everything coming from your pen. Every great historian has risen to eminence by care. McCauley rewrote nearly all his sentences. Gibbon rewrote the first chapter of his Roman History three times. ... Avoid scratching out a word; just draw your pen rapidly through it once, or take a sharp knife and scratch it off and begin further on for the next word. In this way you present a clean, unblotted, page pleasant to behold and one commences to read without prejudice.

"I am very glad you take hold of your Sabbath School class with <u>pride</u>. I sincerely hope that you may so conduct yourself in your duties toward it that it's members may have reason to be proud of their teacher. It is a rare field for usefulness and self-improvement. If you study your lessons out carefully and thoroughly and give your class thorough instruction on the doctrines, history, geography and chronology of every lesson, you will have a chance for mental culture beyond what the same application would furnish at any literary institution. Don't be absent a day unless you are too sick to get there.

"You say that you and Susan are going to <u>hear</u> the music. Could you not help make the music? I wish you would both go if a school is started; only don't let the boys come home with you or the evil may efface the good! ..."

Gertrude, born 27 August 1853 in Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, was the third of six children born to John and Elizabeth (Harger) Williams. She soon became known as "Trudy." At age one, or two, Trudy came to Ohio with her parents and two older brothers. Her mother died about 1862. Her father then married Phoebe Ann Harrison, eldest sister of Thomas Jay, on 8 October 1863 in Jackson County, Ohio.

Young love and mating instincts prevailed over T. J.'s prodding-to-excellence -- or maybe they were enhanced by the prodding. Thomas Jay Harrison and Gertrude Leslie Williams married in Jackson County, Ohio, on 20 July 1871. Trudy's stepmother was now her sister-in-law also.

Following marriage, T. J. and Trudy settled down to farming on Naomi's farm. Thomas J. probably taught school in addition to farming. Their family began growing with the birth of daughter Grace on 6 October 1872.

Naomi Harrison sold the remainder of the "home place," about 60 acres, to her stepson, Thomas Jay, on 31 July 1873 for "certain guarantees ... and five dollars." He became a landowner for the first time. About the same time the Republican Convention of Jackson County nominated T. J., by acclamation, to be Jackson County's representative in the Ohio State Legislature. T. J. easily won the election later that year.

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T. J. began his first, and only, two-year term as a legislator in January, 1874. Trudy, with help from Naomi, "kept the home fires burning," including feeding and caring for the livestock as well as little Grace. T. J. and Trudy corresponded regularly, by letter, while he was at Columbus, Ohio, and she was home on the farm. They each frequently wrote two or more letters a week. Some of T. J.'s letters have survived and are readable today. Unfortunately, none of Trudy's letters have been found. We have some of the originals and copies of others courtesy of a cousin, Virginia (Link) Milano. These letters provide a very detailed insight into Thomas Jay Harrison, the man -- his motivations, his character, his capabilities, his loves and his dislikes. In addition, they show his writing skill, his preciseness. If he were using a word processor with spell-check and grammar-check, I believe the only squawks spell-check would made would be proper names and grammar-check would never flash "This clause may contain a verb in the passive voice!"

T. J.'s letters to "Dear Little Wife," "Dear Little Trudy," et cetra., show he was impatient with and frustrated by the exasperating slowness of legislative progress. They include many satirical, and sometimes caustic, comments concerning progress, or lack of same, motivations of some of his fellow legislators, and social amenities associated with politics such as meeting with the governor and political "big-wigs." They also depict his love of music and his avid support for the temperance movement.

In one letter, T. J. tells of his surprise and utter disgust concerning "sexcapades" of a few of his fellow legislators. {Comment: It appears shenanigans of politicians haven't changed much since the mid 1870s -- or from the days of David and Bathsheba!} In another letter, T. J. complains that Trudy unfairly lambasted him for going to a 1870s equivalent of a honky-tonk or striptease joint; he promised to never do that again!

Appendix 1 is an abridged copy of these same letters.

Legislative duties were not all Thomas Jay had on his mind during the winter of 1875. Cora Lee Harrison, second child of T. J. and Trudy, arrived on 4 February 1875. Unfortunately, we have no letters written by T. J. describing his turmoil at that time. And, he had no way of knowing that in a few short years, little Cora would become the defacto mistress of his household and surrogate mother to his younger children.

T. J. returned to farming following the end of the 1874-1875 legislative session. He did not seek reelection in the fall of 1875. He had his fill of politics. Presumably he returned to Columbus for the fall, or early winter, session. T. J. also resumed teaching. He taught at Oak Hill during the 1877-1878 term as noted at the beginning of this paper. Where he taught the rest of the time is unknown. It is known only that "he taught school several years in Jackson and Gallia Counties." One of his students was Daniel Webster Williams, later a newspaper editor and father of Ben Ames Williams, noted novelist and short story writer. T. J. frequently corresponded with Daniel Williams after he (T. J.) moved to Missouri. The third child of T. J. and Trudy, John Scott Harrison, was born on 11 February 1877. Two years and 8 months later, on 11 October 1879, Nelson Burr Harrison joined his two older sisters and one older brother. He was the last of their children born in Jackson County, Ohio.

T. J. and Gertrude sold their Jackson County, Ohio farm to James K. Henson on 25 March 1880. That same day, T. J. wrote a letter to his brother, Isaac Harrison, who was already in Missouri, concerning his (T.J.s) move to Missouri. It was obvious they had corresponded previously concerning this move. T. J. noted he received Isaac's letter dated 18 March "yesterday." {Comment: Fast mail service -- only six days.} Apparently Isaac had found a farm, or farms, he believed would be acceptable to T. J. and asked about payments, type of deed, et cetra. T. J. wrote "...sold in a hurry to meet this case..." He received \$2,400 for his Ohio land, \$2,000 in cash and \$400 due in November. He noted the move would cost about \$200. He also stated that he did not "want much debt if it can be avoided." With that description of his financial position, T. J. essentially left it up to brother Isaac and brother-in-law Clint Evans to work out the best deal possible considering money available. T. J. ended this letter with "I am ready to come as soon as safe to do so -- must light out by the 15th of April."

Harrison County land records show Thomas Jay Harrison, of Jackson County, Ohio, bought a 156 acre farm in Grant Township for \$1,560 on 12 April 1880. This farm was some six miles northeast of Bethany, Missouri. It was about 1 1/2 miles from a depot called Gardner Station after the Burlington Railroad put a branch line through Harrison County about one year after T. J. purchased the farm.

T. J. and family embarked by train for Missouri, probably in early or mid April, 1880. At that time, the railroad depot closest to T. J.'s farm was about 30 miles away. Horse drawn wagons moved their belongings from the depot to their new farm. Apparently there was a house, or cabin of some kind, on the farm. The 1880 US Census for Grant Township, Harrison County, Missouri, shows Thomas J. Harrison as head of a farm household. Others in the household were Gertrude, Grace, Cora, John S., Nelson B., and Naomi. Naomi listed as "mother" of head of household.

In the fall of 1881 T. J. and Gertrude sold their property near Gardner Station, for substantially more than they paid for it, and bought a 120 acre farm in Bethany Township, four miles south southwest of the then small village of Bethany. There were no improvements on the new farm except fences. Only 35 acres were broken. The family lived either in a temporary cabin or in a rented house until T. J. completed a house in 1884 The new house, a 2-story, wood frame structure with clapboard siding, had six rooms and a full basement. The family may have been basement dwellers for a while.

T. J. and Trudy proudly watched their family grow both in number and maturity during the decade following their move to Bethany Township. Five times the stork visited the Harrison home. Sadly, the death angel touched the family three times during this same time period. These birth and deaths are as follows:

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Son Isaac Fletcher, born 14 January 1882 Son Cary Williams, born 19 October 1884 Daughter Gertrude Emma, born 5 September 1887 Daughter May, born and died 2 May 1890 Stepmother, defacto mother, Naomi (McNeal) Harrison died 5 August 1891 Daughter Anna Lois (my mother), born 15 September 1891 Wife, mother, Gertrude Leslie (Williams) Harrison, died 26 November 1893

T. J. and Gertrude joined the Mitchelville Church, a Methodist Church located several miles south of their farm, shortly after moving to Bethany Township. T. J.'s brother Isaac and wife, and sisters Susan and Mary and their husbands were already active members. By 1886 T. J. was Sunday School Superintendent, a position he held many years. Church functions and activities were an essential part of the Harrison Family life. Summertime ice cream socials were popular.

Education was another essential activity for the Harrison children. The Mitchelville School, a oneroom country grammar school located slightly more than a mile south and east of the family home, provided education through eighth grade. Then came high school at Bethany. By the early 1890s, the older children (including the girls) began enrolling in Missouri University at Columbia, Missouri.

The 1900 US Census of Bethany Township showed all seven of T. J.'s living children residing at home. Grace died 18 June 1899 of spinal meningitis. By 1910 only Cora and Lois remained at home. They both continued living at home until 1920 except when Lois was attending or teaching school. Cora, who had been mother as well as sister to the younger children, died 10 September 1920. Anna Lois married in February, 1921. From then on T. J., in essence, lived alone on the farm until mid-1941 when he entered the Wood Hospital in Bethany. {His arrangement at Wood Hospital was equivalent to that of a Nursing Home today.} At least two of his married children lived with him briefly during the late 1910s and early 1920s. In the late 1930s he became quite frail; his eye sight and hearing progressively deteriorated. A grandson, whose parents lived nearby, stayed with him much of the time during this period.

The 120 acre farm T. J. bought in 1881 proved a boon to him and his family. Most of it lay on the "second bottom" of Big Creek. {Second bottom land is land far enough from the creek or river that it does not normally flood during high waters.} Except for a few acres on the "back side" of the farm, the soil was deep, fertile, loam. Except for the few acres noted above, the lay of the land was such that it did not erode seriously as a result of rain from Missouri thunderstorms even when cultivated. Crops, planted and harvested with horses and horse-drawn implements, included corn, small grain, hay and pasture. He also had a large apple orchard. T. J. was identified as a "progressive farmer." He gleaned literature from the University of Missouri School of Agriculture, and other sources, for new ideas. Some worked, some didn't. HOARD'S DAIRYMAN, a trade magazine for dairymen was one of several magazines he read, studied, regularly. He was the first to grow alfalfa extensively in Harrison County. Alfalfa is a nutritious (high

protein) legume especially suited for dairy cattle feed. Although it tends to "winter-pull" in northern Missouri, a good field of alfalfa will usually last several years before it has to be re-seeded. Alfalfa is considered good for the soil. T. J. practiced soil conservation long before it became the "watchword" for mid-west farmers.

T. J. began dairying in 1890. This proved "another stroke of good luck" as he put it some 48 years later. (Other "strokes of good luck" noted in this same document included coming to Missouri; buying the farm near Gardner Station -- railroad came through near the farm and he sold it for considerably more than he paid for it; buying the farm southwest of Bethany.) He soon built up a large, productive, herd of Jersey milk cows. Jersey's are a relatively small breed (eat less feed) and they produce milk rich in butterfat. He lived far from a market for milk so he sold butter -- butter by the tub. Dairying was labor intensive during the time T. J.'s livelihood depended on it. Milking was by hand. A hand-cranked separator separated cream from the whole milk. A hand-cranked, horizontal-barrel-churn was used for many years to churn the cream into butter.

T. J.'s 120 acre dairy farm provided "bread and butter" for his family as the children were growing up and, later, provided, or helped provide university or college level education for all but one of his eight children that lived to adulthood. His two older daughters and three older sons graduated from Missouri University. His two younger daughters received two years of college or more. In addition, T. J. gave 20 acres of land, or it's cash equivalent, to each of his children.

We visited the Jackson County, Ohio, farm home of T. J. and Trudy in 1987 when we attended the Cherrington Family 100th Annual Reunion. We were amazed at the similarities between this farm home and T. J.'s Missouri farm home. The lay of the land was almost identical -- i.e., gentile slope with a small amount of rougher ground on the back side. A major difference, however, was the soil; the Ohio soil was shallow, rocky, not nearly as productive as the Missouri farm. From the outside, the farm house in Ohio looked almost identical to the Missouri house except for some obvious side add-ons. Both were 2-story, "L" shaped with the foot of the "L" rather short, wood framed structures with clapboard siding, The occupants of the Ohio house told us that a few years before the inside of the house was extensively remodeled. In the course of this work it was found that the house had been build around a log cabin which was left intact insofar as walls were concerned. It would be interesting to know whether T. J. was the one who built the house around the log cabin. The similarity of the two houses certainly suggests that possibility.

Thomas Jay Harrison was a religious man. His previously noted service at the Mitchelville Church seems to be a continuation of the life style he led in Ohio. Letters to Gertrude while he was serving in the legislature indicate his interest and involvement in church activities at that time. He regularly read the Bible according to his children. The Harrison Family Bible, which we now have, is large, heavy, and appears well used. He had other, smaller, Bibles for "everyday" use. The prized Family Bible, a King James version, contains 1,375 pages exclusive of a concordance, index, and pages for family information and pictures. It is approximately 10 1/2 inches high, 9 1/2 inches deep and 3 1/2 inches thick. Weight is about six pounds. Binding is leather over thick cardboard stiffeners. Notes, similar to the notes in the NIV Study Bible, are at the bottom of every page. A mini sermon follows many chapters. The name T. J. Harrison is imprinted in gold letters on the front. We do not know when he acquired this Bible; the only date (except for the handwritten family births, deaths and marriages) is at the end of the preface. This date is 15 August 1847.

Thomas J. Harrison was interested in and worked for improved roads. He built and used one of the first road drags in Harrison County. About 1920 he wrote a letter to the editor of a Bethany newspaper expressing disappointment and disgust concerning a new road going north-south through Bethany. This letter is a mixture of satire, humor, and biting, caustic, remarks. He used the Biblical story of Jacob and Esau as a format for his article. Like his letters to Trudy in 1874-75, he chose and manipulated words and ideas like a skilled violinist plays his instrument. The article illustrates not only his writing skill but his knowledge of both ancient and current history. For example, he developed a scenario with a conclusion that I would normally say "... they might as well commit suicide." T. J. stated it this way: "... might as well go to Armenia and let the unspeakable Turk put an end to their sufferings." {In 1915, the Turks, long noted for barbaric treatment of nomadic tribes, drove most Armenians into the desert where hundreds of thousands perished from fatigue, starvation, and sunstroke.} Attachment 2 is a re-typed copy of T. J.'s letter.

In 1937 Thomas J. Harrison was recognized as one of the two "Oldest Living Alumnus" of Ohio University in the Alumni Association newsletter. This recognition was based on year of graduation. T. J. was more than six years senior in age to his co-Oldest-Living-Alumnus.

T. J. never owned or drove an automobile. Locally he traveled on horseback, in a horse drawn buggy or in a farm wagon. In later years his son living nearby chauffeured him frequently.

Thomas Jay Harrison, by then known as "Uncle Tommy," died 11 September 1943 at age 97 years, 8 months and 2 days. Wood Hospital, Bethany, Missouri, had been his home for 780 days. Although bedridden, blind and deaf, his mind remained alert and active to the end. Unlike the curmudgeon one might envision from his writings noted previously, Uncle Tommy was a sensitive, genial, forward-looking, and cheerful patient.. Being bedridden and blind, he required lots of service from the staff. His nurses reported that he never failed to thank them for service and observed that he gave back more than he received.

I never really knew Grandpa Harrison. He was 76 years old when I was born. I saw him on numerous occasions, though not frequently. Dad was "on the outs" with Grandpa as result of an ill-fated venture involving two families in one house -- I should say a venture involving two strong-willed men

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farming one farm. The relationship may have been tenuous, strained, before that. Granddad did not attend my parents wedding in Bethany. Motivations, beliefs, and lifestyle of the Harrisons were quite different from those of the McQuerrys The occasions when I did see Grandpa Harrison, always at his home south of Bethany, included family get-togethers and when Mom visited him. I also spent a few days with him during at least two summers. My main interest during these visits was playing with my cousins. Two cousins, one my age and one seven years older, lived nearby.

As I knew him, Granddad Harrison was old, somewhat feeble, very quiet -- maybe aloof -- but kind, gentle and courteous. He stood about 5 feet, 9 inches tall, erect, almost, but not quite, a "military bearing," and weighed 150 to 160 pounds. He had a long, white beard which he parted with a dinner knife to drink milk from a glass. I remember he always drank lots of milk and buttermilk -- with every meal and, sometimes, between meals. I never understood why he liked buttermilk; I hated it! His hair was white, somewhat thin but he wasn't bald. I do not remember the "pot-belly" that shows in some snapshots taken during this time period. His eyesight was "not-the-best." In later years his eyes frequently watered profusely. He was hard-of-hearing.

I do not remember seeing Mom and Grandpa play the piano together. I do remember Mom telling how they could "while away the hours" playing the piano and singing together.

During family get-togethers, Grandpa Harrison was always with the "men folk" but he talked, visited, very little. He always, willingly, responded to questions directed at him (when he heard them) but infrequently joined in the general chatter. He definitely was <u>not</u> the "talkative old man" he described himself as in a letter to daughter, Emma, written about two years before I was born. It was the same way when he and I were alone. We never "visited." He readily answered questions I asked if/when I was able to make him understand. Occasionally he would ask me questions — usually about school. One time he talked a little bit about reading the Bible. I believe this was prompted by Mom telling him I was reading the Bible. Grandpa observed he had read the Bible in its entirety more than once. Then he added, with a chuckle, "Well, all but the begats and a few other such parts and (long pause) maybe Revelation." According to Mom, Grandpa thought the Book of Revelation might have good information in it if one understood it.

I wish I had known Grandpa Harrison better. Among other things, maybe he could have persuaded me to appreciate music as a participant -- not just a spectator/listener.

Reflecting on how I saw/knew my grandfather makes me shudder to think how my grandchildren and great grandchildren, some 70 years younger than I, must envision <u>me!</u>

### NOTES, EXCEPTS FROM LETTERS WRITTEN BY THOMAS JAY. TO HIS WIFE WHILE HE WAS ATTENDING STATE LEGISLATURE SESSIONS:

(Salutation, complementary close & signature shown on first line of each synopsis. Direct quotes italicized)

26 Jan 1874 Dear Little Wife; Yours; Thomas J. Harrison

- o Disappointed that he (T J) had not received a letter from her. Disappointment ...all the more poignant because we have today agreed in our <u>patriotism</u> to abjure our love for wife and children and home, and remain without adjournment until we are through. Our wives will no doubt rejoice to know that their <u>dictators</u> are not likely to put in an unpleasant appearance. It is singular that men can be so foolish and weak in principles as to fear to vote for a sufficiency of time to visit home! ... because their constituents would be displeased if they were to go home even for a day.
- o Notes that a fellow legislature, a Dr. Munson, said he was completely disgusted with activities going on and would not return again even though they gave them four times as much money for their service. T J adds *I think him about right*.
- o Notes he greatly appreciated the two letters (from Gertrude) he had just received. He then adds Don't allow Grace's want of "tittle" to prevent your writing again soon.
- o Notes that Right across a little open space from my room is a family of man, wife and 3 little ones after my own heart. They have a small organ and the wife, though a plain farmer's girl like you, plays well and sings finely. I can hardly resist the temptation to go and help her. Sunday evening she played an hour or two and I could but feel like grumbling that you and I could not thus together seek enjoyment.
- o The letter ends with Please allow me to say in your ear that, though I like your letters so very much, I would much rather have the substitute you propose to give. Don't forget that you have my whole love and that I want nothing less from my little wife.
- 20 Feb 1874 Dear Little Trudy; Yours only; T. J. Harrison (Letter transcribed almost in it's entirety) o (opening paragraph) It gave me no great pleasure to read parts of your last letter. I don't think you were hardly fair in some of your criticisms. I felt miserable when I wrote you those short letters and lack of love and good wishes did not cause their brevity. The fact that I did not express my love as freely as usual arose from the fear that the old folks read with small sympathy. Love, pure and disinterested, is a noble attribute of humanity, yet its avowal is often productive of sarcastic smiles from any other than the subject and object of it -- the giver and receiver. If you were here, a warm kiss and caress should soon convince you that my love is not materially lessened to say the least. ... It seems to me you write impatiently. Do you feel so?

I think, Trudy, I can give up going to theaters or any place else where simple pleasure is the object, if my wife desires it. I would not like her to go against <u>my</u> will. I will therefore pledge you herein that I will not attend said resorts of pleasure unless some noted lecturer, whom I wish to hear, constitutes the attraction. Brazen faces, bare legs and bare a\_s shall not control my attendance. Nor shall music, either, if you will wield your power at home. I have so far gone simply out of curiosity — a desire to see what was done at these places. I have seen the inside of each and am now satisfied.

- o How do you spell that which you wished me to dissolve in my mouth? Be careful of that little word to, too, two. You may interchange them. You say "I received" etc.
- o My throat is now well, thanks to Providence, and my body is, I think, sound as usual; but my brain gets very tired of these business proceedings, if <u>proceedings</u> is the proper term when so little is done. We are doing much better, however, as we get better broken into the harness. It is impossible to say when adjournment will come. I think the flowers will bloom and fields look green ere we cast the last long lingering look at our adopted winter's home. ... A great many unimportant bills are introduced and many such pass the House, but they are mostly squelched in the Senate. That body is so contemptibly mean that it will pass nothing in which none of it's members have a personal interest. Their advantage therefore is not superior wisdom but transcendent meanness.
- o I will send you a little money today as I have drawn only one week's wages since I was at home the first time and am about out. I shall draw next week, though, and I shall then supply your needs. Write and tell me how much to send.
- o Accept the assurance of my sincere love for both my little dears, and write soon....

#### 13 Mar 1874 My Dear Little Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison

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- o Chit chat -- how he misses her. Does she need money? Can send it if she doesn't' ask for too much. Notes that I sent for the Star for you according to your request. I hope you will receive (notice how this word is spelled) it soon and be well pleased with it. What did you mean in your last in regard to Mr. Williams's Keeping grocery? You and the children both allude to it in a way that leaves me in doubt whether you are in fun or earnest. Please explain.
- o What are you women doing toward suppressing the whisky trade in your community? There is nothing of importance enough to talk of except the "Whisky War" here. ... Last night Gough lectured on temperance at the open house which was filled to overflowing. It was a masterly effort ... Perhaps when you come up next winter you will have the chance to hear the Lion roar.
- o I want you to tell me, Trudy, what to bring home to the children. I can't make a satisfactory choice either in kind or quality -- I need hardly tell you that.
- o I am glad to hear of your success in the new music book. I hope you will continue to give attention to music...

# 9 Apr 1874 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison. {Letter started on Thurs.; finished Friday} o Discusses, comments on, uncertainty about when legislature will finish their business.

o Notes that the election has strengthened the Democrats and that one had stated he was ... in favor of reorganizing the remaining benevolent institutions before we leave if it takes all summer.

### Appendix 1 THOMAS JAY HARRISON, FARMER, SCHOLAR, TEACHER, LEGISLATOR, FARMER 1846-1943

- o Bad weather snowing, ground covered with several inches of snow and snow still falling. I fear you will have a very disagreeable work to do in your feeding (<u>my</u> feeding, I should say)
- o Says he plans to come home Saturday (11 April) ... to be with my <u>Darling</u> ... Will She greet my coming with a holy kiss?
- o Notes that he was disappointed he did not receive a letter (from Trudy) yesterday
- 3 Dec 1874 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison
  - o Chit chat. Legislature to adjourn for holidays. Boarding house where he stays charges full fare for absences of one week or less and half-fare for absences over a week. Legislator received no pay during recess. T. J. had a roommate -- representative from Clinton County.
     "Nice" room, on third floor. Rent/fare: either \$5.50 or \$0.50 per week -- document faded.
  - I went to church last night to while away the time and I was surprised to find one of the goodest old fashioned prayer meeting I have lately gone to -- good singing and hearty praying.
  - o Recently attended an organ recital at First Congregational Church. Sent Trudy a copy of the "programmie".
- 3 Mar 1874 Dear Trude; Yours; T. J. Harrison
  - o Chit Chat. T. J. had bad headache for several days. Went for a long walk, as recommended by "Dr. Ray." Only made headache worse!
  - o Ended with Now good by e and be a good girl; Kiss Grace for me and receive mine.
- 3 Jan 1875 Dear Wife; Yours; T. J. Harrison {Beginning of T J's 2nd year as legislator}
  - We made a call Friday on the governor. Cake and wine loaded down a side table and few of the members had the grit to say "no" when the latter was offered them. To relieve your apprehensions at this juncture I will just say that I was not tempted above what I bore.
  - o We heard a lecture at the Penitentiary by Furguson, the Chaplain, on "Mordicai the Jew." There was some fun but little sense -- I'll say wisdom -- for it was the most sensual sermon I ever heard. It was full of obscenity and was very ill adapted to the place.
  - o (This afternoon) we called on Mrs. John G. Deshler who set a rich table for perhaps two or three hundred -- at least as many as called. This was the silliest affair I have ever been a partner to. I suppose it was all in strict etiquette but a trained parrot might have entertained company with as much good taste and politeness as did this volary of, and acknowledged leader in, fashion.
  - o I propose to start my juvenile bill forward and I hope it will be dealt with gently.
  - o One year ago was my first Sunday in Columbus, and what great changes my experience has wrought in that time! Instead of the sober, earnest men I expected to see in the halls of legislation, I find few but political tricksters regarding naught but their own interests. But I have no time to pursue the thought as I would...
  - o (End of letter) I must commend you for your penmanship for you are rapidly improving. ...Good bye and may this be the happiest and most useful year of the feast when you make the review a year hence.

## TRANSCRIPT of a LETTER TO THE EDITOR by T. J. HARRISON (Written about 1920; Published in a Bethany, Missouri, Newspaper)

#### Dear Editor:

In my last comments I promised to give your readers a sample of E. Z. Marks and a record of the respect which history accords them. Sixty-five years ago, when I was just beginning to understand what I read, I found it difficult to get reading matter that boys like. We had quite a library of big leather bound volumes, mostly of religious and scientific works, but you know a boy's love for blood and thunder and action. These elements were supplied abundantly in the Bible and Plutarch's "Lives." So I read them as boys would hardly do now.

There were four stories in the Old Testament that were especially interesting to me: The story of Esau and Jacob, the story of Esther and Mordicai, the story of Joseph, and the story of Ruth. The first three are stories of financial, political, and social greed, but the fourth is a story of love and unselfish devotion so beautiful that it has made Ruth the sweetest name loving mother can bestow on her darling babe. If there is anything in English literature finer than Ruth's auto dedication, I have yet to find or appreciate it.

But it is the story of Esau to which I would like to call your readers' attention as it seems to have been recorded for just such cases as ours. I would be glad to have your readers defer to the story for they will find it exceedingly interesting; but for those who may not find reference convenient I will say briefly that Esau and Jacob were twins. Esau was the elder brother and, according to the law of prime-geniture which prevailed at that time, was entitled to succeed his father as patriarch or father-ruler of the family, and was heir as well to the family's great wealth. Esau was preeminently an outdoor boy, helping the cowboys of the range to round up the steers and bust the bronchos. He was also a great hunter and kept the table supplied with the choicest of venison. Jacob, however, was the "Little Lord Fauntleroy," or perhaps the "Merle twin," of four thousand years ago. When Mrs. Ben Hadad called on Mrs. Israel, Jacob leaned sweetly against mother's knees and listened to neighborhood scandals and knew all about how many hens the neighbors had setting and especially the price of eggs. During all this time mother's fingers were gently twining those glossy curls and she loved Jacob as the apple of her eye. Isn't it wonderful then that she should determine that Jacob should supplant Esau in the inheritance and in his father's love.

Came at last a time when Isaac was very old and blind -- so blind that he would not know a great highway from a cross-cut saw. He called Esau to bring him a choice mess of venison and promised then to give him his final blessing. But the mother heard, and when Esau brought his offering, Jacob and his mother had already kidded the blessing from the father and there was nothing left for Esau.

#### Appendix 2 THOMAS JAY HARRISON, FARMER, SCHOLAR, TEACHER, LEGISLATOR, FARMER 1846-1943

Now, Mr. Editor, I would like to call your readers' attention to the fact that though this was the grossest and most unbelievable case of bunco-steering in ancient or modern history, yet Isaac after being convinced beyond the shadow of a doubt that he had done Esau irreparable wrong, refused utterly to unwind one particle of his red tape or change his blue print a single hair. In other words government was just as blind and stupid four thousand years ago as it is today.

Again came a time when Esau went hunting. The wind was wrong and the game was shy. Discouraged, hungry, footsore and weary, Esau turned homeward. By some species of wireless the crafty and conscienceless mother and son learned of Esau's plight and prepared the final act of his undoing. The loving mother prepared a great bowl of steaming broth and sent Jacob with it to meet his brother. To feed him? Not on your life! Esau, full of gratitude, reached for the bowl but Jacob withdrew it and told Esau he could have it only in exchange for his birthright. Of course we know the Mayor of Cork would simply have tightened his belt a notch and gone on a hunger strike, and his wife would have stood by to prevent the cruel English from feeding by force. But I tremble to think what would have befallen little Jake's face if the proposition had been made to a red blooded American. Esau, however, accepted the condition.

I would like to call the readers attention to the fact that Esau and Jacob, though twins, were born in widely separated states. Esau in Utopia and Jacob in Missouri. Esau is one of those that "believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things." Jacob believes nothing till it is proved, hopes for nothing that he has not the energy to make on his own, endures nothing that he can fight successfully. Attention is called to the following rule adop y the Executive Board of the University:

"Each student renting a room or taking out a permit for meals shall make a deposit of \$5.00 with the Proctor of the University, and take a receipt therefor, which receipt shall be filed with the Steward before the student shall take possession of his room or take meals in the dining room. This deposit shall be refunded when the student leaves the dormitory or surrenders his meal permit, provided he has paid all charges assessed against him for damage to University property and his proportionate part of the charges against the Club organization for such damage."

Rooms in the old buildings will be rented on the same terms as heretofore, except that the deposit above named is required.

In remitting menay to pay rent for rooms, each student must also forward, the deposit or 35.00.

The matter of providing furniture for the rooms in the New Dormitory has not been determined. If the Curators have funds available they will provelly supply the rooms with the same quantity of furniture as is provided in the old building (see catalogue.) If they have no funds available, they will probably adopt some uniform standard of furniture which the students may purchase and which will be accepted by the Curators from the students and paid for at east, if in good condition, as soon as they secure an appropriation for that purpose. I am,

In reply to your very interesting letter dated January 21, 1948, I am pleased to write you what I know about the former Harrison home in Ohio, located near Oak Hill.

Yes, indeed the house is still standing. When my father died March 29, 1917, all five of his children met on the occasion of the funeral and they decided that the home place should be kept by our step-mother, who survived my father, during her life time. While she is still living, now nearly 93 years of age, that is, in her 93d year, we all agreed about five years ago to sell the property as father had left no will and there were six heirs living including our step-mother. The sale was made. Today the house and land are rented, the purchaser to take possession in the near future I believe, but I am not certain when.

As you know, the house is located on a paved road between Clay and Oak Hill, on the right of the road as one drives from Clay to Oak Hill, about one mile north of Oak Hill.

I do not know of any history of Jackson County that has been written. If such a history has been prepared, I do not know about it. In this connection I might suggest that you write a letter of inquiry about a history of Jackson County to my sister who lives in Jackson, not taking care of my step-mother. If there is such a history, she would be able to find out and let you know,

# Missouri Farmer and Cincinnati Neurologist Share the Title of "Oldest Living Alumnus"

FOLLOWING the death of Judge Anselm T. Holcomb, '67, in Portsmouth on March 1, the honor of sharing the title of "Oldest Living Graduate of Ohio University,," passed to Dr. Philip Zenner, a prominent 'Cincinnati physician and Thomas Jay Harrison, a retired farmer living near Bethany, Mo. Both are members of the Class of 1870.

Although the honor is a joint one, since their class is the oldest one having living members, Mr. Harrison is more than six-sears the senior of Doctor Zenner in point of years since birth, the Missourian having been born in Jackson County, Ohio, January 9, 1846, while Doctor Zenner first saw the light of day in Cincinnati on May 17, 1852.

Although but a youth when the Civil War broke out, young Harrison, with other boys, served for a week in the Union Army when General Longstreet threatened to cross the Ohio River near Gallipolis. After the War he matriculated at Ohio University where he majored in the arts and sciences, taking the strictly prescribed courses of the old-time curriculum.

Two years after graduation Mr. Harrison married Gertrude Williams, a Jackson County girl. He was elected to the State Legislature but he had no great liking for politics. From 1870 to 1880 he studied law—"enough to keep out of trouble," he says, but he never applied for admission to the Bar. In 1880 he moved to Harrison County, Missouri, where he has since resided. There he purchased a farm of 160 acres and became one of the county's pioneer and most prosperous dairy farmers.

Mr. Harrison is a great believer in education. He is the father of eight children, six of whom are still living. All six have been educated in Missouri schools. Three sons and two daughters are graduates of the University of Missouri, while the other daughter is a graduate of Missouri Wesleyan College. Mrs. Harrison died many years ago.

The nonagenarian is ill at the present time and was confined to his bed when the photographer from the Harrison County Times called upon him a few weeks ago. He still follows the nation and the world with great interest by means of newspapers and his radio, however, and is fond of reading books. Modern modes of living and morals do not receive his approval. "I believe in the sensible things," he says.

Doctor Zenner's father emigrated from Lichtenfels, Bavaria, Germany,

in 1846 and established a mercantile business- in Cincinnati.

Deciding upon a medical career, following graduation from Ohio University, young Philip entered the Miami Medical College, now a unit of the University of Cincinnati, and recevied his medical degree in 1875. He immediately entered upon the practice of his profession. The years 1879-71 were spent in advanced studies in Berlin, Vienna, Leipsic, Paris and London, and on his return he made a specialty of neurology.

Doctor Zenner has been connected with the Ohio Medical College, now a unit of the University of Cincinnati, as professor of neurology, holding emeritus rank since 1910. He was neurologist to the Cincinnati Hospital and is now its consulting neurologist. He helped to organize the staff of the Jewish Hospital in 1886 and has been a member of it ever since.

The Cincinnatian has contributed many articles to the medical journals of America and Europe and to medical cycyopedias. His books are "Education in Sexual Physiology and Hygiene" and "Mind Cure and Other Essays." The former, which is the first attempt at a school course on the subject of sex, consists of talks to school children and college boys which he had given in the public schools and the colleges at the request of the Cincinnati superintendent of schools and the president of the University of Cincinnati.

In 1929, Doctor Zenner established a loan fund for released prisoners of the Ohio Penitentiary which is intended to help tide the freed individuals over that period from the time of their release to the time of securing suitable employment. This fund, the first of its kind, affords an opportunity for the prisoner's rehabilitation, and gives society a more equal chance to escape from further depredations on his part. The loans bear no interest, but the recipients must give their notes duly witnessed. Within two years loans were made to eighty-six released prisoners; eighteen of whom repaid the loan within a year and fourteen repaid it in part.

A pioneer in many ways, Doctor Zenner was the first physician in Cincinnati to devote himself to the treatment of nervous diseases, the first to open a clinic for nervous diseases in the Cincinnati medical colleges, the first to propose a course of lectures for the medical students of Cincinnati in an insane asylum and the first to suggest the Cincinnati Neurological Society, of which he was the first president.

In civic matters he has been a zealous worker in the Cincinnati Charter movement. Doctor Zenner is a member of the Cincinnati Academy of Medicine, the Ohio State Medical Association, and the American Neurolcgical Society. He is unmarried.

The classes of 1871 and 1872 are both now without living representatives. Of the seven original members of the Class of 1873, two are still living: Rev. Frank O. Ballard, Hanover, Ind., and Evan J. Jones, Sr., Athens. Fletcher S. Coultrap, '75, a former member of the Ohio University faculty, is next in the "line of succession."

Mrs. W. B. Gillespie was a native of Virginia. Her mother who was Nancy Flynn had quite an interesting and tragic experience in childhood. While her father was clearing land in Virginia in pioneer days he was killed by Indians just when he had finished fencing his land. The Indians took all of the family prisoners except one girl who jumped into a sink hole and escaped. Nancy Flynn was kept prisoner by the Indians until she was twelve or fourteen years of age, when she was rescued by three white men who had been informed of her identity by a white family where she had been sent by the Indians for milk. A scar caused by a burn was the clue that identified her as she had no knowledge of her parents, having been captured in infancy.

W. B. Gillespie was born in Virginia in 1811 and later moved to Jackson County, Ohio, where he married and lived until 1844. Mr. and Mrs. W. B. Gillespie came to Missouri in the fall of 1844 and settled six miles south of Bethany, where W. H. H. Gillespie was reared. 
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

My father, T. J. Harrison was born in Jackson Co Ohio--January 9, 1846. My mother -- Gertrude Williams was from the same placeborn 1853. My grandfather, Nelson Harrison came with three brothers John, Jacob and Alfred, from Rockingham Co. Virginia early in the 19th century. Probably between 1820-1830. One sister Ann Harrison Polly crossed the mountains in 1833 during a shower of meteors which caused serious trouble with cattle and horses. Grandfather Harrison's first wife died about 1848--leaving six children-1. Phoebe (second wife of Grandfather Williams) 2. Isaac -\*Burr Harrison died 3. Susan McNamee, 4. Della Evans 5. Maria Creighton and Thomas J. His second wife, Naomi McNeal, daughter of a pioneer physician, owned also a farm on which they built a brick house but with investments in iron mines lost both farms and Nelson Harrison died in 1857. His widow was left with a small farm of 40 acres. Thomas J. acquired an education and graduated from Ohio U. in 1870. "e married and taught for several years -- was also a member of legislature. One of his pupils was Daniel Webster Williams, Editor, fatherof Ben Ames Williams. From D. W. Williams he frequently heard by mail years later. About 1880 with wife , children and mother--he came to Missouri and located near Bethany on a farm. His wife died in 1893 and the next years were a struggle to raise and educate the family. The two oldest girls helped in the home and attended school when both entered Mo. University in 1890. Grace graduated in 1896, Cora in 1898. The boys Scott, Burr and Fletcher graduated in 1903-1904-1905. Cary did not finish school. Emma finished in Piano at Missouri Wesleyan College in 1908. Lois graduated in piano and teaching at Maryville Normal College.

Grace died from Meningitis while teaching High School at Harrisonville, Mo. June 18, 1899. Cora taught only one term--had very poor health and made a home for her father. She died in 1920 after one operation. Thomas J. made frequent bequests of money and land to his family. Now lives alone on the home farm at the age of 90. Is well but his eyesight is failing.

#### Death Claims Two Nonagenarians; One Is "Oldest Living Alumnus"

Death this fall removed from alumni ranks two of Ohio University's oldest and most veherable graduates.

One, Thomas Jay Harrison, 15, 4.7 C Bethany, Mo., had, in fact, enjoyed the distinction of being "the oldest living alumnus" since the death of Dr. William H. Scott, '62, in 1937. Mr. Harrison died in a Bethany hospital, September 11, at the age of 97 years, eight months, and three days.

A native of Oak Hill, Ohio, he received a B.S. degree from Ohio University in 1868 and an A.B. degree in 1870. He taught school in Jackson and Gallia counties until 1880, and served in the State Legislature from 1873 to 1876.

In 1880, Mr. Harrison moved to Harrison County, Mo., where he became a successful farmer. All of his six children are graduates of state colleges or universities.

## "UNCLE TOMMY" WAS

Out at the Wood hospital, where "Uncle Tommy" Harrison was a patient for 780 days before his death, Saturday, the staff says that he will be badly missed.

Because he was blind, it was necessary for nurses to feed him at each meal. Not once in the 780 days did he fail to thank the nurses or anybody else for everything that was done for him, even though it was in the line of duty.

Uncle Tommy Harrison When "Uncle Tommy" Harrison passed away at the Wood hospital last Saturday he left a vacant place. Not just the room where he had been a patient for 780 days, but in the hearts of. the whole staff. Nurses who cared for him are going about the hospital lonesome for the genial, happy-spirited old man with his forward looking attitude at nearly 100 years of age. His cheerfulness had no bounds, for age had mellowed him and made him kind and considerate instead of cross and crabbed. His courtesy was unfailing, and no nurse ever did him the least kindness, or ever gave him the most casual attention without eliciting a warm "thank you."

"Uncle Tommy" was blind, but his vision was clear. He had a furnished mind and his home always had been a house of books and magazines. There always had been good talk at the dinner table or around the evening lamp at his house. Eight children grew up in that home with its rich background of high thinking.

The nurses say that while he had to be fed and was given all needed care, with some thrown in for good measure, he always gave back more than he received, so alive and generous was he.

When he died and was carried from his hospital room, there was not really a vacancy. It was a room filled with the memories of 780 days of occupancy by a noble and generous spirit.



## T. J. HARRISON, 97, The oldest living O. U. Alumnus, dies

Served in Ohio Legislature —Pioneered Here in the Growing of Alfalfa—Burial at Burris Cemetery

Thomas Jay Harrison, reputed to have been the oldest living alumnus of Ohio university at Athens, Ohio, died Saturday afternoon at the Wood hospital, at the age of 97 years, eight months and one day.

Mr. Harrison had been cared for at the hospital for two years, after he became so feeble of body that attending him in a private home was difficult. He had lost his sight, but that faculty returned to him in slight degree before his death, and he could discern the shape and nature of objects placed before his eyes. His mind was alert even during the last week.

Born in Jackson county, Ohio, Mr. Harrison was graduated from a general course at Ohio university in 1868, and he received a degree in Greek there two years later. He taught school in Jackson and Gallia counties, Ohio, until 1880, and he served in the Ohio state legislature from 1873 to 1876.

In 1880, when he was 34, Mr. and Mrs. Harrison came from Ohio to Harrison county, and he bought 156 acres of land near what later became Gardner. After 18 months there he sold that tract, and bought 120 acres five miles southwest of Bethany, which since had been his home.

On that farm he came to engage in dairying, and he pioneered locally in the growing of alfalfa. He was superintendent of the Mitchelville Sunday school for many years and, when active, participated in public welfare movements.

His wife, Gertrude, also a native of Ohio, died in 1893. Their sons and daughters, both alive and dead, all were given higher educations. The survivors are

Thomas Jay Harrison, the son of Nelson and Margaret Buck Harrison was born at Oak Hill, Jackson County, Ohio, Jan 9, 1946, and passed away at the Wood hospital, which had been his home the past two years, Sept. 11, 1943, at the age of 97 years, eight months and two days.

"lways interested in learning the truth, he attended the public schools, then went to Ohio University, Athens, Ohio, from which he was graduated in 1870.

After graduation, he taught in the schools of Ohio and for a time was a member of the state legislature from his district. Not caring for teaching or politics, he engaged in farming, in which occupation he remained until advanced age compelled him to quit.

He was married to Gertrude Williams in 1871, who passed away in November 1893. To this union were born eight children-four sons and four daughters. Two daughters, Grace and Cora preceded him in death.

In 1880, he moved from Ohio to Missouri, later purchasing a farm near Bethany.

He was interested in the work of the Sunday School and for many years served as superintendent of the Mitchelville Sunday school. He was also interested in good roads, and through his efforts a shorter road was built from his home to Bethany, which later became part of highway No. 69. <sup>He</sup> made and used one of the first road drags seen in this locality.

He is survived by the following children: J. S., Green Forest, Ark., N. B.; Bethany, Mo.; I. F., Birmingham Ala.; C. W., Eagleville, Mo.; Mrs Emma Link, Mount Ayr, Io.; and Mrs Lois McQuerry, Blythedale, Mo. Twenty-one grandchildren and three great-grandchildren also survive. Four grandsons are now with the Armed Forces.

His life was a sincere expression of the first psalm, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful."

Funeral services were held at the Mitchelville Church Sept. 13, conducted by the pastor, the Rev. Edgar P. Reed. Music was furnished by the Choir of the church, with Mrs. Olin Slaughter at the piano. The numbers used were "Going Down the Valley", "Does Jesus Care?", and "Sweet Peace, the Gift of God's Love."

Pallbearers were Cecil Davis, Olin Slaughter, Cecil Harrison, Harrison Link, Wesley Harrison, and Carlyle Harrison. Burial was at Burris Cemetery.



Wilhereas. The party of the second part has heretofore entered into contract with the Washington Irrigation Company for

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Telhereas, I condition of said contract is that the amount of water to be furnished for said lands shall not exceed one cubic foot of water per second for each 160 acres; and

Whereas, The party of the second part desires to obtain the benefits of the storage connected with the Sunnyside project, the benefits of the better distribution of the water supply through the urrigation season, the benefits derived from the enlargement and improvement of the present Sunnyside irrigation system, an increased water supply over the existing contract allowance, an eventual reduction of maintenance charges when the improved system is completed or within a period not exceeding five years, and the better security of operation and facilities afforded for draining wet lands through the construction of wasteways:

Now, Therefore, The parties hereto have mutually covenanted and agreed, and by these presents do covenant and agree with each other as follows:

1. That in consideration of the premises the party of the second part hereby agrees to pay to the Special Fiscal Agent of the Reclamation Service assigned to the Sunnyside project, or such other officer of the United States as may be duly authorized to receive the same, the sum of \$10.00 per acre for the benefits to be derived from said project of the United St. tes, the water for the said lands to be furnished in such amount and distributed through the irrigation season as in the case of other like lands in such project which are subject to the provisions of the Reclamation Act, in full consideration for the water to the use of which the party of the second part is entitled in pursuance of his said contract with the Washington Irrigation Company or its predecessors in interest. The party of the second part further agrees to pay to the Special Fiscal Agent or other proper officer, such annual maintenance charges as may be levied by the Secretary of the Interior under the provisions of the Reclamation Act against other like lands in the said project.

2. The party of the second part further agrees to pay the said sum of \$10.00 per acre in Sime annual installments, the first of which shall become due and payable within 60 days from the date of this agreement, and subsequent payments shall become due and payable on or before the first of December of each year after the present year until fully paid.

3. The party of the second part further agrees to pay within 10 days from the date of this agreement the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per acre as maintenance charges for the irrigation season of 1907, unless such payment has already been made, and agrees to pay the annual maintenance charges hereafter assessed against like lands in the project, on or before the date when the same shall be due, not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00) per acre.

4. In case of failure to make any of said payments when due, the United States shall be authorised and empowered to refuse to deliver water for any of the lands herein described until such payments have been made in full, with legal interest as provided by the State Law, from the date when the same is due.

5. The party of the second part hereby agrees within 30 days from the date hereof to subscribe to the stock of the Sunnyside Water Users Association for all the lands hereinbefore described, and in case the party of the second part elects to pay the \$10.00 per acre in more than one installment and the lands held by him under the project exceed in area 160 acres, it is understood and agreed that he will execute an excess holding contract with the Sunnyside Water Users Association in the form heretofore adopted by said association and will agree that the power of sale therein conferred upon the Water Users Association shall be exercised within one year from the date of this contract, unless the party of the second part shall have sold the excess over 160 acres to some person or persons qualified to perfect a water right under the provisions of the Reelamation Act.

6. It is further understood and agreed that the power of sale conferred by the said excess holding contract shall remain in full force and effect until such excess lands shall be held by parties duly qualified in tracts not exceeding 40 acres or 80 acres, in accordance with the classification of lands shown upon the map on file in the office of the project engineer at North Yakima, Washington, said map having shown thereon the areas within which individual holdings shall be limited to 40 acres and 80 acres, respectively, when the lands are subdivided as excess holdings, or are entered under the public land laws. The said excess holding contract shall be modified in accordance with these provisions.

7. It is understood and agreed that this contract shall serve the purposes of the water right application provided for in Section 6 of the stock subscription and contract of the Sunnyside Water Users Association, and the party of the second part is hereby expressly relieved of the necessity of making such water right application.

relieved of the necessity of making such water right application. S. The amount of water to be furnished hereunder shall be three acre-feet of water per annum per acre measured at the land, or as much water as will be required to successfully irrigate the land, the annum so required to be determined by the authorized agent of the United States, and the water shall be used only to irrigate said lands and for domestic purposes incident thereto; Prozided, that the annum of water furnished shall be limited to the amount beneficially used upon such lands.

9. It is further understood and agreed that the party of the second part will conform to the rules and regulations concerning the distribution and measurement of water and the construction, operation, and maintenance of laterals now or hereafter adopted for the project.

10. It is further expressly understood that the United States shall not be responsible for the failure to supply water under this contract, caused by insufficient supply of water in the Yakima river, due to hostile diversion or unusual drought, nor for damage caused by floods, acts of hostility or unavoidable accidents.

11. It is further expressly understood that no Member of or Delegate to Congress, officer, agent, or employee of the Government is or shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract, or to any benefit which may arise therefrom, and the provisions of Sections 3739, 3740, 3741, and 3742, of the Revised Statutes of the United States, relating to contracts, enter into and form a part of this agreement, so far as the same may be applicable.

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



Her children arise up and call her blessed. Her husband also and he praiseth her. Give her of the fruit of her hands and let her own works praise her in the gates."

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon, November 19, from the Christian Church in Bethany, conducted by the pastor. Burial was made near Bethany.

## Longtime engineer Harrison retired at 86

#### By Charlotte Miller

Most folks look at 65 as being an ideal time to retire.

But not Isaac Fletcher Harrison. H e c e l e – brated his 90th birthday this month, and has only been retired 4 years.

Mr. Harrison was chief engineer on the "V u l can project" f o r Birmingham....and thereby hangs a tale.

He was born in 1882 in Missouri, g r a d u ated from the University of Missouri w i t h a BS degree in mechanical engineering in 1904.

He worked a s an apprentice in the Union Pacific shop a t Armstrong for 2 years, then worked in an engineering office in Kansas City.

He came to Birmingham to work for the firm of Ford, Bacon, and Davis from 1907 til 1908.

Then he founded a partnership a n d did small contracting jobs under the firm name of Harrison and Houston until 1913.

He went to Mobile in '13 and in 1914 again went to Kansas City, returning to Bessemer the same year to work on the Bessemer Realty Building.

(Last year the inside of the Van Antwerp build ing he engineered i n Mobile was redone, but the outside of the building, although built in 1913, was

From 1917 until 1934 he was with Bessemer Clay Works.

In 1936 he was named as chief engineer f o r moving Vulcan to it's present location atop Red Mountain.

Mr. Harrison h adfirst seen Vulcan in St. Louis in 1904 at the World's Fair.

About 1915 he saw it at the S t a t e Fairgrounds standing with a p o l e to hold the left arm in place.

In 1936 he began working on a pedestal f o r Vulcan, and was asked to supply the necessary equipment for the dismantling of the figure so it could be moved to Vulcan park.

A serious accident almost r e s u l t e dand Mr. Harrison was asked to t a k e direct charge of the moving. Using a WPA crew, and a crew of Union riggers the figure w a s erected on the p e d e s t a l using the scaffolding and rigging already in place.

Everything e x c e p t a small amount of stone wor k and some painting was done whil e Mr. Harrison was in charge. He was sent to work on the water w o r k s water treating plant f o r Tarrant city in 1937.

In 1949 Mr. Harrison, then past the age most men retire, came to St. Bernard. He w a s chief engineer when the library and n e w church building were erected. And he reretired in 1968 at the age of 86.

While working on the church he designed and built a derrick to lift the stones into place f o r the church and designed and built a hydraulic press to shape the heavy beams in the church into arches.

The pottery wheel used in the ceramic s h op was also designed and built by

Mr. Harrisonis the father of seven living children (one died in infancy). T h e y are: Thomas, a s a l e s engineer i n Birmingham; William, who owns a heavy machinery and supply business in Houston, Texas; Margaret, a social worker with the state of Georgia; Jane Frances, a Benedictine nun who i spresident of a hospital a t Council Bluffs Iowa; Isaac Fletcher, b e t t e r known as Father Timothy at St. Bernard College; Edward, who is with the S & H Stamp Company in North Carolina; and Sister Eleanor, who is Dean of Cullman College.

Their mother was the l a t e Margaret McQue Harrison.

Today he leads a quiet life with his second wife, the former Kathleen Quinn Thompson.

T o look at him, one would never guess his age to be 90. For he walks with the gait of a man much younger, and even his hearing is sound.

In f a c t some folks wonder if he h a s really



retired. H e is presently engaged in building a leafraking machine he designed for the use of St. Bernard College.

H is family has already made plans for his 100th birthday.

which would remain beyond his lifetime.

He attended, and graduated from, the University of Missouri and became an engineer. He and a friend visited the 1904 Exposition at St. Louis. Perhaps it was more than coincidence that one of the exhibits which interested them was Vulcan, displayed by the city of Bir-mingham' although Harrison was not aware then that he would become well known because of it.

His first job after college was with the Missouri Pacific railroad in Kansas City. He did not remain there long, but once remarked that diesels and other "modern" trains which were not on the tracks until many years later were on the designing boards and in models at the time so were nothing new to him when they came into daily use.

It was in Kansas City that he met his first wife, Margaret McCue, while he boarded with her grandmother who had several young engineers in her home. They were married in Birmingham where Harrison and George Houston had a partnership in the construction business. The partners built several schools in the Birmingham area and also worked a short while in Mobile.

When the partnership was dissolved, Harrison became associated with the Vulcan Tile and Brick Industry, later known as National Fire Proofing and was plant manager in the early 30's. By this time he had seven children and since the company was prone to pay in stock, his wife persuaded him to leave that work since they "couldn't eat stock."

He worked for the government and held various other positions until he was approached to do the pedestal for Vulcan monument, which was only one of many major engineering, for pershawa ation of Sue Lawless, who bis concept is the happy uo sau

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SISTER JANE FRANCES HARRISON osb January 23, 1919-September 6, 1984

...Blest are the single hearted for they shall see God...(Mt 5, 8)

Isaac Fletcher Harrison and Margaret Mary McCue were blessed with a loving and devoted family. Seven children survived to adulthood and one baby girl having died a few hours after her birth.

On January 23, 1919 in Birmingham, Alabama, their fourth child, Jane Frances was born. There were two older brothers and an older sister. Later two more brothers and a sister completed the family. William, Fr. Timothy, O.S.B. and Sr. Margaret, O.S.B. preceded Jane Frances in death. Thomas Jay, Joseph Edward and Sr. Eleanor survive and helped gladden Jane's last summer with visits and short sightseeing trips. Her nephew, Dr. Tom Harrison of Sikeston, Missouri, with his family spent a day with her and Dr. Tom returned on Sept. 4 to spend several hours visiting. Another nephew, Paul Harrison was with her the evening she died from 7 to 7:15.

Jane Frances was educated by Benedictines from kindergarten through high school at St. Paul's in Birmingham. There she received a scholarship to Mt. St. Scholastica College, Atchison, Kansas, which she attended for one year. The following year she took a course on the Burrough's calculator and worked in Birmingham for over a year. Next she accepted a position in Washington, DC, in a department which was a forerunner of the CIA. After a year and a half, her desire to become a religious prompted her to resign this position in July, 1942. While making her final arrangements to enter the Benedictines of Perpetual Adoration at Clyde, she visted her family in Birmingham and her brother Ed, who was in the army. Jane Frances felt that through a life of prayer she could bring herself and others closer to God. Her entrance date was October 10, 1942.

On August 26, 1944, she pronounced her first vows, receiving the name, Sr. Mary Praxedes. Her profession companions ere: Sr. M. Consilia Judge, Sr. Lucille M. Beyer and Sr. Gaudentia Sommer. She was stationed at our monasteries in Tucson, AZ, and Mundelein, IL, before making her final profession at Clyde, September 17, 1949.

In 1951 she was afflicted with an illness that required hosptalization for twenty three years. During the latter part of this period, she was able to be employed at the hospital as a nurses aide, and also visited her family. With several other Sisters she returned to her baptismal name, Jane Frances on Holy Saturday, 1974. In December of that year she returned to Clyde to resume monastic life. She helped in the infirmary and reception room until 1977 when she came to St. Louis, These were happy years for her. In St. Louis she worked at the Health Care Center, where she received the nickname "Hummingbird" as she cheerfully hummed while she worked. She enjoyed her friends and loved to travel, appreciated art and classical music. One of her ambitions was to visit as many churches as possible and for this she was teased about "Church-hopping". She had a great devotion to Mary and prayed the rosary by herself or with others.

The last year and half, Sister suffered with cancer; as the disease progressed she seemed to become stronger in her zest for life. It was not until about a month before her death that she was confined to bed. She was able to participate in community activities, almost to the end of her life. About 9 p.m. Thursday, September 6th, she breathed her last very peacefully. She had made two requests, both of which were honored: that she not be taken to the hospital and that her remains be cremated.

The community in St. Louis had a Vigil service on Sunday evening, September 9th, and the Memorial Mass on Monday, the 10th. In addition to the Sisters and local friends, the following family members were present: Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Jay Harrison from Birmingham, AL., and their son Tom from Sikeston, MO., Joseph Edward Harrison from Jacksonville, FL, and Sr. Eleanor Harrison OSB, from Montgomery, AL. The latter was accompanied by two other sisers from her community (Cullman): Sr. Adelaide and Sr. Ruth. Msgr. William James, from St. Jude's City, Montgomery, and a friend of the family, concelebrated with our chaplain, Fr. William Doyle, S.J. In his homily, Fr. Doyle quoted John Dunne's words "No man is an island unto himself ..." and "thus when someone is lost to us, we all suffer. Today we feel somewhat diminished." He went on to relate the present experience to Sr. Jane Frances' vow day when she joyfully died to material possesions, to the joy of a husband and children, to personal independence. "She was ready for whatever Christ asked..and He did ask; He asked her to suffer...He had asked her to drink deeply of the chalice and it was through the Cross that she found this suffering not only palatable but even sweet."

We her Sisters in community, marveled at Jane Frances' positive outlook on life and will continue to miss her cheery presence in community.

On Tuesday Septmeber 11th, Sisters Joy Ann Wege and Deanna Maria Pavone drove to Clyde with the cremains, where they were interred the following day at Mt. Calvary cemetery.

Joe Harrison was born the 6<sup>th</sup> of 7 children in Birmingham, AL in a devout Catholic family. He was either fortunate or unfortunate to be born into a family of scholars depending of your outlook. He was a marginal student at best, but his calling was not to be a scholar. His mother having so many children that were gifted students, was concerned about his ability to make a living. She echoed her concern, not for lack of love, but because of the benchmark his siblings had set. He took this as a challenge his entire life to prove that his mother's fears were unfounded for she had underestimated her son Joseph Edward and the spirit he had within him.

Joe Harrison was a depression era child and this would forever impact his nature. He learned to scrimp and save, and never relented from his saving methods even later in life when he had more means.

Joe Harrison was called to serve his country in WWII. It was during his Air Force training at Westover field in Massachusetts that he was fortunate enough to meet Marie Nadeau and the rest of her French Canadian family. They would correspond frequently throughout his combat tour in Europe. It was through this correspondence that they commenced their relationship that would last for the next 60 years. They celebrated their 56<sup>th</sup> anniversary in November.

He served in the 15<sup>th</sup> Army Air Corp based out of Italy and flew 13 combat missions. He was shot down on the 5<sup>th</sup> mission, and with the help of friendly Yugoslavian partisans and a Russian transport he was able to get back to Italy to his unit. He went from 165 lbs to 135 lbs. during this period - you see the people in Yugoslavia were starving, but offered what little they had. He would return twice later to Yugoslavia to visit Medjorgje and to try and find the people who aided him. On his return he flew more missions and was shot down once again over northern Italy. God had a plan for this man for unbeknownst to him in his effort to get back to friendly lines he walked straight through a mine field into the British lines. The British Infantry told him only after making it to their camp. Having been shot down twice this got him past the 50 mission requirement so he made his way back to the States.

About his war experience, he said, "he would not wish the experience on anyone, but he would not trade it for the world." This prepared him for everything thereafter for no other experience was truly a life or death situation as this war experience was.

He also indicated that on the descent of his second parachute jump that if he made it back alive he was going to marry Marie Nadeau .... If she would have him. They got married immediately following the war as most did back then. He often stated that the best thing he ever did was marry Marie. They had a common Catholic faith and both wanted more than anything to have a big family - mission accomplished. He based his upbringing on firm discipline that he received from his family and military training. He lived his life with fairly simple code of conduct based on the tenets of his Catholic faith, and had very little tolerance for anyone who waivered from these tenets, especially his children. He made good on ALL disciplinary measures with his family.

As hard as he could be at times, he also had an extremely soft, affectionate side. He would never hesitate to come up and give his family a hug, or to tell each and everyone of his family members that he loved them. He always had a "Nickel's worth of free advice", and it was usually heartfelt and sincere, and always perfectly frank. His advice was always sound, and much to the chagrin of his children, usually right. He had a series of adages for every situation that you could encounter and all the adages are permanently ingrained in his children's minds because he used them so often.

He worked extremely hard to provide food, shelter, clothing and values to his family. His frugal ways learned during the Depression were put to good use during this time. He also valued providing a Catholic and higher education to all of his children. With 9 children to provide for, he was fortunate to have married a woman that was so adept at managing the home and taking care of children for these were not his strong suites. His strong suit was his ability to communicate with his children and his work colleagues. He never new a stranger, and used his ability to communicate and to sell S&H Green Stamps for 37 years. His 37 years took him from Massachusetts to Connecticut, to North Carolina and to Florida where he retired at the ripe age of 62.

Joe had unwavering faith in himself and with his Lord which helped keep the family going. He loved his wife and family unconditionally. He was a proud man, but he was never to proud to ask for assistance from family and friends. We would be remiss if we did not mention the help of Memere and Pepere

Nadeau, Auntie Jean and Uncle Herve early in their marriage, Pop Drolet's family in Connecticut, Doctor Bill Robie for his countless visits to the house in the middle of the night, Helen and Bob Steigerwald for providing shelter for wayward sons, the staff at Windsor Point Retirement Community, and a litany of other family and friends.

Christmas was also a special time in the Harrison house, an almost surreal time. It was, first and foremost, a religious celebration of the Christ Child's birth. This also was the one time of year that Joe and Marie would provide clothes & toys to the children which would hopefully last until the next year and would always be handed down. As with all things in the Harrison house their was an order, even to Christmas. You first went to church in the morning, came home and ate breakfast, cleaned the entire kitchen, and only then did we open presents, one at a time from youngest to oldest

In the last years of his life he offered up one last lesson - a lesson of humility. The Good Lord asks you to come before him humbly, and in his last few years, he gradually lost his ability to walk, take care of his personal hygiene, feed himself, and finally in the last week he lost his greatest gift, the ability to communicate. Through this his 6 year ordeal, he never complained, and often stated, "That there was no sense in complaining because no one was going to listen". We his children our comforted by the passage in Mathew 23, "The greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest. Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, but whoever humbles himself shall be exalted."

As a tribute to him, everyone should have some toast with Raspberry preserves, and after eating the toast, for good measure, never mind the toast just take a spoonful right out of the Raspberry preserves jar and taste that goodness.

Joe Harrison you had only one goal in life and that was to make it to heaven. You realized that on the day of reckoning each person had to give an accounting of themselves. You also realized that you, like all of us, are flawed characters, and without the grace of the Almighty, and the dying and rising of his son Jesus Christ to forgive our sins, none of us could fit through the narrow door.

God bless you and grant you your forgiveness.

FUQUAY-VARINA — Joseph Edward Harrison, 77, passed away on Friday, February 1, 2002.

Pepere, you taught us that the only goal important in life is to make it to heaven, everything else was secondary. You taught us the importance of prayer and that all the graces that were bestowed on you and our family were because of the time you and Mom spent on your knees in prayer asking the Lord for help and guidance.

"You wore your emotions on your sleeve. Happiness, anger, frustration, dismay, disgust and pity flashed across your face, but no one ever remembers seeing fear. ..but today there is nothing but peace."

You served your country well during WWII, having been awarded the Air Medal and ETO Ribbon with five battle stars. You had the gift with good oldfashioned "common sense" and an innate ability to assess people, and the best assessment you ever made in your life was marrying Mom, which you would not hesitate to tell anyone. The two of you complemented each other, you brought the unwavering self confidence, optimism, and faith that the Good Lord always provides a way. Mom brought the homemaking and children rearing skills. You won over not only Mom, but her parents as well, Monsieur and Madam Nadeau, with your southern hospitality (you weren't even a Frenchman). You never knew a stranger and you used your "gift of gab" to the fullest to sell S&H Green Stamps for 37 years.

Joseph E. Harrison, you've lived a wonderful life and you have earned eternal rest. Your wife and your family will miss you—not one day will go by without us thinking about you. We thank you, Lord, for providing a wonderful husband, father and friend.



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
