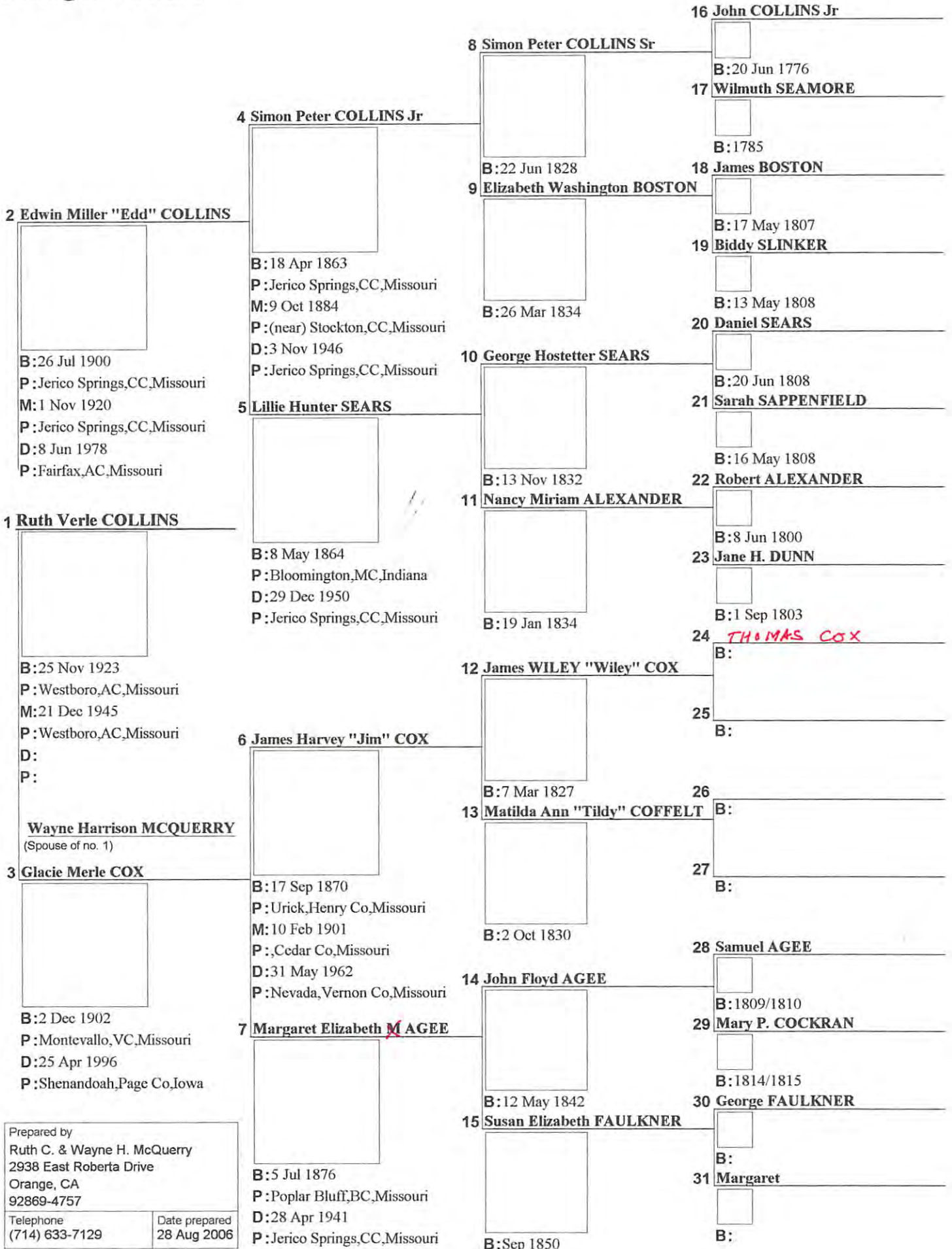

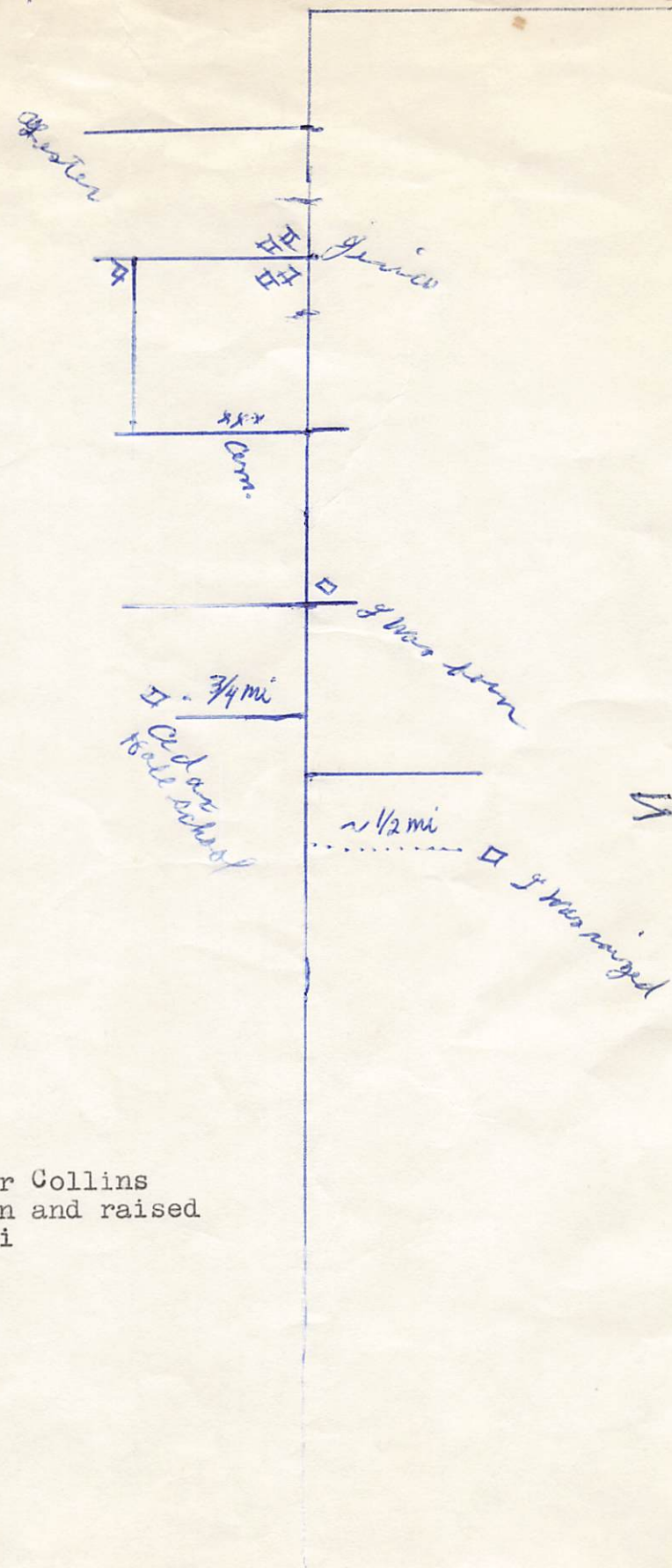

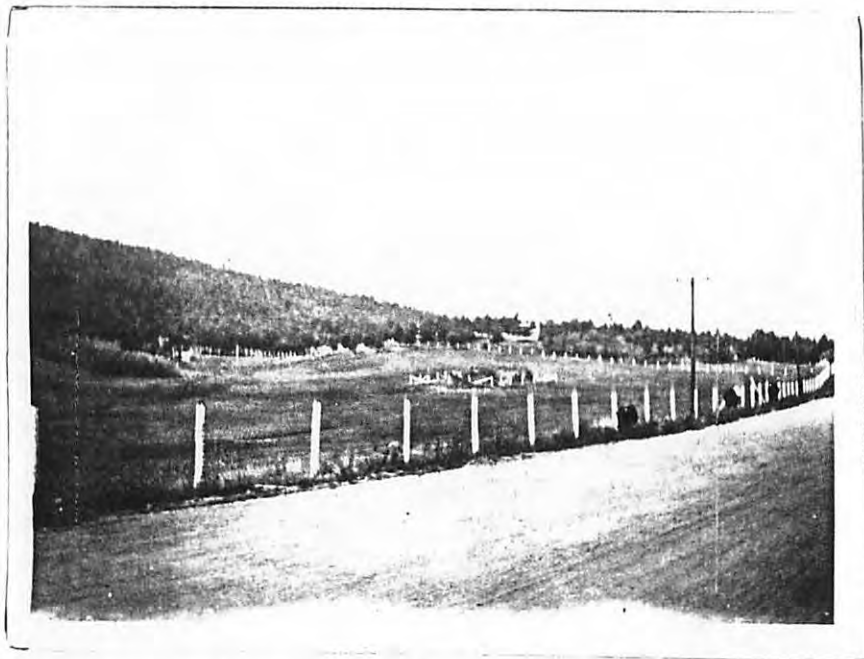

We are making every effort to speed up measurement service for the 1969 program year and we hope that a better understanding of the photocopies by the producer will help us to be of better service to you.

We will be using those photocopies for the next six to eight years, so take good care of them and keep them with your other valuable papers.

Dear Farm Operator:

Atchison County is one of the counties selected to use a new method of obtaining Feed Grain and Wheat acreages. In the past, a reporter has visited participating farms and measured these acreages.

Under this new method, operators on participating farms will file a report of acreages.

We are enclosing an aerial photo-copy of the area in which your farm is located. On this photo-copy we have entered boundary lines, farm number, a number for each field, and acreages for fields previously determined by field inspection or which could be identified and determined in the county office. Field acreages shown will be considered correct for current year unless the field boundary differs from the boundary lines shown.

KEEP THIS RECORD for use in planting and identifying areas. Later, we will ask you (if you participate in either Wheat or Feed Grain Program) to bring it to the county office to report and certify to crop and diverted acreage on your farm. Additional detailed information with respect to reporting acreages will be furnished at a later date. However, we want to call your attention to the following items now:

1. A reporter WILL NOT visit your farm to measure acreages as in the past. (You will report the acreages instead.)
2. However, after acreage reports are obtained, acreages will be measured on about 25% of farms, selected on a random basis.
3. If the measured crop acreage exceeds the applicable permitted acreage, or if the diverted acreage is less than the intended diverted acreage, no payment can be made and there will be no further opportunity to adjust acreages.

We will give you all the help we possibly can in making sure that your acreages are correct. We will measure any acreages you are not sure about, either before or after planting, upon your request and payment of the cost. We will also assist you in the county office in determining crop acreages.

If you have any further questions on this matter, we will be glad to discuss them with you the next time you are in our office.

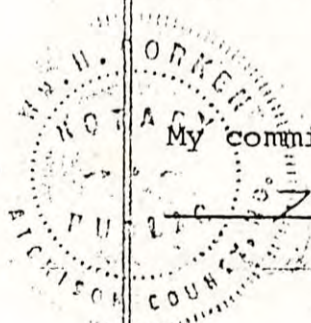

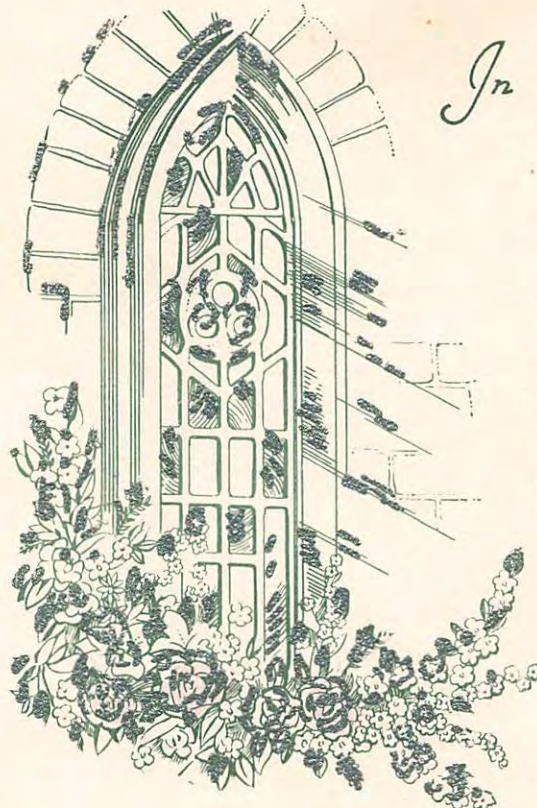

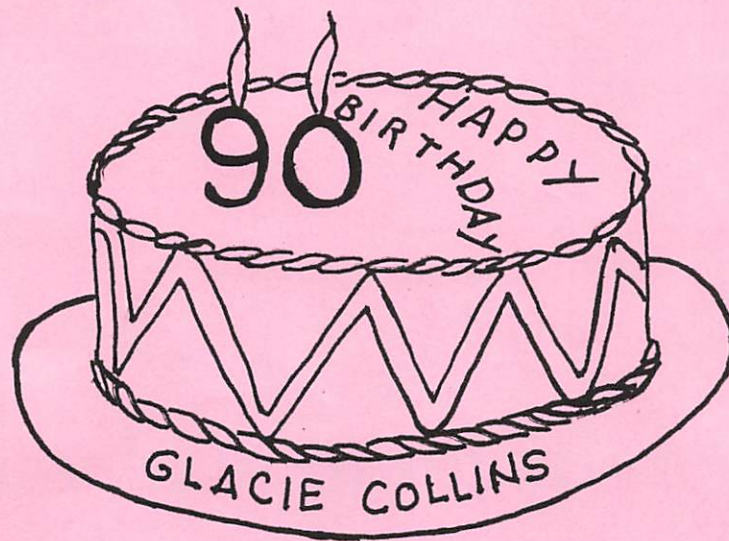

Following their marriage, Glacie and Edd resided for brief periods in Wyoming and California, but then lived in southwest Iowa and northwest Missouri for the rest of their lives. They became residents of Atchison County in 1932. Glacie became a resident at Garden View Care Center in Shenandoah in 1990 following medical problems which included both hips broken and open heart surgery.

Glacie was a member of the United Methodist Church in Westboro for over 55 years. Prior to entering the care center, she served the church energetically and with great devotion. This service stemmed, in part at least, from a promise she made to our Lord and Savior while bedfast with a near fatal case of pneumonia fever. She promised that if he allowed her to survive to raise her two children, she would be His diligent and faithful servant for the rest of her life. She served the church in many ca-

pacities including: the Pastor-Parish Relations' Committee; delegate to Annual Conference; a member of the United Methodist Women (UMW) of which she was president for eight years; and was representative to the School of Missions. She also taught Sunday School for 35 years. Glacie was honored in 1954 with a life membership in the Women's Society of Christian Service (WSCS), predecessor of the UMW.

Glacie was also an active member of the Eureka Social Club, the North Starlette Extension Club, the Tarkio Garden Club, and the Westboro L.D. Book Club. She had many interests and hobbies including: gardening, flowers (both raising them and making beautiful arrangements), sewing, knitting, crocheting, needlepoint, oil painting, leather tooling, and cooking. She made most of her clothing until she entered the care center. She knitted and/or crocheted many items for family and friends, and even after she entered the care center, crocheted doilies for sale at the annual Lord's Acre Day at the United Methodist Church in Westboro. Family and friends were blessed with oil paintings - each depicting a place, or event, special to the recipient.

Survivors include: one son, Everett Wayne Collins, and daughter-in-law, Vera, of Fremont, California; one daughter, Ruth Verle McQuerry, and son-in-law, Wayne, of Orange, California; seven grandchildren, Wayne, James and Richard Collins, Thomas, Samuel and Bruce McQuerry, and Patricia Usary; 12 great-grandchildren; and two great-great-grandsons. She is also survived by three brothers-in-law, three sisters-in-law, and numerous nieces and nephews.

Glacie was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, five sisters, and one brother. Memorials may be directed to the United Methodist Church in Westboro.
