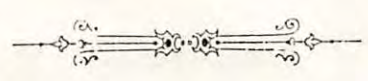

MARY JANE (BOSTON) TAYLOR

In November 1995, Barbara Jordan, then living at 7617 S. New Jersey Street, Indianapolis, IN sent me photocopies of some letters written by members of the Boston Family in Missouri to relatives in Kentucky. They were written in 1856 to 1871. The letters were found by another researcher (name unknown) in the Kentucky home of an elderly lady with a Slinker connection. The "other researcher" identified each letter by number, probably in the order he pulled them from the trunk. He sent photocopies to Barbara Jordan who, in turn sent photocopies of some of the letters to me with the stipulation that I never publish them. I prepared the following excerpts, or summaries, of items in these letters pertaining to Mary Jane (Boston) Taylor and husband, Hayden Taylor. Brackets [] indicate my personal notes.

Ruth (Collins) McQuerry

Letter #2. Bowdark (sic) [Bois D'Arc] P.O., Green County, Missouri (sic), April 21, 1857. To Grandfather & Grandmother, [Christopher and Pheba Slinker], Unkles (sic) and Aunts from Mary J. Taylor.

- a. Landed at Fathers [James Boston] 7 April.
- b. All had bad "coalds."
- c. Father "bout a waggon in Sant Louis then we come up Missouri River to Boonville."
[It appears that James Boston returned to KY to escort the Taylors and perhaps others to MO]
- d. Hayden gave \$90.00 for a yoke of oxen the Sunday before we got here on Tuesday.
- e. Snow was 4" deep.
- f. Hayden "ploud 6 day and holed corn one day."
- g. "We haven't got any home yet."
- h. "We can't say we like Missouri (sic) yet."

Letter #3. Green Co. MO, May 25, 1857 from Martha Boston to Aunt Faney Slinker.

- a. Hayden & Mary and all the children got here safe.
- b. Elvira is the "prettes one, can begin to talk, stand alone and push a chair over the floor."

Note added by Mary Taylor;

- a. She is no better satisfied.
- b. Hayden is going to start tomorrow to see if he can find any part he likes better.

Letter # 5. Green Co. MO, Oct. 19, 1857 from James & Bidy Boston to sister Frances M. Slinker.

- a. Hayden and William started to move east Sept 21.

Letter # 6A. Green Co. MO, Dec 27, 1857. Bidy W. Boston to [sister] F. M. Slinker.

- a. Hayden has been here "onst sence I wrote to you."
- b. Him & William "stoped in Paulaska (sic) Co. about one hundred miles east of us."
- c. Hayden has bought land.
- d. They was all well.

Letter # 7. Greene Co. MO. James F. Boston to Aunt F.M. Slinker 8 February 1858

- a. Hayden & William live in "Peulaskey" (sic) Co.
- b. They was all well 3 weeks ago.

Letter # 8. Bowdark (sic), Green Co. MO. May 25, 1858. James & Bidy Boston to sister Frances M. Slinker.

- a. Hayden was here about the 25 March.
- b. His and William's families were all well.
- c. Mary J. has a fine boy named John Frankling (sic).
- d. Mary M. has a fine boy named James Henry. [wife of William]
- e. Hayden lives 100 miles [away]

Letter # 9a. Bowdark (sic), MO, 27 Sept. 1858. James & Bidy Boston to sister Frances M. Slinker.

- a. Hayden was here about the twent_____ of August.

- a. We had a letter from Hayden & William a few weeks ago.
- b. They were all well.

Letter # 13. Green Co. MO, Nov. 5, 1859. Bidy Boston to Sister F. M. Slinker.

- a. In August Hayden's and William's was all well.

Letter # 16. Waynesville. Missouri (sic) Mary & Hayden Taylor to Aunt Frances M. Slinker, Baron Co. KY, Suger (sic) Plant P.O. Sept. _____ 185_____. [Year not legible.]

- a. Hayden has got the third day chills. Took them the first of August
- b. Mary had fever then chills from last Sept. to first of Nov.
- c. Had dry year, crops are bad.
- d. Mary & Hayden had son born Nov. 16 last. He died 14 Feb. Named him Lemyemon (sic) Smith. Had bad hare-lip.
- e. Hives broke out on this child before he was shrouded.

Letter # 18. Greene Co. MO. Aug. 24, 1863. Emily P. Boston to Aunt Frances M. Slinker.

- a. Hayden's was all well.
- b. They have a daughter, Martha (Marthy) Frances.

Letter # 21. Willard, MO. Green Co. MO. Aug 27, 1865 (?) Letter, unsigned, to "Deare Aunte" F. M. Slinker, Shugar (sic) Plant P.O., Metcalfe Co. KY [formerly in "Baron" Co.]

- a. Father received a leter (sic) from Hayden two weeks ago.
- b. Mary Jane wants to "no" (sic) when we "herde" (sic) from you.

Letter # 23. Greene Co. MO. July 3, 1868. B. W. Boston to "Deare sister" Faney Slinker.

- a. We got a letter from Mary Jane today.
- b. They was all well.

Letter # 27. Mr. Christopher Slenker (sic), Knob Lick, KY from Mary J. Taylor, Wainsville (sic) P.O. Polaski (sic) Co. Missouri (sic). Oct. 8, 1871.

- a. Letter to Grandfather [indicating to me Grandmother not alive]
- b. Wrote that Mother [Bidy Boston] had been sick and died 9 September, 10 days before Mary Jane got there.
- c. It had been 14 years since Mary Jane had seen Bidy.
- d. Mary Jane has 3 girls and 8 boys "liven" (sic) and 1 dead.
- e. Went to Cedar County to see Elizabeth [sister] and James [brother.]

Minor and Maud Hickman were married Sept. 22 1921.

In 1925, he went to Russell, [error, should be Rozel] Ks. as a full time pastor. He served five other charges before coming to Lewis in October of 1941. While at Lewis on March 5, 1944, Maud Hickman passed away after a very short illness.

From Lewis, Rev. Hickman served churches at Deerfield, Satanta and Cimmaron before Minor's retirement in 1954.

Rev. Hickman married Osa Reed of Kinsley after Maud's death.

I remember this because it was in the Depression, and while I had no idea what a million dollars was, I knew, from the way Dad told the story that it must have been a lot of walnut.

ELIZABETH WASHINGTON (BOSTON) COLLINS

Albemarle County, Virginia, was the ancestral home of Elizabeth Washington Boston, my great grandmother. This county lies in the highlands east of the Blue Ridge Mountains, about mid-way between the north and south borders of Virginia. The highlands rise sharply from the western Piedmont. Rivers tumbling out of the heavily wooded Blue Ridge Mountains carved deep ravines as they rushed through the highlands. Nuts, berries, and game were plentiful. Elizabeth's grandfather, James Boston Sr., born in 1775 (the year the Revolutionary War began), was probably born in this county. At age 24, he married Nancy Hill on 25 August 1799 in Albemarle County. Their first four children, including Elizabeth's father, James Boston Jr. (born 17 May 1807), were born there. James Sr. served as a soldier from Albemarle County during the War of 1812.

Shortly after the end of the War of 1812, circa 1815-16, James Sr., Nancy, and their four sons -- Reuben, Abner, James Jr. and William, joined other hardy pioneer families in the migration to, and settlement of, Green County, Kentucky. Three more sons John, Richard, and Benjamin were born to James Sr. and Nancy in this primitive land of opportunity that Daniel Boone explored and opened for settlement.

Green County is one of several counties in the center of the state, lying south of Green River, still referred to as "the garden of Kentucky"[51]. The soil, which is red clay and limestone, is rich and productive. The growing season is long with lots of sunshine and plentiful rain. The terrain in Green County is generally rolling, or hilly, with flat land interspersed throughout along rivers and creeks. At the time the Boston family moved there, much of the land was covered with large, original growth trees and brush. Wild game was abundant.

The Bostons were farmers. Tobacco was their chief cash crop. They grew corn, hay, and small grain to feed their livestock. They raised horses, mules, cattle, and hogs for home use, as well as for sale or trading. Farmers were, for the most part, self-sufficient. They grew animals for meat and hunted wild game such as deer (venison), turkeys, rabbits, and squirrels. Fish were abundant in rivers and creeks. They had milk, cream, and butter from their cows. Other food included wild berries, fruit, nuts, and garden grown vegetables such as cabbage, potatoes, and turnips. Numerous gurgling springs supplied all the fresh water needed.

Timber was readily available to make log cabins, furniture, and household items, such as wooden trenchers (platters) and bowls. Churns, piggins (a small wooden pail with one stave extended above the rim for a handle), pails, and washtubs were also made from the local timber. Tinkers traveled the countryside peddling such items as pewter basins, bowls, dishes, plates, spoons, cups, pitchers, and mugs. Tin wares, including basins and cups, were available from a tinsmith. Spoons were made of wood, iron or pewter. Tables were made of wood boards resting on crossed wooden legs. Wood stools and benches preceded home made chairs [52].

Cards for carding wool and cotton; wheels for spinning thread, and looms for weaving cloth were standard equipment in the homes. Dress was plain and serviceable. The men dressed for summer in flax, tow linen, or striped cotton for breeches, coat and waistcoat. For winter they exchanged cotton for woolen jeans or linsey-woolsey made in the home. Some wore buckskin hunting shirts. The pioneer made shoes for the family. First he tanned the leather; then he cut, fashioned and sewed it into shoes. Fur hats were used by most men in winter. Straw ones were more common in summer. Women and girls wore homespun cotton of various colors, striped or checked. Underwear was usually made of linen that was spun, woven, and sewn at home. Sunbonnets were a standard part of the female wardrobe [52].

Farming was "labor intensive"—mostly hand work in those days. The land was first cleared of trees and brush, using crude tools and brute strength. Stumps were dug or pulled out by horses, mules or oxen. Crude plows pulled by a yoke of oxen or a team of horses or mules, and guided by the farmer walking behind, were used to till the soil so crops could be planted. These plows probably were made of cast iron with wooden handles. Cast iron plows, patented in 1797, slowly replaced metal sheathed wooden plows, despite fears of some that iron would poison the soil. Corn probably was planted by digging a small hole with a sharpened stick, dropping the grains in the hole, kicking dirt in the hole, and then stepping on it to firm the soil. This method of planting was called "holing" corn.

James Jr. grew to manhood in Green County. He learned the art of farming from his father. Mother nature's mating instinct developed as he matured to adulthood. James Boston, Jr. and Bidy (sic) Slinker, daughter of Christopher and Pheba Slinker, married 29 December 1826 in Green County, Kentucky [50]. A few years later, they were listed on the Hart County tax records of 1833 [1]. Whether they actually moved is open to question.. County boundaries changed, so they may not have moved at all. The following year, on 26 March 1834, a baby girl named Elizabeth Washington Boston, my great grandmother, was born. She joined two older brothers, Reubin and William, and older sister Mary Jane. Elizabeth had six younger siblings -- brothers Thomas, James Franklin, and George; sisters Martha, Emily, and Sarah.

Elizabeth grew to womanhood in the family home. She learned the duties and pleasures of being a mother and homemaker from her mother. By age twenty Elizabeth was ready to set up housekeeping and start having babies of her own with a young man from a neighboring farm, Simon Peter Collins. For reasons unknown, Elizabeth's parents didn't approve. So, Elizabeth and Simon Peter planned to elope. On the planned night of elopement, Simon came over with a long ladder for Elizabeth to quietly slip down from her upstairs bedroom. Simon stumbled in the darkness while putting the ladder up to the window. Her father came charging out of the house, shotgun in hand, to see what the ruckus was about. He was enraged when his eyes adapted to the darkness and saw what was going on! Undaunted by the gun, and colorful language of his intended father-

in-law, Simon proceeded to help Elizabeth down the ladder. After realizing that he faced a very determined young man and a stubborn daughter, Mr. Boston grudgingly relented. He told the love-struck couple that if there was to be a wedding, it had to be "done right." The young couple married in the bride's parents home on 23 November 1854 [5].

Elizabeth and Simon's first child, a son, named Youel, was born 8 April 1856.

A month or so later the family, along with Elizabeth's parents and siblings, began a long trek to southwest Missouri. They endured many hardships in their travels to new, unfamiliar land. Trails were treacherous. There were few bridges. Ferries crossed larger rivers including the mighty Mississippi into Missouri near St. Louis. Once in Missouri, they follow the Missouri River west to Boonville, then headed southwest across country, fording small streams and rivers, dodging trees, shrubs, and boulders.

The Bostons settled first in Greene County, near the hamlet of Bois D'Arc (Bowdark), a few miles northwest of Springfield. This farming region is located in the "Springfield Plain" area. The soil is red limestone clay, moderately flinty. It was well adapted to such crops grown by the early settlers as wheat, oats, corn, molasses cane, and some cotton. Fruits grown included watermelon and "mushmelons" (sic). Vegetables included cabbage, potatoes and, "beans" (sic) [56].

Simon and Elizabeth settled in Cedar County, near the village of Jerico Springs, some thirty five miles northwest of Bois D'Arc [6]. Cedar County is located in one of the low plateaus of the northwest Ozarks known as the "Springfield Plain." The terrain is hilly, with some flat areas suitable for crops. The soil is similar to that in Greene County, but slightly different. The soil is reddish, sandy, and in some areas, quite rocky. The area was laced with spring fed streams.

Timber was abundant when Simon and Elizabeth settled in Cedar County. Forest of oak, hickory and pine was alive with white tailed deer, fish, birds, and wildflowers. Other original growth trees included maple, black walnut, poplar, cedar, elm, sycamore, and cottonwood. River birches and beech trees grew in the cool valleys [6]. Fruit trees included apple, peach, wild persimmon, paw-paw (Missouri banana) and wild plum. An abundant supply of wild blackberries grew in the pastures; gooseberries grew along creek banks. The Collins' planted corn and wheat. Hay was grown and harvested to feed the animals. Most of the homes were log cabins built using native trees.

The early settlers obtained much of their food, and some skins for clothing or sale, from the land. Most of the larger streams contained fish. Wild animals included deer, rabbit, fox, opossum, squirrel, muskrat, civet cats, skunks, otters, and mink. Wild fowl included turkey, and quail. Natural springs were plentiful for human use as well as for domestic animals such as hogs, cattle, horses, chickens, and geese.

The following year, on 1 August 1857, Simon and Elizabeth purchased land from Samuel Brown near their first place of residence [7]. George Dixon, their second son, was born in March 1858 [9, 10, 12, 47]. Elizabeth kept busy caring for her little family and doing other tasks demanded of a pioneer farm wife.

Personal letters [56, 57, 58, 59, 60] tell of the hard times that plagued the families during the late 1850s. Part of these difficulties was undoubtedly due to the depression that gripped the entire country at that time [49, Vol. 4, p 1957]. In addition, the letters tell how drought took its toll [56, 60].

These letters frequently listed prices of various items and seemed to indicate the writer considered these prices high. For example, a letter dated 10 August 1857 [56] shows that corn and wheat were \$1.00 per bushel and that "baken" (sic) was 15 cents per pound [56]. Another letter dated 27 February 1859 states that corn and wheat were 75 cents per bushel, horses were \$75.00 to \$150.00 per head, oxen were \$40.00 to \$75.00 per yoke, and cows were \$15.00 to \$20.00 per head [58]. A letter dated 30 May 1859 states that corn was from \$1.00 to \$1.25 per bushel and flour was \$4.00 per hundred pounds [59]. Most of the letters [56 through 60] noted the writer(s) had plenty to eat and a little to sell. They seemed to indicate that other family members in the area also had ample food. None of the letters noted that any of the family lost their farms due to foreclosure.

Personal tragedies compounded the woes of Simon and Elizabeth during the late 1850s and early 1860s. Elizabeth was pregnant or recovering from child birth much of the time during the years 1857 through 1861. Unfortunately three of the four children born during this period died shortly after birth. These three children of Simon and Elizabeth and their birth and death dates were:

Sadness weighed heavily on the family each time they made the trip to the Cedarville Cemetery in Dade County, Missouri, where they buried their three infants side by side [15]. Dade County is the county adjacent to Cedar County on the south. Cedarville Cemetery, located near the northern boundary of Dade County, was only a few miles from Simon and Elizabeth's farmhouse.

In a letter dated 30 May 1859 [59] the writer(s) wrote the following observation concerning the latest woman's fashion:

*The ladies are hooped from the ankle (sic) to the waist and (on)
some windy days from waist to over the top of their head.*

In 1860, the same year Abraham Lincoln was elected President of the United States, Simon Peter became an itinerant pastor of the Missionary Baptist Church [21]. Elizabeth united with another Baptist

church. Later she changed membership to the Primitive Baptist Church. Elizabeth attended to many of the farm duties while Simon was away preaching.

The slavery issue reached the boiling point following Lincoln's election. Several states seceded from the Union in 1860 and early 1861. The Confederate States of America, a new Southern Union, formed in Montgomery, Alabama, in February, 1861. Jefferson Davis was elected President of the Confederacy; Alexander Stephens, was elected Vice President. Just a couple of months later, on 12 April 1861, Confederates fired on Fort Sumter, South Carolina, marking the beginning of the Civil War [42, p 216]. These actions must have been of great concern to Elizabeth and all of the Collins and Boston families who were southern sympathizers.

Elizabeth's husband, Simon, volunteered in the 10th Missouri Cavalry, Confederate States Army at Red River, Arkansas, on 1 January 1863 [24]. Elizabeth was left at home, pregnant, and with two small boys to care for. She managed the farm in Simon's absence. On 18 April 1863, she gave birth to my grandfather, Simon Peter Collins, Jr.

During the fall of 1863, the pro-union group known as Kansas Jayhawkers (Bushwhackers) were active in eastern Kansas and western Missouri, destroying everything in sight where people favored the Confederacy [61]. They came to the Collins home and told Elizabeth to take her little family and anything else she wanted and leave. She loaded her three small sons and some possessions into a wagon hitched to a team of horses. She then drove about 35 miles southeast to her parents home near Willard, Missouri, in Greene County. (Willard is a few miles northeast of Bois D'Arc.) After the "bushwhackers" looted the home, they took live coals from the fireplace, scattered them throughout the house, and burned it to the ground. Elizabeth made several trips back to see about the family farm during Simon's absence.

General Lee surrendered his Army at the Appomattox Courthouse in Virginia, seventy-five miles west of Richmond, on 9 April 1865. Six weeks and five days later, on 26 May 1865, the unit Simon served with surrendered in New Orleans. They were paroled at Shreveport, Louisiana on 7 June 1865 [24]. Simon then began the long trip home to Elizabeth and their sons.

Elizabeth may have enjoyed the respite from being pregnant and giving birth to babies. That didn't last long after Simon returned home. Their next child was born 13 May 1866. That child, sex unknown, and not named, died 5 June 1866. Again the family made the sad trek to bury one of their babies in the Cedarville Cemetery [23].

Simon and Elizabeth were parents of six more sons and two daughters. They lost both daughters and one son. Three more times, with heavy hearts, they buried their babies [14, 19, 20, 21, 23]. Eight sons lived to their majority. Youel, the eldest, was kicked by a horse and died from those injuries at age 23 years. Four of the sons, George Dixon, Simon Peter Jr., Haden Hope, and John Spurgeon, became farmers and lived locally. Isaac Sidwell became a medical doctor. Russell Franklin and Benoni Lee became teachers. Later Isaac, Russell, and Benoni went into mining in Idaho and in the vicinity of Spokane, Washington.

Simon and Elizabeth bought and sold several parcels of land in Cedar County. Apparently this was for investment purposes. Some fifty land transactions by them are listed in the Cedar County, Missouri, Deed Books [7]. Some of these records document mortgages and/or pay-off of mortgages so, in their later years, they may have been "bankers" for some family members and neighbors. Several transactions were in Elizabeth's name only. Not many women in those days were land owners unless the land had been inherited from her departed husband or from her father.

Elizabeth seemed to have considerable practical business knowledge. She knew how to manage money as well as invest in farm acreage. She preferred outdoor life and was good with cattle. Frequently she rode her horse over the farm checking on the animals. Apparently she was a very poor housekeeper and didn't rank very high in the culinary department. She would much rather be out in the field helping with the farming. She would drive the horses in at noon, throw the reins to each side, tell the boys to take care of the horses, and then "stir-up" something to eat. Reports are that Simon managed to be away from home as much as possible at meal time. Preachers were well fed at parishioners' tables.

Another of her talents was knowing how to care for the sick. Her obituary states: "Aunt Betty was known for her ability and kindness in waiting on the sick and anyone in trouble." Frequently she was summoned to help with a neighbor's illness. She usually mounted her favorite blue roan pacer horse and rode sidesaddle to the destination, regardless of whether it was during the day or the dead of night. Family legend has it that Elizabeth had training in midwifery before she left Kentucky. She served as a midwife and delivered dozens of babies throughout Cedar County. She had lots of experience of her own birthing fifteen children.

Elizabeth had considerable knowledge of herbs, roots, leaves, and plants, according to family recollections and verbal accounts. One of her granddaughters, my Aunt Clara (Collins) Foster, said she was told that Elizabeth would ride her horse for miles to find a certain root or herb she needed for a particular ailment [55]. Some of her descendants attribute this knowledge of herbs and herbal medicine to her alleged Indian heritage. {NOTE: It has not been proven Elizabeth had any Indian heritage. One of her sons is said to have claimed he was 1/16 Indian. All attempts to prove or disprove this hypothesis have been unfruitful.}

ELIZABETH WASHINGTON (BOSTON) COLLINS

For reasons unknown to me, Elizabeth educated only three of her children, three of her younger children. As mentioned above, Isaac became a medical doctor. He graduated from Marion-Sims College of Medicine at St. Louis, Missouri, and began practice at Wagoner, Missouri. Russell and Benoni attended the Normal School at Warrensburg, Missouri. They became teachers and taught in local schools [54]. They were well respected within their communities. She referred to these younger sons as "hers" and the older sons as "Simon's." Why? The mystery still remains.

Elizabeth was not supportive of Simon's ministry according to stories handed down through the family. One grandson stated that she "fought him all the way" and that she never attended any of the services to hear her husband preach [11]. Did she have different theological beliefs? Was she miffed because he spent so much time away from home and the family?

Around the turn of the century, Simon and Elizabeth had separate, full length portraits taken of themselves. She would NOT have her picture taken "with that old man!" Elizabeth appeared to be of medium height and slender; she has a sober, determined expression but definitely not a dour look [27].

Simon passed away Christmas Day, 1906. He was buried beside his children in the Cedarville Cemetery. After Elizabeth became a widow, she sold 160 acres of land to Walter Higgins [7]. She still owned quite a bit of property.

Elizabeth made a holographic will on 22 March 1909. Sons George D. and Simon Jr. were, in effect, disinherited; they were willed \$5.00 each. The remainder was bequeathed to her other five living sons. A. W. Porter (son-in-law of brother James F. Boston), was designated executor of her estate [38]. Probate records show that Elizabeth recanted this will the day before her death and stated that she wanted all her children to share and share alike. The court later upheld her death bed wish.

Illness and old age caught up with Elizabeth; she could no longer care for herself. Son Haden moved her from the farm to his home in Jerico Springs so he and his wife could care for her. She succumbed quietly early on the morning of 24 April 1909, at age seventy-eight years, one month, two days. Funeral services were held at the Methodist church in Jerico Springs [22]. This church was selected because it was larger than the Baptist church where she maintained membership. It could better accommodate the large number of family and friends who wished to celebrate her life. Burial was at Cedarville Cemetery beside her late husband. The epitaph on the gravestone reads:

BOSTON, AMERICA M.






"Mrs. J. F. Boston Dead." America M. Killensworth was born in Green county, Mo., Sept. 20, 1850, was married to J. F. Boston, Aug. 6th, 1865. To this union was born four children, one having died in infancy, the other three are living and were present at her funeral. She died May 20, 1915, aged 64 years 8 months. She was converted in 1865 and joined the Mt. Pleasant Baptist church, was baptized by Eld. Jackson Justice; Came to Cedar county in 1865 and joined the Cedarville church, afterward transferring her membership to Jerico Springs having made a very efficient member until her death. She lived about 50 years on the place where she died. Thus the pioneers are passing. She served well her generation as a neighbor, a christian and friend to those in distress (sic). She will be missed in the church and community, but most of all in the home where she had lived happily since she was a youthful bride. The funeral was conducted by the writer, in the Baptist church at Jerico Springs. Interment in Jerico cemetery. (Jerico Springs Optic, May ??, 1915)

BRAND, SAMUEL S.

Samuel S. Brand was borned in the city of Covington, Ky., September 26, 1845. Died in Jerico Springs, February 22, 1918. Age 72 years, 4 months, and 26 days. Mr. Brand was married to Mariam H. Clark at Carrolton, Mo. July 11, 1876. To this union were born three children, Katherine, Ruany Virginia and Mariam Laurretta. Ruany Virginia died at the age of two years, March 13, 1882. Mariam Laurretta died Jan. 20, 1907. Mariam, his wife, after a long siege of illness, in which she was confined to her bed, passed to the great beyond, March 17, 1913. He united with the Christian Church when a young man and adhered to that faith until death. He leaves a daughter, Miss Katie, who is teaching school at Campbell, Dunklin Co., and who was at his bed side and nursed him through his last sickness, and two sisters, Mrs. Sallie Anderson, of Kansas City, and Mrs. Lettie Longstreet, of Fairview, Okla. S. S. Brand, or "Sam Brand" as he was better known, was an old land mark, having settled here in the early days of the town and has been identified with the progress and adversities; its joys and sorrows and took a public interest in everything that came up for the good of the town. Mr. Brand was peculiar, in that he always seemed happy and cheerful, always seemed to see the silver lining in the darkest cloud. He was for several years city clerk. He was an advocate of good schools

**HISTORY OF GARRETT LODGE NO. 359,
 A. F. & A. M., AT ARCOLA, MISSOURI.**

Master Masons in the vicinity of White Hare, Cedar County, Mo., met at the masonic hall in White Hare, March 22, A. D. 1870, A. L. 5870, to organize a Masonic lodge under dispensation. Brother H. J. Church, D. D. G. M. was present and called the brethren to order and opened a lodge of Master Masons and called the appointed officers to their stations, viz:

W. C. Montgomery, W. M.
 C. G. Snyder, S. W.
 S. P. Collins, J. W.

The following brothers were present—J. B. Sellars, W. N. Sellars, James J. Frisbie, Jesse Harris, P. R. Dix and William T. Shaw. Visiting brothers present:

D. W. Roberts, Union Lodge No. 7, Kansas.
 J. M. Conoway, Stockton Lodge, No. 283, Missouri.
 G. W. Murphy, Washington Lodge No. 87, Missouri.
 W. A. Ackison, Hesperian Lodge, No. 286, Missouri.
 J. T. Farris, Stockton Lodge, No. 283, Missouri.

The lodge next elected J. B. Sellars, treasurer and P. R. Dix, secretary. The worshipful master then appointed W. N. Sellars, S. D., J. J. Frisbie, J. D., D. W. Roberts, S. S., Jesse Harris, J. S., Charles Corprell, Tyler and the following committee on finance: J. J. Frisbie, R. C. Ball and Morris W. Mitchell.

The following petitions were received for initiation: B. F. Handley, J. L. Thurman, A. M. Morrison, after which the members of Garrett Lodge, U. D., met in special committee for the purpose of organizing under a charter

at Masonic Hall, White Hare, Mo., October 26th, A. D., 1870, A. L. 5870. The charter granted by the Grand Lodge of Missouri was read and the lodge proceeded to the elect the following officers: W. C. Montgomery, W. M., C. G. Snyder, S. W., S. P. Collins, J. W., J. B. Sellars, Treasurer; J. L. Thurman, secretary and the following officers were appointed:

P. R. Dix, S. D.; J. J. Frisbie, J. D.; W. N. Sellars, Tyler; and the following finance committee: James J. Frisbie, Morris W. Mitchell and John Dale. John C. Harris, chaplain.

Garrett Lodge, No. 359 continued at White Hare, Cedar County and was very prosperous both fraternally and financially, having money loaned out, until Jerico Springs decided to organize a lodge of Masons, when a number of brethren demitted from it to help organize at Jerico about April 10th, 1884, when Washington Lodge, No. 87 at Greenfield and Melville Lodge, No. 458 at Dadeville, were asked for a waiver of jurisdiction that Garrett Lodge might be removed from White Hare, Cedar County, to Arcola, Dade County, a distance of five miles. The waiver was granted and the Grand Lodge permitted the removal.

On the 24th day of July, 1884, a Special Grand Lodge of Missouri met at Arcola, Missouri, to dedicate the new hall of Garrett Lodge. D. D. G. M. Seymour Hoyt opened the Grand Lodge with the following officers present:

Seymour Hoyt, W. M.; J. F. Boston, Deputy; Alfred Kennedy, S. W.; T. J. Van Osdell, J. W.; J. R. Clark, Secretary; W. Kennedy, Treasurer; R. M. Crutcher, S. D.; R. A. Church, J. D.; T. P. Calfee, Tyler; Thomas Toney, Chaplain.

Seymour Hoyt then read his commission from Lee A. Hall, G. M., and proceeded to dedicate the hall, after which he made a pleasing address, urging the brethren to be faithful and gave valuable instruction in Masonry. He was followed by Thomas Toney, J. J. Van Osdell and J. M. Travis. This part of the program was followed by a splendid dinner for everyone present.

Last will and testament of J.F. BOSTON.

I, J. F. Boston, of the County of Cedar, State of Missouri being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make public and declare this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

1. I direct that all my just debts, my funeral expenses and the expenses of my last illness be first paid, and, if possible, out of my personal estate.
2. I give and bequeath to my son Charkey K. Boston the sum of five dollars.
3. I give and bequeath to my daughter Biddie E. Porter the sum of five dollars.
4. I give and bequeath to Fern Wolf, Pauline Quick and Reitha A. Linscott children of my deceased daughter Luretta May McNeil, collectively, the sum of Five dollars, and I direct that the said several legacies above mentioned be paid and delivered to the respective legacies within six months after my decease.
5. I haveing heretofore provided for my wife Addie Boston by gifts and an anti nuptial marriage contract it is my will that said contract be carried out in full and that she take nothing further from my estate.
6. I devise and bequeath to Charley K. Boston, Biddie E. Porter and the children of my deceased daughter Luretta May McNeil to with; Fern Wolf, Pauline Quick and Reitha Linscott, (collectively) the rents, profits and income from all the rest residue and remainder of my estate real, personal and mixed and whenever situate for and during the Natural lives of my said children Charley K. Boston and Biddie E. Porter, that is to say one third of said income to Charley K. Boston, one third of said income to Biddie E. Porter and one third income to Fern Wolf, Pauline Quick and Reitha A. Linscott, and at such time as any of my above named children shall depart this life then the children of the deceased child shall take the share of said income their deceased parent and the death of my last child above named the fee simple title to all of my estate shall rest as follows to wit:

An undevided one third interest therein to the children collectively of my son Charles K. Boston, and undevided one third therein to the children collectively of my daughter Biddie E. Porter and undevided one third interest therein collectively to Fern Wolf, Pauline Quick and Reitha A. Linscott children of my deceased daughter Luretta May McNeil.

It is my will that at the death of my last surviving child that the probate court of Cedar County, Missouri shall appoint three disinterested free holders of said County to divide my real estate into three equal portions

and that they shall number same, and that the heirs of each of my deceased children shall cast lots for said portions by drawing number corresponding to said divisions.

My object in making the foregoing disposition of my property and limiting the same is to secure to my children an annual income beyond the accident of fortune and bad management and their part and with this view, I take away from them the power of disposing the same or creating any liens thereon or making the same liable in any way for their debts.

Having special confidence in C. F. Wolf husband of Fern Wolf I do hereby appoint him as executor of this my last will and testament.
