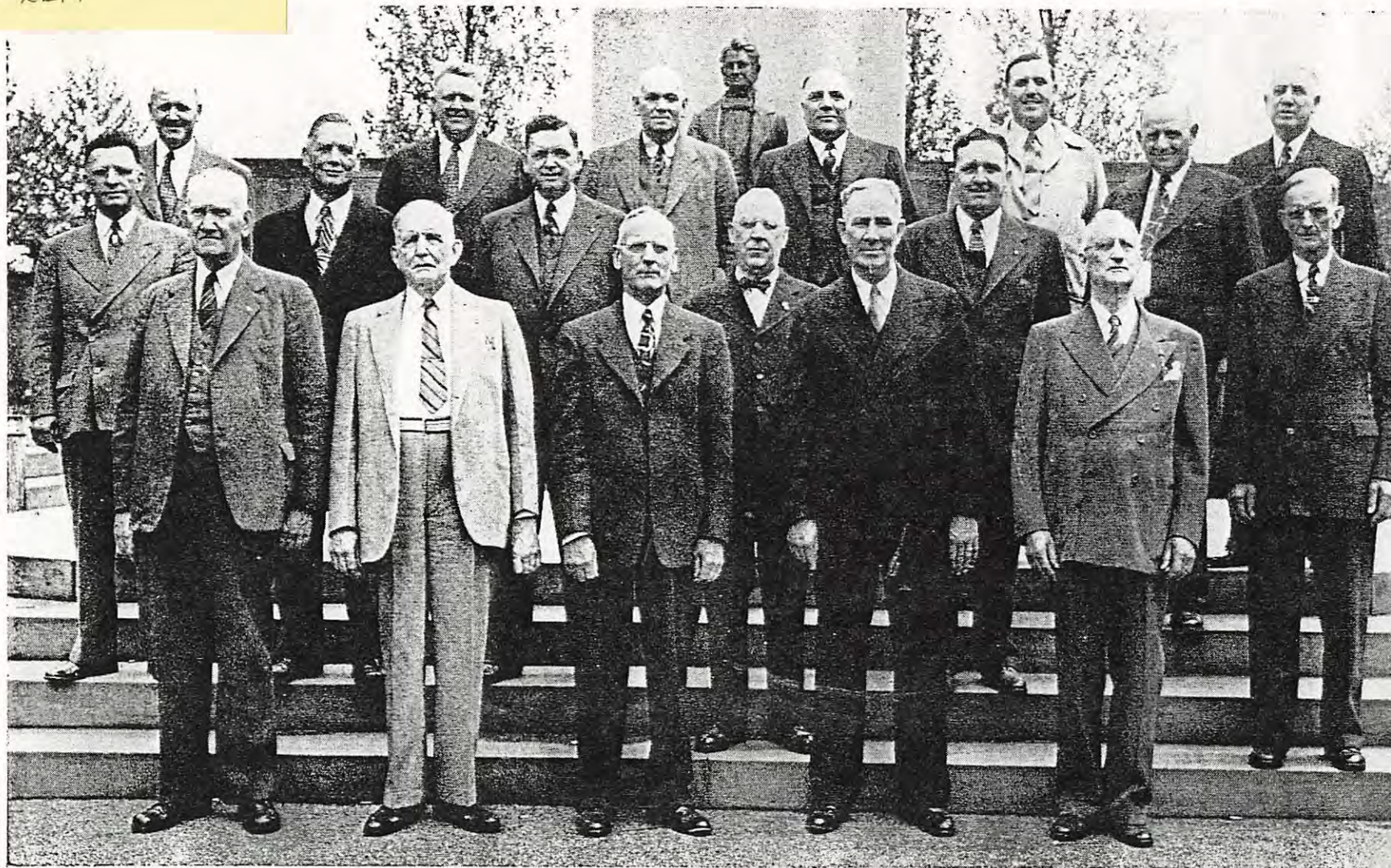

The Cleveland Press article dated December 5, 1900, states that Captain Guillet was the first captain on the Akron Police Department. In the March 25, 1955 issue of the Akron Beacon Journal a brief sketch of his service dates was featured.

I am sorry that we do not have any personnel records pertaining to Captain Guillet as I am sure they would be invaluable in your research. Most likely many of the records kept at that time were destroyed in the fire during the 1900 Riot. Between the years of 1900 - 1918, there should have been some type of records; however, we are unable to locate them.

I trust this information will be of some value to you and perhaps you will be able to visit our Police Department museum some day in the near future.

Police museum records deeds of Akron's men in blue

AMONG Akron museums, possibly the least known is the one maintained by the city's Police Department on the second floor of the Safety Building.

But the collection here of weapons used by both policemen and criminals, of seized gambling devices and drug paraphernalia and of pictures dating back a century make a fascinating display.

And if the visitors want to know more about law enforcement in Akron, almost from its founding date of 1825, Lt. James Buie, in charge of community relations, has a wealth of information in old record books and newspaper clippings.

Casual visitors are welcome but because the museum is not advertised, too few persons are aware of its existence. Classes of students, ranging all the way from elementary schools to the university, are the most frequent visitors.

Materials for the collection were first assembled 12 years ago by Capt. John Cunningham and Lt. Buie, then holding the ranks of lieutenant and sergeant, respectively. Both are long-time veterans of the force with a deep interest in local history. Retired policemen and their families continue to provide me-

mentoes for the museum.

Two riots are focal points of attention. The first was on Aug. 22, 1900, when an enraged mob, wanting to lynch an alleged rapist, dynamited and destroyed the City Hall and jail which then was at the southwest corner of South Main and Bowery streets.

A large picture shows the smoldering remains of the city building and of Columbia Hall, next door on Main Street. In plastic wrapping is the front page of the Akron edition of the Cleveland Press with a huge black headline:

DEEDS OF BLOOD DONE AT AKRON

Elsewhere, among pictures of all Akron police chiefs, is the photo of Huglin H. Harrison, the first to hold that title after a succession of marshals.

Harrison is said to have fled from the mob. He resigned a few days later. The alleged rapist, who had been spirited away to Cleveland before the fire, was sentenced to life but was pardoned 13 years later because of doubts concerning his guilt. Two children were killed by stray bullets during the riot.

A memento of the riot at the Good-year plant gates on May 27, 1938, is a device for shooting tear gas shells. Alongside it in a glass case are several unused shells and a large picture from the Beacon Journal showing a policeman at the scene ready to fire the gun.

Weapons confiscated from criminals and on display include revolvers, brass knuckles, razors, hunting knives, studded wrist cuffs, machetes and a long-shoreman's hook.

One of the revolvers is that which was used by a member of the Borgia gang to kill Patrolmen Edward Costigan and Joseph Hunt on North High Street near Market on the night of Jan. 10, 1918. That was a bloody winter for the Akron police. Two other officers, Guy Norris and Gethin Richards, also fell victims to the gang. Detectives rounded up the gunmen. Three were executed and others sentenced to life.

Of more recent interest is a display of LSD tablets, marijuana, hypodermic needles, pipes and other illegal materials seized from drug addicts.

An early lie detector, called the Berkely Psychograph, was the first one used by the department about 40 years ago. Close by is a bullet-proof vest, made so by steel plates so heavy that the wearer would be overburdened.

A life-size mannequin wearing a traffic officer's uniform of the 1960s stands beside a fully equipped police motorcycle.

Transportation of a much earlier era is shown in pictures. After a patrol wagon drawn by a team of horses in the 1890s comes the city's first motorized police patrol vehicle which was put in service in 1899. It was said to be the first such vehicle in the country, achieving the remarkable speed of 16 miles an hour.

Of course, no record of the Akron Police Department would be complete without pictures of its long time chief, John Durkin. Joining the force in 1885, he rose to the top in 1900, succeeding Harrison, and remained the head man for 30 years until retirement in 1930. It

is claimed that in all those years he never took a day off.

Other evidence that policemen at the turn of the century had full-time jobs is shown in a record book in which the attendance of each officer is tallied — usually seven days on duty followed by seven nights. In some cases a man worked a day and a night shift successively and thus was credited with 32 days' work in a month.

A few absences were noted due to sickness or to death in the family but the routine seemed to be a seven-day week.

Another record book of the early 1900s contains a gruesome handwritten list of violent deaths. Drowning in the canal was a common occurrence and there were frequent fatalities on the railroads, not only at crossings but involving drunks falling from trains and others committing suicide.

The police museum and the accompanying archives provide a view of Akron's history that is not commonly known to law-abiding citizens.

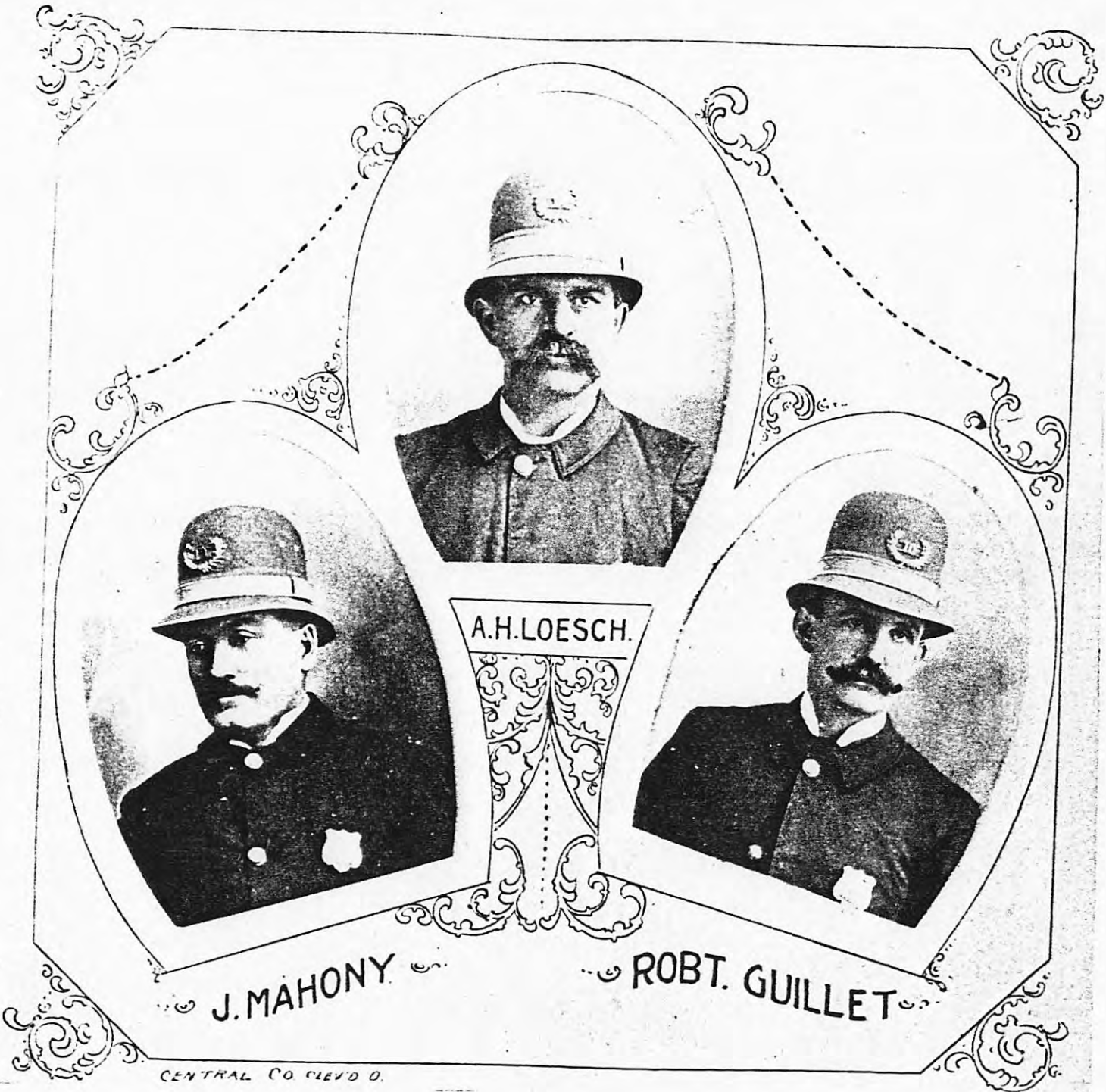

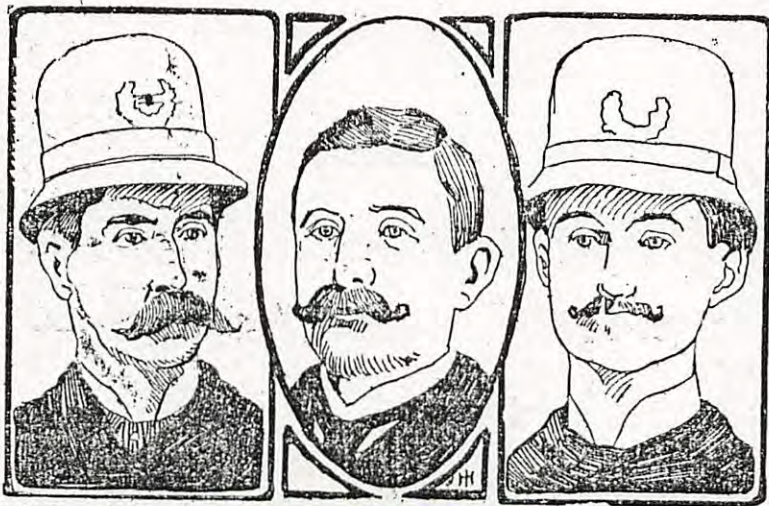

Akron, O., Dec. 5.—(Spl.)—The new officers of the police department will not assume the positions for ten days. Chief Durkin and Captain Guilett have been given leaves of absence to examine police department methods in other cities, in the meantime.

In an address to Chief Durkin, Tuesday afternoon, Chairman McMillen, of the police committee of the commissioners, told him that he was to conduct the office of chief without interference from anyone.

Durkin is the oldest man on the force in point of service. He was 18 years younger when he first swung a club. He is easily the tallest man

on the force, six feet four inches. The new chief is not married, but lives at his father's home, 300 East Voris-st. Durkin was acting chief in the absence of ex-Chief Harrison after the riot, and was acting chief just before Harrison was appointed, following the expiration of Wm. Mason's term as marshal.

Captain Robt. Guilett gave up his work in a local factory to become a member of the police force, so long ago that he is one of the best known of the down-town policemen. He has been called the best-dressed man on the force. He is married and lives at 108 North Union-st.

Ten years ago, Lieutenant Alvah Greenlese became a policeman. He is not so big a man as Durkin, but never hesitated to tackle anyone. Greenlese has a wife and pleasant home at 339 West North-st.

CONFESSION

IT COUNTED FOR MUCH AGAINST BISSON.

An Expert Tells What Bullets Can Do.

Akron, O., Dec. 5.—(Spl.)—Frank Bisson's confession, written and signed by himself, was strong evidence against him in his trial, Tuesday, on the charge of shooting with intent to wound during the riot. His attorneys, E. E. Otis and W. R. Talbot, set up the claim that Bisson was so far away when the shooting was done that no one could have been hurt.

Attorney W. B. Doyle was called by them to testify as an expert regarding the distances at which harm is likely to be done by firing shot of various sizes.

His testimony was not entirely favorable to Bisson. The case is likely to go to the jury, Wednesday afternoon.

Akron Gas Co. Needs Some Wells.

May Pipe From the Boston and Peninsula Fields.

The company has in view the piping of natural gas to Akron to compete with the East Ohio Gas Co., the supply warrants this. The latter company has made great inroads on the Akron Co.'s business.

The company fears there is not enough gas to warrant the undertaking, but the matter is in the hands of the directors in Chicago and a plan to put down many wells is being talked of.

The directors have also before them the proposition to reduce the price of artificial gas in Akron.

It is reported that the grand jury, this morning, found indictments for murder against Chapman and Faulkner and three others.

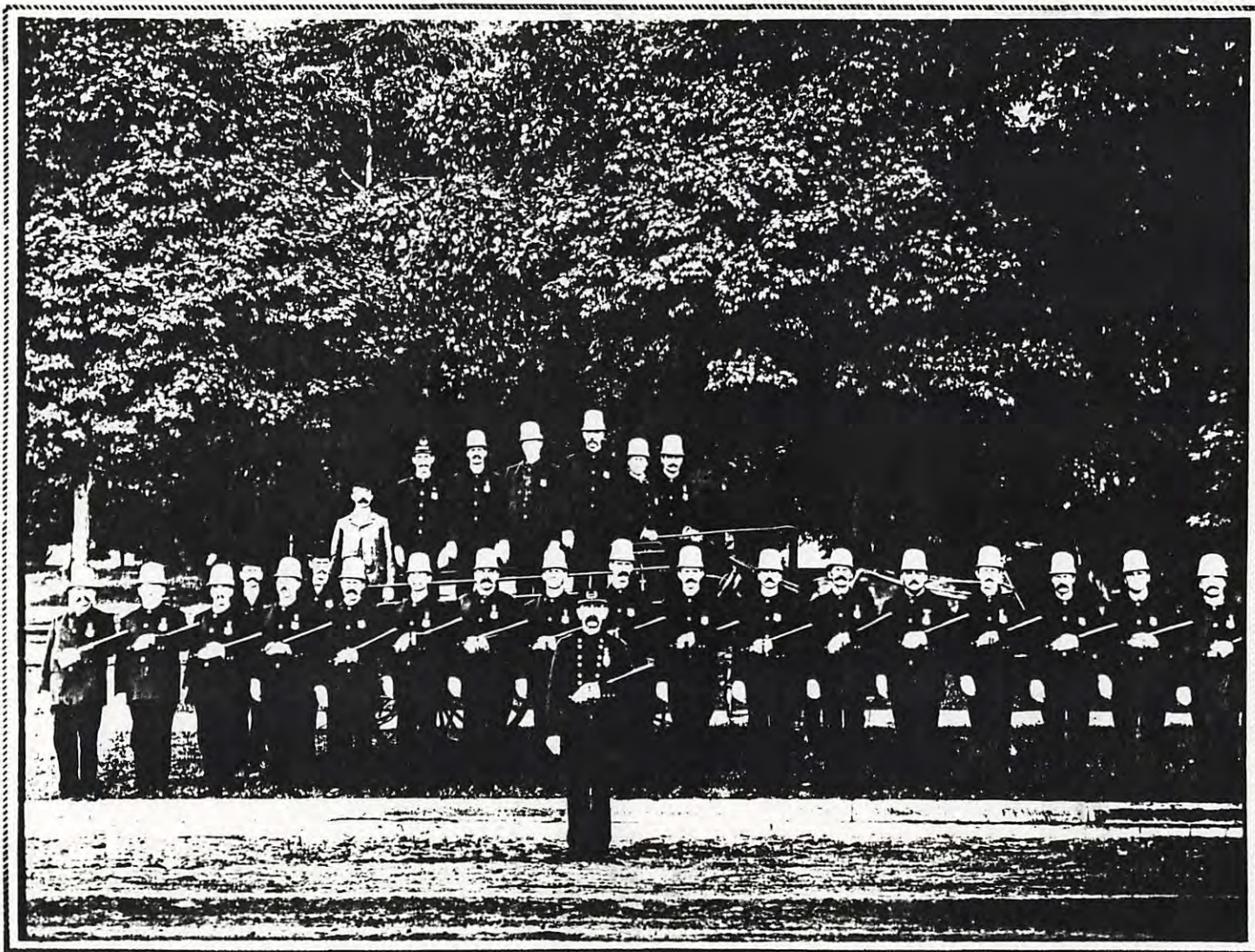
