In 1636 he was one of eight men to work with Governor & Council to prepare laws for the Colony. In 1645 he married Ann Clark. He moved to Barnstable in 1640 and was active in town affairs. He d. in 1674 as Goodman Annabel.

ANTHONY AND JANE ANNABLE OF ENGLAND AND MA

Anthony ANNABLE (c 1599 England - 1674 Barnstable, MA) md (1) at All Saints' Church, Cambridge, England on 26 Apr 1619 Jane MOMFORD (c 1600 England - bur 13 Dec 1643 Barnstable, MA), parents not known. They came to New England in the ship "Ann" in 1623, along with their daughter, Sarah. They remained in Plymouth until 1634, when they resettled to Scituate as one of its founders. They lived there until <sup>1639</sup>1640, when they followed Rev. Lothrop and his congregation to Barnstable. Anthony ANNABLE served twice as constable of Scituate. After the move to Barnstable, he was delegate to the Plymouth Court 13 times. He lived on a farm of 77 acres in West Barnstable. ✓ Anthony and Jane had at least five ch.

*Anthony Annable made his mark to corroborate purchase of land from Indians in 1644 in Barnstable*

1. Sarah (1620 prob. Cambridge, England - 1687) on 22 Nov 1638 md Henry EWELL of Scituate. *Ch incl Bethia; Deborah; Hershon; Hannah; Ichabod; and Abiah.*

2. Hannah (c 1625 Plymouth - ) on 10 Mar 1645 in Barnstable md Thomas BOWERMAN (1611 England - 1683 Barnstable) and BOWERMAN ch incl Hannah; Thomas; Samuel; Desire; Mary; Mehitable; and Tristram.

3. Susanna (1630 Plymouth - ) md 13 May 1652 William HATCH of Scituate. Their <sup>not recorded in Scituate</sup> three HATCH ch. *incl Mary; Lydia; Phoebe and William. (These were two William Hatch families)*

4. dau (1635 Scituate - bur 8 Apr 1635)

5. Deborah (bp 7 May 1637 Scituate - ) no info, *may have d. young.*

Anthony ANNABLE md (2) at Barnstable on 3 Mar 1645 to Ann CLARK, of whom little is known. Savage recorded that she was buried 16 May 1651. She apparently had two ch:

6. Samuel (22 Jan 1646 Barnstable - 1678) md 1 Jun 1667 Mehitable ALLYN, dau of Thomas ALLYN. Their four ch were Samuel; Hannah; John; and Ann. They lived at Barnstable.

7. Ezekial (bp 29 Apr 1649 Barnstable - died young.)

Savage then recorded Anthony as marrying (3) Ann BARKER, who had one ch before she was buried 16 Mar 1658:

8. Desire (16 Oct 1653 Barnstable - 24 July 1706 Scituate) md John BARKER, Esq., 18 Jan 1677. *Ch. not found in Scituate VR*

Others who have studied the record of Anthony ANNABLE state that his wife, Ann, died "recently," in 1686, and that there were only two wives. Since the lineage of Hannah (ANNABLE) BOWERMAN is clearly established, the problem of the second or third wives is not of concern.

JOHN, Westfield, eldest br. of the preced. was in the great fight of Turner's falls, m. 23 Dec. 1680, Abigail Parsons, and d. at Springfield, 16 Sept. 1684, leav. John, b. 16 Mar. 1682, and Benjamin. NATHANIEL, Springfield, youngest br. of the preced. may have had fam. SAMUEL, Woodbury 1680, wheelwright, may well seem to be of a differ. fam. from any of the preced. as Cothren says he came in from Milford, and his f. is unkn. had Jane, and Amy, bapt. Oct. 1680; Mary, Nov. 1681; Daniel, Feb. 1684; and Samuel, Apr. 1687. In mod. times the name has double n.

MUNDAY, or MONDAY, HENRY, Salisbury, freem. 13 May 1640, was rated in 1652, higher than any other inhab. but one. Farmer, from the rec. says his w. d. 22 July 1654. The spell. is sometimes Monde or Munde. He has prefix of respect in town rec. WILLIAM, passeng. in the Mary and John, 1634, may have been f. of the preced. at least we kn. that sev. of the early sett. at Salisbury came in that voyage.

MUNDEN, ABRAHAM, Springfield, m. 16 May 1644, Ann Munson, had Mary, b. 8 Aug. 1645, and he was drown. 29 Oct. at Enfield Falls, the same yr. This d. was complain. against, in 1676, at Northampton, for "wearing silk, and that in a flaunting manner;" the enormity of her offence was aggravat. perhaps, by the disaster of her f. thirty yrs. bef.
