(THE CARRINGTON LINE).

Carrington, as a surname, is of locality in origin, and means "of Carrington." Carrington is (first) a chapelry near New Bolingbroke, County Lincoln; (second) a chapelry in the parish of Bowdon, County Chester; (third) a village in the parish of Basford, County Nottingham, all in England. Each of these has undoubtedly given birth to representatives of this surname.

The origin of Dr. Peter Carrington has never been found. The earliest Carringtons in Connecticut were executed for witchcraft in 1651, these being John Carrington, a carpenter of Wethersfield, and his wife, Joan. This was too early for them to have been the parents of Dr. Peter Carrington, but they are believed to have been the parents of John Carrington, who died at Waterbury in 1690. His children are named in the probate records, and when one of his sons died two years later the heirs were named again, so it is certain that Dr. Peter Carrington was not a son of the John who died in 1690. Dr. Peter Carrington was evidently an original settler of Connecticut. It is interesting to note the devotion of members of this family to the practice of medicine.

1. *Dr. Peter Carrington*, first of this line to be of record, was born in 1660 or 1670, and died at New Haven (now Woodbridge), Connecticut, in 1727. He was a physician.

Dr. Peter Carrington married, about 1691, Ann (Wilmot) Lines, who was born at New Haven, Connecticut, February 26, 1669-70, died after 1727, daughter of William and Sarah (Thomas) Wilmot, and widow of Benjamin Lines.

And to compress all desirable matter into as small a space as practicable, the following abbreviations will be used; to wit:—b. for born, d. for daughter and died, m. for married, and Is. for issue. The names of the months will be abbreviated, and the th, d, and st, omitted; and the numerals, to dates, only set down, as 1, 2, 3, 4, 8 for 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th, 8th, &c. The orthography of names, in the ancient records, will be scrupulously observed.]

RECORDS OF WETHERSFIELD, CONNECTICUT.

[For the greater facility of reference, the names, in the following Record of Marriages, Births and Deaths, are arranged alphabetically, and not chronologically. In every family is traced down, nearly chronologically, until the commencement of the present century, or until the name disappears from the record.]

Atwood Abigail, the daughter of Capt. Thomas Atwood & Abigail his wife was borne the last day of Sept. Anno 1668. Andrew the son of Capt. Thomas Atwood & of Abigail his wife was borne the 1st day of Sept. Anno 1671. Jonathan the son of Capt. Th^o Atwood & of Abigail his wife was borne the 8th day of June in the year 1675. Josiah the son of Capt. Th^o Atwood & of Abigail his wife was borne the 1th day of Octobr in the year 1678.*

Attwood Josiah & Bathsheba the daughter of Bazelacl Lattimer deceased were married on the 16th day of Febry Anno Domini 1709-10 by John Chester Assisant. Abigail Attwood the daughter of Josiah Attwood & of Bathsheba his wife was born on the 6th day of December Annoque Domini 1710. Oliver Attwood the son of Josiah Attwood & of Bathsheba his wife was born March 1: Anno Dom. 1715-16. Jedediah Attwood y^e son of Josiah Attwood & of Bathsheba his wife was born on y^e 28th day of June Anno Dom. 1719. Josiah Attwood & Hezekiah Attwood, twins, y^e sons of Josiah Attwood & of Bathsheba his wife were born on April 13th day Anno Dom. 1727. Asher y^e son of Josiah Attwood & of Bathsheba his wife was born December y^e 27th day Anno Dom. 1729.

Attwood Oliver & Dorothy Curtis were married on the 12th day of November Anno Domini 1716 by y^e Rev^d Mr James Lockwood. Abigail the daughter of Oliver Attwood & of Dorothy his wife was born on the 28th day of Augt Anno Dom. 1717. Elijah the son of Oliver Attwood & of Dorothy his wife was born on the 28th day of Augt A.D. 1751. Levi the son of Oliver Attwood & of Dorothy his wife was born on the 10th day of May A.D. 1752. John the son of Oliver Attwood & of Dorothy his wife was born on the 16th day of April Anno Domini 1755.

Attwood Jedidiah & Susanna Deming were married on the 29th of November Anno Domini 1717, by David Goodrich Esqr Just. Pacis. Timothy the son of Jedediah Attwood & of Susanna his wife was born on the 9th day of September A.D. 1719. Attwood Jedidiah & Sarah Lomis were married together on the 22^d day of Nov^r A.D. 1759, by Silas Lomis Justice of Peace.

Attwood Josiah Jun^r & Caroline Mygatt were married together on the 13th day of April A.D. 1751, by the Rev^d Elisham Whitman. Huldah the daughter of Josiah Attwood Jun^r & of Caroline his wife was born on the 23th day of July A.D. 1752 & died on the 2^d of October A.D. 1752. Huldah the daughter of Josiah Attwood Jun^r & of Caroline his wife was born on the 13th day of March A.D. 1751.

Attwood Ashur & Mary Mitchell were married together on the 1st of April A.D. 1757 by the Rev^d John Baldwin. Huldah the daughter of Ashur Attwood & of Mary his wife was born on the 11th day of Febry

(THE ATWOOD LINE).

The surname Atwood or Attwood is of local origin, meaning "at the wood," and was first used to indicate residence thereby. In the year 1273, Geoffrey Ate Wode was of County Hunts and Matheus Atewode was of County Cambridge, while in the same year Agnes Attewode is recorded in County Oxford, and Gilbert Atte Wode in County Sussex.

I. *Captain Thomas Atwood*, progenitor of the family in America, is said to have been descended from Thomas Atwood, Gentleman, of Bromfield, County Essex, England, and was claimed by some authorities to have been a captain in Cromwell's army. He was born at Bromfield, County Essex, England, about 1610 and died in 1682. Inventory of his estate amounted to £148-6-9, same being made by John Kilborn, Sr., and Thomas Wright, October 24, 1682.

He settled in Plymouth, Massachusetts, in 1640, and tradition says that his log cabin was built on the same site later occupied by the Congregational Church of Plymouth. In 1663, he located at Wethersfield, Connecticut, where he was recorded as a householder in 1670. He was a physician of some prominence and, according to Hartford County Probate Records, his practice forced him to cover a large tract of territory between Saybrook in the southern part of the State and Woodbury in the western part. He owned property at Rockyhill and Newington.

Captain Thomas Atwood married, at Plymouth, Massachusetts, in 1667, Abigail, whose surname is not known.
