KEEPING UP WITH THE ^ JONESES

PART 4: OTHER JONES FAMILIES

This final part of the series on the Jones families of Stamford will take note of the various other isolated Jones individuals and families that appeared in Stamford up to about 1800 – but who are not associated with any of the three major groups already outlined in previous installments.

The Rev. Eliphalet Jones ("Mr. Jones")

The Rev. **ELIPHALET² JONES**, son of the Rev. John¹ Jones of Concord and Fairfield, was born at Concord, Massachusetts on 9 January 1640/41, and died at Huntington, Long Island, New York on 5 June 1731.¹

He married at an unknown place and time **MARTHA LAWRENCE**, baptized 9 August 1646, the daughter of Thomas and Martha (____) Lawrence of Milford. Thomas Lawrence had died in 1648 when his daughter was an infant and his only son Thomas Jr. had not yet been born. His widow married (2) John Chapman of Stamford, and (3) on 17 December 1657, Francis Brown, also of Stamford. Martha's brother Thomas Lawrence Jr. married Hannah (Smith) Knapp, daughter of Henry Smith and widow of Caleb Knapp, both of Stamford.²

Eliphalet Jones studied at Harvard College in Massachusetts, but did not graduate.³ He apparently preached briefly in Huntington, Long Island in 1664.⁴ The connections with Stamford families may have had something to do with a pastoral assignment beginning at

is mention of the death of both. Under date of Feb., 1798, is stated that "the wife of Ebenezer Thomas died in child bearing, age about 30 years."

Ebenezer's death is given as 27 Nov., 1811, aged 47.³³

The early death of Elizabeth explains why the deed record (discussed above) of 1806 gives Ebenezer Thomas as one of the heirs of William Bailey but does not mention Ebenezer's wife.

F. Samuel Bailey.

No marriage record is found yet for Samuel but his will names his wife, Jemima, and his children.³⁴ The Congregational Church records give the date of Samuel's death as 21 June, 1813, "age 40 years & 10 months."³⁵

B. Eliakim Bailey.

Eliakim also made application for a Revol. War Pension and in it stated that he was born "in the Town of Haddam in the year 1759," although "he has no record of his age."²⁶ He is burried in Old Higganum Cemetery where the tombstone states he died 31 Oct., 1836, age 80.²⁷ These two records disagree as to his year of birth (1759 vs. ca. 1756) and since the tombstone was probably erected some years after his death, it is more likely that the date given by himself on the pension application is nearer correct. The extensive Brainerd Genealogy compiled about a century ago gives his date of birth as 29 Sept., 1758, but does not cite source.²⁸ That work states his first wife, Thankful, was daughter of Samuel Brainerd, and his 2nd wife, Mary, was daughter of Daniel Spencer and widow of James Treadwell. However, a published genealogy of the Spencers identifies the Mary Spencer who married James Treadwell as the daughter of Elizur Spencer, but does not mention a second marriage.²⁹ Thus, the identity of Eliakim's second wife is uncertain.

The cemetery records for Eliakim's two wives are: "Thankful Bailey, wife of Mr. Eliakim, died Sept. 25, 1798, age 41 years;" and "Mary Bailey, wife of Eliakim, died April 21, 1832, age 75 years."³⁰

C. William Bailey.

Records of the First Congregational Church in Haddam include the marriage of William. It reads, "William Bailey, Jr., & Ruth Thompson or Thomas ?" suggesting uncertainty by the recording clerk about her surname.³¹ While there were few Thompsons in Haddam and adjacent areas, there were some Thomas families. Still, it has not yet been possible to relate Ruth to any of those Thomas families, and her identity remains uncertain.

D. Christian Bailey.

The marriage of Christian to William Clark, Jr., and the births of three of their children are entered in Haddam Vital Records. Their marriage is also recorded in the Congregational Church records, as also the deaths of both William and Christian.³²

E. Elizabeth Bailey.

The name Elizabeth is given only in the Thomas genealogy. In all original records seen so far she is referred to as the wife of Ebenezer Thomas, without mention of her name. Their marriage does not seem to have been entered in the the Congregational Church records although there

Militia of Haddam, and for the rest of his life he was called "Ensign John" in the records of Haddam.²¹ Presumably this title was perpetuated as a means of distinguishing him from his relatives of the same name.

In his will, "Ensign John" mentioned his wife, Esther, and children. He devised his land to his four surviving sons, including part to "my fourth son, William."

In addition to the land inherited from his father, William purchased other lands in Haddam and during his lifetime sold parts thereof to his children. However, even at his death he still owned land which fell to his heirs. Two deeds that document that inheritance can be mentioned. In Sept., 1806 (William died in Aug.), "Christopher Bailey, William Bailey, William Clark and Christian his wife, and Ebenezer Thomas" all of Haddam, sold to Eliakim Bailey and Samuel Bailey, also of Haddam, their interest in "the Estate both real and personal left by our honored father, William Bailey, late of Haddam, deceased."²² Then in 1813, Eliakim Bailey of Haddam sold to "my brother Samuel Bailey" his right in "the Estate of our honored father, William Bailey, late of Haddam, deceased."²³

The children of William Bailey are given here, with sources cited in the following discussion. The names are documented, but their dates of birth are not all known. Thus the order of birth has some uncertainty.

- A. Christopher Bailey, b. ca. 1756, d. 18 April, 1840; md. 26 Dec., 1782, Naomi Bailey.
- B. Eliakim Bailey, b. 29 Sept., 1758 (or 1759?), d. 31 Oct., 1836; md. 1st Thankful Brainerd; md. 2nd Mary (Spencer) Treadwell.
- C. William Bailey, b. ca. 1760, d. 30 Nov., 1815; md. June, 1782, Ruth Thomas (or Thompson?).
- D. Christian Bailey, d. Jan., 1820; md. 1 March, 1781, William Clark, Jr.
- E. Elizabeth Bailey, b. ca. 1768, d. Feb., 1798; md. 2 May, 1787, Ebenezer Thomas.
- F. Samuel Bailey, b. Aug., 1772, d. 21 June, 1813; md. Jemima.

A. Christopher Bailey.

Christopher made application for a Revolutionary War Pension on 11 June, 1822, and stated that he was then 66 years of age, and that his wife, Naomi, was age 58.²⁴ The vital records for Christopher & Naomi's family as entered in the deed book states they were married 26 Dec., 1782, & that he died 18 April, 1840, age 84. and she died 22 Sept., 1825, age 62.²⁵

deed Isaac sold to Richard Skinner part interest in a tract of land in Haddam, described as "part of the Estate of my father William Bailey, deceased," specifically, "my right to said piece," and the "right of my sister Sybil Bailey deceased."¹⁶

Cemetery records are known for Richard & Martha (Bailey) Skinner, but none have been found for the other members of this Bailey family. Those for the Skinners are: Richard Skinner, died Feb. 12, 1842, age 78 years, and Martha Skinner, wife of Richard, died Sept., 23, 1840, age 70 years.¹⁷

The children of William, Jr., & Desire Bailey, as known from the above mentioned records, were.

- A. Dorothy (Dolly) Bailey, b. 18 March, 1763, d. before her mother's will was written; md. Mr. Barns.
- B. Abel Bailey
- C. Martha Bailey, b. ca. 1770, d. 23 Sept., 1840; md. Richard Skinner, June, 1786.
- D. Sybil Bailey, d. prior to 31 Nov., 1803.
- E. Linda Bailey.
- F. Isaac Bailey, b. between 1775 & 1782.

2. William, son of John & Esther Bailey.

In Dewey's article, William Bailey the father of Christopher Bailey was identified as the son of Ephraim & Deborah Bailey. This is clearly an error as explained below. Dewey also stated that this William was married to Betsy Horton. No record is known to this author that names the wife of this William, either by given or surname. Since some of the claims made in Dewey's article are proven to be in error it would be unwise to accept his statement about William's wife without supporting evidence.

The evidence that this William was the son of John & Esther Bailey is partly indirect, but convincing. The listing of the family of John & Esther Bailey in Haddam Vital Records gives the date of their marriage (14 Jan., 1711/12) followed by the births of all their children.¹⁸ Their son, William, born 17 July, 1732, was the ninth child listed in their family. His tombstone has, "died Aug. 28, 1806, age 74 years."¹⁹

John Bailey made his will in 1764 and it was proved in 1767 before Joseph Wells the J. P. for Haddam, who appended the notation that the witnesses "personally appeared and made solemn oath that Ensign John Bailey" had acknowledged this as his last will and testament.²⁰ In Oct., 1731, John had been commissioned Ensign of the Second Company of

William Bailey, Jr., died intestate, probably in late 1789 or early 1790. The 1790 census lists Desire Bailey as head of household having 1 male age 16 or over, 1 under 16, and 3 females.¹⁰ Middletown Probate Court records, under date of 5 April, 1790, state that Desire Bailey is appointed Administratrix of the Estate of "William Bailey, late of Haddam, deceased."¹¹ This is followed in the record book by the inventory of the Estate dated 18 March, 1790, taken by John Smith & Elijah Brainerd, appraisers.

Desire Bailey made her will on 5 May, 1794, and it was probated the 24th of that same month.¹² In it she left bequests to her "oldest son, Abel Bailey," to her "youngest son, Isaac Bailey," to the three children of her deceased daughter, "Dolly Barns," and to her daughters, Martha Skinner, Sibble Bailey and Linda Bailey, and named her son, Abel Bailey, as Executor. The will was witnessed by Samuel Bailey, Hannah Smith and Caty Smith. On the same page of the Record Book with Desire's will, is recorded the appointment by the court of Abel Bailey as guardian of Isaac and Linda Bailey.

The Probate Packets of the Middletown Probate Court contain the original of Desire's will, plus several other documents pertaining to this family. Among those is the report of the distribution of Desire's Estate to the heirs which states that Dolly Barns had been the "eldest daughter," Martha Skinner the "second daughter," Sibble [Sybil] Bailey the "third daughter," and Linda Bailey the "fourth daughter."¹³

The marriage of Martha Bailey to Richard Skinner is recorded in the records of the local church but with only the month and year given.¹⁴ Proof that this was Martha, daughter of William & Desire Bailey is in the following record.

Preserved among the papers for the Guardianship of Isaac is one which may hold the identity of Martha's husband. It seems that Abel Bailey relinquished the Guardianship of Isaac before Isaac came of age. A paper submitted to the Judge of Middletown Probate Court on 7 Feb., 1797, states, "these may certify that Isaac Bailey minor Son of William Bailey late of Haddam deceased personally appeared & declared that he wished to have a guardian & that he made choyce off & wanted his Brother Mr Richard Skinner should be appoented his guardian," [original spelling retained].¹⁵ Thus the "second daughter Martha Skinner" mentioned in Desire's will would seem to have been married to Richard Skinner.

Proof that Sybil Bailey died young is contained in a land transaction dated 30 Nov., 1803, between Isaac Bailey and Richard Skinner. By that

THE TWO WILLIAM BAILEYS OF HADDAM

This concerns two men, first cousins, who were contemporaries and who had the same given and surnames. The tradition in past centuries of repeating family given names, has sometimes resulted in two or more contemporary individuals of the same given and surnames living in the same area. This has at times led to confusion of identities, as for instance in the following example.

The Township of Haddam in Middlesex County, Connecticut, was from the beginning of settlement the home of numerous families of surname Bailey. John & Esther Bailey had a son, William, born 17 July, 1732, and on 1 Aug., 1736, was born William, son of Ephraim & Deborah Bailey.¹ In the brief published account of the Baileys by Dewey, William the son of Ephraim & Deborah was said to have been the father of Christopher Bailey the Revolutionary Soldier.² That is an error as is shown by records discussed below. Unfortunately, that error was copied in other publications and continues to be cited.

1. William, son of Ephraim & Deborah Bailey.

Because this William was four years younger than his cousin of the same name, he was usually called William, Jr., in the records of Haddam. In 1757 Ephraim deeded a piece of land in Haddam "to my loving son William Bailey, Jr. of Haddam."³ Numerous other deed records exist for William Bailey, Jr., including two from his cousin, William Bailey.⁴

The vital records of Haddam contain the notation that William, Jr., married Desire Thomas on 18 March, 1762, and that their daughter, Dorothy, was born 18 March, 1763.⁵ The other children are known only from the probate and deed records cited hereafter.

By deed dated 6 April, 1779, David Smith of Haddam gave a tract of about 7 & 2/3 acres of land "to my well beloved daughter, Desire Bailey, of said Haddam," located ca. 1/2 mile east of Great Candlewood Hill.⁶ Isaac Thomas married Desire Smith, 24 April, 1760. Isaac died 4 Sept., 1760. On 2 Feb., 1761, was born Isaac, son of Isaac (& Desire) Thomas.⁷ This son was apparently the one who left a will dated 8 Jan., 1783, proved 28 Jan., 1783, in which he bequeathed "to my honored mother, Desire Bailey, the whole of my estate both real and personal."⁸ He was buried in Old Higganum Cemetery with the inscription, "Mr. Isaac Thomas, died Jan. 24, 1783, age 22 years."⁹

Wood, Martha to Joseph James, Sarah to Alexander Gresham, Jane to a Morgan, Rachael to D. J. Barnett, Elizabeth to William Stone, Nancy to George W. King, Rosannah to James F. Blakely, Amanda to Dr. Green, Eliza to A Stone, and 2nd Robert Stoddard. Robert never married (CSA), Caroline to O. A. Pickell, William C. married twice. All left children. I could not pass this up!! 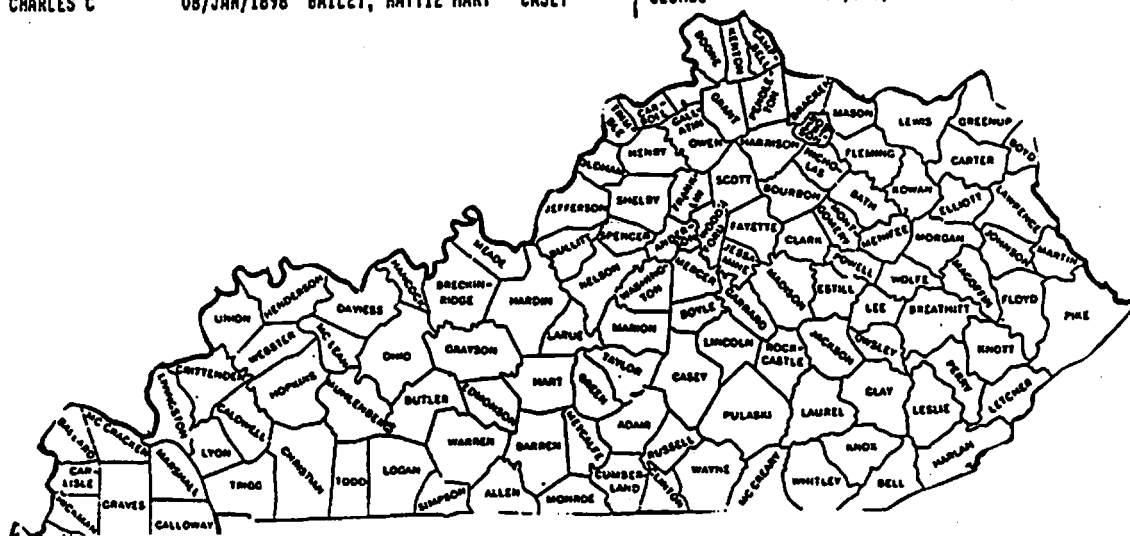

SULLIVAN CO TENNESSEE
=====

Tennessee was originally part of Fincastle Co, VA. Next, it was half North Carolina, and half Indian Territory (Natchez or "area south of the Ohio"). Next, the NC half tried to make themselves the state of Franklin, which was abolished. Finally, the state of TN was formed in 1796. When it was NC, it was Washington Co. NC and the old area of Sullivan Co. TN was then called Sullivan Co. NC. There was a few years between the state of Franklin and the real TN that were the "Watauga" years-another attempt at a separate government for TN.

The current state line between KY/TN is not the original one. The original was called the "Walker Line." When this was in effect (and it took the federal government many years to determine the current line). TN came over the KY line on the average of 20 miles all along what is the current state line. FINALLY-if your ancestors came from east TN, chances are they may have been included on censuses for KY/TN/NC because this is a very mountainous region. The settlers actually never knew which state and county they really lived in. Many Sullivan Co, TN early records may even be found in Lee Co, VA! The census taker really never knew where he was in those mountains. If a TN resident on the 1820 TN census was born before 1796, then technically, he was born in NC!

This is ABSOLUTELY the worst area of the United States to research because of all the above! Unfortunately, you can't be sure you've checked all resources until you've checked KY/TN/NC and probably South West VA.

Parks BAILEY, a brother of John BAILEY, was the youngest son of Samuel and Augusta PARKS BAILEY, and named for his grandfather, David PARKS. He was born at Hedgeland, Oct 13, 1763. He married May 5th 1786 in Amelia Co, VA, Mary CABINESS, the daughter of Charles CABINESS, the inventor of plug Tobacco. Charles was both a planter and manufacturer. Parks BAILEY was a soldier, took part in the battle of Yorktown, VA. This couple lived several years in his native county, then moved to Henry Co, but finally went to Pulaski, Giles Co, Tenn, to a grant of land given for his services in the Revolutionary War.

He walked twice during the day of his death to his daughter's home, Mrs Sarah Lewis BAILEY PULLEN, and without a day's illness, died while at evening prayers, Feb 9th, 1833. His wife died June 1st, 1819.

Rev. Robert Parks BAILEY, a son of Parks, and Mary CABINESS BAILEY, lived with his parents after his marriage to Miss GREEN of S.C till their death.

William BAILEY, another son of Parks and brother of the above, married Valerine NEVEN, of Lyons, France. They had a son, William Adolphe, who was entered at Yale and graduated as valedictorian in 1842.

William Adolphe BAILEY, after his graduation at Yale returned to New Orleans, studied law, and before this, was Supt. of Public Schools, and soon afterwards was appointed-Judge of the 18th Judicial District. His wife was Cecile LASTROPES, who came from one of the most prominent and influential Creole families.

Charles Cabiness BAILEY, son of Parks and Mary CABINESS BAILEY, married Martha Hairston ROWLAND of Henry Co, VA. Their daughter, Mary BAILEY, was born in this county, but was taken to GA. in infancy and finally married J.H. TRAYLOR, the youngest son of Rev. J.C TRAYLOR, long of Henry Co, VA.

Patience BAILEY, a descendant of Samuel and Augusta PARKS BAILEY, married T. Patterson TRAYLOR.

The English BAILEYs were descended from a general of William of Normandy, France. This general was intrusted with the great treasures of the King. The office of stewardship was often called bailey instead of steward, hence the name "BAILEY." Quite a number of them were crusaders who achieved a large number of escutcheons, as many as eleven being recorded in Burke's General Armory. One claimed by this Bailey shows the strong Norman preference for parts of the human body, or the brute creation, while the Anglo-Saxon leaned to Cabalistic designs.

The tradition back of the crest is that his general successfully defended a tower filled with women and children. On the coat decoration is found a representation of an animal skin, ermine, and bars, which, in any number means protection, taken in 35 as they are here, they mean a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

The English BAILEY's intermarried with the royal family of Ireland, lineal decendants of the kings of Leinster (Mac-Murrough), Ireland, and lived near Dublin.

Samuel BAILEY, the son of Sarah LEWIS, and a descendant of the English-Irish BAILEY's was a large, handsome man, and a true Virginia. He married Augusta PARKS in 1744, and build a home in Albemarle Co, VA, which he called Hedgelands and where his children were born and raised. One, Sarah Judith, born in 1745, married I.Y. HILL. It was during the France and Indian Wars, that he earned the title of General BAILEY. He was a patriot, ever inch of him, for he spent his means, too, in the last named, as well as in the Revolutionary conflict. It is unfortunate that we have only a record of his being Quartermaster of the 11th Virginia Regiment. He died in 1781.

John BAILEY, the eldest son of Samuel, was born at Hedgelands in 1746. He was a member of the Albemarle Guards in the Revolution. He did not marry early, but was a great trader, traveling to Richmond, Norfolk, Savannah and New York, on horseback to the boats. Other times he went on stage from state to state, but always accompanied by his body-servant, "Chester Wade", who was purchased from Wade HAMPTON, of S.C. Chester was a artist in his line as a servant.

After John BAILEY was wealthy and a bachelor, he married, on March 8th 1790, Mrs Sarah SMITH ALLEN, a widow with six children, but the latter were well provided for. She was the widow of William ALLEN, who reared 20 children. On one of John BAILEY's trips to Savannah, he heard it whispered that there were cases of Yellow fever in that city, and he left immediately on a boat to Washington, thence hurried home only to die of this fearful disease in 1817.

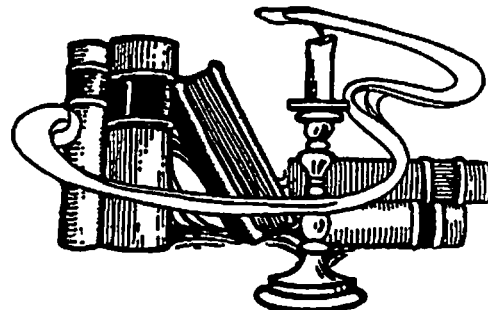

The Bailey Family Bible Record is a part of Georgia Supreme Court Case No. 15749 - Caleb A. Blake vs. Jennie A. Black, et al., on pages 33 & 34 of the court papers. The will of Claiborn W. Bailey is mentioned in this case and this will is of record in Newton County, Georgia in 1864. This case involves disputed land, apparently in Newton County, and states, "counsel for plaintiffs introduced deed from Thos. P. Born to Claiborn W. Bailey to premises in dispute dated _____. Copy of last will & testament of Claiborn W. Bailey and probated - see copy hereafter - & certified to _____. Letters Testamentary issued to Mrs. Mary J. Bailey, Executrix of C. W. Bailey, dated May 2, 1864 (will admitted to record). Extract from family Bible showing ages of children..."

Sacred to the memory of Thomas BAYLY, Son of Edmund BAYLY, Grandson of Edmund BAYLY, and great-grandson of Richard BAYLY of Craddock. His mother was Rose, the dau of Maddox FISHER, of Northampton. He was born 14/Mar/1737-8, Old Stiles and died--(illegible).

In memory of Anne BAYLY, wife of Thomas BAYLY, Dau of Richard DRUMMOND and grand-dau of Major Richard DRUMMOND by his wife Patience, who was the dau of Richard HILL, the proprietor and patentee of this plantation (Hill's Farm) in the year 1666. Her mother was Catharine, the dau of Thomas HARMANSON of Northampton. She was born 26/Feb/1742-3, Old Stile, and died 8/Sep/1801, North Stile. On her left lie her Father, sister and six of her children. Her second son was lost at sea and left living three sons and two daughters.

Edmund BAYLY, son of Thomas BAYLY and Ann his wife. He was married to the dau of John UPSHUR, of Northampton. He was the clerk of the district and county courts held at Accomac Court House, and was born 27/Aug/1763, and died 18/Nov/1805.

Sacred to the memory of Col. Thomas M. BAYLY, 3rd son of Col. Thomas BAYLY and Anne DRUMMOND his wife. He was born 26/Mar/1775. On the 24th of March, 1802, he was married to Margaret P. CROPPER, Daughter of Gen. John CROPPER. On the 21st of Dec, 1826, he was married to Jane O. ADDISON, the widow of Colonel Kendall ADDISON, and the daughter of Samuel COWARD. On the 7th of January, 1834, he died.

Devoted attached to his country, he spent the best years of his life in her service. Col. BAYLY entered into public life in 1798, and continued in it, with the intermission of a few years, until 1830, during which time he discharged the respective duties of a Member of the House of Delegates of Virginia, of the Senate of Virginia, of Congress of the United States, of the late Convention of Virginia which formed her new Constitution, and of the important session of the Legislature succeeding it. Col. BAYLY's highest eulogy as a public man is found to be in the continued confidence of his constituents, which he enjoyed during all the aggravated times, and amid all the mutation of parties through which he passed. It is a fact as honourable as singular in his history that he never lost a election, and very rarely ever had one closely contested. Col. BAYLY as a politician was found on the side of popular rights. This monument is erected to his memory by his Widow.

Rachel UPSHUR, the wife of Edmund BAYLY, was the daughter of John UPSHUR and Anne EMERSON. 1763-1805

Crawford County was to become part of Pope County in 1840.) Although the family had owned slaves in Virginia, none was reported on the 1840 census. A Rufus is listed on the 1860 census of Pope County as living at Galla Rock in the home of Martha Tate Williamson, a widow with two younger children and twins, Marion and Elizabeth Robinson, age 25. (It is possible the twins were from a previous marriage.) Marriage Book D, Page 83 of Pope County states that Rufus and Elizabeth were married on 1 Decmber 1861. In February of 1862, he enlisted in Company A, 1st Battalion Arkansas Cavalry, C.S.A., serving under Colonel Stirman. He fought at Shiloh in Tennessee on April 6 and 7, 1862, and was captured at Iuka, Mississippi, about three days later. He was subsequently paroled, according to The History of the Shinn Family, by Josiah Shinn, 1903, but his military record shows that he was absent without leave in January 1863; also, that he never received any pay for himself nor his horse, which he apparently furnished for the Cavalry.

Rufus and Elizabeth Robinson Bailey had the following children:

- i. George Alexander Bailey, born 18 January 1863 at Galla Rock, Pope County, Arkansas
- ii. Richard Abraham Bailey, born 29 February 1866, was usually called "Dick". He married Bertha _____, and they had two children: a daughter, JoAnne Bailey, and a son, Earl Bailey.
- iii. Caledonia (called "Donna") Bailey was born about 1867. She never married.

Elizabeth Robinson Bailey died when her daughter, Caledonia, was born and probably is buried at Galla Rock Cemetery. After her death, Rufus married (2) Elizabeth Malinda Shinn Shoptaw on 4 August 1867. Elizabeth Malinda was the daughter of Littleton C. and Nellie Tucker Shinn, a prominent Pope County family who had moved in 1840 from Cararrus County, N.C., where Elizabeth was born 3 February 1836. Elizabeth Malinda was the widow of John Wycliffe Shoptaw who had served in the same Cavalry unit with Rufus and never returned from the war. Rufus homesteaded a farm at Mill Creek, 7 miles west of Russellville, Arkansas, and it was there that he and Elizabeth Malinda Bailey raised their seven children. Those children were:

- iv. Evalina Bailey, born 1868, died 1927, married a Mr. Price
- v. Virginia Elizabeth Bailey, born 1870, died 1949, lived at Mill Creek
- vi. Laura Ellen Bailey, born 1871, died 1955

7. FRANCIS BAKER BAILEY, born 1 May, 1796 in Mecklenburg County, Virginia, died in January of 1855. He married Evalina B. Hill in Mecklenburgh County, on 6 May 1819. She was born 26 March 1802 and died in July of 1854. Evalina was the daughter of Elizabeth Hill Clark and her first husband, John Hill. The children of Francis Baker and Evalina B. Bailey were:

Francis Baker Bailey served as a justice of the peace in Virginia. He apparently was of an adventurous nature, for in 1833 he left Virginia, spent 1834-1836 in Kentucky and Tennessee, and arrived in Crawford County, Arkansas in 1837. He was in Fort Smith, Arkansas, in 1841, then left there for Texas on a prospecting tour in 1845 (History of Texas, Tarrant and Parker Counties, 1895, p. 623). Next came a sojourn in Illinois, and in 1848 he was in Warsaw, Missouri. (Knowledge of his travels is revealed through letters written by Francis, which are in the possession of some of his descendants.) In 1835, Francis Baker Bailey had settled with his family in Galla Rock, Pope County, Arkansas, where he built and operated an iron works. An iron headstone in the Galla Rock Cemetery is presumed to be his, although no inscription is visible now.

8. RUFFUS ALEXANDER BAILEY was born in Crawford County, Arkansas, on 26 June 1839, and he died 26 September 1913, (This part of

6. PETER COCK BAILEY was born 9 October 1762 (His pension application indicates he was born in 1762 and that he was a descendant of William Bailey and Abraham Bailey) in Henrico County, Virginia. (Note: Account of Peter Cock Bailey to Roger C. Bailey, his guardian, dated 1 January 1780 and recorded 7 August 1780, Charlotte County, Va., Guardian Book I, Page 100, states his birth year was 1765.) Peter Cock Bailey entered service as a Revolutionary War soldier in Granville County, N.C. and served under Captain William Gill, Jr., and Colonel Thornton Yancey. He eventually received a pension of \$75.66 per annum for this service. In 1831, he moved from Mecklenburg County, Va., to Montgomery County, Tenn. (Virginia Pension Abstracts, Vol. 2, Kate McGhee, p. 91-93). He was security for Samuel Cox, who served as executor of the will of John Cox. In December 1786, Peter Bailey signed a receipt for 10 negroes, "in full of my legacy left me by my Grandfather Abraham Bailey pr. me." The receipt was exhibited in Court held in Charlotte County, Va., 1 October 1787, by Francis Barnes, Guardian of Peter Cock Bailey, and ordered to be recorded.

Peter Cock Bailey married 27 August 1792 Sarah Baker who died 23 January 1822. She was the daughter of Jane and Zachariah Baker (Bible record: "Mother was Sarah Baker, wife of Peter Bailey"). Their children were:

Bailey's line...to William Randolph's line...to corner Chatian(?) Bailey's line. Wit. Roger Cock Bailey, Thos. Williams, Darby Whitlow. SIGNED: Abraham Bailey."

History of Henrico Parish and Old St. John's Church, 1611-1904, Moore, p. ____: "A vestry held at Curles Church in 1730 - To Abraham Bailey, for John Worth, Brought over. 25,800 lbs. (of Tobacco) 1,164

p. 36: "Pursuant to an Order of Vestry held for Henrico Parish, 6 Dec. 1735: '...bounds of land bewtween Abraham Baly and Tabitha Ballou'".

p. 75: "Henrico Parish for the year 1745: To Abraham Baley for burying Mary Guinn, a mulatto, a poor person who happened to be taken ill and dyed at his House. 100 lbs (of Tobacco)"

p. 133-134: "Vestry held in Courthouse of Henrico Parish, Wednesday, 9 Nov 1768, for the parish Levy: To Abra. Bailey for maintaining Jemima Scott 2 years - 500. To Abra. Bayley for David Johnston - 300."

p. 145: "Vestry held at Richmond Town, Henrico County, Monday, 9 Dec 1771, for laying parish Levy: To Abra. Bailey, Const., his account allowed for removing 5 persons out of this parish - 237."

5. ROGER COCK BAILEY was born ca 1727 and died ca 1785. He received 140 acres of land on the north side of the James River in Henrico County, Virginia from Abraham Bailey on 7 March 1763 (Deed and Will Books, 1750-1767, Page 774). He purchased 60 acres of land on Bluestone Creek, Charlotte County, Va, in 1777. He served in the Revolutionary War in 1781 as a Corporal in Capt. James Gunn's Company of Virginia Regulars from Charlotte County, Va. (Virginia Colonial Militia, Crozier, Henrico County, 1774-1782) Roger Cock Bailey married (1) Mourning Hoskins (Will of Nicholas Giles, probated 1781, who had married Phoebe Bailey, widow of Thomas, names daughter Betty Hoskins and granddaughter Mourning Bailey. Cockes and Cousins, Vol. II, p. 20). Also, Nicholas Giles and Roger Cock Bailey were neighbors in Henrico County: "...Between Roger Cock Bailey of Henrico County and Thomas Williams 7 lbs - 12 acres small tract once sold by Luzby Turpin - Cornelius Creek Corner line of Nicholas Giles to line of Roger Cock Bailey." Henrico County June Court 1772 (Ibid).

Roger Cock Bailey married (2) Elizabeth _____, a widow. (As a widow of Roger Cock Bailey, she lived alone in Charlotte County, Va. Court Records O.B. 7, 1789-1794.)

Cotrall sells Wm. North of Henrico Par. for L20. 50 acres on S. side Deep Run, Old House Branch, being the plantation first settled by Thos. Baley. Signed Thomas Cotrall. Wit: Abra. Childers, Elizabeth x Childers. Recorded July 1736."

Thomas Bailie had at least two children:

i. Thomas Bailie, Jr. (relationship necessarily inferred by the use of the term "Sr." - Colonial Abstracts, Court Orders, Charles City County, Va., 1658-1661, p.49).

ii. Abraham Bailey (Sr.) (relationship necessarily inferred by the Revolutionary War pension application of Peter Cock Bailey who named his grandfather, Abraham Bailey (Jr.), and his first ancestor at Jamestown, William Bailey. His grandfather was the son of Abraham Bailey, Sr. - Cockes and Cousins, Vol II, p. 8).

3. ABRAHAM BAILEY (Sr.) died ca 1713 (Inventory, Cockes and Cousins, Vol. II, p. 8). Cavaliers, Vol. II, p. 325, states, "Mr. Thomas Peren, 140 acres Henrico Co. in Verina Par. on N side of James Riv. 20 Oct. 1688, p. 666. Adj. Mr. Richard Peren; and Abraham Bayly; on Cornelius Creek; to Wm. Giles (Gyles); & Thomas Bayly. Trans of 3 pers. Thomas Mortin (or Martin), Jonathan Bayly, Wm. Jesop." Page 326: "Mr. Abraham Bayly 142 acs Henrico Co. in Verina Par. on N side of James Riv. called Mount Pelom (or Pelom); _____ of Oct 1688, p. 667. Beg. nigh the goeing over of Cornelius Creek; to Mr. Burton; on head of Holly Br. Trans of 3 pers: Jno Good, Mary & Frank _____." Page 363: "William Glover 217 acs. Henrico Co. N side of James Riv. 28 Apr 1691, p. 160...adj. William Ballue & land of Abraham Bayley."

Abraham Bailey had at least one child: Abraham Bailey, Jr. (Cockes and Cousins, Vol. II, p. 8).

4. ABRAHAM BAILEY (Jr.) was born ca 1694, died after 1774, and was named in the Revolutionary War pension application of his grandson, Peter Cock Bailey. He married Temperance Cocke prior to 1720. She was born ca 1700. Children born to Abraham and Temperance Bailey were:

William Bayley
of Jamestown, Virginia
and One Branch of His Descendants
1583-1979

Most of the following was researched and compiled by C. Tennyson Bailey of Russellville, Arkansas. Arabic numerals indicate descending generation.

1. WILLIAM BAYLEY, born in 1583, arrived at Jamestown Colony, Virginia aboard the ship "Prosperous" in May 1610. (Ship Passenger Lists, The South 1538-1825, Boyer, p.10 NOTE: This arrival was ten years prior to the arrival of the famous "Mayflower" passengers at Cape Cod, Massachusetts in December of 1620.) Mary, his wife, was born ca 1600, arrived in the ship "George" in 1617. A son, Thomas, was born to them ca 1620 in Jamestown. This family was reported in the 1624 Musters of the Inhabitants in Virginia as being in the "West & Sherley hundred, Charles Cities" on January 22, 1694. (Hotten: Original Lists of Persons of Quality 1600-1700, p205) In the original records of this Muster, William Bayley's valuable assets are listed as one house, one cow, 12 pounds of lead, 1 pound of powder, 150 pounds of fish, "corne", a gun, and 12 "poultrye." William Baly was granted a "pattent" for 100 acres in "The Corporacon of Charles Citie" and again, William Baily was granted a "pattent" for 50 acres in "the Territory of Greate Weyonoke" (Hotten, p. 268 and 269) William Bailey was named in the Revolutionary War pension application of his great-great-great-grandson, Peter Cock Bailey as an ancestor who was the first settler at Jamestown Colony.
2. THOMAS BAILIE was born in 1620 at Jamestown, Virginia. His father, William Bayley, had settled in Henrico County along the James River. On the colonial map, "Curles of the James", in Henrico County, Thos. Bailie is shown occupying the west side of Bailey Creek where it emptied into the James River. Wm. Baily is shown directly opposite on the east side of Bailey Creek. In Cavaliers and Pioneers, Patent Book No. I, Part I, p.26, we find the following entry: "THOMAS BAILIE (Baylie), 150 acs. Chas. City Co., 9 July 1635, p. 215. On the S & near the mouth of Baylys Cr., beg. at a small swamp with a little brooke running in the "middest" of it & extending S. into the woods. 50 acs. due until him as heire of his father William Baylie who dyed possessed thereof & 100 acs. fro trans of 2 pers. Mary Welsh & Mary ____." In Vol. II of Colonial Abstracts, Court Orders, Charles City County, Va, 1658-1661, Beverly Fleet, p. 11, "Mrs. Mary Wests sells Ardington 150 acres...wch so land did formerly belong to Mr. Thomas Bayly and was purchased of him by the so John Butler dec'd. Recorded August 1658." On page 48 of the same volume, Thos. Baylie Sr. signed as witness to a power of attorney on 23 Sept. 1658. On Page 49, Thomas Baylie served as a witness to a legan document on 8 Sept 1659. Cavaliers, Vol II, p. 109: "Wm. Blechinden 150 acres Nansimond Co., 28 Oct 1672, Granted to Thomas Bailey & escheated..." In Colonial Abstracts of Virginia, Henrico Co. Vol 21, Fleet, p. 31, p. 561 Deed 5 July 1736. Tho.

of powder for the Garrison of the former place when it was besieged by the Indians. Having obtained this she returned and thus saved the Garrison and other inmates from death at savage hands. The distance between the two forts was more than a hundred miles, the whole of it was a wilderness road.

1800. Her son William, grown to full manhood, took Mary Cooper, whose home was on the farm now owned by George Pullins, Esq., on the Kanawha river about nine miles above Point Pleasant in a canoe, to Gallipolis where they were united in marriage, the first Virginians married in the old French town. (See Records of Gallia county, Ohio.)

1802. Her husband, John Bailey, died and was buried on the Joseph Carroll farm, fifteen miles above Charleston, on an eminence overlooking the beautiful Kanawha and there he now reposes. A second time Anne Bailey was a widow and she went to live with her son William Trotter. She rode back and forth from Point Pleasant to Lewisburg and Staunton, acting in the capacity of letter carrier

and express messenger, and thus she was employed for several years.

1817. She made her last visit to Charleston and there and in that vicinity spent the summer of that year.

1818. She removed with her son to Harrison township, Gallia county, Ohio, he having sold his farm on the Kanawha about three miles above Point Pleasant, the preceding year to William Sterrett, the consideration being fourteen hundred dollars, current money of Virginia. (See Records, Mason County Clerk's Office.)

1820. About this time she was a frequent visitor at Gallipolis where she was ever a welcome visitor in the homes of the old French settlers of that place. Her home was nine miles away and she was in the habit of walking the whole distance.

1825. November 22nd, Anne Bailey died suddenly at night, while sleeping with her two little grandchildren, one of whom, the aged Mrs. Wiley, still lives at Gallipolis. For seventy-six years her remains reposed in the Trotter graveyard in the vicinity in which she lived, her grave being kept

1901. The members of the Point Pleasant Battle Monument Commission learned that the relatives of Anne Bailey were willing that her bones should be removed to Point Pleasant. On Saturday, October 5th, Hon. John P. Austin, accompanied by Mr. Norman Gibson, of Henderson, West Virginia, was dispatched to the graveyard in Gallia county, Ohio, where, on

that day the remains were exhumed and the next day conveyed to Point Pleasant, where on the 10th of October they were reinterred in the Monument Park under the auspices of the Col. Charles Lewis Chapter, Daughters of the Revolution, and here they will repose while thousands who hereafter visit the spot will learn the story of her strange and eventful life.

Those Dirty Girtys

(From "Biographical Sketches with other literary remains of the late John W. Campbell, Judge of the U. S. Court for the District of Ohio" By his widow, 1838)

Perhaps there was no part of America so highly prized by the aboriginals as Kentucky. To them its importance consisted not so much in the fertility of soil as in the abundance of game which it afforded. Indeed, by common consent, they abstained from occupying it with their families, reserving it exclusively for a great hunting ground: The interminable cane brakes and numerous licks, yielded subsistence to such vast herds of buffaloes and deer, as have never been seen elsewhere.

It is not at all astonishing that the Indians should have defended, with great obstinacy, a country so dear to them, against the incursions of the whites. That they were vigilant, active and cruel cannot be denied. They were provoked to a degree of phrenzy, which led to acts of daring and outrage, shocking humanity. In their atrocities they had the aid and countenance of the Girtys, of whom a brief account will be given.

Girty, the father, was an emigrant from Ireland, about eighty

years ago, if report can be relied on. He settled in Pennsylvania, where that liberty, which he sought, degenerated in his possession, into the basest licentiousness. His hours were wasted in idleness and beastly intemperance. — Nothing ranked higher in his estimation, or so entirely commanded his regard, as a jug of whiskey. "Grog was his song, and grog would he have." His sottishness turned his wife's affection. Ready for seduction, she yielded her heart to a neighboring rustic, who to remove all obstacles to their wishes, knocked Girty on the head and bore off the trophy of his prowess.

He left four sons, Thomas, Simon, George and James. — The three latter, were taken prisoners by the Shawanoes, Delawares and Senecas, in that war which developed the military talents of General Washington. George was adopted by the Delawares, and continued with them until his death. He became a perfect savage — his manners being entirely Indian. To consummate cunning he added the most fearless intrepidity. He fought in the battles of Kenhawa, blue Licks and Sandusky, and gained himself much distinction for skill and bravery. In his latter years, like his father, he gave

while our abhorrence of the Rebellion found vent in our expressed desire to 'Hang Jeff Davis on a sour apple tree.'

"In this way the song with its five verses was put together, piecemeal, and when sung at night, in the barracks, became immensely popular.

"Every Saturday afternoon Gilmore's Band came down from the city to play for dress parade, accompanied by crowds of people in excursion steamers. One Saturday the quartette took P. S. Gilmore into one of the casemates, and sang the tune to him time and time again, while he played it on his cornet, and then noted the air in his band book. The next Saturday, when the regiment was at parade rest, the band started down the long front to the inspiring strains of 'John Brown,' then played by a band for the first time.

"When the regiment left Boston for Harper's Ferry, it stopped for dinner in City Hall Square, New

York. After dinner the line was reformed for the march down Broadway to the Ferry. When the order 'Forward march' rang down the line, our band struck up our favorite tune, the regiment joined in the refrain, and their steady tramp was emphasized by the chorus from a thousand throats of 'Glory Hallelujah.' The song soon became a national one, while in the Army of the Potomac the 12th Mass. was known as the 'Hallelujah Regiment.' "

Note: It is generally known that Julia Ward Howe wrote the Battle Hymn of the Republic to the measure of the John Brown song. She heard thousands of soldiers singing with great fervor their battle song and was profoundly impressed. At the suggestion of a friend that more appropriate words might be written for the music she composed her famous poem. The soldiers, however, to the end of the war clung to the words of the John Brown song.

Dates in the Life of Anne Bailey

By Virgil A. Lewis
In Ohio Archaeological
and Historical Publications, 1908

(Mr. Lewis is the State Historian of West Virginia, the author of "The History of West Virginia" and many valuable publications concerning the early historical events in the Ohio Valley.)

All that was earthly of Anne Bailey, the Pioneer Heroine of the Great Kanawha Valley, that has not crumbled to dust, has been removed to Point Pleasant and re-interred in Tu-Endie-Wei Park. It is, therefore, now time to eliminate from the story of her wonderful career and life of adventure, as scout and messenger, everything of a mythical legendary, fabulous and fanciful

character, and to learn and to know the real narrative—the truth—regarding that record female heroism which has no parallel in the annals of the Border Wars. The keeping of her grave is now in care of the Colonel Charles Lewis Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution and they must answer a thousand questions regarding her, whose bones they keep. Anne Bailey was herself a Daughter of the Revolution, a real one, who served her country faithfully and well when that struggle was in progress. Then this western border was the "Back Door of the Revolution," and the men and women who kept back from it the savage allies of Great Britain were the "Rear Guard

of the Revolution." Anne Bailey was one of these; and the school children should be able to tell to the thousands who will henceforth visit her tomb, the real story of her life.

The following facts obtained from Border Annals, from official records, and from persons who knew Anne Bailey, will help them to do this:

1742. Anne Bailey, whose maiden name was Hennis, was born in Liverpool, the western metropolis of England the home of her father, who, in early life, had been wounded at the battle of Blenheim, while serving under the Duke of Marlborough. She was named for Queen Anne.

1747. When five years of age her mother took her to London to visit relatives, and for the first time and probably the last, she saw the splendors of the British capital. While there she witnessed the execution, April 9th, of Lord Lovet on a charge of treason.

1748 to 1760. She resided in Liverpool and attended school in that city.

1761. Both parents were dead and she was alone in a great city. This year she crossed the Atlantic to join her relatives, the Bells who had emigrated to Virginia some years before. A journey over the Blue Ridge brought her to their home near Staunton in the Shenandoah Valley.

1765. She wedded Richard Trotter, who had been at Braddock's Defeat and was prominent in Border Wars. Representatives of his family still reside in the Shenandoah Valley.

1774. On the 10th day of October, her husband, Richard Trotter, was killed in the battle of Point Pleasant.

1774 to 1785. Eleven years of widowhood. When she heard of

the death of her husband a strange wild dream seemed to possess her and she vowed revenge on the Indian race. Having matured her plans she submitted them to Mrs. Moses Mann then residing in Augusta, but afterward in Bath county. She approved them and gave a home to the orphan son. It was now that Anne Bailey abandoned that home life that had once been so dear to her and entered upon that military career which has made her name famous for all time. Clad in the male costume of the Border, with rifle in hand, she attended the militia musters and urged men to go to war against the Indians in defense of hopeless women and children; or to enlist in the continental army and fight the Briton from the sea. Then she became messenger and scout going from one frontier post to another, thus continuing that career of female heroism which made her name a familiar one to the pioneers.

1785. She was again united in marriage, this time to John Bailey, a distinguished border leader of southwest Virginia. He had assisted in carrying Col. Charles Lewis off the field when fatally wounded at the battle of Point Pleasant. Rev. John McCue was in the County Clerk's office at Lewisburg.)

1788. She went with her husband to Fort Lee which was built by the Clendenins that year on the present site of the city of Charleston, the capital of West Virginia. The husband was a member of the Garrison and she served as messenger between Fort Lee and Fort Randolph, at Point Pleasant.

1791. She made her famous ride from Fort Lee to Fort Savannah at Lewisburg to secure a supply
