Levi Beer, Pvt Co. B. 27th U. S. Colored Troops

State of Ohio, County of Columbiana,

In the matter of pension claim of Emma Beer, widow of Levi Beer late Pvt. of Co. B. 27th Colored Troops.

Personally appeared before me a Notary Public in and for the aforesaid County and State. Benjamin Evans who after being duly sworn according to law declares in relation to the aforesaid case as follows;

That he is one of the trustees of the Woodland Cemetery at Salineville, Ohio and make the following statement from the records of said cemetery now in my possession. The records show that Levi Beer's first wife was buried in said cemetery, that Mrs. Levi Beer died December 22, 1886 and was buried on Levi Beers lot No. 147 on the 24th day of December 1886 at 1 am. The records also shows that Levi Beer the above said soldier died on 23rd day of January 1900 and was buried on his own lot No. 147 in said cemetery. I further certify that I have no interest in the above claim.

In the matter of pension claim No. 714326 of Emma Beer, widow of Levi Beer, Co. B. 27th U. S. Colored Troops.

Personally appeared before me a Notary Public in and for the aforesaid County and State, J. S. Reed who after being duly sworn according to law declares in relation to aforesaid case as follows to wit;

That his post office address is Salineville, Ohio and his present age is 32 years. That he has known the said soldier and his whereabouts from boyhood up to the present time. That he remembers said soldiers first wife quite well and remembers of her death in December 1886 that said soldier and his first wife lived together until her death, also affiant remembers of the marriage of said soldier to Emma Simpson on the 23 day of May 1888, affiant futherdeclares that from the time of his first knowledge of said soldier and his family, said soldier lived peaceable with his first wife to her death and also lived peaceable with his last wife who is Claimant in this case. That to his knowledge no divorce was ever asked for in eith case. I have been about them a great deal and do not believe that either party in either marriage ever thought of seeking for a divorce, affiant futher states that he knows without a doubt that claimant was not previously married, affiant says that his means of knowing the above facts are from a personal acquaintance and from bring at their home very often. That he has no interest direct or indirect in the prosecution of this case.
