The records show that Nathan bought five acres of land in New Haven, 1654, but it would seem more likely he sold 5 acres, probably the old home, because he moved to East Hampton, LI, and bought land on the Northwest Road at East Hampton, July 13, 1653. He is next heard from at Southold, L. I. where he purchased some more land. He soon came back to Hempstead, where in 1657 he became one of the first settlers in East Hempstead. He lived for nine years on the north end of B Street, on the east side of the street in East Hempstead.

In the Fall or Winter of 1665-66 seven men, including Nathan, decided to buy land at what is now called Matinecock. They went there as squatters but offered to buy land from the Matinecock Indians. During the time Nathan and his neighbors lived in the Matinecock area the following events occurred:

March 14, 1666 - The Indians sent the governor a letter saying they did not want to sell their land but they would respect the seven families now living at Matinecock. The governor told the inhabitants of Matinecock to agree with the Indians until they could be induced to sell more land.

September 21, 1666 - The Governor R. Nicolls sent a letter to the constable of Hempstead County that he received a petition from the Matinecock Indians complaining that purchasers of their lands did not pay them. The governor appointed John Underhill as the Indian's Attorney.

The BIRDSALL Family

Henry Birdsall Nathan's father died about July or August, 1651, as his will was proved September 28, 1651. He was then in Salem, Mass. and was about 65 years old. His estate is recorded in the Probate Records of Essex County, Salem, Mass., Vol. 1, Page 123:

Nathan Birdsall, February 16, 1653, conveyed to his brother-in-law, Henry Cook, the lot in Salem which belonged to Nathan's father. A few months later, July 5, 1653, Nathan bought land at East Hampton Long Island.

Nathan Birdsall, 1654, five acres of land. I do not know whether he bought or sold five acres in this transaction, but he must have sold it and used the money to make the following transactions: Southold, L. I. 1667; Westmoreland, 1692; Matinecock, 1664; and Birdsall Swamp at Oyster Bay, 1677. In Matinecock, he was one of seven founders of a settlement they wanted to call Killingworth.

Mr. Rulon of Washington, D. C. He did much research work in the Boston Transcript of 1920-43. Mr. Rulon thinks Henry had three sons, Samuel, Stephen and Nathan; and Nathan had the seven sons, which would add another generation. That would account for the tradition of "three brothers" mentioned in so many biographies, and also it would put the generations closer together, making the boys marry at about 20 years of age instead of about 30 years. I cannot go along with that because it would make the recorded birthdates of the seven brothers all wrong. I do not know where those original dates came from but they seem to be well established by Mrs. Bunker. She wrote the book LONG ISLAND GENEALOGIES. According to many biographies one of the three brothers went south (West Indies) one went to Canada, and the other was Nathan who had the seven boys in Matinecock. Biographies are usually written from some one's memory and they are often wrong. I therefore do not agree with that tradition. Whether Nathan married Temperance Peltrin is a controversial question. Mrs. Bunker revised her book for the purpose of correcting herself on that very question. I wish some one would prove it either way.

IN AMERICA

GENERATIONS 1 and 2

HENRY BIRDSALL arrived in America, a widower, 1632, near Boston with his daughter Judith, age 13, and son Nathan, age 21. He was a member of the First Church, Salem, and known as Birdsall, 1636. He was registered as a Freeman at Salem, May 2, 1638.

The clerks apparently spelled names as they sounded as other well known names were similarly misspelled. I have used the correct spelling BIRDSALL rather than confuse the issue further by using the Clerk's various spellings.

Judith if her birth date is 1619 and every one does not agree on that, was 13 years old when she arrived in America. She undoubtedly kept house for her father and brother. Her father got into trouble with the Court for "stealing" an Indian girl. This trouble was probably caused by Judith running around with Henry Cook and neglecting her housekeeping duties. I don't think he "stole" the Indian girl. He may have cheated on the wages though. Judith married Henry Cook, in 1639.

Nathan, son of Henry, was 21 years old when he arrived in America, if his birthdate was 1611, and that is one thing every one seems to be agreed upon. Women were scarce so he did not marry for another 12 years at least, any way he never stayed in one place long enough to get married and he travelled mostly among the indians. He did not marry Temperance Baldwin as Mrs. Bunker first reported in her book. Temperance married Nathan Burwell and I believe Burwell and Birdsall are two different people. Nathan apparently made his living buying land from the indians and selling it to the white people.

Nathan first appears in New Haven, October 4, 1643, when he was taken to Court for taking 13 pounds from Mr. Newman's house. He had worked in his house and had a temptation. He was ordered to pay back double the amount. The next year Nathan was made a Freeholder in New Haven, 1644, by Theophilus. He was remitted of his defects in the Army (Army), provided he attend training hitherto. At that time every able-bodied male belonged to the army.

Nathan married about 1645, age about 34. During Nathan's twenties he must have been working in the wilderness where he became likeable to the indians. I can find no trace or record of whom he married. His first son, Benjamin, was born 1646.

Henry Birdsall, Nathan's father apparently lived for a year or two with Nathan in New Haven. I presume to keep him out of trouble during his troubles with Mr. Newman, the army and getting married, and while living there was chosen by the Court of New Haven, December 3, 1644, to keep the Meeting House clean upon all public meetings for 3 pounds 15 shillings a year. "Good" Birdsall, as he was called, probably to identify him from his not-so-good son was paid 3 pounds 17 shillings for work on a bridge.
