## Blum Family Cemetery

Teri Bromley

Located in the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 33, of Township 1 North, Range 6 West, Mascoutah Township, St. Clair Co., Illinois, east of Mascoutah due south of the intersection of Richter Road and Route 177, in a field on the Roy KLINGELHOEFER farm. The cemetery is on the original property of J. George and John BLUM who were brothers. Teri BROMLEY visited the farm in December 2001.

The only marker that remains is a stone containing the family name of BLUM, although the cemetery is known to have contained 20 or more graves. Four graves were moved to the Mascoutah City Cemetery during the 1940's per Mr. KLINGELHOEFER, but no records could be obtained to verify this.
