

Cabeen Family

The Cabeen Family of Muskingum County, Ohio

Thomas Cabeen, s/o Thomas & Catherine Kyle Cabeen was born in Glasgow, Scotland, 10 Sept. 1745 and died in Ireland 12 Aug. 1798. He married Catherine McCrahar, b. 25 Aug. 1753, Ireland, d. 12 April 1843, Muskingum Co., Ohio. She is buried in Salt Creek Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

Thomas and Catherine lived at Balleymena, Co. Antrim and had nine children, all of whom were b. at Balleymana, Ireland. Their fifth son John was the first to come to America. The entire family followed John to America but the father Thomas returned to Ireland in 1798 and died there.
