Structure awaits demolition

**Old Emden hotel
to be torn down**

EMDEN - One of the oldest structures in town, a former hotel, is scheduled to be razed due to the construction of Route 121.

The building was a farm house before the village of Emden was established, about 117 years ago. When the Illinois Central railroad came through the village, the house was converted into a hotel.

The proprietor was a Snyder and the inn was called Snyder Hotel. Mary Ann Snyder, a widow, married William T. Carnahan July 24, 1881, and the place later became known as the Carnahan Hotel.

A plate reading "Carnahan House" was on the cap worn by the man from the hotel when he met the trains.

There are no known dates or names of owners of the structure until it was sold in the early 1900s to John H. and

Johanna Ringering Rademaker. They moved from the house in about 1920.

It is believed that the property was purchased about 1944 by William and Katherine Komnick, both deceased. The property remained in the Komnick family until about two years ago when it was bought by Gene and Wanda Cross, whose farm home is located just southwest of the junction of highways 136 and 121.



Pioneer Business Man In
Blanchester Taken
At 90

HAD SUFFERED FALL

Which Hastened Death—
Services Thursday
At 11 A. M.

William H. Carnahan, 90, one of Blanchester's early business leaders, died at the Deaconess Hospital, Cincinnati, Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 from complications which followed a fall and injuries almost seven months ago at the Hotel Bindley, where he has resided for a number of years.

Funeral services are to be held at the Hannah Funeral Home here Thursday morning at 11 o'clock in charge of Rev. R. S. Kellerman, with interment in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

Surviving is a daughter, Mrs. Theodore Bange, of Cincinnati, and a granddaughter, Jean Bange. Several nieces and nephews also survive, including Harley and Mart Carnahan, of this place. A brother, James Carnahan, of Washington C. H., now an invalid, is the sole survivor of a family of eight children of Mr. and Mrs. David Carnahan. The Carnahans were descendants of a pioneer family which originally settled in Clinton county from Kentucky in 1811.

The Carnahan family lived near Cuba when William H. was born, and later moved to the place on Route 28 now occupied by L. Wigginton. He engaged in farming during his younger days, coming then to Blanchester where he engaged for many years in the buggy and implement business. He also owned a blacksmith shop on the present site of the Blanchester Motor Co.

Mr. Carnahan was an officer and director in the old Merchant & Farmers Bank; it having at one time been in his building on South Broadway. The brick Carnahan Block, now owned by William Rogers, and erected by Mr. Carnahan in 1895-6, was one of the few business structures to survive the Blanchester fire. He also built the imposing home on West Main street now the property of Dr. H. E. Gibson, in which he lived for a number of years.

Mr. Carnahan's wife preceded him in death two decades ago.

WILLIAM CARNAHAN FAMILY

The first ancestor known to us at this time was Thomas Carnahan. He was born about 1780 in Pa. He and his wife Hannah, lived in Clarion Co. Thomas died between 1847 and 1850, leaving his widow and the following children: James, William, Betsy, Mary, John, Margaret, Polly, and Jane.

My great grandfather was James, who was born in Clarion, Co. about 1806 and died Dec. 15, 1863, buried at Munderf, Jeff Co. He married Mary Randolph in 1823. They were the parents of eleven children. When James and Mary moved to Polk Twp. between 1850 and 1860, they brought their two youngest sons, Hugh and Benjamin. By 1870 their two oldest sons, William and Thomas had moved to Polk Twp. As far as we know their other children, David, Taylor, James, Phoebe, Isabel, Lucinda, and Eliza remained in Clarion Co.

My grandfather Thomas, was born Oct. 20, 1829, in Clarion Co. He was a boat builder there, and a carpenter when he lived in Munderf, served in Civil War, married Mary Taylor in 1864, had five children, of whom my father James, was the oldest, born June 25, 1865. James made his first voyage rafting down the Clarion River at age of 15, was farmer and lumberman, married Bertha Ecklund in 1900. Bertha born in Sweden in 1881, died 1923. Both buried in Munderf. They had ten children, I being number eight.

I, William Monroe, was born June 10, 1918, at Munderf. I spent my childhood and youth on the family farm. Attended Munderf school and graduated from Brockville High School in 1935, inducted in U.S. Army, June 10, 1941, and discharged in 1945. I married Lois Lindholm of Brockway in 1943, and we have four children. Wesley, who lives one and a half away with his wife and two daughters; Diana, who lives in Bath, N.Y. with her three sons; Barry, living at home yet; and Randall, who lives in Brockway with wife and son.

CARNAHAN

A wholesome, interesting life came to a close at noon time, Monday, May 12, when J. W. Carnahan laid down his earthly burdens after nearly 89 years of living. Through all these years he had maintained an optimistic outlook and friendly spirit toward all. Of the old school, kindly and courteous at all times, and considerate of others, he made and held friends, who with his family, will miss his cheery presence.

A man of sterling integrity, Mr. Carnahan had a diversified knowledge of current issues of the day, and never lost his zest for living.

Mr. Carnahan was intensely practical, and he had decided viewpoints on public affairs, but they were logical and fair to all sides. He disliked wrong doing and lived in accordance with the golden rule, being honest and square in all his dealings.

With a well developed sense of humor and a store of information from reading and personal experiences, Mr. Carnahan was welcomed in any group he chose to join, and many relied upon his judgment in various problems. With his passing the community has lost a good citizen.

Joseph Wilson Carnahan was born in Youngstown, Pennsylvania, July 31, 1858. He grew to young manhood there, and while quite young remembered his father's return from the Civil War.

At age of 20 he started west arriving in Kansas in 1878. He worked as a farm hand for a short time, then taught school for 15 years in Brown, Marshall and Washington counties, afterwards farming in Washington.

In September, 1885, he married Alberta Pearl Lynch who passed away in November 1945. In 1902 Mr. and Mrs. Carnahan moved to a farm east of Clay Center, and in 1925 they came to Clay Center.

Since the death of his companion, Mr. Carnahan had made his home most of the time with his son Jim and wife, on the old home place east of Clay Center.

A few weeks ago Mr. Carnahan was taken to the Clay Center Municipal hospital for an operation, from which he seemed to recover quite well, but suddenly took worse and passed away on May 12th 1947 at the age of 88 years, 9 months and 12 days.

J. W. Carnahan was active in both the political and farm organizations of the community. He served two terms as state representative and received recognition for his constituents.

He is survived by three sons, Joe, James and Don Carnahan of Clay Center, and one daughter, Mary Chayer of Topeka; ten grandchildren and four great grandchildren, also three brothers, and a host of friends who cherish his memory.

SUICIDE -
THE COURSE OF TRUE LOVE, ETC....

William CARNAHAN whose parents reside near the Wabash freight depot in this city, committed suicide at the residence of Daniel H. Williams, in Shiloh township, on last Saturday morning by taking strychnine. We give the following facts furnished us by Mr. Williams:

Mr. Carnahan, who was about 22 years of age had been working as a farm hand for James Burgett (whose farm adjoins that of Mr. Williams) during the spring and up to harvest. It appears that the young man and Miss. Matilda Burgett, daughter of the farmer, became very much attached to each other. Early last week the young man made a visit to Mr. Burgett's and it seems that a disagreement occurred between Miss. Matilda and her parents concerning Carnahan, and on Tuesday evening about 10 o'clock, the young people went to the house of James North, a brother-in-law of the young lady, and staid until the next morning. On Wednesday morning they came to the house of Mr. Williams, where young Carnahan engaged boarding for the young lady until Saturday, when it was understood he would return and take her to Paris township, and there they would be married. Early on Saturday morning, Mr. Carnahan hired a spring wagon and 2 horses at Mr. Hannasy's livery stable and with his sister started after the young lady, and reached the house of Mr. Williams about 8 a.m.

Mr. Carnahan took with him half a bottle of whiskey and also a quantity of strychnine. It is believed by his sister that he put a portion of the poison in the bottle. He took an occasional drink on his way out, and when within about a quarter of a mile of Mr. Williams residence, he drank the remainder of the whiskey, after shaking the bottle thoroughly. On arriving at the house, he appeared in good health, and after remaining seated in a chair some ten minutes, he fell prostrate to the floor, apparently in a fit. Dr. Roberts of Redmon, was immediately sent for and was with the sick man about an hour and a half before he died. He was beyond medical skill when the doctor arrived. Carnahan admitted that he had poisoned himself, and told the parties present to examine his pocket, where a portion of the poison was still in a package. He refused to give any reason for his rash act. He died about 30 minutes before 12 o'clock, on Saturday morning. An inquest was held by coroner, J.W. Garner over the body, and a verdict rendered to the effect that "he took his own life, of his own free will and accord."

His remains were interred in Edgar cemetery on last Sunday afternoon. The report that Miss. Burgett had taken poison is without foundation.

CARNAHAN IS BURIED HERE - OLD RESIDENT

Funeral services for PORTER M. CARNAHAN, 82 years old, of Monmouth, native and former prominent resident of Mercer county, were held at 2 p.m. yesterday at the United Presbyterian church in Aledo. Burial was in the Aledo cemetery. Mr. Carnahan died Friday, Jan 22, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. George Morrison, 5 Washington Place, Meriden, Conn. He went to Meriden to visit about a month ago and was taken ill with pleurisy on Jan 5. He was much improved and resting comfortably but suffered three severe heart attacks which caused his death. Porter Montgomery Carnahan was born of pioneer parents on Jan 2, 1850, in Mercer county, the community being known as Nigger Ridge in derision of its anti-slavery sentiments. Among his earliest recollections was the passing through of fugitive slaves who were hidden in his father's home. In 1855 his father showed him the site of the future county seat of Mercer county. In 1856, the first railroad came through. Then came the Civil War when his father and brother marched away and he was left at home to run the farm. He was 15 when peace was declared. After finishing his education, he taught school for four years.

THREE CHILDREN SURVIVE- He was married Feb 12, 1873 to Jennie Lind McCrory, and for 58 years they traveled life's journey together. Three children survive: Herschel L. of Los Angeles, Calif; Frank M. of Tacoma, Wash., and Eva Carnahan Morrison of Meriden, Conn; also one grandchild Vera Jean Morrison.

WILLIAM M. CARNAHAN - Was born in Lawrence county, PA, June 20, 1818, where he lived until 1839, when he came to Mercer county, Illinois, and has resided here since that time. From his youth he was an earnest supporter of the abolition cause, and aided many a dusky son of the South to the land of the North Star. When the contest for freedom came he gave himself to his country's cause, but was discharged after one year's service, on account of ill health. In 1843 he was united in marriage to Miss. Sarah Ann Nevius. Eleven children were born to them, three of whom have preceded him to the better land. Seven, with their mother, were present at the funeral, one son William, being in California. Coming to Aledo to live in 1882 he entered the United Presbyterian church, of which he was a member at the time of his death which occurred May 16 th, at 5 p.m. Mr. Carnahan was a man well known to the people of Aledo and vicinity, especially to the Christian people for he sought their fellowship, and delighted in it.

MRS SAMUEL CARNAHAN, who has resided in Aledo for eight or ten years died on Wednesday evening last, and was buried at Peniel cemetery on Friday. Shortly after the death of Mr. Carnahan, which occurred about two years later, her mind partially failed her, and she has since been tenderly nursed and cared for by her youngest daughter, Linda who removed with her to Aledo. Mr. Carnahan was born in Westmoreland county. In 1836 he married Miss Martha Morrison. Seven children were born to them, four of whom are living. Mrs. Carnahan died in 1855.

In 1856, he, with his children removed to this county, locating on a farm in Center township. In 1863 he married Miss Lavinia Berkapile. By this union seven children were born all of whom are living.

Of Mr. Carnahan's children now living all were present but four. Of his thirty-five grand-children all were present but seven. Of his ten great-grand-children all were present but two.



Florence (nee Carnahan), age 88, res. St Paul, on June 4. Preceded in death by husband, Dr. Ralph R. Bradshaw and sister, Margaret Carnahan. Survived by 2 nieces and 2 nephews. Mrs Bradshaw was born in Clay Center, KS. on June 30, 1901. The daughter of the Rev. George E. Carnahan & Mary Florence Glasgow. She graduated from high school in Jamestown, KS. She attended the Univ of Northern Iowa where she graduated in 1922. In 1927 Mrs. Bradshaw moved to St Paul to become Girl Reserve (teen-age) Secretary (Director) for the St Paul YWCA. In 1932 she married Dr. Ralph R. Bradshaw. She continued as Secretary/Director until 1943. From 1945 to 1948 Mrs. Bradshaw was Secretary of the Leisure Time Council of the St Paul Community Chest. In 1948 Mrs. Bradshaw was appointed Executive Director of the St Paul YWCA, she served in this capacity until 1957. She left in 1957 to care for her husband Dr. Bradshaw who died in March 1959. Mrs. Bradshaw then returned to work as Director of the Neighborhood House on the West Side of St Paul. In 1960 she became activities director for the Wilder Foundation Senior Health Center. Mrs. Bradshaw retired in 1971. In 1983 Mrs. Bradshaw was named a Founding Feminist by the Minnesota Women's Political Caucus for "her leadership in spear heading the desegregation of the St Paul YWCA." She also received the Caucus's distinguished service award for her pioneer work in racial integration. Mrs. Bradshaw had been in declining health for the past several months. She spent her last years at Wilder Residence East. She will be missed by all those whose lives she has touched. A memorial service will be held on SUNDAY, JULY 1, 12 NOON AT CENTRAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, 500 CEDAR ST. Memorials preferred to St Paul YWCA or Central Presbyterian Church.

OBITUARIES

Former YWCA director Bradshaw dies

Florence Bradshaw, former executive director of the St. Paul YWCA who was instrumental in its integration, died Monday. She was 88.

A native of Clay Center, Kan., she graduated from the University of Northern Iowa in 1922, and came to St. Paul in 1927 to work for the YWCA as a girl reserve director.

She held that post until 1943, then was secretary of the Leisure Time Council for the St. Paul Community Chest from 1945 to 1948 before becoming executive director of the YWCA.

As director, Bradshaw developed lifelong friendships with several women. A few of these friends she met more than 40 years ago held a 48-hour vigil at Bradshaw's bedside before she died, said her nephew, E. David Cater.

Bradshaw led the desegregation of the YWCA with the hiring of black employees in addition to opening swimming and camping activities to black girls.

After retiring from the YWCA in 1957, she worked as director of Neighborhood House on the West Side and as activities director for the Senior Health Center of the

Wilder Foundation until 1971.

She was honored in 1983 by the Ramsey County Chapter of the Minnesota Women's Political Caucus as a founding feminist for her work in integrating the YWCA.

Bradshaw married Dr. Ralph Bradshaw in 1932. He died in 1959.

She is survived by nephews Douglas Cater of Oak Park, Ill., E. David Cater of Iowa City, Iowa, and two nieces, Margaret Swartz, of Houston and Alice Nelson, of Huntington Beach, Calif.

A memorial service will be held at noon, July 1, at Central Presbyterian Church, 500 Cedar St.

Feay and interment was made in the El Reno cemetery.



LIFE'S LABOR ENDED.

Death Tuesday of a Pioneer Citizen. Judge
Archibald A. Carnahan.

Hon. A. A. Carnahan died at his home in this city at 9:30 o'clock Tuesday evening, after an illness of but four days. The news of his death came as a sudden and sorrowful shock to the hundreds of his friends who had but so recently met him in his walks about town, and the very general expression of regret proved the high esteem in which he was held by all. Death was due primarily to an attack of pneumonia with which he was taken down on the evening of February 28 and was directly due to heart failure, that organ, for some time weak, failing under repeated violent spasms of coughing. On Tuesday afternoon and evening he was bright, hopeful and apparently on the high road to recovery, but as his son Harry sat reading to him about the hour named above, he suddenly collapsed and was dead in a moment.

The funeral occurred this afternoon from the Methodist church, under the auspices of the Masoua. Rev. H. G. Amhurst officiating, and was very largely attended.

Archibald A. Carnahan was one of the oldest, best known and most highly respected citizens of Cloud county, having been identified prominently with its history for thirty-five years, coming here at a day when it was yet a comparative wilderness, the home of the buffalo and the haunt of marauding bands of red men, and living to see it one of the most peaceful, prosperous and populous of Kansas communities. He was of Scotch-Irish descent, born at Loudonville, O., December 2, 1837. His father was a successful tanner, an original anti-slavery man and one of the founders of the liberty party in Ohio, doing much for fugitive slaves in the days of the "underground railway."

Judge Carnahan was educated at Northwood and at the Miami university. He studied law two years at Bucyrus and then left his native state to become a Kansan, locating at Olathe in 1860, in June of that year being admitted to the bar by Judge John Pettit at Wyandotte. He practiced law and taught school in Missouri until the war began, when he enlisted in Co. C., 2nd Kansas infantry, and served until the regiment was mustered out, when he re-enlisted in the 1st Kansas cavalry from which he was given an honorable discharge in February 1863 on account of a wound received in an engagement at Blue Springs, Mo., with Quantrell's band, on January 8, 1862, he having been in the hospital nearly a year. He also participated in the battle of Wilson's creek one of the earliest and most sanguinary battles of the war.

He spent about a year in New Mexico in 1864, returning to aid, in 1865-6, in the construction of the

Kansas Pacific railroad from Lawrence to Abilene. In 1867 he located in this county at Lake Sibley, and in 1868 was elected to the state senate from this district, then the Seventh, composed of the counties of Cloud, Marshall, Republic, Riley, Washington and the unorganized counties to the west. He served two years, during which time he took part in much valuable legislation and did much to aid the famine stricken settlers who suffered alike from grasshopper and Indian raids. It was while serving as senator that he met the lady who afterward became his wife—Miss Ollie Sheldon, to whom he was married at her home in Topeka on April 23, 1873, and who has been the richest blessing of his life. Mrs. Carnahan, with two sons, William E. and Harry T., survive and mourn him.

In the strenuous times of the county's early settlement Judge Carnahan was a valuable citizen, advising, helping and fighting as a volunteer soldier in the days of Indian raids and massacres. Through his long residence and the prominent part he took in local affairs he became probably as well known in county and state as any of our citizens.

During the administration of Gov. Glick Mr. Carnahan was appointed judge of the district court and from this came his title. He was receiver of the land office under Cleveland's first administration and once or twice was the Democratic nominee for congress, but failed of election. Of recent years he left the Democracy, was for a time identified with the People's party, but later took up socialism and was that party's candidate for associate justice in 1900.

Of genial nature and sunny disposition Judge Carnahan made his every acquaintance his friend. Prominent in Masonry, a Knight Templar and Shriner and one of the stays of the Eastern Star, his lodge affiliations were of the strongest. He was also a Workman and a Woodman.

During the administration of Gov. Glick Mr. Carnahan was appointed judge of the district court and from this came his title. He was receiver of the land office under Cleveland's first administration and once or twice was the Democratic nominee for congress, but failed of election. Of recent years he left the Democracy, was for a time identified with the People's party, but later took up socialism and was that party's candidate for associate justice in 1900.

Of genial nature and sunny disposition Judge Carnahan made his every acquaintance his friend. Prominent in Masonry, a Knight Templar and Shriner and one of the stays of the Eastern Star, his lodge affiliations were of the strongest. He was also a Workman and a Woodman.

In our acquaintance with him we never recall an instance in which he spoke unkindly of another and it was this kindness of heart and sunny disposition which drew men to him and will make his presence in the community missed more, perhaps, than the loss of any other man in it.

Funeral services for the late James G. Carnahan, which were held this morning at ten o'clock from the Kimball residence, 813 Ella street, were largely attended, the G. A. R., of which the deceased was a member, attending in a body.

Following the services at the home, the G. A. R. accompanied the body to Evergreen Home cemetery where a short service was held and interment made.

Rev. V. F. Clarke, of the Congregational church preached the sermon. The pallbearers were R. C. Hemphill, J. E. T. Dickenson, J. T. White, J. W. Jackson, J. W. Meeker and J. M. Brown.

Mary L. Carnahan departed this life Nov. 20th 1888 aged sixty one years eleven months and five days. Mary L. Dilley was born in the county of Mercer in the state of Pennsylvania December 15th 1826, and at the age of eighteen was married to William W. Carnahan who, after a companionship with deceased of more than forty-three years is now left to finish the journey of life alone. Deceased and her husband established their early home in the state of her birth, whence after a period of about ten years they moved to the state of Ohio. Twelve years of toil in this state inspired them to go farther westward which they did first stopping in the state of Wisconsin for four years and then coming to Long Island Kansas in the year of 1878, where deceased with her family has ever since resided.

To deceased were born three sons and and three daughters of whom Lafayette, John and Myrtle survive deceased and who this day, have one less tie on earth, one more in heaven. Deceased was converted and joined the church in the year 1857 and for thirty-one years has experienced the joy of religion.

Religion was not to her a sentiment it was a principal.

It was not to her a theory, it was a living reality.

GOT SHOT.

Little Robert Carnahan, 14 years of age, but of small stature, adopted son of L. K. Carnahan of this city, met with a very serious accident on Saturday, by being shot in the leg while out hunting along the banks of the river, in company with Al Skelton, a boy of about his own age. Each of the boys were carrying a shot gun, and through their anxiety to get a squirrel, or perhaps carelessness, Bob received a full charge of shot in the leg, just under the knee. The boys were alone at the time and the Skelton boy had to go for help, so he ran to the road, a distance of a quarter of a mile, to where folks were passing, leaving Bob alone in the woods and a messenger was sent to town; Mr. Carnahan and Dr. Bennie hastened to the unfortunate boy, on the Johnson farm one mile west of town and brought him home. The wound was probed but the shot could not be found and still remains, perhaps in and around the bone and knee joint. It is a bad wound and may prove very serious for Bob. It is not known how the accident occurred. Bob says he did it with his own gun, but from the nature of the wound the charge entered the leg straight from the rear. The supposition is, that he was trailing the gun, holding it by the muzzle.

LATER:—It now comes out that Bob was in the act of shooting a squirrel that was up in a tree and Al's gun was discharged by accident, the charge striking Bob with the above result.

As we go to press—Wednesday three o'clock—Drs. Bennie and Wolcott are holding a consultation as to the propriety of amputating Bob's leg. Blood poisoning of the very worst form has set in and already spread to his body and they have decided that amputation will not save his life.

Pioneer Stories

Reminiscences Told by Pupils in Carson School, Mrs. Mary Sailor, Teacher, and Juanita McFadden, Chairman of Project.

May 18th of each year is a day of celebration of note. The character and purpose of the celebration are unique and unusual. Relatives, friends, and well-wishers set aside this day to make a pilgrimage of homage and respect to "Grandma" Carnahan at Carson.

In a comfortable rocking chair but in a most regal manner Grandma welcomes her guests at the club house. After a sumptuous pot-luck dinner Grandma asks the guests to sing some one of her favorite hymns. This is followed by a short select program given by neighbors.

Grandma was born 87 years May 18, 1842, in Adair County, Kentucky.

It is my privilege as a pupil of the Carson school to write down the following incidents of her life in a charming manner in which she told me these incidents and the laughter we shared as she told them will be a cherished memory of my Carson schoolhood days.

Outwitting the Confederates and Other Incidents

Grandma was born in Adair County, Ky., on a plantation owned by her father and on which the main crops were cotton, grain and tobacco. They had many negro slaves to help on this 200-acre plantation. Since she was a small girl she has been opposed to slavery. When she was nine years old her parents moved to Macon County, Mo.

The Civil war broke out when she was at the age of 20. Three brothers were in the Union army, being with Sherman on his March to the Sea. The younger and oldest brothers were in the Second Missouri cavalry company F, and one was the lieutenant.

During the war Grandma had many daring experiences, one of which I will relate here.

They learned of a certain rebel detachment, which were pilfering the neighborhood for cattle, horses, and food. Grandma's father had many fine horses which he didn't wish to be stolen. As there was an absence of men to take them to safety, Grandma and her girl cousin undertook the task to take them to the county seat, where there were soldiers stationed, as the horses would be in safe keeping if taken there. As the county seat was 12 miles away, they started with the horses in the early morning, arriving in the mid-afternoon.

They turned the horses over to the soldiers. They went out into the country and stayed all night with one of Grandma's cousins. In order to get home quicker they took a short cut through the woods and crossed Salt river swollen by heavy rains. The horses had to swim across. The water was up to the girls' riding skirts.

After the Civil war Grandma was married to William M. Carnahan, who had been a private in the Union army. Their children were reared in Missouri. When Grandma came to Oregon she was 45.

She came by Immigrant Train, really the Union Pacific R. R. The tickets were \$300 for 8 people. They left Missouri March 21, 1888, and arrived in Eagle Valley March 26, 1888. They laid over one day in Green River, Wyo. There were Grandma and her eight children, her cousin and family, and four young men. They had the control of entire car. They bought their lunch, and made coffee on a stove in the car and recall it as a very enjoyable time.

There were many reasons for coming to Oregon, but the chief reason was on account of Grandma's health.

Pine Valley was very sparsely settled when she came. There were the Demick and the Pancake log cabins standing when Grandma came. They homesteaded the

farm west of Langrell, which now goes by the name of the Valley View farm. Ben Ashley now lives there.

After selling the farm the Carnahans returned to Missouri for a visit. On returning here they bought property in Carson and ran a hotel for nine years between 1901 to 1910.

After 1910 they moved to Baker where they had property and lived there for two years. Mr. Carnahan's health was poor, so they again moved to Carson where Grandma now lives.

Postmaster Carnahan and Wm. Jordan
Have Solved the Great Problem.

H. H. CARNAHAN.

Mr. H. H. Carnahan died at his home in Larrabee Saturday afternoon, after an illness of several months duration. The funeral was held at the M. E. church at Larrabee Tuesday morning.

Deceased was a well known resident of Cedar where he had resided since 1882. He was born in Columbia county, Pa. in 1834. In 1850 he removed with his parents to Lee Co., Ill., where in 1850 he was united in marriage to Miss Matilda Berringer who survives him. Mr. Carnahan and family came to Iowa in 1882 locating in Cedar township where the family has since resided. Deceased was a respected member of the community in which he lived, having held positions of trust in the township for many years, and was postmaster of Larrabee at time of his death. Members of the Cherokee Lodges of Moscos and Odd-Fellows of which orders deceased was a member, attended the funeral from this place.

H.H. Carnahan, dealer in general merchandise at Larrabee, Iowa, is one of the enterprising and energetic men of the village. He was born in Columbia County, Pennsylvania, in 1834, and is a son of Charles Stuart and Elizabeth (Wolf) Carnahan. The parents, full of courage and bravery to encounter the dangers and hardships of pioneer life, removed to Lee County, Illinois, in 1850, and settled at Malugin's Grove. There H.H. grew to manhood, receiving his education in the common schools. In 1865 he engaged in the mercantile business at Malugin's Grove, which business he followed for fifteen years. In 1882 he decided to make a change in his place of residence, and located in Cedar Township, Cherokee County; he has a farm in an advanced state of cultivation, well improved with good buildings. All the surroundings bespeak thrift and wise management on the part of the owner. Mr. Carnahan was married in 1859, in Lee County, Illinois to Miss Matilda Berringer. By this union twelve children have been born, six sons and six daughters: Elsie I., Mary E., Margaret I., Edwin, Eliza, Charlotte, Wilbert, Minnie, Harry, Clyde, Walter and Herbert. Politically Mr. Carnahan affiliates with the Republican party. The people of his township have attested their confidence in him by calling him to fill the offices of township treasurer, clerk and justice of the peace, acquitting himself with much credit, and to the entire satisfaction of the public. He was made a Mason in Illinois in 1859 by Brooklin Lodge, No. 282. He is also a member of the I.O.O.F. Mr. Carnahan is a worthy and respected member of the Methodist Episcopal Church; he is a man strong in his convictions of right and wrong, and lives a life accordingly. He represents the Phoenix Insurance Company of Brooklyn, and the Aetna of Hartford.

WILLIAM F. CARNAHAN

Was born January 15th, 1862. His parents, the late William M. and Sarah Ann Carnahan, lived four miles east of Aledo, where he grew to manhood. In 1880 he was married to Miss Adda Wing. Three children were born to them, the youngest of whom died in infancy last June. The other two, with his sorrowing companion, have been with him during his long and painful illness, and truly mourn his loss. In the year 1887 he removed from Illinois to Kansas, and after spending two years there he went to California, remaining there until some time after his final sickness began, which was in December last. There being no medical skill that could give him relief there, he and his family, casting themselves upon the mercies of God with an earnest desire to be submissive to His will, came back to Illinois. Much as it was desired on his part and on the part of his friends that he should recover, yet God, who doeth all things well, saw fit to take him to Himself and gradually he grew worse until the fatal disease of cancer finished its work and death came to his relief at 1:30 o'clock Friday morning, August 13, 1897. But death did not find him unprepared.

Some ten years ago or more he experienced the power of God's redeeming and regenerating power and grace in his heart, and was led to tell what God had done for his soul by publicly professing his faith in Him and uniting with the Wesleyan Methodist church. His Christian warfare was not always victorious, for even after he had professed his faith he was left to wander, to becalm; but he was not forsaken; God still had a claim upon him. He always claims His own, and "although they fall yet shall they not be cast down entirely." Over two years ago he was led by the spirit of God to see the folly of doubt and disobedience, and enlisted again with renewed energy in the Master's service. He united with the Congregational church in California. He was superintendent of the Sabbath school of the congregation of which he was a member, and was thus enjoying the Master's service when the summons came for him to go up higher. His sufferings were intense, his patience, his faith, his hope, in fact every grace of the spirit was tried, but he proved faithful unto the end. He died in the faith. He longed to depart and be with Christ which was far better. "It was through much tribulation he entered the kingdom of heaven. And while the mother, the wife, the children, the brothers and sisters mourn to-day, they do not mourn as those who have no hope. The life was short, but it was long enough to accomplish the end for which it was given. The family is left without an earthly father, but our Heavenly Father has promised to be a husband to the widow and a father to the fatherless.

The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. W. M. Story in the United Presbyterian church on Sabbath morning at 10:30 o'clock. The church was filled with sympathetic friends, many of whom accompanied the mourners to the cemetery, five miles east of Aledo, where his body was interred in the family burying ground.

Theodore Carnahan Respected Citizen and Civil War Veteran, Dies- Theodore Carnahan was born November 26, 1847, and died February 20, 1925 at the age of 77 years, 2 months, 24 days.
