In most cases passengers seemed to be traveling by themselves, however, the following appear together and are possibly related: Mary-40, John-25, Ellen-23, Mary-20, William-19, Dan-17, Conoriah-14, Thomas-11, Pat-10, Martin-9, James and Mag-6 who sailed 5 June. Mary-40, Mary-19, John-17, Mayr-14, Annie-10, Mathilda-9 came on the Baltic 18 July. The City of Chicago brought Thomas-16, Catherine-14, and William from Monaghan on 4 Aug 1884. The data was found on 7 rolls of microfilm covering the 14th of April to the end of the year and are available at the Temple Library in West Los Angeles.

# CASEY · CLIFFORD · NASH

Daniel and Mary (Cronin) Casey were born, raised and married in Ireland. They lived in Killorglin, County Kerry, Ireland, Parish of Snaem near McGillicuddy's, 10 miles from Killarney. They were the parents of 12 children, eight of whom lived to adulthood. They were: Timothy; Patrick; Daniel; Peter; Margaret (Coffey); Catherine (McCruhan); Julia (Cavanaugh); and Mary (Moriarty). All left Ireland but Peter and the mother, Mary. She died of a fever as did some of the other children when Timothy was 15. No one in the family can recall what became of Peter. Daniel and the children came to the United States about 1851 and they settled in various parts of the country.

Julia Casey married Thomas Cavanaugh. They settled in Summit, Van Buren County, Iowa, and had at least one daughter, Mary who married a Mr. Love.

Mary Casey married John Moriarty (b.1831, d. 21 Jan. 1896), and is buried in St. Mary's cemetery, Bear Creek, Wisconsin. They lived in Nashua, N.H. and later in Wisconsin where they raised their family east of Bear Creek. Mary Casey Moriarty died Appleton, Wisc. in 1912 where she was residing with her daughter, Kate Peerenboom. They had 6 children: 2 daughters; Catherine who married a Mr. Peerenboom; and Margaret who died 28 Nov. 1888, aged 10 yr. 6 mo. 4 da., and is buried St. Patrick's cemetery, Lebanon, Wisc.; 4 sons; Daniel 1858-1915; James M. 1863-1931 m. Anna \_\_\_\_\_, 1870-1952; John L. b. 4 May 1870, d. 3 Mar. 1938, his wife Mary A. \_\_\_\_\_ b.4 Dec. 1880, d. 1 Dec. 1942; all buried St. Mary's cemetery. The 4th son I have no name or data for.

Patrick Casey married Mary Murray/Morry/Morris (all surnames given by different family members). They lived in New York with 2 daughters; Mary m. a Mr. Brown of Connecticut; and Julia m. a Mr. Pallister of Long Island, N.Y. They were the parents of Rev. Walter; Charles; Mary; and one who married a F. LaPatie, it is not known if male or female.

Daniel Casey was a saloon keeper in Nashua, N.H., his wife was Ellen Cronin, they had 5 children: Mary, Honora; John; Daniel; and Timothy.

Margaret Casey m. Michael Coffey in Ireland. They came to America and then went to live in Australia.

Catherine Casey m. a Mr. McCreehan/McCruhan (the usual spelling in Ireland is McCrohan) in Ireland. They were forced to leave their son James in Ireland until he recovered from the measles. Catherine became ill and died shortly after she arrived in Quebec, Canada. Her son Jimmy came to this country with his grandfather, and was raised as a son by his uncle, Timothy Casey. He died in his home in Butte, Montana in 1915.

Timothy Casey was born 21 June 1831 in Killorglin, County Kerry, Ireland, and died 14 Jul. 1917, Lebanon Twp., Waupaca Co., Wisconsin. He married 6 Feb. 1859, Nashua, N.H., St. Mary's Church by Rev. W.O'Donnell, Margaret Clifford who was born Apr. 1835, Kenmore, County Kerry, Ireland. The daughter of John and Mary (Nash) Clifford. She died 2 Jun. 1899, Bear Creek, Wisc. Both are buried St. Mary's Cemetery. Timothy Casey was about 20 years old when he came to America with his father and other members of the family. He worked on farms in Vermont, lived in Lowell, Mass., where he cast his first Presidential vote for James Buchanan, and worked in a tannery in New Hampshire.

Margaret Clifford Casey was one of a family of 10 children. She never saw her 3 youngest brothers as she left home before they were born. At the age of 10, she stayed with Timothy Casey's sister, Margaret (Coffey) in Killarney for 3 years. Margaret came to America at age 16 with her aunt, Elizabeth (O'Connell), she worked in the Indian Head Mills, and did housework until her marriage to Timothy Casey.

In August of 1859, the summer following his marriage, Tim came alone to Bear Creek Twp., Waupaca Co. Wisc. He bought 80 acres of land in Section 36, about 2 miles S-SW of the town of Bear Creek. He stayed with the Jerry Sullivan family while erecting a log dwelling on his land. Margaret arrived from Nashua, N.H. in November before winter set in. She traveled by rail to Oshkosh, Wisc., then by boat to New London, Wisc., accompanied by the orphaned nephew of Tim Casey, James McCruhan. They lived on the farm, adding to it, and improving it to one of the finest farms in the county, until 1897, going then to live in Welcome, Wisc., now known as Bear Creek. During their residence there Margaret Clifford Casey passed away. In 1906, Tim left Welcome for Lebanon to make his home with his daughter, Margaret (Loughrin) until his death at age 86. He had lived the life of an invalid for 18 months previous as a result of a broken hip caused by a fall on the ice. A solemn High Mass was celebrated by Fr. Ripp of Bear Creek, Fr. Casey of Maple Grove, and Fr. Grace of Lebanon.

Timothy and Margaret (Clifford) Casey were the parents of 10 children, all born on the farm in Bear Creek: Mary Ellen Casey b. 27 Mar. 1860, d. 31 Dec. 1947, m. Robert Fitzgerald b. 7 Aug. 1860 New Haven CT, d. 27 Nov. 1946, son of John H. and Anna (Malloy). Both are buried in St. Patrick's cemetery. Their children: John H. Fitzgerald 1886-1970 m. Grace E. Carew; Margaret H. Fitzgerald b. 1888 is single and resides in Milwaukee, Wisc.; Timothy Edmund 1889-1973, m. Kathryn E. Garrity; Anna C. Fitzgerald b. 1892 m. Bernard M. Sullivan, resides in Royalton, Wisc.; Robert L. Fitzgerald b. 1894 m. Marie H. Kelly, resides in New London, Wisc.; Daniel J. Fitzgerald b. 1896 m. Julia Keating, 2m. Ada \_\_\_\_\_; Michael B. Fitzgerald 1898-1973 m. Verna I. Ingle; and Mary Elizabeth Fitzgerald c. 1902 m. Abner Fredenberg

and resides in Syracuse, NY.

John T. Casey 1861-1941 m. Alice Malloy 1860-1934, dau. of Patrick and Mary (O'Brien). They lived in different locations in Wisconsin as he was a conductor for the Chicago & Northwestern R.R. They had no children. Both are buried in St. Mary's Cemetery.

Margaret Anna Casey was b. 15 Aug. 1864, d. 30 Nov. 1955, m. 7 Jul. 1886 in St. Patrick's Church, John Loghrin, b. 28 Feb. 1855 Perth Amboy NJ, son of Bernard and Ann (Maloone), d. 6 Dec. 1921. Both are buried St. Patrick's Cemetery. They were the parents of 11 children: Mary Frances 1887-1952, took vows as Dominican Sister Maria; twins, a boy and a girl Theresa who both died at birth 15 Jun. 1889; Anna Regina b. 1891 m. Henry Flanagan, resides in New London, Wisc; Margaret Genevieve b. 1893 m. Arthur Crain; Joseph Bernard 1895-1957 m. Anna Bricco; John Patrick b. 1897 m. Evelyn Ahern; Timothy Charles b. 1899 d. 1901; Agnes Catherine b. 1901 m. Leo V. Zehren resides in Green Bay, Wisc.; (and who was the guiding light behind all of this material); Alice Theodora b. 1902; William James b. 1905 m. Genevieve Leahy; and Roger Leo 1907-1962 m. Barbara Jungwirth.

Catherine Casey b. 1867 m. John Coffey, a police officer, they had four children: Daniel; Mary; Margaret m. Mr. Burke; and Catherine who married a Mr. Madden. A bit of family tradition here says that John Coffey was a police officer in Chicago IL and in order to get some youngsters off the streets he organized a sandlot baseball team which is now known as the Chicago Cubs.

Daniel J. Casey b. 1869 met his death at age 24 in an accident 18 Feb. 1893 in the north Woods at Watersmeet, Michigan. He is buried St. Mary's Cemetery.

Julia Casey b. 15 Nov. 1870 d. 8 Sep. 1968, m. 26 Oct. 1892, St. Mary's Bear Creek, James Mullarkey, b. 2 Oct. 1859 in Bear Creek, the son of John and Ann (Butler/Butter), he d. 19 Dec. 1943. Both are buried St. Mary's Cemetery. They were the parents of 9 children: John, 1894-1966 m. Marie Bricco; Timothy 1896-1961; Margaret, b. 1898 m. Milton Van Dreese; Ann b. 1900, single, and resides in Bear Creek; Beatrice b. 1903 m. Humphrey Sullivan; Agnes b. 1907 d. 1912; Eileen 1905-1906; James b. 1910 m. Betty Scimek; and Mark b. 1913.

Timothy Casey b. 5 Dec. 1872, d. 9 May 1957, buried St. Mary's Cemetery, never married.

Elizabeth Marie Casey b. 2 Feb. 1875 d. 16 Apr. 1969 m. 19 Oct. 1898 St. Mary's Church, John T. Mullarkey, brother of the above James, b. 22 Nov. 1863 Bear Creek, d. 12 Dec. 1946, both are buried St. Mary's Cemetery. They were the parents of 10: John Clifford b. 1899 m. Isabelle Steffes; Mary Margaret b. 1901 m. Harold Schribner; Daniel Timothy b. 1903 m. Florence Reynolds; Roy Ignatius b. 1905; Eleanor Elizabeth b. 1906 m. Leonard Conrad; Clifford Conrad b. 1909; Elizabeth Ann b. & d. in 1913; Regina Patricia b. 1914 m. Hugh Herald; Dorothy Irene b. 1917 m. Robert Leyrer; and Aloysius Joseph b. 1919 m. Rosemary Daley.

Agnes Honora Casey b. 30 Mar. 1877 d. Dec. 1974 Appleton, Wisc., m. 22 May 1906 St. Mary's Church, Jeremiah Michael Hurley, b. 30 Nov. 1880, Lebanon, son of John and Ellen (Crain), d. 9 June 1934, Appleton, Wisc. Both are buried St. Patrick's Cemetery, Lebanon. They had 8 children: Clifford John 1907-1970 m. Leone C. Ashauer; Ellen Ann b. 1908 m. Thomas G. Cherney; Donald Timothy b. 1910 m. Grace Otto; Harold Jerome b. 1912,

Im. Bernette Spoerl 1917-1964, 2m. Marion (VanVreede) Joosten; Owen Aloysius 1914-1971 m. Marcy Geenen; John born and died 1916; John G. b. 1919 m. Joan V. Sigl; and Margaret 1921-1923.

Michael A. Casey b. 29 Sep. 1879 d. 14 Feb. 1930 Clintonville, Wisc., m. 2 May 1916 St. Patrick's Church, Ellen H. Hurley, sister of above Jeremiah Michael Hurley, b. 29 Aug. 1878, d. 15 Jan. 1953, Clintonville, Wisc., both are buried St. Mary's Cemetery. They had two sons: Clifford Timothy b. 1917 m. Frances L. Polansky; and John M. b. 1919, m. Barbara Klein.

His full name may have been Garrett Job Pendergrass or Job Garrett Pendergrass/Prendergast. Pendergraft (Prendergast and Pendergrass and Pendergast were the three main forms used in the second generation; Pendergraft started in the third generation in the south, we believe.) First Settlement was in New York state in Dutchess Co, with references to CT, then in PA, then in Orange Co, NC by 1776. The Prendergasts are said to be descendants of Sir Maurice Fitzgerald de Prendergast who accompanied Strongbow in the Norman invasion of Ireland in 1169. The Fitzgeralds also descend from Sir Maurice, who are said to spring from the Gheraldi family of Florence.
