It is evident that it was copied from some other record because it is all of one handwriting and the ink is all of one color. My wife's father, whose name was Grindal Chase, left this record at my house a short time before he died, which was on the 10th of June, 1843. He was buried in Rehoboth in Pecks burying ground so called, where his wife's ancestors have been buried for the last hundred years.



PREFACE.

So much of the following Records as relate to Rev. Nathaniel Chase, an early settler in Buckfield, Me., and his descendants, was collected and compiled by his granddaughter, Mrs. Julia Chase Washburn, of Livermore, Maine. They were furnished for publication in the Maine Genealogist and Biographer, but it was subsequently thought advisable to print them in a pamphlet; also to prefix a brief account of the emigrant ancestor, and records of his children and grandchildren, thereby making genealogical connection between the earlier and later branches of the family. This part of the pamphlet, and also the closing pages giving an account of Edmund Chase, an early settler of Minot, Maine, and records of some of his descendants, were compiled from other sources, and supplied by me.

The pamphlet is designed for distribution among such members of the two branches traced therein, as may desire to possess it, and in the case of Rev. Nathaniel, as a token of respect and love to the memory of a worthy ancestor, who voluntarily aided in the struggle for Independence, hewed out for himself and family a home in the wilderness, and was, for many years, a faithful minister of the Gospel among the pioneer settlers of Oxford county.

CHASE FAMILY RECORDS.

The Chase family is said to be of Norman descent, and it has been suggested that the name was formerly LaChass. Be this as it may, the fact that families of this name, have been for several centuries in England, is unquestioned. As early as 1326, families of Chase, lived in Suffolk. The criminal records, show that a Thomas Chase, was barbarously murdered, in 1506. There was a Sir John Chase in Exeter, before 1637, and John Chase, Esq., was Apothecary to Queen Anne, in 1690.

Savage says that Aquila Chase of Hampton and Newbury, was a mariner from Cornwall, England, but the records of the Herald's Visitation, at Buckinghamshire in 1634, indicate that his family may have been of Chesham. There was a Thomas Chase of Chesham, who had a son Richard, baptised August 3, 1542. This Richard, married Joan Bishop, at Chesham April 16, 1564, and had: i, Robert, baptised, September 16, 1565; ii, Henry, baptised, August 10, 1567; iii, Lydia, baptised, October 4, 1573; iv, Ezekiel, baptised, April 23, 1576; v, Dorcas, baptised, March 2, 1578; vi, Aquila, baptised, August 14, 1580; vii, Jason, baptised, January 13, 1583; viii, Thomas, baptised, July 18, 1585; ix, Abigail, baptised, January 12, 1588; Mordecai, baptised, July 31, 1591.

The old story of "three brothers", which so frequently proves to be mythical, holds true with regard to the Chase family, for three brothers by the name of Chase, supposed to have been sons of Aquila and grandsons of Richard above named, were among the early emigrants to New England. William¹ with his wife Mary, and son William, came in the company with Governor Winthrop, in 1630. He thought of going to Scituate, but, finally changed his purpose, and went with a party to Cape Cod, and settled in what is now Yarmouth. He died there in May, 1659, leaving children; i, William born about 1622; ii, Mary born 1637; iii Benjamin born 1630 married Phillippe Sherman. The widow of William Chase was found dead the same year that her husband deceased, and an inquest decided that she died a natural death. The descendants of William and Mary Chase continue to reside in the towns of the Cape, and

may be found scattered elsewhere. The two Chase brothers, Thomas and Tristram who came from Marthas' Vineyard and settled early in Livermore, Maine, are supposed to be descendants of William the emigrant.

Thomas¹ and Aquila Chase,¹ younger brothers of William, appeared in Hampton about the year 1639. They were young, unmarried men. Thomas married Elizabeth daughter of Thomas Philbrook and resided in Hampton until his death which occurred in 1652. His widow married (2) John Garland in 1654, and (3) Henry Roby in 1677. The children of Thomas and Mary Chase were: i, Thomas born 1642 died unmarried October 23, 1714; ii, Joseph born 1645 married Rachel Partridge, January 31, 1671; iii, Isaac born April 1, 1647 married (1) February 20, 1673, Mary Perkins and (2) October 5, 1675, Mary Tilton; iv, James born 1649, married Elizabeth Green, September 2, 1675; v, Abraham born August 6, 1651, unmarried, "was killed in ye warres 1676."

Aquila Chase¹, mariner, born in 1618, married Anne, daughter of John Wheeler of Hampton, N. H., and about the year 1646 he moved to Newbury where he had a grant of four acres of land and resided till his death which took place Dec. 27, 1670. He was a man of some note in Newbury, and his name often appears upon the town records of his time. He is said to have been the first person to bring a vessel over Newbury bar. The only record to his discredit is that which states that "Aquila Chase and his wife were presented for gathering pease on ye Sabbath day." The purpose of this little pamphlet is to trace down one or two branches of the family of Aquila, but we have given his children and grandchildren complete, so far as they appear upon the records of ancient Newbury. 70 Eleazer⁴ came in early manhood to Windham, Maine, to aid in defending the infant settlement, from the attacks of the Indians. He never returned to Newbury, but married Jeanette Elder of Windham, and settled there. By this marriage, he had: Isaac and Mary (1756) and two other children who died young. His wife died and he married Mrs. Mary (Booby) Brown of Marblehead, Mass., and had Betsy, Nathaniel (1761) and Joseph (1769), and one other child that died young. Eleazer

was a soldier of the Revolution. In 1782, he removed to Buckfield, and died there in 1808, aged 86.

Isaac, (son of Eleazer⁴) married Lois Smith, and had 8 children : Gideon, Eleazer, Abigail, Isaac, David, Jane, James and Mary,

He lived and died in Standish, Me., and many of his descendants now live there. Isaac, Jr., married his cousin, Eunice Chase and moved to Turner, Maine. He was known as "Esquire Chase".

6 Mary, (daughter of Eleazer⁴) born April 5, 1755, married Nathaniel Freeman, of Gorham, Maine, 1744, and had 10 children, Jane, Mary, Lydia, David, Bethiah, Nathaniel, Hannah, Betsey, Eunice and John. Jane married Eben Lombard; Mary married Joseph Whitney; Lydia married Gershom Hamlin; Bethia married Enoch Shaw; Hannah married Stephen Whitney, and Betsey married Cyrus Hamlin.

7 Betsey, (daughter of Eleazer⁴) married Eben Cotton, of Gorham and had six children; Joseph, Susan, Nathaniel, Polly, Lydia and William. Betsey lived and died in Gorham.

8 Nathaniel Chase, (son of Eleazer⁴) was born in Windham, Me., Sept. 2, 1761. When 14 years old, the Revolutionary War broke out, and his father enlisted as one of the first minute men, leaving the whole family dependent upon him. When sixteen he enlisted himself and when seventeen he entered the army and served one year. In March, 1781, being nearly twenty years of age, he left Windham in company with two others and walked forty miles on snow-shoes, through the forest, drawing a hand-sled on which was a bushel of meal, axe, hatchet and gun, to what is now the town of Buckfield, Maine. Here he cleared twelve acres of land and built a log cabin to which he removed his parents in 1782; giving them the land thus prepared, he began anew in the forest himself. By an act of Legislature he was enabled to secure one hundred acres of land for his father and a tract adjoining this of equal extent for himself, and he subsequently added over 200 acres to his own farm by purchase. Here he built first a log cabin, then a small frame house and finally the large square house where he lived till his death. This house and a large part of the farm is still owned and occupied by the family of his son, the late Hon. Thomas Chase, to whose faithful care he was indebted for the comfort and quietude of his last years. The remainder of the farm is divided into two farms, on one of which his oldest son Daniel lived and died, and the other was owned for many years by his son William. He was married three times. In 1783 he married Rhoda Elliot of

Windham, Me., and had five children; first twins that died in infancy: Daniel, born March 18, 1785; Dolly, March 12, 1787; and Jaibel, died in infancy. His wife died and he married Jemima Haskell of New Gloucester, Me., 1791, and had eleven children. Mercy, born April 4, 1792; Betsey, Jan. 2, 1794; Eunice, Mar. 30, 1796; Priscilla, May 4, 1798; Nathaniel, June 29, 1800; Salome, April 15, 1802, (died Jan. 15, 1806); Miriam, April 1, 1804; Job, June 28, 1806; Thomas, June 6, 1808; William, January 25, 1811; Isaac, April 6, 1815. His second wife died Dec. 14, 1831, aged 61, and he married Mrs. Joanna (Berry) Briggs, Feb. 20, 1833, who survived him many years. He was ordained a minister in the Baptist church in 1800, and preached fifteen years to the First Baptist church of Buckfield, also at Livermore, Harrison, Woodstock, Paris and other places, mostly without compensation. He was a man of firm will, a benevolent heart, and great physical endurance. Nathaniel died in Buckfield of typhoid fever April 20, 1853, aged nearly 92 years.

9 Joseph (son of Eleazer^d) born in Windham, 1769, came to Buckfield with his parents in 1782. He married Hannah Elliot of Windham (a sister of his brother Nathaniel's wife,) and had two children: Rhoda 1791, and Hannah 1795. His wife died and he married Anna Legro and had four children: Joseph, 1796; Eleazer, 1797; Mary, 1800, and Nancy, 1802. Joseph died in Buckfield, (on the place now owned by his grandson Lewis) in 1814, aged 45 years.

10 Daniel (son of Nathaniel^s) married Abigail Record 1805, and had seven children: Daniel, April 13, 1807; David R., Dec. 26, 1808; Jacob E., May 8, 1811; Charles G., Sept. 13, 1813; Stephen D., Aug. 1, 1817; Cyrus G., Sept. 1819; Rhoda A., March 12, 1822. Rhoda A. died July 1824. His wife died and he married Mrs. Dieldamia Thompson, 1846. Daniel lived in Buckfield and died there July 8, 1855, aged 70.

11 Dolly, (daughter of Nathaniel^s) married William Tuttle 1807, and had nine children: Isaac, Oct. 7, 1807; (died June 7, 1855;) Rhoda E., March 12, 1810; Hiram, Nov. 8, 1812; Mercy, March 9, 1815; Lois, Sept. 29, 1817; William, Oct. 5, 1820; Adeline, May 21, 1823; Angeline, Oct. 6, 1825, died 1843; Oscar F., April 14, 1828. Isaac married Rozana Spaulding, died; Rhoda married Joseph Hutchinson, died June 4, 1843; Hiram married Mary A. Conant and Britannia Fernald; Mercy married

Benjamin Roberts, died July 25, 1848, and Lois married David Ripley, died January, 1856; the remainder of the children died unmarried. William died Sept. 1845; Adeline, April 22, 1841. Dolly lived in Turner and died there Dec. 1841, aged 54.

12 Mercy, (daughter of Nathaniel⁹) married William Walker of Peru, March 17, 1818 and had four children: Martha, March 16, 1819; William Haskell, Jan. 7, 1824; Amanda, Feb. 21, 1829; Adelia B., March 12, 1834. Martha married Orrin Reynolds of Canton, Aug. 31, 1853 and had one child: Malcomb, born May 12, 1855; she died May 25, 1877. William II., married Mrs. Sebrina R. Walker, May 25, 1856, and had two children: Charles Sumner, born March 9, 1857; Daniel II., Feb. 8, 1859 (died Sept. 23, 1860.) Adelia married Gilbert Eustace, April 2, 1863 and had one child: Lucy Malvina, Sept. 17, 1864, died May 2, 1872. Her husband died and she married Amos Harlow of Peru, May 9, 1872. Mercy lived in Peru and died there May 6, 1877 aged 85.

13 Betsey (daughter of Nathaniel⁹) married Adam Knight of Peru, Dec. 1815, and had eight children, viz: Nathaniel, Dec. 7, 1816; Merrill, Dec. 6, 1818; Salome, Dec. 26, 1820; Eveline A., March 23, 1824; Calista, March 27, 1826; Daniel, March 10, 1828; Jemima, Dec. 23, 1831; Maria Louisa, Aug. 1837. Nathaniel married Columbia Sweet, June 5, 1842, and had two children: Aubry Mellen, Aug. 8, 1843, and Eveline A., June 11, 1845. Nathaniel died Oct. 20, 1856. Merrill married Esther Woodsome, Jan. 15, 1854, and had two children; Bevillo A., July 11, 1856, and Lura M., Aug. 16, 1863. Salome married Enoch Morrill, June 23, 1850. Eveline died March 7, 1844. Calista married Oliver Robbins Aug. 20, 1848, and had five children, viz: Susan, Sept. 20, 1849, (died Oct. 4, 1854); Betsey, March 8, 1851, (died Nov. 22, 1854.) E. SOME OF THE DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM CHASE OF ROXBURY AND YARMOUTH, MASS.

Contributed by JOHN CARROLL CHASE of Derry, N. H., as compiled for him by GEORGE WALTER CHAMBERLAIN, M.S., of Malden, Mass.

1. WILLIAM¹ CHASE, of Roxbury and Yarmouth,* carpenter, the first of the Chase name to settle in New England, came with his family to Roxbury in 1630. As he married in England, before 1627, MARY ———, and had a son born there as early as 1627, he probably was born about 1600. He died at Yarmouth between 4 May 1659, the date of his will, and 13 May 1659, when his will was proved. His widow, Mary, died there on or before 6 Oct. 1659.

William Chase and his family lived at Roxbury from 1630 to 1638; and the following information about them has been copied from the records of the church at Roxbury kept by Rev. John Eliot:

"William Chase, he came with the first company, 1630; he brought one child his son william. a child of ill qualitis, & a sore affliction to his parents: he was much afflicted by the long & tedious affliction of his wife; after his wives recovery she bare him a daughter, wch they named mary borne aboute the middle of the 3d month [May], 1637. he did after y^e remove (intending) to Situate, but after went with a company who maide a new plantation at yarmouth." (Roxbury Church Records, pp. 73-74.)

"Mary Chase, the wife of William Chase. she had a paralitik humor wch fell into her back bone, so yt she could not stir her body, but as she was lifted, and filled her wth great torture, & caused her back bone to goe out of joynt, & bunch out from the begining to the end of wch infirmity she lay 4 years & a halfe, & a great pt of the time a sad spectacle of misery: But it pleased God to raise her againe, & she bore children after it." (Ib., p. 75.)

William Chase was named, 19 Oct. 1630, among those "who desire to be made freeman;" and he was made a freeman of the Massachusetts Bay Colony on 14 May 1634. (REGISTER, vol. 3, pp. 90, 92.) In 1639 he moved to Yarmouth on Cape Cod, was appointed constable for the town of Yarmouth by the General Court of the Plymouth Colony, 5 Mar. 1638/9, and took the oath of office 4 June 1639. (Plymouth Colony Records, vol. 1, pp. 116, 125.)

His life at Yarmouth was not a peaceful one. Trouble with Marmaduke Mathewes brought him before the Court almost immediately, on 1 Sept. 1640 he was censured for his "miscarriages" against Mr. Mathewes and disturbance of the proceedings of the church, Court, and "contrey," and he gave the General Court bond for £20 for his appearance at the next Court, 2 Mar. 1640/1. (Ib., vol. 1, pp. 135, 162, vol. 2, p. 9.) In 1641 he was again in Court on account of a
