ILLINOIS MARRIAGE RECORDS

The following information was extracted from an article that appeared in the January 5, 1987 issues of the TRI STATE TRADER.

In 1985 the Illinois State Archives and the Illinois State Genealogical Society began a joint project of indexing pre-1900 marriage records in the state of Illinois. Members of genealogical societies throughout Illinois are helping by copying and proofreading the original records in courthouses. The Archives staff and other volunteers then enter the material into the state's computer.

The indexing is done by both statewide and county-by-county indexes of combined brides' and grooms' names, and will provide easy access to marriage records for researchers. The first 80,000 entries on microfiche were distributed last September to 101 societies in Illinois. The indexes may be consulted at society libraries, the Illinois State Archives and the Illinois Regional Archive Depositories throught Illinois.

The first county to have all marriages prior to 1900 completely entered into the computer was Macon. There are partial entries for the following counties: Adams, Bond, Calhoun, Christian, Coles, Crawford, Hancock, Jackson, Knox, Macoupin, Saline, Sagamon, Shelby and Union. Several other counties are ready to be entered, or are in the process of being transcribed from original courthouse records.

The entire project is expected to take five years or longer to complete.
