DATA OF THE CONE FAMILY

This data received from William Whitney Cone of Topeka, Kansas, 1891.

Daniel Cone, the first of the name in America, came from England or Scotland and settled in Connecticut in 1615. Later in East Haddam, Conn., in 1662 he had 7 sons and 3 daughters. His descendants are found in every state in the union except Maryland; also in Canada, England, Germany, Nova Scotia and Japan.

William Cone (my great-great-grandfather) was born about 1734. During the Revolution he resided at Halifax District, Eastern North Carolina. His first wife, Elizabeth Morris, born 1740, died 1796. They were married about 1754.

Their eight children were:

Ada's mother. She says that she doesn't know where the 'Parton'
name entered in but she knows that it was not a marriage.

Note: The words inserted (my great-great-grandfather), (my
grandfather) etc. - she doesn't know what descendant
wrote it originally so there is no telling the relation-
ship from that source. There is also no way from these
papers of determining which William Cone is the William
Whitney Cone referred to as putting together the data.

Dear Mr. Perkins:

Back in 1919 George H. Perkins, your grandfather, sold a 17.1 acre tract of land, now abutting upon the present State Highway No. 95-Bastrop to Elgin, to a negro Josiah Perkins, and in said deed reserved title to the "lignite coal interests" in said tract. I'm sure none of the heirs knew of this. This negro sold the land and the title rested in a Mexican named Jesus Barrientos in 1941 when the Government acquired the lands in Camp Swift. On examining the title it was first learned about the reservation of the title to the lignite by your grandfather.

The eastern tip of this tract, being 0.34 of an acre extends east of the said highway, for which the Government is to pay Barrientos \$20.00 when the title is cleared of this lignite title. I might also say that this Mexican had both legs shot off in World War 2, and now lives in a wheel chair.

I am enclosing you herewith a waiver of your interest in the lignite title so we can pay this Mexican the \$20.00. All the heirs of your grandfather have signed the identical waiver, except you and Mrs. Oma Martin, ne Van Reid, a grandchild of your mother by her first marriage. I am sending her a waiver today. As the Government is desirous of completing this tract as soon as possible, as the lands in Camp Swift will soon be re-sold by the Government through this office, I will thank you to sign this waiver and return to me.
