EDWARD CONNER FAMILY

The following information was provided by Irene E. Adler, Modesto, CA and has been expanded on by the Editor.

Edward CONNER was born between 1770 and 1780 in North Carolina. He married in Anson Co., N.C., 15 Mar 1797 to Elizabeth CARTER, she b 1779 N.C. Edward died 28 Sep 1830 Fayette Co., IL. They appear in White Co., TN Tax Lists from 1811 to 1813. Their daughter Eliza Ann was a child when the family made the move to Fayette Co., IL.

The petition for bounty land made by Elizabeth CARTER CONNER stated that her husband, Edward served in the War of 1812 at which time they were living in White Co., TN. Elizabeth died after 1850 probably in Seminary Twp., Fayette Co. Records indicate that Edward served with Capt. Newman's Co. W, Tennessee Militia.

Sometime before Thomas Benton RILEY's birth, the family had lived in Illinois where several children were born and then they moved to Platteville, Grant Co., WI. In 1854 William and Lucinda with their family headed west. They joined up with a 100-wagon train at St. Joseph, MO and took their family to California settling in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, El Dorado County. The wagons started the journey April 4, 1854 and arrived at Placerville, California, August 4, 1854. The trail was well traveled and marked which aided them in their journey. Gully banks had been worn down, but it was still a long dusty road, except during the heavy summer rains when the wagons would mire down in the deep mud.

CORINTH BAPTIST CHURCH RECORDS
Seminary Township

January 1, 1898 - August 27, 1939

Some years ago Mr. Clifford Tedrick presented the church record book of Corinth Church to our Society. The church was organized January 1, 1898, affiliated with the Rehoboth Association in September that year with a membership of 50, represented by Elder J.W.F. SHELTON as Pastor, Bros. J.F. TEDRICK, George HOWELL and R.B. COIN as Messengers. The church stood one mile south of Pittsburg and has since been town down.

Officers of the church as listed inside the front cover: J.W. R. SHELTON, Moderator, Bro. G.W. DAVIS, Clerk, J.F. TEDRICK and Isaac HOWELL, Deacons, G.W. HEATHER, B.N. COOK, John W. HOWELL, George HOWELL and R.B. COIN were Trustees.

A house of worship was built which served for 41 years. Pastors were Rev. J.W.F. SHELTON, 1898; 1900-1901, 1909; Robert SAVAGE, 1899; David K. BARKER, 1902, 1918; Henry SMITH, 1905; Charles A. BROWN, 1906, 1921; Henry TOBERMAN, 1907; T.E. MORRISON, 1910, J.W. HOWELL, 1912; A.E. KRETZER, 1913, George JIMMERSON, 1914-1915; Jesse ULLOM, 1916; F.A. DeMOULIN, 1917; Edward GRIGG, 1922; Robert RENCH, 1924-1925; William H. GRIGG 1926-1917; H.E. LOCKARD, 1934-1935; H.A. TODD, 1939.

A loose paper in the front of the book dated October 3, 1950 stated that a meeting was held regarding disposition of funds left in the church treasury amounting to \$24.58 left over from the fund to raise money to repair the church. It was voted to give the money to the Taylor Cemetery.

Early entries identify the church as the Corinth United Baptist Church. They adopted the church Covenant and Rules Of Order of Seminary church.

“Where as the great Commission of Christ is to go and to preach the gospel to every creature and to babtise (sic) them that believe. Wherefore the said Corinth Church that was organized was a portion of Seminary Church that was holding meeting at Shiloh School house and having built a new church which was more convenient for them they were lettered of (sic) from Seminary to join the said church known as Corinth and the undersigned names joined as charter members of said Corinth Church on said day.”
