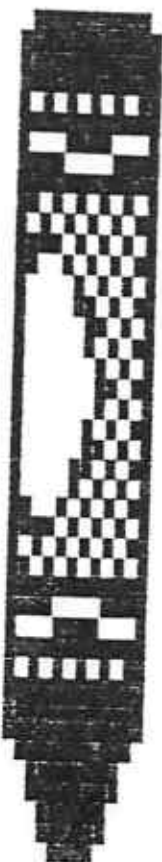

I started working on this family when I was told I had a COPPOCK ancestor. I had already been working on my PEARSON family of Wilmslow, Cheshire. Since the COPPOCK family was from the same place, immigrated to Penna. at the same time, and followed the same route through Virginia, South Carolina, and into the same place in Ohio, it was easy to do the research all at the same time. THEN, I found out my ancestor was not a COPPOCK! By then, I had collected all of this, and it would be a shame to put it in File Thirteen. It is far from complete, but it does have more information about the family in ONE spot than I had seen elsewhere.

A large number of Quaker ancestors followed the same migration routes over two centuries. About 1681, Penna. was opened up to settlement to Quakers. Before this, they had been hanged in New England. Many thousands came. Around the 1740's, many migrated to the area of Frederick Co., Virginia for cheaper land. In the 1770's this family went to South Carolina for the new land too.

About 1800, an itinerate preacher named Zachary Dicks traveled through the south, predicting a terrible war over slavery that would destroy much of the south during their lifetimes. Between 1800-1810, thousands and thousands of Quakers left the slave states for the new territory of Ohio and Indiana, principally the Miami Valley of Ohio. Whole towns were abandoned in South Carolina. Then, after the Civil War, they were on the move again to the plains states, again looking for room to expand.

Please use this as a research tool. There are undoubtedly many errors. This family was fun to research, but I know I don't have the last word on these people. Please forgive any typographical errors.

Note: When names are cross-referenced to cousins, the Family Group Sheet is always filed under the reference number of the husband.

Dates in Record-Keeping

DATA:

In Quaker records, dates are given as: 1805, 5, 28, meaning May 28, 1805. They never used worldly names for months, since they were derived from pagan worship. Sunday was "First Day", Monday was "Second Day", etc.

In days past, the new year began on the 25th of March. Dates would read March 24, 1567, March 25, 1568. January was the 11th month, and February was 12th month. A common mistake is to find a marriage April 1677, and a child born February 1677; the researcher assumes the child was born before the wedding, instead of the correct 10 months after.

Double-dating avoids this problem. In 1582, when the old Roman Empire ended, the Julian calendar was in use. It was 10 days off, the equinoxes falling at slightly different times over the years. Catholic countries (Austria, Hungary, parts of Germany, etc.) adopted the new and correct calendar in 1582 under Rome's leadership. Protestant countries held out till 1752, when they changed January to the 1st month. Between 1582 and 1752, double-dating is used.

Months were written, Dec. 1590, Jan. 1590, Feb. 1590, March 1590, till the 24th, then March 1591. Dates between Jan. 1st and March 24th are written as Feb. 14, 1590/1, meaning the date fell between 1590 and 1591. A few clerks continued the old system after the change, still calling March "1st month". Others went back and re-wrote old records to the new dates! You have to know the clerk's system. Sometimes they will indicate "OS" for old style.

WHEN READING A PRINTED GENEALOGY, ALWAYS BE SURE THE AUTHOR UNDERSTOOD about double-dating! If the author read 12 month, 15 day, 1683, and printed it in his book as Dec. 15, 1683, everyone who reads it will be led astray. The correct date is Feb. 15, 1683/4.

DO NOT THINK THE "OLD CALENDAR" IS A UNIQUELY QUAKER SYSTEM. THE NEW YEAR BEGAN ON MARCH 25th FOR EVERYONE! It is just that the Friends used month & day NUMBERS instead of names. Puritans and others often used the numbers. When I say Lawrence died 1673/4, it does not mean I am uncertain, but that he died between the two years.

When speaking of Quaker dates, let us notice the difference between when a marriage was recorded, and when it was reported. If a couple married within the Meeting, it was RECORDED when it happened. If they married outside the Meeting, it was often not REPORTED for several months, even a year, allowing the couple time to decide if they wished to hold membership there or not. If not, they were REPORTED "married out" after the fact. Many researchers get upset because their ancestors were "thrown out" without realizing the couple was given a lot of time to make the decision for themselves. Benjamin Pearson was reported married out May 1792, and had a child born October 1792, but he had been married longer than 5 months! They did not ask for membership till after 2 children had been born to them, and the births were recorded after the fact then.

Do not get tripped-up by this frequent stumbling block.

The family went from Cheshire to Wales for a period of years. They were there during the English Civil War. It was a time of much upheaval and terrible disputes, which turned many a man into a peace-loving Quaker. They seem to have kept their ties to the Mobberly/Wilmslow area.

Wilmslow and Mobberly are adjacent, and other families are known to have crossed the line freely. Morley Monthly Meeting had members from both parishes, met in Wilmslow parish, but had their burial ground in Mobberly. See "Quaker Pearsons" for more background about the area.

This outline may not be correct. However, it gives us numbers so we can organize and cross-reference these people.

COPPOCK

Aaron Coppock, Friend, of Cecil Co., Maryland is the ancestor of most of the Coppock families in the Miami Valley, thru his son John. John died in Cecil Co., Md. in 1788 and his wife, Margaret (Couleon) Coppock died in 1789. Their sons, who came to Ohio with their families were -

John Coppock, born in Maryland in 1736, married Abigail Skillern, and in 1777 removed from Nottingham M.M., Cecil Co., Md. to Bush River M.M., South Carolina.

Joseph Coppock, born in Maryland in 1742, married, 1769, Jane Wilson, and in 1772 removed to Bush River M.M. South Carolina.

John Coppock

The Bush River records (Enc. Quaker Genealogy, Hinshaw), give the children of John and Abigail (Skillern) Coppock, with dates of birth as follows -

Aaron Coppock, born Sept. 20, 1762; (he married Feb. 9, 1797, Margaret Tucker, at Little Limestone, Washington Co., Tenn.)

John Coppock, born Aug. 20, 1766; (married, Jan. 7, 1790, Ann Jay).

Susanna Coppock, born Nov. 14, 1769, died 1810; married, Aug. 2, 1787, John Elleman, born 1766 (son of Enos & Catharine).

Margaret Coppock, born Dec. 20, 1771.

Abigail Coppock, born Feb. 28, 1774, (married, Mar. 26, 1796, Benjamin Weeks).

Mary Coppock, born June 16, 1776.

Isaac Coppock, born Dec. 2, 1779.

Ann, born Mar. 18, 1781.

Samuel Coppock, born Nov. 1, 1783.

Of these children, Aaron, John, Susanna Elleman and Abigail Weeks came to Ohio.

Aaron Coppock was a Friends' minister and with his sons, Abraham, Aaron, Josiah, Elijah and Elisha, removed to Washington Co., Tenn. Jan. 3, 1818. The mother, Abigail Coppock, came with him and died there, May 20, 1818. This would indicate that John died previously in South Carolina. Aaron later came to Miami Co., where he died in 1837. His will, recorded April of that year, names his wife Margaret; daughter Elizabeth and other two daughters; son Aaron in Tennessee and grandson Aaron; sons, Elijah, Abraham and Josiah. The executors were the son Josiah and Samuel Coate; the witnesses were Nicholas Tucker, Richard Thompson, William Coppock.

John Coppock, married, Jan. 7, 1790, Ann Jay, daughter of William and Mary (Vestal) Jay (See Jay Family, Sunday Journal, Aug. 4, 1935); Ann, born 1765, died 1821. The records at Waynesville show that they removed to Ohio in 1805, with children, Jesse, Aaron, Eunice, James, Isaac and John. Of these -

Eunice, married, Aug. 2, 1809, Robert Pemberton, (son of Isaiah).

James, 1799-1867, married, May 24, 1825, Jane Huntsman, born Feb. 8, 1803, died Mar. 9, 1875; (daughter of George & Mary).



Susanna Coppock, married, Aug. 2, 1787, John Elleman, (son of Enos and Catharine Elleman); issue, 6 daughters, 3 sons. They are said to have removed to Tennessee with her brother Aaron Coppock, and in 1805, Susanna Elleman with her son Enos and daughters, Drusilla, Elizabeth, Temperance and Susanna, removed to Miami Co.

Enos Elleman was born Mar. 31, 1802.

Drusilla, married, Nov. 7, 1810, John Pemberton, (son of Isaiah and Esther Pemberton).

Abigail Coppock, born Feb. 28, 1774, married, Mar. 26, 1796, Benjamin Weeks. In 1809 they were living in North Carolina and the New Garden M.M. records give their children as Susannah, Mary, Hannah, Clara, Abigail and Karenhappock. In 1813 this family removed to Ohio.

Clarissa, married, Jan. 17, 1820, Richard Thornberry.

✓ Karenhappock, married, May 2, 1825, Peter Rhodehamel.

Abigail, married, July 5, 1832, John Macy, (son of Thomas and Bethiah), as his second wife.

COPPOCK

Another Coppock family on record at Bush River, South Carolina was that of Moses and Martha (Scarr) Coppock, said to have come directly from England to South Carolina. Martha was killed by the Indians and the daughter Mary taken prisoner. Moses died prior to 1771; only three children known -

Mary Coppock, who married Marmaduke Coate about 1764 and settled in Miami County (See Coate Family, Dayton Sunday Journal Nov. 26, 1933), where Marmaduke died, Sept. 25, 1822, age 84 years. Mary survived her husband several years.

Martha Coppock, who married, Dec. 30, 1771, William Tomlinson of Fredericksburg Township, S. Car. and later moved to North Carolina. The record of her marriage states that she was "the daughter of Moses Coppock dec'd and Martha his wife."

James Coppock, died Feb. 9, 1838, age 79 years (born 1759); he married, about 1784, Hannah Pugh, who died Apr. 11, 1820 and is buried in old Mill Creek Cemetery. They came to Ohio in 1806, with children, Moses, Susanna and Martha. Of these -
