ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Bylaws, Article III, Section 1.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's (Andrew Creswell) place of residence during the Revolution was Washington County, Virginia

My ancestor, Andrew Creswell, assisted in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution as follows:

ANDREW CRESWELL enlisted in June or July 1776, in Washington County, Virginia, and served three months as private in Captain Colville's Company, Colonel Arthur Campbell's Virginia Regiment, engaged in the defense of Black's Station, afterwards he served on monthly tours each summer for four or five years, engaged against the Indians on the headwaters of Clinch River, once under Colonel Evan Shelby, and at other times under Lieutenant Newell; he served one month in 1780, in Captain Dysert's Company, Colonel William Campbell's Virginia Regiment and was at the Battle of King's Mountain, and one month at the Battle of Guilford (1781) under said Colonel William Campbell; he rendered other short tours of service, officers not named. His entire service amounted to at least one year.

The record of ANDREW CRESWELL is furnished in his claim for pension S. 1948.
